Workers' Compensation and Assistance Act 1981-87

HOSPITALS ACT 1927

Armadale-Kelmscott District Memorial Hospital (Traffic and Grounds) By-laws 1987

MADE by the Minister under sections 7 and 22.

PART I—PRELIMINARY

Citation

1. These by-laws may be cited as the *Armadale-Kelmscott District Memorial Hospital (Traffic and Grounds) By-laws 1987*.

Interpretation

2. (1) In these by-laws, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Administrator” means the person holding or acting in the office of chief executive officer (however designated) of the hospital;

“authorized person” means an officer or servant of the Board authorized in writing by the Administrator for the purpose of these by-laws;

“Board” means the Minister for Health being the Board, pursuant to section 7 of the Act, of the Armadale-Kelmscott District Memorial Hospital;

“driver”, in relation to a vehicle, includes rider;

“hospital” means the Armadale-Kelmscott District Memorial Hospital;

“parking facility” means any land or structure on the site containing a parking space or parking spaces;

“parking space” means a section whether in a parking facility or not which is marked by means of painted lines or metallic studs or similar devices for the purpose of indicating where a vehicle may be parked whether or not a charge or permit is required in relation to the parking of the vehicle;

“permit” means parking permit issued under by-law 13;

“roadway” means part of the site which, although it is not a road within the meaning of the *Road Traffic Act 1974*, is set aside for the use by vehicular traffic, but excludes a parking facility;

“sign” means marking, notice or sign marked, erected or displayed by or by authority of the Administrator;

“speed restriction sign” means a sign erected or marked in or about a roadway containing a numeral or numerals;

“the site” means the grounds attached to or belonging to the hospital;

“vehicle” has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1974*.

(2) Subject to sub-by-law (3) when these by-laws prohibit the doing of an act or thing without permission—

(a) that permission shall be in writing and may be given and revoked by the Administrator or by an officer or servant of the Board authorized by the Administrator to give and revoke that permission; and

(b) that permission shall be obtained before the act or thing is done.

(3) An officer or servant of the Board acting in the course of his employment has the permission referred to in sub-by-law (2) without that sub-by-law being complied with in respect of him.

PART II—GROUNDS**No entry without cause**

3. A person shall not enter or remain on the site without a reasonable excuse.

Directions concerning use of certain areas

4. (1) An authorized person may, by the display, erection or marking of a sign or notice, direct that a specified part of the site shall be open to members of the public or a specified section of the public subject to compliance with such conditions as may be specified.

(2) A direction given under sub-by-law (1) may be varied or cancelled by the Administrator.

(3) In this by-law “specified” means specified in the relevant direction given under sub-by-law (1).

(4) A person who contravenes a direction given under sub-by-law (1) commits an offence.

PART III—TRAFFIC CONTROL**Division 1—General****Driving of vehicles**

5. (1) A person shall not, without permission, drive or bring a vehicle on any portion of the site unless that portion is a roadway or a parking facility.

(2) A person shall not, without permission, drive or bring a vehicle, the unladen weight of which exceeds four tonnes, on any portion of the site.

(3) A person shall not drive, use or stand a vehicle in any portion of the site contrary to any sign displayed in relation to that portion of the site.

Driver to obey reasonable direction

6. Notwithstanding anything in these by-laws, the driver of a vehicle shall obey any reasonable direction given to him by an authorized person in relation to the parking or movement of the vehicle.

Speed limits

7. (1) A person shall not drive a vehicle on a roadway—

(a) where no speed restriction sign is displayed—at a speed exceeding 25 kilometres an hour;

(b) where a speed restriction sign is displayed in relation to a portion of a roadway—at a speed exceeding the speed indicated on the speed restriction sign.

(2) Sub-by-law (1) does not apply to or in relation to an emergency vehicle.

Give way

8. The driver of a vehicle that is entering or preparing to enter a parking facility shall give way to any vehicle that is—

(a) leaving the parking facility; or

(b) travelling in the roadway in the vicinity of his vehicle.

Roadway not to be used for instructions or repairs

9. A person shall not on a roadway in the site—

(a) drive a vehicle for the purposes of giving or receiving driving instructions;

(b) except in an emergency, effect repairs or adjustments or both to a vehicle.

Division 2—Parking

Parking only in parking spaces

10. A person shall not park a vehicle in the site except in a parking space.

Signs to be obeyed

11. A person shall not park, stand or move a vehicle in a parking facility in the site contrary to any direction contained in a sign.

Parking in parking spaces

12. (1) A person shall not park, stand or move a vehicle in a parking facility in the site contrary to any directions contained in a sign.

(2) Where a sign indicates that a parking facility or portion of a parking facility in set aside—

- (a) for a specified vehicle or specified class of vehicles;
- (b) for the vehicle of a specified person or specified class of persons;
- (c) for parking of vehicles for a specified period of time; or
- (d) for the parking of vehicles for a maximum period of time so specified,

a person shall not park a vehicle in the parking facility or portion of the parking facility unless—

- (e) the vehicle is the particular vehicle or is within the class of vehicle so specified;
- (f) the vehicle is the vehicle of the person or a person of the class so specified;
- (g) the vehicle is parked within the period of time so specified;
- (h) the vehicle is parked for a period that does not exceed the maximum period of time so specified,

as the case requires.

(3) Where a sign in a portion of a parking facility directs that a vehicle parked in that portion is required to display a permit in a specified position on the vehicle a person shall not park a vehicle in the portion of the parking facility unless a valid permit is displayed in accordance with directions in the sign.

(4) In this sub-by-law “specified” means specified in a sign.

Permits

13. (1) A person who desires to obtain a permit to park vehicle in a parking facility shall apply to the Administrator.

(2) An application for the purposes of sub-by-law (1) shall be in the form of the form approved by the Administrator.

(3) A permit may be issued by the Administrator permitting parking in a specified portion of the site or for the purposes of parking anywhere on the site.

(4) A permit is valid—

- (a) if issued in relation to a specified vehicle, for the purposes of parking only the vehicle so specified;
- (b) if issued for the purposes of parking a vehicle owned by a specified person or class of persons, for the purposes of parking a vehicle owned only by a person of the class of persons so specified;
- (c) if issued in relation to a vehicle of a specified class, for the purposes of parking only a vehicle of the class so specified;
- (d) if issued for the purposes of parking a vehicle in a specified portion of a parking facility, for the purposes of parking a vehicle only in the portion of a parking facility so specified;
- (e) if issued for the purposes of parking a vehicle during a specified period of time, for the purposes of parking a vehicle only during the period of time so specified.

(5) Subject to sub-by-law (6), a permit expires on the day specified in the permit.

(6) The Administrator may cancel a permit if—

- (a) a vehicle in respect of which the permit is issued is parked in the site in contravention of these by-laws or the terms of the permit issued in relation to the person or the vehicle specified in the permit;
- (b) the person in relation to whom the permit is issued commits an offence against these by-laws;
- (c) the person in relation to whom the permit is issued ceases to be entitled to be holder of the permit.

(7) A person shall not park a vehicle in a parking facility without a valid permit.

(8) In this by-law—

“specified” means specified in the relevant permit.

PART IV—OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

Definition

14. In this Part—

“alleged offender”, in respect of a vehicle on or in which an infringement notice has been left under by-law 17 by an authorized person includes registered owner of the vehicle;

“infringement notice” means infringement notice referred to in by-law 17;

“modified penalty” means modified penalty prescribed in Schedule 1 for an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws.

Offences and penalty

15. Subject to by-law 16 a person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of these by-laws commits an offence.

Penalty: \$50.

Modified penalties

16. (1) A person who does not contest an allegation that he committed an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws may pay to the hospital within the time specified in the relevant infringement notice or within such extended time as the Administrator allows the modified penalty prescribed for that offence in Schedule 1.

(2) The production of an acknowledgement from the hospital of the payment in accordance with sub-bylaw (1) of the modified penalty concerned is a defence to a charge of the offence in respect of which that modified penalty was paid.

Infringement notices

17. (1) An authorized person who believes on reasonable grounds that a person has committed an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws may serve on that person an infringement notice by delivering it to the alleged offender or by affixing it to the vehicle of the alleged offender.

(2) An infringement notice shall be in the form of Form 1 Schedule 2 and shall—

- (a) be identified by a serial number;
- (b) identify the alleged offender by reference to his name and address or the vehicle make and registration number of his vehicle;
- (c) state the by-law under which the offence is alleged to have been committed, and the brief description of offence and modified penalty set out opposite that by-law in Schedule 1; and
- (d) inform the alleged offender in general terms that if he does not wish to have a complaint of the alleged offence heard and determined by a court of summary jurisdiction, then he may deliver the amount of the modified penalty to an authorized person within the time provided in the infringement notice, which shall not be less than 14 days.

Modified penalties procedure

18. (1) A person who does not contest an allegation that he has committed an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws may complete the infringement notice by signing the admission on that notice and forwarding the infringement notice and the amount of the modified penalty set out in Schedule 1 opposite the by-law alleged to have been breached to an authorized person specified in the infringement notice.

(2) Upon receipt of a modified penalty under sub-bylaw (1) sent within the time provided in the infringement notice or such further time as an authorized person allows, the authorized person shall issue to the person paying that modified penalty an acknowledgement.

Withdrawal of infringement notice

19. An authorized person, not being the person who issued the infringement notice, may by notice in the form of Form 2 in Schedule 2 served on the alleged offender withdraw an infringement notice.

Removal and endorsement of infringement notices

20. A person other than an authorized person who—

- (a) makes an endorsement on or alteration to an infringement notice; or
- (b) not being the driver registered owner or person in charge of a vehicle to which an infringement notice is attached, removes the infringement notice,

commits an offence.

Other penalties for illegally parked vehicles

21. (1) In addition to any other penalty, a vehicle parked in breach of these by-laws or a vehicle which is left on the site for more than 3 days may be removed by order of the Administrator to a storage place within the site.

(2) For the purpose of removing a vehicle under sub-bylaw (1), a person authorized by the Administrator may take such action by way of unlocking, driving, towing or otherwise as is reasonably necessary.

(3) The hospital may retain possession of a vehicle removed and stored under sub-bylaw (1) until the owner of that vehicle has paid all costs incurred by the hospital in so removing and storing that vehicle.

Authorized person may request name and address

22. Where an offence under these by-laws is alleged to have been committed by the driver or person in charge of a vehicle then the registered owner of the vehicle shall, if required to do so by an authorized person, supply the name and address of the person driving or in charge of the vehicle at the time the offence is alleged to have been committed and in the event that he refuses to do so, he shall be deemed to be the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at the time the offence is alleged to have been committed.

PART V—GENERAL**Other offences**

23. A person who—

- (a) wilfully obstructs any officer or servant of the Board in the discharge of his duty under these by-laws;
- (b) removes, damages, defaces or misuses a sign;
- (c) disobeys or fails to comply with any notice or sign, including a traffic sign erected or displayed by an authorized person in accordance with these by-laws,

commits an offence.

Repeal

24. The *Armadale-Kelmscott District Memorial Hospital (Traffic and Grounds) By-laws** are repealed.

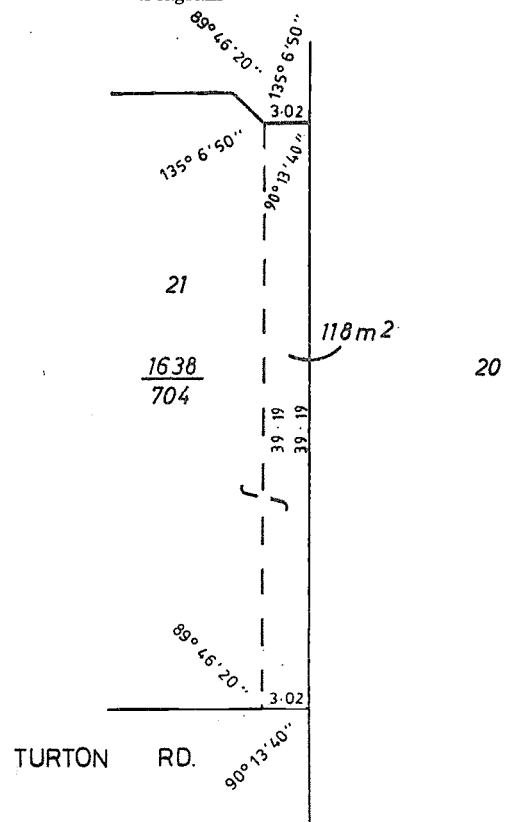

MADE by the Minister for Education.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Education Amendment Regulations (No. 6) 1987*.

Principal regulations

2. In these regulations the *Education Act Regulations 1960** are referred to as the principal regulations.

For amendments to 15 September 1987 see page 211 of 1986 Index to Legislation of Western Australia and the Gazettes of 24 January 1986, 24 April 1986, 2 May 1986, 4 July 1986, 5 September 1986, 14 November 1986, 23 January 1987, 27 March 1987 and 24 July 1987.]

Regulation 19 repealed and substituted

3. Regulation 19 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—

“ 19. Where the principal of a school is of the opinion that—

(a) the kind of clothes worn by a student; or

(b) the length of hair of, or, the hair style adopted by, a student,

constitutes a hazard to the student or to the other members of school community the principal may exclude the student from the school or from any particular school activity as the case requires. ”

Regulation 59 amended

4. Regulation 59 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) by inserting after the regulation designation “59.” the subregulation designation (1);

(b) in paragraph (a) by deleting “his physical fitness” and substituting the following—

“ his physical ability to perform the duties of a teacher without risk to himself or the students ”;

(c) by deleting paragraph (c);

(d) by inserting the following subregulation—

“ (2) The Director General may refuse to recommend a person for permanent appointment to the teaching staff if that person does not undertake to accept employment in any part of the State. ”

Regulation 85A repealed and substituted

5. Regulation 85A of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—

“ 85A. (1) Where following application from a teacher the Director General is of the opinion that by reason of special circumstances connected with the family of the teacher, a teacher is unable to—

(a) accept a transfer to another position; or

(b) continue in the position held by the teacher,

the Director General may approve of the teacher taking leave without pay for such period not exceeding 12 months as is approved by the Director General.

(2) Where a teacher having taken leave without pay for the period approved by the Director General, does not accept the position in which the Director General requires the teacher to be employed, the teacher's employment is deemed to be terminated on the date of the expiration of the period of leave without pay. ”

Regulation 98 amended

6. Regulation 98 of the principal regulations is amended in subregulation (1) by deleting paragraph (c).

Regulation 106 amended

7. Regulation 106 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) in subregulation (1), by deleting “A married teacher” and substituting the following—

“ Subject to the approval of the Director General, a teacher ”; and

(b) in subregulation (2)—

(i) by deleting “Where a married teacher” and substituting the following—

“ Where, a teacher ”; and

(ii) by deleting “so”.

Regulation 167 amended

8. (1) Regulation 167 of the principal regulations is amended in subregulation (1) by inserting after "(female)" in paragraph (d) the following—

“ and one deputy principal (male) ”.
