FOOD HYGIENE AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Food Hygiene Amendment Regulations 1988.

Regulation 6 amended

2. Regulation 6 of the Food Hygiene Regulations 1973* is amended-

- (a) by inserting after the regulation designation "6." the following designation—
 "(1)";
- (b) by deleting paragraph (a) and substituting the following paragraph-
- " (a) ceilings or internal roofs that comply with subregulation (2); "; and
- (c) by inserting the following subregulation—
 " (2) Each room on food handling premises whether of solid impervious or lightweight construction shall have a smooth impervious ceiling other than—
 - (a) dining rooms, where the ceiling shall be—
 - (i) smooth and impervious; or
 - (ii) of approved materials; and
 - (b) rooms, or parts of rooms, where only pre-packaged food or fresh fruit or vegetables which are adequately protected from contamination are stored or exposed for sale, which shall have—
 - (i) if the interior of the roof is light in colour, no ceiling;
 - (ii) a smooth impervious ceiling; or
 - (iii) a ceiling of approved materials. ".

3. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted— = 5 - (1) Uplace otherwise provided by this regulation the fee referred to in castion 174

5. (1) Unless otherwise provided by this regulation, the fee referred to in section 174 of the Act for the examination of the plans, block plan and specifications or descriptions relating to a public building and accompanying a notice given under that section shall be calculated in accordance with the Table to this regulation and the minimum fee for any examination is \$70.

(2) The Executive Director, Public Health, shall decide for the purpose of this regulation if a structural engineer is to examine any plans, block plans, specifications or descriptions.

(3) Where a notice given under section 174 of the Act relates to a public building used or to be used—

- (a) by a charitable or benevolent organization, or as a place of worship the fee for the examination of the documents accompanying the notice is a half of the fee that would otherwise be charged under subregulation (1) and the minimum fee for the examination is \$35; or
- (b) by a local authority, no fee is payable under this regulation.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960

Municipality of the City of Nedlands

By-laws Relating to Eating Areas in Streets and other Public Areas

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Local Government Act 1960 and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of Nedlands hereby records having resolved on 6 August 1987, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

Interpretation

1. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires—

"Act" means the Local Government Act 1960.

"By-law" means a by-law of these by-laws.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Nedlands.

"eating area" has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of section 244AA of the Act.

"eating house" has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of the Health Act 1911. "Health Act" means the Health Act 1911 as amended and includes the Food Hygiene Regulations 1973 as amended made pursuant to the provisions of the Health Act.

"Licence" means a licence issued by the Council under these by-laws to set up and conduct an eating area.

"Licence plan" means a plan attached to and forming part of a licence depicting those areas of a street or public place within which an eating area may be set up and conducted.

"proprietor"-

- (a) has the same meaning given to it in and for the purposes of Division 3 of Part V of the Health Act 1911 where the premises in question are registered as an eating house under that Act; or
- (b) means the holder of a licence granted under the Liquor Act 1970 where the premises in question are the subject of an hotel licence, a limited hotel licence or a restaurant licence granted under that Act.

"public facility" means any structure, item or fitting whether in a street or public place that is the property of or has been provided by a Government Department, instru-mentality of the Crown or the Council.

"Schedule" means a Schedule to these by-laws.

Application of by-laws

2. These by-laws do not apply to any eating area set up or conducted on a place which is on private properly notwithstanding that the public are allowed to use that place.

Prohibitions

- 3. No person shall set up or conduct an eating area in a street or public place—
 - (a) other than in a portion of a street or public place adjoining an eating house;
 - (b) unless the person is the proprietor of the eating house referred to in sub-bylaw (a) of this by-law;
 - (c) unless the person is the holder of a valid and current licence issued pursuant to these by-laws; and
 - (d) otherwise than in accordance with the licence plan and any conditions on the licence.

Application for licence

4. A proprietor of an eating house seeking the issue of a licence shall make application in the form prescribed in Schedule 1 and shall forward the application to the Council together with—

- (a) the fee and the charge prescribed in Schedule 3;
- (b) a plan and specification of the proposed eating area on a scale of 1:50 showing-
 - (i) the location and dimensions of the proposed eating area and the means by which the eating areas is to be separated from the balance of the street or public place;
 - (ii) the position of all tables, chairs and other structures proposed to be provided in the eating area and which of such items, if any, are to be retained within the eating area at all times;
- (c) a plan and specification on a scale of 1:200 showing the eating area and all land and improvements thereon within 30 metres of the boundaries of the eating area including any public facility and parking restrictions;
- (d) a colour photograph or photographs of the tables, chairs and other structures to be set up in the eating area;
- (e) a written statement of the manner in which foodstuffs and other dining accessories are to be conveyed to and protected from contamination within the eating area;
- (f) written particulars of arrangements made in respect of public liability insurance of not less than one million dollars (\$1 000 000); and
- (g) any other information that the Council considers necessary in the circumstances of the case.

Council Consideration of an Application

5. The Council shall not be obliged to consider an application for a licence which is incomplete in relation to the requirements of By-law 4.

6. The Council may in respect of an application-

- (a) refuse the application; or
- (b) approve the application on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit.

7. Where the Council approves of an application it shall issue a licence in the form of Schedule 2, such licence expiring on 31 December next, and shall cause to be attached to the licence a plan which shall form part of the licence.

Renewal or Transfer of Licence

- 8.1 A proprietor who is the person named in a licence may—
 - (a) in writing apply to the Council by 1 December in each year for the renewal of the licence and shall submit with the application for renewal the fee and the charge prescribed in Schedule 3;
 - (b) at any time seek the Council's consent to alter any of the conditions of the licence and such application shall be treated as though it were an application for a licence to the extent of the alteration;
 - (c) for the purpose of a function or event, seek in writing a minimum of fourteen (14) days beforehand, the Council's consent to the operation of the eating area on a day or time not permitted by the licence.

8.2 An application pursuant to By-law 8.1 (c) shall-

- (a) be in writing;
- (b) state the nature of the function or event concerned and the additional day and time sought; and
- (c) be accompanied by the fee prescribed in Schedule 3.

8.3 Where it is proposed that the proprietor named in a licence be replaced by another person (such other person being herein referred to as "the proposed licensee") the proprietor and the proposed licensee shall, prior to the date proposed for the replacement, make application in writing to the Council for the licence to be transferred to the proposed licensee and shall submit the licence to be transferred together with the written application to the Council and the Council may in its discretion on payment of the fee prescribed in Schedule 3 transfer the licence by endorsement upon the licence and by the issue of consent in the form of Schedule 4.

8.4 Where the Council approves of the transfer of a licence for the remaining period of the licence it shall not be obliged to refund any part of the fee or charge paid by the former licensee.

Obligations of Proprietor

- 9. A proprietor who is the person named in a licence-
 - (a) shall ensure that the eating area is conducted at all times in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws;
 - (b) shall ensure that the eating area is kept in a clean and tidy condition at all times;
 - (c) shall maintain the chairs, tables and other structures set up in the eating area in good and serviceable condition at all times;

- (d) shall be solely responsible for all and any costs associated with the removal, alteration, repair, reinstatement or reconstruction of the street, carriageway or footpath or any part thereof arising from the conduct of the eating area or persons therein. The Council may recoup from the proprietor such cost in a court of competent jurisdiction;
- (e) shall be solely responsible for all rates and taxes levied upon the land occupied by the eating area;
- (f) shall display the licence in a conspicuous place in the adjoining eating house and whenever requested by a Health Surveyor to do so shall produce to him the licence.

Offences and Penalties

10. A person who commits a breach of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a maximum penalty of—

- (a) \$1 000 in the case of a breach of By-law 3 (c); or
- (b) \$500 in the case of a breach of any other by-law, and in addition in either case to a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$50 per day.

11. The Council may cancel a licence where the proprietor has been convicted of an offence against these by-laws, the Health Act or any other law relating to the setting up or conducting of eating areas or has transferred or assigned or attempted to transfer or assign the licence without the consent of the Council and shall not be obliged to refund any part of the fee or charge to the proprietor.

Delegation

12. The Council may, pursuant to section 157A of the Act, delegate to a specified officer the powers coferred on it by these by-laws.

DOG ACT 1976

The Municipality of the City of Gosnells

By-laws Relating to Dogs

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Dog Act 1976 and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Municipality of the City of Gosnells hereby records having resolved on 24 November 1987 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

The by-laws of the City of Gosnells Relating to Dogs published in the *Government Gazette* on 26 June 1981 are hereby amended as follows—

1. The definition of "Approved kennel establishment" in By-law 9 is deleted and replaced with the following definition—

"Approved kennel establishment shall mean the kennel or kennels and yards appurtenant thereto for which a licence has been issued pursuant to the provisions of By-Law 11."

2. The following new Part is added before By-law 8-

"Part 1A—Keeping of Dogs"

3. By-law 11 is deleted in full and replaced with the following-

"11. Subject to the provisions of the Dog Act the Council may grant or refuse an approved kennel establishment licence and if granting an approved kennel establishment licence shall forthwith make available to the applicant an approved kennel establishment licence in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto."

4. By-law 18 is deleted in full and replaced with the following-

"18. The land specified in the Fourth Schedule to these by-laws is hereby designated as dog exercise areas for the purposes of the Dog Act 1976 as amended. The exercising of dogs in the dog exercise areas shall be subject to the provisions of the Dog Act 1976 as amended."

5. After By-Law 18 the following is added-

"18A A person who permits a dog, the control for which he is liable, to excrete on any street or public place or on any land within the district of the City of Gosnells without the consent of the occupier commits an offence unless the excreta is removed forthwith and disposed of either on private land with the occupier's consent or in such other manner as the Council may approve.

18B (1) The offences described in column 3 of the Fifth Schedule are prescribed pursuant to the respective by-laws as offences in relation to which modified penalties apply and the amount appearing in column 4 of the Schedule directly opposite an offence is a modified penalty payable in respect of that offence if dealt with pursuant to this by-law.

(2) Infringement notices issued under this by-law shall be in the form prescribed in Form 1 of the Sixth Schedule.

(3) Withdrawal of infringement notices issued under this by-law shall be in the form prescribed in Form 2 of the Sixth Schedule."

6. By-law 19 is amended by deleting "ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00)" and adding in lieu thereof "\$200."

The City of Gosnells

By-laws Relating to Pest Plants

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Acts and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 24 November 1987, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

1. These by-laws may be cited as the City of Gosnells Pest Plant By-laws.

2. In these by-laws, unless the contrary intention appears—"Council" means Council of the Municipality of City of Gosnells; "district" means the district of the Council; "pest plant" means a plant described as a pest plant by By-law 4 of these by-laws.

3. These by-laws apply in respect of the district.

4. Every plant described in the First Schedule to these by-laws is a pest plant.

5. (1) The Council may serve on the owner or occupier of private land within the district, a duly completed notice in the form of the Second Schedule to these by-laws requiring him to destroy, eradicate or otherwise control any pest plant on that land.

(2) A person served with a notice under sub-bylaw (1) of this by-law shall comply with that notice within the time and in the manner specified therein.

6. Where a person fails to comply with a notice under By-law 5 of these by-laws served upon him, the Council may—

- (a) without payment of any compensation in respect thereof, destroy, eradicate or control, as the case may be any pest plant the destruction, eradication or control of which was required by the notice; and
- (b) recover in a court of competent jurisdiction from the person to whom the notice is directed, the amount of the expense of such destruction, eradication or control.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960
The Municipality of the City of Wanneroo
By-laws Relating to Swimming Pools
IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and all other power
enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolve on 23 September 1987 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By
laws.
1. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires—
"Council" means the Council of the City of Wanneroo;

- "Attendant" means an officer or employee of the Council duly authorised to perform duties in connection with a pool premises;
- "Manager" means the person for the time being employed by the Council to manage a pool premises and includes his assistant or deputy;
- "Pool premises and includes its assistant of deputy, "Pool premises" means and includes each of the swimming pools for the time being under the control and management of the Council and all buildings, fences, gardens, car parks, structures, fittings, fixtures, machinery, chattels, furniture and equipment forming part of the swimming pool or used in connection therewith;

"Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk of the City of Wanneroo.

2. The pool premises shall be open for admission to the public during the hours and days the Council from time to time determines.

3. The pool premises or any part thereof may at any time at the discretion of the Manager be set aside for the use of certain persons to the exclusion of others.

4. The Manager or Attendant may refuse any person admission to the pool premises or part thereof at any time and children under the age of six (6) years shall be refused admission unless accompanied by a responsible person over the age of fourteen (14) years.

5. Every person using the pool premises shall obey all reasonable directions of the Manager or Attendant with regard to such use.

6. The Manager or Attendant may temporarily suspend admission to, or remove from the pool premises or any part thereof, all or any person or persons, if in his opinion, such action is necessary or desirable.

7. If a person shall appear in public and in the opinion of the Manager or Attendant, be indecently or insufficiently clad, the Manager or Attendant shall direct that person forthwith to resume adequate bathing attire and such person shall forthwith comply with that direction.

8. (a) It shall be the duty of the Manager or Attendant, who is hereby so empowered to refuse admission to or remove, or cause to be removed from the pool premises any person who, in the opinion of the Manager or Attendant—

 (i) is a child under the age of six (6) years and is unaccompanied by a responsible person over the age of fourteen (14) years;

(ii) is committing a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws;

(iii) is by his past, or present conduct within or about the pool premises undesirable;

(iv) is under, or apparently under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs;

(v) is apparently suffering from a contagious, infectious or cutaneous disease or skin complaint.

(b) Any such person shall upon the request of the Manager or Attendant to withdraw from the pool premises, quietly peaceably, do so immediately.

9. (a) Any person who has been refused admission to the pool premises or has been directed to leave the pool premises and who feels aggrieved by the action of the Manager or Attendant, may appeal to the Council by letter addressed to the Town Clerk, against such action.

(b) The Council shall consider the objection and give such direction in the matter as it thinks fit.

(c) The right of appeal given by this by-law shall not imply any right of action for damages or other remedy against the Council or Pool Manager or an Attendant arising out of such refusal of admission or direction to leave the pool premises.

10. A person shall not for profit teach, coach or train any person in the pool premises unless with the prior written consent of the Council, subject to such conditions as it thinks fit and may at any time withdraw such consent.

11. (a) A person, club, organisation or association shall not conduct controlled swimming or diving events, carnivals or competitions without the prior consent of the Manager.

(b) The Manager may grant his consent subject to any conditions he thinks fit and may, at any time, withdraw that consent.

(c) A person, club, organisation or association conducting a carnival or event at the pool premises shall be responsible for the conduct of the competitors and spectators during the carnival or event and shall prevent overcrowding and ensure that no damage is done to the buildings or fencing or any other portion of the pool premises and that these by-laws are observed by all competitors, officials and spectators attending the carnival or event.

(d) Council may from time to time and for such periods and reasons as it determines close the Aquatic Centre provided a minimum of twenty-eight (28) days notice is given.

12. (a) Every person finding within the pool premises an article which may have been left or lost therein shall immediately deliver it to the Manager or Attendant who shall thereupon register a description of the article and all particulars relating thereto in a book to be kept for that purpose.

(b) A person claiming the article who satisfies the Manager or Attendant that he is the lawful owner of the article and on payment of the fee and upon such delivery such person shall by way of acknowledging receipt of the said article sign his name and his address in the lost property register.

(c) In the interpretation of this by-law the word "article" shall include money.

(d) All articles left in the pool premises and not claimed within a period of three (3) calendar months shall be disposed of by the Council in any manner acceptable at common law.

13. No person shall—

- (a) Enter any portion of the aquatic centre premises set apart exclusively for the opposite sex except a person under the age of six (6) years.
- (b) Without the consent of the occupier, enter or attempt to enter any dressing or other compartment which is already occupied.
- (c) In any way interfere with any other person in or upon the pool premises or with any other person's use thereof, not throw or push, or attempt to throw any stones, sticks or any other matter or thing to the annoyance of any person using the pool premises.
- (d) Play any ball games or take any action whatsoever which shall in any way limit the enjoyment of the users of the pool premises, provided that nothing therein contained shall apply to the playing of any games or aquatic sports organised and conducted on the pool centre premises by any club, organisation or association or other person at such time and in such manner as shall be approved by the Manager.
- (e) Permit an animal of which he is liable for the control to enter or remain in or about the pool premises with the exception of a registered guide dog.
- (f) Enter the pool premises without having first paid to the Manager or Attendant, the proper charge for admission unless that person is an invitee, officer or employee of the Council in the course of his duties.
- (g) Obstruct the Manager, Attendant or any other authorised person in the course of his duties.

- (h) Enter or exit from any part of the pool premises except by means of the entrances or exits set apart for that purpose.
- (i) Undress or remove any part of his bathing costume except in a dressing room enclosure provided for that purpose.
- (j) Appear in public unless properly attired in a costume of such nature as to preserve public decency and to cover the body so as to prevent indecent exposure of the person.
- (k) Enter or be in the pool premises while in the intoxicated condition induced by alcohol or drugs.
- (l) Take into the pool premises, or have in his possession therein, any intoxicating liquor without the prior approval of the Town Clerk.
- (m) Take into the pool premises or have in his possession therein any drugs.
- (n) Use any soap or shampoo in any part of the pool premises other than in the dressing room or shower recess.
- (o) Climb up or upon any roof, fence, wall or partition on the pool premises.
- (p) In any part of the pool premises behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly, riotous manner or use indecent obscene, offensive or abusive language or gamble illegally or misconduct himself.
- (q) Bring onto or deposit in any part of the pool premises any filth or rubbish except in receptacles set aside for that purpose.
- (r) Smoke, consume foodstuffs or drinks in any specific area in which smoking or consumption is prohibited.
- (s) Wastefully use the water or leave any taps flowing in the dressing rooms or elsewhere in the pool premises.
- (t) Expectorate in the pool or on any part of the pool premises or in any way commit any nuisance on or in any part of such premises.
- (u) Use any substance or preparation whereby the water of the swimming pools or spa become discoloured or rendered turbid or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers.
- (v) Foul or pollute water in any shower, or in the swimming pools or spa, or soil, damage, injure, destroy, use improperly, disfigure or write in or upon any dressing room, cubicle or compartment, or any part of the pool premises or any furniture or other article or equipment therein.
- (w) Damage, break, injure, improperly use, interfere with or destroy any fitting, appliance, equipment or any other property of the Council in or about the pool premises.
- (x) Whilst suffering from a contagious, infectious or cutaneous disease or whilst in an unclean condition enter or use or attempt to enter or use the swimming pool or spa or pool premises.
- (y) Soil or defile or damage any towel or bathing costume.

14. Every person shall when leaving the pool premises, if requested to do so, produce his or her bathing costume or towel for inspection by the Manager or Attendant.

15. No ticket, token, licence, membership card or receipt issued as provided by these bylaws shall be transferabale and a person other than the person to whom it was originally issued shall not enjoy the benefit therefrom or any privileges thereunder.

16. Neither the Council nor the Manager or Attendant or other officer or employee of the Council shall in any way be responsible for any articles or money lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the pool premises or for any articles damaged or destroyed whilst in or about the pool premises.

17. Any person who commits a breach of these By-laws is liable on conviction to-

- (a) A maximum penalty of \$500.
- (b) A maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20 per day.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960

Municipality of the Shire of Beverley

By-law Relating to Trading in Public Places

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality records having resolved on 27 May 1987 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law relating to trading in public places within the Townsite of Beverley.

1. In this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires-

- "public places" includes a street, way, and place which the public are allowed to use, whether the street, way or place is or is not on private property;
- "trading" means selling or hiring of goods, wares, merchandise or services, for sale or hire, in a street or other public place and includes displaying goods, wares or merchandise for the purpose of offering them for sale or hire, inviting offers for sale or hire, soliciting orders or carrying out other transaction therein, but does not include the setting up of a stall, or the conducting of business at a stall, under the authority of a licence issued under by-laws made under section 242 of the Act.

"Community Association" means a institution, association, club, society or body, whether incorporated or not, the objects of which are of a charitable, benevolent, religious, cultural, educational, recreational, sporting or other like nature and the members of which are not entitled or permitted to receive any precuniary profit from the transactions thereof.

- 2. This by-law shall not apply to-
 - (a) the selling or offering for sale of newspapers or magazines;
 - the selling or offering for sale of vegetable produce from a stall on the property on (b) which that produce is grown;
 - (c) any Community Association.

3. No person shall carry on trading in any public place unless that person is acting within the specifications of a current licence issued under this by-law and for which all fees and charges have been paid.

4. An application for a licence shall be in writing and shall contain such information as the Council may require.

5. In consideration of an application for a licence the Council shall have regard for any relevant policy statements, and for the desirability of the proposed activity and its location and for the circumstances of the case, and may refuse to issue a licence, in which case it shall provide the applicant with reason in writing.

6. The Council may issue a licence specifying such requirements, terms and conditions as the Council sees fit, including—

(a) the place to which the licence applies;

- (b) the days and hours when trading may be carried on;
- (c) the number, type, form and construction, as the case may be, of any stand, table, structure or vehicle which may be used for trading;
- (d) the particulars of the goods or services or transaction in respect of which trading may be carried on;
- (e) the number of persons and the names of persons permitted to carry on trading, and any requirements concerning personal attendance at the place of trading and the nomination of assistants, nominees or substitutes;
- (f) whether and under what terms the licence is transferable;
- (g) any prohibitions or restrictions concerning the causing of any nuisance, the use of signs, the making of noise and the use of amplifiers, sound equipment, sound instruments and lighting apparatus;
- (h) any requirements concerning the display of the licence holders name and other details of the licence, the care, maintenance and cleansing of the place of trading and vacating of the place when trading is not taking place;
- (i) any requirements regarding the acquisition by the licence holder of public risk insurance;
- (j) the period, not exceeding 12 months, during which the licence is valid;

 $7. \$ The amount of the charges and fees shall be calculated and payable in accordance with the Schedule hereto.

8. The Council may at any time revoke a licence.

9. Where a licence is revoked the Council shall, if requested, provide the licence holder with reasons in writing and shall refund the charges having first deducted the charge applicable to the period from the issuing of the licence to its revocation.

10. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of the by-law commits an offence and is liable to conviction to a penalty for each offence of not more than \$1 000 or six months imprisonment.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960

Municipality of the Shire of Mount Magnet

By-law Relating to Trading in Public Places

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 16 March 1987, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law relating to trading in public places within the Townsite of Mount Magnet.

1. Interpretation: In this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires-

"Council" means the Municipality of the Shire of Mount Magnet.

"Public Place" includes a street, way and other place which the public are allowed to use, whether the street, way or place is or is not on private property.

"Trading" means selling/or hiring of goods, wares, merchandise or services, or offering goods, wares, merchandise or services for sale or hire, in a street or other public place and includes displaying goods, wares or merchandise for the purpose of offering them for sale or hire, inviting offers for sale or hire, soliciting orders or carrying out any other transactions therein, but does not include the setting up of a stall, or the conducting of business at a stall, under the authority of a licence issued under by-laws made under section 242. "Community Association" means an institution, association, club, society or body, whether incororated or not, the objects of which are of a charitable, benevolent, religious, cultural, educational, recreational, sporting or other like nature and the members of which are not entitled or permitted to receive any pecuniary profit from the transaction thereof.

2. This by-law shall not apply to the selling or offering for sale of newspapers or magazines, nor shall it apply to community associations.

3. No person shall carry on trading in any public place unless that person is acting within the specifications of a current licence issued under this by-law and for which all fees and charges have been paid.

4. An application for a licence shall be in writing and shall contain such information as the Council may require.

5. In considering an application for a licence the Council shall have regard for any relevant policy statements, and for the desirability of the proposed activity and its location and for the circumstances of the case, and may refuse to issue a licence, in which case it shall provide the applicant with reasons in writing.

6. The Council may issue a licence specifying such requirements, terms and conditions as the Council sees fit, including—

- (a) the place to which the licence applies;
- (b) the days and hours when trading may be carried on;
- (c) the number, type, form and construction, as the case may be, of any stand, table, structure or vehicle which may be used for trading;
- (d) the particulars of the goods or services or transaction in respect of which trading may be carried on;
- (e) the number of persons and the names of persons permitted to carry on trading, and any requirements concerning personal attendance at the place of trading and the nomination of assistants, nominees or substitutes;
- (f) whether and under what terms the licence is transferrable;
- (g) any prohibitions or restrictions concerning the causing of any nuisance, the use of signs, the making of noise and the use of amplifiers, sound equipment, sound instruments, and lighting apparatus;
- (h) any requirements concerning the display of the licence holder's name and other details of licence, the care, maintenance and cleansing of the place of trading or the vacating of the place when trading is not taking place;
- (i) any requirements regarding the acquisition by the licence holder of public risk insurance;
- (j) the period not exceeding 12 months during which the licence is valid.

7. The amount of the charges and fees shall be calculated and payable in accordance with the Schedule hereto.

8. The Council may revoke a licence in the event that the licence holder breaches any provision of this by-law or fails to comply with any requirement, term or condition of the licence.

9. Where a licence is revoked the Council shall if requested, provide the licence holder with reasons in writing and shall refund the charge having first deducted the charge applicable to the period from the issuing of the licence to its revocation.

10. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of the by-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty for up to 1000 or imprisonment for six (6) months.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960

Municipality of the Shire of Swan

By-laws Relating to Eating Areas in Public Places

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 25 May 1987 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

1. Interpretations.

2. In this by-law unless the context otherwise requires-

"Act" means the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended).

"Council" means the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Swan.

"eating area" has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of section 244AA of the Act.

"eating house" means premises which are either—

- (a) registered as an eating house under the Health Act 1911; or
- (b) the subject of an Hotel Licence, a Limited Hotel Licence or a Restaurant Licence granted under the Liquor Act 1970.

"Health Act" means the Health Act 1911 as amended and includes the Food Hygiene Regulations 1973 as amended made pursuant to the provisions of the Health Act.

"licence" means a licence issued by the Council under these By-laws to set up and conduct an eating area.

"licence plan" means a plan attached to and forming part of a licence depicting those parts of a street or public place in which an eating area may be set up or conducted by authority of a licence.

"proprietor"

- (a) has the same meaning given to it in and for the purposes of Division 3 of Part V of the Health Act 1911 where the premises in question are registered as an eating house under that Act; or
- (b) means the holder of a licence granted under the Liquor Act 1970 where the premises in question are the subject of an Hotel Licence, a Limited Hotel Licence or Restaurant Licence granted under that Act.

"public facility"

(a) means any structure, item, fitting or work, whether in a street or public place that is the property of or has been provided by a Government Department, instrumentality of the Crown or the Council and includes, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, any light, power or telephone pole, fire hydrant, drain, sump, tree, sign, traffic light, parking device or meter, shelter, seat, telephone box, letter boxes and public toilet.

"Schedule" means a schedule to these by-laws.

Application of by-laws

3. These by-laws do not apply to an eating area set up or conducted on a place which is on private property notwithstanding that the public are allowed to use that place.

Prohibitions

- No person shall set up or conduct an eating area in a street or public place---
 - (a) other than in a portion of the street or public place adjoining an eating house; (b)
 - unless the person is the proprietor of the eating house referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause and is licenced in accordance with Division 3 of Part V of the Health Act;
 - unless the person is the holder of a valid and current licence issued pursuant to these (c) by-laws: and
 - (d) otherwise than in accordance with the licence plan and any conditions on the licence.

Application for Licence

5. A proprietor of an eating house seeking the issue of a licence shall make application to the Council in the form prescribed in the First Schedule hereto and shall forward the application to the Council together with-

- (a) the application fee prescribed in the Second Schedule.
- (b) three copies of a plan and specification of the proposed eating area at a scale of 1:50 showing
 - (i) the location and dimensions of the proposed eating area and the means, if any, by which the eating area is to be separated from the balance of the street or public place;
 - (ii) the position of all tables, chairs and other structures proposed to be provided in the eating area and which of such items, if any, are to be retained within the eating area at all times;
- (c) three copies of a plan and specification at a scale of 1:200 showing the eating area and all land and improvements thereon within 30 metres of the boundaries of the eating area including any public facility and parking restrictions;
- a colour photograph or photographs of the tables, chairs and other structures to be set up in the eating area;
- any other information that the Council considers necessary in the circumstances of (e) the case.

Council Considerations of an Application

6. The Council shall not be obliged to consider an application for a licence which is incomplete in relation to the requirements of Clause 5 of these by-laws.

- 7. The Council may in Respect of an Application-
 - (a) refuse the application; or
 - (b) approve the application on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit.
- 8. When the Council Approves an Application-
 - (a) it shall issue a licence in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, such licence expiring on the 30th day of June next, and shall cause to be attached to the licence a licence plan which shall form part of the licence; and
 - (b) prior to issue of the licence the proprietor is liable to pay a charge equal to \$5 per annum per square metre of the area of the eating area
 - (c) except in the case of a Transfer under Part 9 of these By-laws, where a licence is to be issued on or after the 1st day of August in any year, the charge specified in paragraph (b) of this clause shall be reduced by the following formula-(12-number of full months since 1 July)

-number of full months since 1 July)	37	charge specified

Renewal or Amplification of Licence

9. A proprietor who is the person named in a licence may-

- (a) in writing apply to the Council by 1 June in each next year for the renewal of the licence and shall submit with the application for renewal the fee prescribed in the Second Schedule.
- (b) at any time seek Council's consent to alter any of the conditions of the licence and such application shall be treated as though it were an application for a licence to the extent of the alteration;
- in the event of impending change of proprietorship of the adjoining eating house, apply to the Council's consent to transfer the licence to the incoming proprietor. (c)

10. Where the Council approves of the transfer of a licence, it shall cause to be issued to the incoming proprietor a supplementary licence in the form of the Third Schedule for the period remaining of the licence and is not obliged to refund any part of the fee or charge paid by the former proprietor.

Obligations of Proprietor

11. A proprietor who is the person named in a licence-

- (a) shall ensure that the eating area is conducted at all times in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws;
- (b) shall ensure that the eating area is kept in clean and tidy condition at all times;
- (c) shall be solely responsible for all and any costs associated with the removal, alteration, repair, reinstatement or reconstruction of the eating area or any part thereof arising from the carrying out or proposed carrying out of any works in the street by or on behalf of a Government Department, instrumentality of the Crown or the Council and does not have any claim for compensation or damages on account of any disruption of business or loss suffered on account of any such works;
- (d) shall be solely responsible for all and any costs associated with the removal, alteration, repair, reinstatement or reconstruction of the street, carriageway or footpath or any part thereof arising from the conduct of the eating area or persons therein. The Council may recoup from the proprietor such costs in a court of competent jurisdiction;

- (e) shall be solely responsible for all rates and taxes levied upon the land occupied by the eating area;
- (f) shall effect public liability insurance of not less than \$2 000 000 relating to the eating area.

Offences and Penalties

12. A person who commits a breach of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a maximum penalty of—

- (a) \$1 000 in the case of a breach of By-law 4(c); or
- (b) \$500 in the case of a breach of any other by-law; and
- (c) in addition in either case to a maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$50 per day.

13. The Council may cancel a licence where the proprietor has been convicted of an offence against these by-laws, the Health Act or any other law relating to the setting up or conducting of eating areas or has transferred or assigned or attempted to transfer or assign the licence without the consent of the Council and shall not be obliged to refund any part of the fee or charge to the proprietor.

Delegation

14. The Council may, pursuant to section 157A of the Act, delegate to a specified officer the powers conferred on it by these by-laws.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIFORM GENERAL (PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS) BY-LAWS 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Local Government Uniform General (Parking for Disabled Persons) By-laws 1988.

Interpretation

2. In these by-laws unless the contrary intention appears-

- "ACROD sticker" means a current parking sticker issued by ACROD Limited (Western Australian Division) a corporation, being a company limited by guarantee incorporated under the *Companies Ordinance 1962* of the Australian Capital Territory;
- "international symbol for access for the disabled" means the symbol described in Australian Standard 1428;
- "parking bay" means a portion of a road or parking facility set aside for use by a disabled person and identified in accordance with By-law 4;

"vehicle of a disabled person" means a vehicle-

(a) in which a disabled person is either the driver or a passenger; and

(b) which is identified in accordance with By-law 5.

Parking for disabled persons

3. A person shall not stand or park a vehicle, other than a vehicle referred to in By-law 5, on any land which has been set aside within a parking region as a parking bay for use of a disabled person.

Penalty: \$80.

Specified manner of identification of land

4. The land on which a parking bay has been set as ide shall be identified, for the purposes of By-law 3, by —

- (a) the words "Disabled Parking Only" clearly written on the ground within the limits of the parking bay; and
- (b) an elevated sign, so located as to identify the parking bay to which it relates, on which there appears the international symbol for access for the disabled.

Specified manner of identification of vehicle

5. The vehicle of a disabled person shall be identified, for the purposes of By-law 3, by displaying a current ACROD sticker, which shall be displayed in a prominent position, in such a manner as to be clearly visible from the front of the vehicle.

Unauthorized parking bays prohibited

6. A person shall not identify or purport to identify a parking bay in accordance with Bylaw 4 without the written authority of the Council.

Unauthorized use of ACROD sticker prohibited

7. A person, other than a disabled person, shall not identify or purport to identify a vehicle in accordance with By-law 5.

Penalty: \$80.

Form of notice under section 669C

8. A notice requiring the owner of a vehicle to identify the driver for the purposes of section 669C of the Act shall be in the form of Form 1 of Schedule 2.

Modified penalty

9. For the purposes of section 669D (1) of the Act the amount specified in Column 2 of Schedule 1 is the modified penalty for the offence committed against the corresponding by-law specified in Column 1 of that Schedule.

Form of notice under section 669D(1)

10. For the purposes of section 669D (1) of the Act an infringement notice shall be in the form of Form 2 of Schedule 2.

Form of infringement notice under section 669D (2)

11. An infringement notice under section 669D (2) of the Act shall be in the form of Form 3 of Schedule 2.

Form of notice under section 669D (5)

12. A notice under section 669D (5) of the Act, that an infringement notice has been withdrawn, shall be in the form of Form 4 of Schedule 2.

MINES REGULATION ACT 1946

MINES REGULATION (EXEMPTION) ORDER 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under section 5 (2). Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the *Mines Regulation (Exemption) Order 1988.* **Exemption**

2. The Cadjebut Mine in the West Kimberley Goldfield is hereby exempted from the provisions of sections 38 (1) (b), 39 (1), 42 and 45 (1) of the Mines Regulation Act 1946 for a period ending 1 January 1990 on condition that—

- (a) a person shall not be employed to work underground for more than 12 hours in any day except as provided for under section 39 (3);
- (b) a person shall not be employed to work underground for more than eight shifts or parts of shifts in any 14 day period;
- (c) each person required to work underground shall take a mid-shift crib-break of not less than 30 minutes duration on surface and the duration of that break shall not include the time necessary for travelling between the underground work-place and the surface eating place;
- (d) biological monitoring for lead levels in the blood of each person who is or may be required to work underground shall be undertaken at regular intervals not exceeding six months and the results of the monitoring shall be reported in writing by the registered manager to the district inspector of mines;
- (e) the blood lead level of each person who is or may be required to work underground shall be measured, recorded and reported in writing by the registered manager to the district inspector of mines, prior to that person commencing work at the mine site;

- a code of practice on industrial hygiene with reference to lead in the working environ-ment is submitted for approval to the Ventilation Board established under section (f) 23C within three months of the date of this order coming into force and that Code of Practice shall include but not to be limited to the measures which will be taken to ensure the education of the workforce in the toxicity of lead and its methods of absorption;
- the code of practice on industrial hygiene with reference to lead in the working environment after approval by the Ventilation Board is implemented and enforced by (g) the registered manager of the mine;
- (h) the ventilation of the underground workings of the mine are maintained generally in accordance with the document entitled "Cadjebut Mine Ventilation Design—October 1987" submitted to the regional mining engineer by the registered manager of the mine on 9 November 1987;
- the air in every part of the underground workings of the mine where persons are working shall be maintained so as not to exceed any of the following wet bulb or dry (i) bulb temperatures-

45.5°C dry bulb

45.0°C dry bulb and 28.0°C wet bulb

- $44.0\,^\circ\mathrm{C}$ dry bulb and $28.5\,^\circ\mathrm{C}$ wet bulb
- 42.0°C dry bulb and 29.0°C wet bulb
- $41.5\,^\circ\mathrm{C}$ dry bulb and $29.5\,^\circ\mathrm{C}$ wet bulb
- 40.5°C dry bulb and 30.0°C wet bulb
- 30.0°C wet bulb:
- in all parts of the underground workings of the mine where the dry bulb temperature (i) exceeds or is likely to exceed 40°C or the wet bulb temperature exceeds or is likely to exceed 28.3°C, the ventilation officer shall make a daily determination of the wet bulb and dry bulb temperatures using a whirling hygrometer equipped with thermometers which comply with the requirements of British Standard 2842, and shall record the wet-bulb and dry-bulb temperatures so determined in the ventilation record book;
- (k) an adequate supply of cold water for drinking shall be provided to all persons who are required to work underground;
- in all underground working places and travelling ways where the air velocity would (1)otherwise be less than 0.5 metres per second, ventilation equipment is provided to ensure that the velocity of the ventilating air current is maintained at not less than 0.5 metres per second;
- (m) the registered manager ensures that all persons who are or may be required to work or travel underground in any area of the mine where the wet bulb temperature exceeds or is likely to exceed 25°C receive adequate training in the treatment of persons suffering from heat-related illness or bodily disorder attributable to heat in the working environment;
- (n) the registered manager shall be responsible for the reporting to the district inspector of mines by the fastest practicable means available of any heat-related illness or bodily disorder attributable to heat in the working environment and also shall be responsible for the recording of the same in the mine record book; and
- adequate cool rest areas on the surface shall be provided for the use of persons who are or may be required to work underground and that the environmental conditions in those rest areas are maintained so that the depression between the dry bulb and wet bulb temperature is more than 5° C and the wet bulb temperature is not less than 16° C.
