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ELECTORAL ACT 1907

ELECTORAL REGULATIONS 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Electoral Regulations 1988.

Commencement

2. These regulations shall come into operation on the day on which the Electoral (Procedures) Amendment Act 1987 comes into operation.

Forms in Schedule 3

3. In these regulations unless the contrary intention appears a reference to a form is a reference to a form in Schedule 3.

Charges in Schedule 1

4. The charges specified in Schedule 1 are charges to be paid in relation to the matters specified in that Schedule.

Appointments and Declarations

- 5. (1) The declarations prescribed for the purposes of sections 12 and 104 of the Act are the declarations in Forms 1 and 2 respectively in Schedule 2.
- (2) An appointment of a person to act as presiding officer, assistant presiding officer, poll clerk or doorkeeper shall be in the form of Form 3 in Schedule 2.
- (3) The appointment of a person to act as scrutineer shall be in writing and signed by the candidate by whom the scrutineer is appointed.
- (4) A person shall not be permitted to enter a polling place for the purpose of acting as a scrutineer unless that person has made a declaration in the form of Form 4 of Schedule 2.

Forms

6. The forms in the Schedules are the forms prescribed in relation to the provisions of the Act or of these regulations specified in the form.

Forms to be completed

- 7. (1) Where a form in a Schedule requires to be completed by the insertion of particulars required in the form those particulars are prescribed as the particulars required under the provision of the Act for the purposes for which the form is prescribed.
- (2) Where a form in a Schedule contains directions for its completion the form shall be completed in accordance with those directions.
- (3) The provisions of these regulations and the forms prescribed thereunder shall, as nearly as is practicable and with such modifications as are, in the opinion of the Electoral Commissioner, necessary or expedient, apply as well to more than one election, including one or more referendums, held for a district or region on the same day as to any other election.

Rolls

8. In addition to the matters prescribed in section 22 of the Act a roll shall contain the sex and occupation of each elector on the roll.

Registrar to certify roll

9. The Registrar for a district shall whenever directed by the Electoral Commissioner produce to the Electoral Commissioner a roll certified by the Registrar as the roll for the district.

Marking of roll where objection by registrar to a claim is subject to appeal (section 47 (3) (g))

10. Where the Registrar objects to the enrolment of a person on a roll and the appeal in relation to the objection has not been heard and determined on the fourteenth day next preceding the day fixed for an election or referendum the Registrar shall in accordance with section 47 (3) (g) of the Act enter the notation "47 (3) (g)" against the name of the claimant on the roll.

Issue of postal votes

- 11. (1) An issuing officer shall record the name of every applicant for a postal ballot paper whether the application is made orally or in writing.
 - (2) The list referrred to in subregulation (1) shall be in the form of Form 25.
- (3) The names so listed shall be numbered consecutively in arithmetical order and the number so allocated shall be recorded on every written application made.
- (4) Every issuing officer shall forthwith after 6.00 pm on the day preceding the day fixed for polling forward to the Electoral Commissioner every list compiled by the issuing officer under this regulation.
 - (5) A postal ballot paper shall be endorsed with the words "Postal ballot paper".

Taking of postal ballot papers delivered to returning officers or presiding officers

- 12. Where an envelope containing a postal ballot paper is posted or delivered pursuant to section 92 (4a) the returning officer or presiding officer, as the case may be—
 - (a) shall endorse on the envelope the place at which and the time when the envelope was received and sign and date the endorsement;
 - (b) enter the name of the elector on a list in the form of Form 32;
 - (c) number the envelope according to the number of the elector on the list; and
 - (d) deposit the envelope in a locked and sealed ballot box.
 - 13. The following provisions apply to the taking of absent votes—
 - (a) an absent vote shall not be cast by an elector at any polling place within the district for which the elector is enrolled;
 - (b) before a person is issued with a ballot paper for the purposes of casting an absent vote the authorized person shall attest the signature of that person to the statement in the form of Form 30 which may be printed on the envelope to be used for the purposes of forwarding the ballot paper to the Electoral Commissioner.
 - (c) the ballot paper issued to an elector for the purposes of absent voting shall contain the particulars relevant to a ballot paper in relation to the district or region in relation to which the vote is proposed to be cast in accordance with the Act and if necessary these particulars shall be endorsed on the ballot paper by the appropriate officer;
 - (d) the elector shall mark the ballot paper in accordance with the directions printed on the ballot paper and place the ballot paper in an envelope marked "Ballot Paper", seal the envelope and return the envelope containing the ballot paper to the appropriate officer;

(e) the appropriate officer shall enclose the ballot paper envelope so received in the envelope addressed to the Electoral Commissioner.

Taking of provisional votes under section 119 (4a), 122 (2) or 122A

- 14. The following provisions apply to the taking of provisional votes under sections 119 (4a), 122 (2) or 122A of the Act—
 - (a) before a person is issued with a ballot paper for the purposes of casting a provisional vote the person shall in the presence of an authorized person sign a statement in the form of Form 31 which may be printed on the envelope to be used for the purposes of forwarding the ballot paper to the Electoral Commissioner;
 - (b) the authorized person shall attest the signature of the person voting by signing his or her name in the place specified in the form;
 - (c) the ballot paper issued for the purposes of provisional voting shall contain the particulars relevant to the district or region for which the vote is to be cast and if necessary those particulars may be endorsed on the ballot paper by the appropriate officer;
 - (d) the person claiming the provisional vote shall mark the ballot paper in accordance with the instructions printed on the ballot paper and place the ballot paper in an envelope marked ballot paper, seal the envelope and return the envelope containing the ballot paper to the appropriate officer;
 - (e) the appropriate officer shall enclose the envelope containing the ballot paper in the envelope addressed to the Electoral Commissioner, seal that envelope and place it in a locked and sealed ballot box.

Postal votes, absent votes and provisional votes in ballot boxes

15. Postal votes, absent votes and provisional votes may be placed in any ballot boxes in use at the polling place at which the votes were cast or received.

Lists of postal votes and provisional votes to be made

- 16. (1) A presiding officer shall compile a list for all postal votes, absent votes and a list specifying each class of provisional votes taken at the polling and shall at the close of the poll forward every such list to the Returning Officer.
- (2) When a Returning Officer has compiled a list as a presiding officer at a polling place or receives a list from a presiding officer the Returning Officer shall compile a consolidated list of each class of vote referred to in subsection (1) and forward the list to the Electoral Commissioner together with those votes.

Presiding Officers to forward postal votes, absent votes and provisional votes to Returning Officer

- 17. (1) Except where ballot papers are to be forwarded to a Returning Officer or Assistant Returning Officer for counting, the presiding officer shall, at the close of the polls—
 - (a) cause all ballot boxes to be opened and the envelopes with postal votes, absent votes or provisional votes to be separated from the ballot papers contained in the ballot boxes;
 - (b) cause the envelopes to be sorted into their respective district or region; and
 - (c) forward the envelopes and the lists referred to in regulation 16 to the Returning Officer for the district or region as the case requires by any means approved by the Electoral Commissioner.

(2) Where the presiding officer is not an Assistant Returning Officer or Returning Officer the presiding officer shall send the ballot boxes unopened by the means approved by the Electoral Commissioner to an Assistant Returning Officer or the Returning Officer.

Returning Officer to forward postal votes, absent votes and provisional votes to Electoral Commissioner

- 18. (1) The Returning Officer of a district or region shall at the close of the polls—
 - (a) cause all ballot boxes received from polling places within the district that contain envelopes with postal votes, absent votes or provisional votes at the polling place at which the Returning Officer presides to be opened;
 - (b) cause all the envelopes to be sorted into their respective districts or regions and list them according to their class; and
 - (c) forward the envelopes sorted according to their respective districts or regions to the Electoral Commissioner by any means approved by the Electoral Commissioner.

Scrutiny of envelopes containing postal ballot papers, absent votes and provisional votes under section 119 (4), 122 (2) or 122A

- 19. (1) The officer concerned with the scrutiny of declarations made in respect of postal ballot papers shall—
 - (a) open the envelope addressed to the Electoral Commissioner and examine the declaration to ensure that the postal ballot paper should not be rejected by virtue of the provisions of section 92 (9) of the Act;
 - (b) if the postal vote was obtained by a written application check the declaration against the application made by the person applying for that postal ballot paper;
 - (c) if satisfied that the postal ballot paper should not be rejected—
 - (i) record the elector as having voted by striking off the name of the elector on the roll issued for that purpose by the Electoral Commissioner; and
 - (ii) place the envelope in the ballot box for the relevant district or region; and
 - (d) if satisfied that the postal ballot paper should be rejected set the envelope aside for retention by the Electoral Commissioner.
- (2) Where a postal vote has been obtained on an oral application the officer concerned shall carry out the duties referred to in subregulation (1) (b), (c) and (d) with respect to the postal vote.
- (3) Where an envelope containing a postal ballot paper cannot be checked against a written application but the Assistant Returning Officer is satisfied from the list of applications for postal votes that the postal vote was obtained by written application the Assistant Returning Officer shall allow the envelopes to be dealt with in accordance with subregulation (1) (b), (c) and (d).
- (4) The officer concerned in the scrutiny of declarations on envelopes containing absent votes or provisional votes under section 119 (4), 122 (2) or 122A shall—
 - (a) examine the declaration on the envelope to ensure it is signed by the elector and witnessed by an authorizing officer;
 - (b) examine the roll to ensure that the voter's name is enrolled;
 - (c) if the voter's name is on the roll record the voter as having voted by striking off the name of the voter on the roll;
 - (d) place the envelope in the ballot box for the relevant district or region.

(5) Where a declaration on an envelope containing an absent vote or provisional vote is not signed by the authorized officer, the officer conducting the scrutiny of the declarations shall not reject the envelope.

Scrutiny of postal, absent and provisional votes

- 20. (1) After the declarations on the envelopes containing ballot papers have been scrutinized under regulation 19 the envelopes containing the ballot papers of persons whose names are on the roll in relation to which a vote is claimed shall be opened and counted in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Act.
- (2) Where a ballot paper in an envelope is not the ballot paper for the district or region in relation to which the ballot paper was cast the ballot paper shall be rejected.

Compulsory enrolment

- 21. (1) Any person entitled to enrolment as an elector shall fill in, sign and send to the registrar of the district in which that person is entitled to be so enrolled a claim in the form of Form 2.
- (2) Where it appears to the Electoral Commissioner that the name of a person who is qualified to be enrolled as an elector on a roll under this Act is not so enrolled the Electoral Commissioner shall—
 - (a) by notice notify that person that that person is required to fill in, sign and send to the officer indicated in the notice within the period specified in the notice a claim for enrolment in accordance with section 45 of the Act;
 - (b) notify the person that no claim or notice in writing for enrolment in respect of that person's present address has been received by the Registrar or on the Registrar's behalf subsequently to that last known date of the breach;
 - (c) notify that person that a penalty (not exceeding \$20) has been imposed by the Electoral Commissioner for the apparent breach and advising that upon payment of the penalty and lodgement of a claim or notice of writing by that person within a specified time no further action in respect of the breach will be taken;
 - (d) notify the person that should the penalty not be paid and a claim or notice in writing for enrolment not lodged with or on behalf of the Registrar, within the specified time, the Electoral Commissioner may institute proceedings before a court of summary jurisdiction for a breach of section 45 (1) or (2); and
 - (e) provide a copy of Form 2 to the person and inform him or her of the right available under subregulation 4.
 - (3) Notification to a person pursuant to subregulation (2) shall be in writing.
- (4) If a person against whom action has been taken under subregulation 2 believes that he or she is not in breach of section 45 (1) or (2) that person may complete and sign a declaration in accordance with Form 2 within the time specified and return it to the Electoral Commissioner who may then decide to discontinue the action under subregulation 2, or to confirm that action and advise that person accordingly.
- (5) No action taken pursuant to subregulation 4 against a person shall prevent any further like action should a breach of section 45 (1) or (2) appear to the Electoral Commissioner to continue on the part of that person.

Prescribed officer under section 162 (1) (ca)

22. Any officer employed in the department referred to in section 4A of the Act is a prescribed officer for the purposes of section 162 (1) (ca) of the Act.

Public employees standing for election

23. (1) In this regulation, unless the contrary intention appears—

"election" means a Legislative Council election or Legislative Assembly election;

"election period", in relation to a candidate in an election, means the period commencing when the nomination of that candidate is lodged and ending when—

- (a) that nomination is withdrawn; or
- (b) that candidate or another candidate is declared elected to the Legislative Council or Legislative Assembly, as the case may be; or
- (c) the Electoral Commissioner, during the counting of the votes, certifies (as he is hereby authorized to do) that that candidate has no prospect of being elected,

whichever occurs first;

"member" in relation to a prescribed body means-

- (a) any member of the body whether known as a member, commissioner, councillor, trustee, director or by any other title;
- (b) any deputy, alternate or acting member of the body,

and includes a person holding the office of chairman or president or any other office of the body;

"prescribed body" means a commission, council, board, committee or other body mentioned in Part 3 of Schedule V to the Constitution Acts Amendment Act 1899:

"public employee" means a person who holds any office or place mentioned in Part 2 of Schedule V to the Constitution Acts Amendment Act 1899.

- (2) A public employee who nominates as a candidate in an election shall take leave of absence from employment as a public employee, such leave to commence not later than the working day next following the day on which the election period commences and to end not earlier than the day on which the election period ends or, if that day is not a working day, the working day next preceding that day.
- (3) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Act under which a public employee is appointed or employed—
 - (a) the employee is hereby authorized to apply for and take; and
 - (b) the employer of the employee is hereby authorized to grant,

leave of absence that is required to be taken under subregulation (2).

- (4) Leave of absence taken by a public employee under subregulation (2) shall be taken without pay except to the extent that the employee has an accrued entitlement to, and applies for, leave of absence with pay.
- (5) A member of a prescribed body who nominates as a candidate in an election shall not at any time during the election period attend any meeting of the body, or perform any function or duty as a member of the body, or receive any salary, fees, allowances, expenses or other remuneration as a member of the body.
 - (6) The inability of a member of a prescribed body to—
 - (a) attend a meeting of the body; or
 - (b) perform a function or duty as a member of the body,

without contravening subregulation (5) shall be sufficient cause for a duly appointed or elected deputy as alternate of that member to attend the meeting or perform the duty or function, as the case may require.

- (7) Where a member of a prescribed body-
 - (a) is absent from a meeting of the body; or
 - (b) fails to perform a function or duty as a member of the body,

in compliance with subregulation (5), that absence or failure shall be disregarded for the purposes of any enactment under which the member may vacate or be removed from his office as a member by reason of absence from meetings or neglect of duty.

Application of declaration to a region

24. In any form of declaration or statement made, or to be made, by an officer, clerk, elector or voter, in relation to such elections or referendums, a reference therein to a district shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be read and construed, as well, as a reference to the corresponding region.

Repeal

25. The Electoral Act Regulations 1949 are repealed.
