INTERPRETATION ACT 1984

BETTING CONTROL AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Betting Control Amendment Regulations 1988*.

Commencement

2. These regulations shall come into operation on the day that the *Betting Control Amendment Act (No. 2) 1987* shall come into operation.

Principal regulations

3. In these regulations the *Betting Control Regulations 1978** are referred to as the principal regulations.

Regulation 9A inserted

4. After regulation 9 of the principal regulations the following regulation is inserted—

Application to become an approved organization

- “ 9A. (1) An application for the purposes of section 4A (1) of the Act shall be in the form of the Form in the Schedule and shall be submitted in a completed form.
(2) The particulars required to be given in the form of the Form in the Schedule are the particulars prescribed for the purposes of section 4A (2) of the Act.
(3) The Minister may require the Commissioner of Police to report on any application made for the purposes of section 4A (1) of the Act.
(4) An application for the renewal of an approval under section 4 (4) of the Act shall be in the form approved by the Minister.
(5) An application for the renewal of an approval under section 4 (4) shall be made not earlier than 2 months and not later than 1 month before the date of the expiry of the approval.
(6) A person shall not make a false statement in any application made under this regulation.

Penalty: \$200. ”

HOSPITALS ACT 1927

KALGOORLIE REGIONAL HOSPITAL (TRAFFIC AND GROUNDS) BY-LAWS 1988

MADE by the Minister under sections 7 and 22.

Part I—Preliminary

Citation

1. These by-laws may be cited as the *Kalgoorlie Regional Hospital (Traffic and Grounds) By-laws 1988*.

Interpretation

2. (1) In these by-laws, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Administrator” means the person holding or acting in the office of chief executive officer (however designated) of the hospital;

“authorized person” means an officer or servant of the Board authorized in writing by the Administrator for the purpose of these by-laws;

“Board” means the Minister for Health being the Board, pursuant to section 7 of the Act, of the Kalgoorlie Regional Hospital;

“driver”, in relation to a vehicle, includes rider;

“hospital” means the Kalgoorlie Regional Hospital;

“parking facility” means any land or structure on the site containing a parking space or parking spaces;

“parking space” means a section whether in a parking facility or not which is marked by means of painted lines or metallic studs or similar devices for the purpose of indicating where a vehicle may be parked;

“roadway” means part of the site which, although it is not a road within the meaning of the *Road Traffic Act 1974*, is set aside for use by vehicular traffic, but excludes a parking facility;

“sign” means marking, notice or sign marked, erected or displayed by or by authority of the Administrator;

“speed restriction sign” means a sign erected or marked in or about a roadway containing a numeral or numerals;

“the site” means the grounds attached to or belonging to the hospital;

“vehicle” has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1974*.

- (2) Subject to sub-by-law (3) when these by-laws prohibit the doing of an act or thing without permission—

(a) that permission shall be in writing and may be given and revoked by the Administrator or by an officer or servant of the Board authorized by the Administrator to give and revoke that permission; and

(b) that permission shall be obtained before the act or thing is done.

- (3) An officer or servant of the Board acting in the course of his employment has the permission referred to in sub-by-law (2) without that sub-by-law being complied with in respect of him.

Part II—Grounds

No entry without cause

3. A person shall not enter or remain on the site without a reasonable excuse.

Directions concerning use of certain areas

4. (1) An authorized person may, by the display, erection or marking of a sign or notice, direct that a specified part of the site shall be open to members of the public or a specified section of the public subject to compliance with such conditions as may be specified.

(2) A direction given under sub-by-law (1) may be varied or cancelled by the Administrator.

(3) In this by-law "specified" means specified in the relevant direction given under sub-by-law (1).

(4) A person who contravenes a direction given under sub-by-law (1) commits an offence.

Part III—Traffic Control

Division 1—General

Driving of vehicles

5. (1) A person shall not, without permission, drive or bring a vehicle on any portion of the site unless that portion is a roadway or a parking facility.

(2) A person shall not, without permission, drive or bring a vehicle, the unladen weight of which exceeds 4 tonnes, or any portion of the site.

(3) A person shall not drive, use or stand a vehicle in any portion of the site contrary to any sign displayed in relation to that portion of the site.

Driver to obey reasonable direction

6. Notwithstanding anything in these by-laws, the driver of a vehicle shall obey any reasonable direction given to him by an authorized person in relation to the parking or movement of the vehicle.

Speed limits

7. (1) A person shall not drive a vehicle on a roadway—

(a) where no speed restriction sign is displayed—at a speed exceeding 10 kilometres an hour;

(b) where a speed restriction sign is displayed in relation to a portion of a roadway—at a speed exceeding the speed indicated on the speed restriction sign.

(2) Sub-by-law (1) does not apply to or in relation to an emergency vehicle.

Give way

8. The driver of a vehicle that is entering or preparing to enter a parking facility shall give way to any vehicle that is—

(a) leaving the parking facility; or

(b) travelling in the roadway in the vicinity of his vehicle.

Roadway not to be used for instructions or repairs

9. A person shall not on a roadway in the site—

(a) drive a vehicle for the purposes of giving or receiving driving instructions;

(b) except in an emergency, effect repairs or adjustments or both to a vehicle.

Division 2—Parking

Parking only in parking spaces

10. A person shall not park a vehicle in the site except in a parking space.

Signs to be obeyed

11. A person shall not park, stand or move a vehicle in a parking facility in the site contrary to any direction contained in a sign.

Parking in parking spaces

12. (1) A person shall not park, stand or move a vehicle in a parking facility in the site contrary to any directions contained in a sign.

(2) Where a sign indicates that a parking facility or portion of a parking facility is set aside—

(a) for a specified vehicle or specified class of vehicles;

(b) for the vehicle of a specified person or specified class of persons;

(c) for parking of vehicles for a specified period of time; or

(d) for the parking of vehicles for a maximum period of time so specified,

a person shall not park a vehicle in the parking facility or portion of the parking facility unless—

(e) the vehicle is the particular vehicle or is within the class of vehicle so specified;

(f) the vehicle is the vehicle of the person or a person of the class so specified;

(g) the vehicle is parked within the period of time so specified;

(h) the vehicle is parked for a period that does not exceed the maximum period of time so specified,

as the case requires.

(3) In this sub-by-law "specified" means specified in a sign.

Part IV—Offences and Penalties

Definition

13. In this Part—

"alleged offender", in respect of a vehicle on or in which an infringement notice has been left under by-law 16 by an authorized person includes registered owner of the vehicle;

"infringement notice" means infringement notice referred to in by-law 16;

"modified penalty" means modified penalty prescribed in Schedule 1 for an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws.

Offences and penalty

14. Subject to by-law 15 a person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of these by-laws commits an offence.

Penalty: \$50.

Modified penalties

15. (1) A person who does not contest an allegation that he committed an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws may pay to the hospital within the time specified in the relevant infringement notice or within such extended time as the Administrator allows the modified penalty prescribed for that offence in Schedule 1.

(2) The production of an acknowledgement from the hospital of the payment in accordance with sub-by-law (1) of the modified penalty concerned is a defence to a charge of the offence in respect of which that modified penalty was paid.

Infringement notices

16. (1) An authorized person who believes on reasonable grounds that a person has committed an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws may serve on that person an infringement notice by delivering it to the alleged offender or by affixing it to the vehicle of the alleged offender.

(2) An infringement notice shall be in the form of Form 1 Schedule 2 and shall—

- (a) be identified by a serial number;
- (b) identify the alleged offender by reference to his name and address or the vehicle make and registration number of his vehicle;
- (c) state the by-law under which the offence is alleged to have been committed, and the brief description of offence and modified penalty set out opposite that by-law in Schedule 1; and
- (d) inform the alleged offender in general terms that if he does not wish to have a complaint of the alleged offence heard and determined by a court of summary jurisdiction, then he may deliver the amount of the modified penalty to an authorized person within the time provided in the infringement notice, which shall not be less than 14 days.

Modified penalties procedure

17. (1) A person who does not contest an allegation that he has committed an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws may complete the infringement notice by signing the admission on that notice and forwarding the infringement notice and the amount of the modified penalty set out in Schedule 1 opposite the by-law alleged to have been breached to an authorized person specified in the infringement notice.

(2) Upon receipt of a modified penalty under sub-by-law (1) sent within the time provided in the infringement notice or such further time as an authorized person allows, the authorized person shall issue to the person paying that modified penalty an acknowledgement.

Withdrawal of infringement notice

18. An authorized person, not being the person who issued the infringement notice, may by notice in the form of Form 2 in Schedule 2 served on the alleged offender withdraw an infringement notice.

Removal and endorsement of infringement notices

19. A person other than an authorized person who—

- (a) makes an endorsement on or alteration to an infringement notice; or
- (b) not being the driver, registered owner or person in charge of a vehicle to which an infringement notice is attached, removes the infringement notice,

commits an offence.

Other penalties for illegally parked vehicles

20. (1) In addition to any other penalty, a vehicle parked in breach of these by-laws or a vehicle which is left on the site for more than 3 days may be removed by order of the Administrator to a storage place within the site.

(2) For the purpose of removing a vehicle under sub-by-law (1), a person authorized by the Administrator may take such action by way of unlocking, driving, towing or otherwise as is reasonably necessary.

Authorized person may request name and address

21. Where an offence under these by-laws is alleged to have been committed by the driver or person in charge of a vehicle then the registered owner of the vehicle shall, if required to do so by an authorized person, supply the name and address of the person driving or in charge of the vehicle at the time the offence is alleged to have been committed and in the event that he refuses to do so, he shall be deemed to be the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at the time the offence is alleged to have been committed.

Part V—General**Other offences**

22. A person who—

- (a) wilfully obstructs any officer or servant of the Board in the discharge of his duty under these by-laws;
- (b) removes, damages, defaces or misuses a sign;
- (c) disobeys or fails to comply with any notice or sign, including a traffic sign erected or displayed by an authorized person in accordance with these by-laws,

commits an offence.

Repeal

23. The *Kalgoorlie Regional Hospital (Control of Traffic) By-laws** and the *Kalgoorlie Regional Hospital (Traffic and Grounds) By-laws*** are repealed.

HEALTH ACT 1911

Shire of Swan

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Health Act 1911 the Shire of Swan being a local authority within the meaning of the Act, having adopted the Model By-laws described as Series "A" made under the Act and as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954 in the *Government Gazette* on 17 July 1963 and as amended from time to time has resolved and determined, that the adopted by-laws shall be further amended as follows.

Part 1—General Sanitary Provisions

By-laws 12, 13, 14, 15A and 16 are deleted and the following substituted in lieu thereof—

12 (i) In this by-law unless the context otherwise requires—

“authorised officer” means the Chief Health Surveyor of the Shire of Swan or other officer of the Shire of Swan authorised in writing by the Shire Clerk to administer the provisions of this by-law.

“collection time” means the collection time from time to time notified to the occupier of the premises by the Local Authority or its contractor.

“receptacle” means a polyethylene cart fitted with wheels and a handle and with a lid of a capacity of 240 or 120 litres supplied by the local authority or its contractor or other type of receptacle specified or approved by the local authority.

the terms “street alignment” and “building line” have the meaning given to them in and for the purposes of the Local Government Act 1960 and its amendments.

(ii) The occupier of every premises in the district shall—

- (a) subject to paragraph (c) hereof cause all household refuse to be deposited in a receptacle;
- (b) at all times keep the lid of the receptacle tightly closed except when depositing refuse in or cleaning the receptacle;
- (c) not deposit or permit to be deposited in a receptacle—
 - (i) any material being or consisting of—
 - (1) hot or burning ashes;
 - (2) oil, paint or solvent;
 - (3) slops or liquid wastes;
 - (4) bricks, concrete, earth or other like substances;
 - (ii) more than 35 kg of rubbish or refuse at any one time;
 - (iii) an object which is greater in length, width or breadth than the corresponding dimensions of the receptacle or which will not allow the lid of the receptacle to be tightly closed;
 - (iv) refuse which is or is likely to become offensive or a nuisance or to give off an offensive or noxious odour or to attract flies or cause fly breeding unless it is first wrapped in absorbent or impervious material or placed in a sealed impervious container;
- (d) except for collection keep the receptacle on the premises located behind the building line or in a position approved by an authorised officer;
- (e) Collection of Receptacle.
 - (i) Prior to the collection time place the receptacle between 1 m and 4 m from the street alignment adjacent to the premises, but so that it does not obstruct a footpath, cycleway or other carriageway;
 - (ii) after the contents of the receptacle have been removed, the receptacle shall be replaced on the premises behind the building line;
- (f) at all times keep the receptacle clean and whenever directed by an authorised officer to do so place and keep in the receptacle a deodorant material approved by the authorised officer;
- (g) notify the local authority within 7 days after the event if the receptacle is lost, stolen, damaged or becomes defective;

- (iii) In the case of residential premises consisting of more than 3 dwellings, units or flats or premises used for commercial or industrial purposes the local authority may require the use of a receptacle or receptacles other than a polyethylene cart fitted with wheels and a handle and the occupier of those premises shall comply with and observe the directions given by the local authority.
- (iv) The occupier of every premises in the district who is required under sub-by-law (iii) of this by-law to use a receptacle other than a polyethylene cart fitted with wheels and a handle shall—
 - (a) cause all refuse to be deposited in a receptacle in a manner which is compatible with the type of receptacle used;
 - (b) take all reasonable steps to prevent fly breeding in and emission of offensive or noxious odour from the receptacle;
 - (c) cause the receptacle to be located on the premises in a position where—
 - (i) it is screened so as not to be visible from a street but is readily accessible for the purpose of collection of the contents thereof;
 - (ii) it does not obstruct a driveway, service road or footpath on those premises;
 - (iii) it does not cause a nuisance to the occupiers of adjoining premises;
 - (d) at all times keep the receptacle clean and whenever directed by an authorised officer to do so place and keep in the receptacle a deodorant material approved by the authorised officer;
 - (e) where the premises are used for the manufacture, preparation or sale of food or any putrescible refuse emanates from the premises cause the receptacle to be cleaned with a suitable detergent and treated with disinfectant at least once per week.
- (v) An authorised officer may direct that refuse of the type referred to in paragraph (e) of sub-by-law (iv) hereof or which emanates from premises referred to in that paragraph be collected and removed more often than once per week.
- (vi) Where refuse emanating from premises is of a nature that an authorised officer considers requires to be treated before being placed in a receptacle he may give directions as to the manner in which it is to be treated and the occupier of those premises shall comply with those directions.
- (vii) A receptacle supplied by the local authority or its contractor remains the property of the local authority or its contractor as the case may be.

"

- (b) by repealing subregulation (4).

Regulation 32 amended

4. Regulation 32 of the principal regulations is amended in subregulation (1) by deleting paragraph (b) and substituting the following paragraphs—

- (iii) a trailer, the label is fitted in a holder on the near side of, and not more than 305 millimetres from the front of, the tray, in such a manner that the label faces the same direction as the near side of the tray to which it is fitted, and is clearly visible to a person who is standing outside the trailer and facing the label;

- (c) where the vehicle is a caravan of the trailer type the label is either—

(i) fitted to the front window in such a position that its centre is approximately 150 millimetres from the bottom, near side corner of the window and the front of the label is facing towards the front of the vehicle; or

(ii) fitted in a holder in the manner set out for a trailer in paragraph (b) (iii),

and the choice of label type shall be indicated by the owner, or where no preference is indicated shall be nominated by the Board, at the time of registration or renewal. "
