- (b) because of the likelihood of the introduction of disease into the State, prohibit the bringing or sending into the State from any other State or Territory of the Commonwealth of—

(i) potatoes; or

(ii) machinery and equipment which has been used in the production or handling of potatoes,

except in accordance with the Plant Diseases (Potato) Regulations 1984.

Mining Act 1978

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS it is enacted section 127 of the Mining Act 1978 that the Governor may by Order in Council establish Warden's Courts at such places as he deems necessary, and may assign districts as he thinks fit; and whereas it is enacted, inter alia, by section 127 of the Mining Act 1978 that the Governor may in like manner order that any

goldfield or mineral field or district shall cease to be assigned to a particular Warden's Court and be assigned to another Court and that when any goldfield or mineral field or district ceases to be assigned to such court the proceedings pending therein and the records thereof as relate to such goldfield, mineral field or district shall be transferred to and continued in such other Warden's Court as the Governor may direct: now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth hereby—

- (a) order that a Warden's Court be established at Norseman;
- (b) cancel the assignment of the Dundas Mineral Field to the Warden's Court at Kalgoorlie;
- (c) assign to the Warden's Court at Norseman the administration of the Dundas Mineral Field; and
- (d) in respect to the Dundas Mineral Field only, direct that the proceedings pending in and the records of the Warden's Court at Kalgoorlie be transferred to and continued in the Warden's Court at Norseman.

Local Government Act 1960

ORDERS IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor on request by a Council of a Municipal District, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* to declare any lands reserved or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare under the care, control, and management of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Council, or lands comprised in a private street of which the public has had uninterrupted use for a period of not less than 10 years, as a public street and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the Schedule hereto have requested that certain lands named and described in the said Schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Councils, be declared public streets: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets and such land shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

## HOSPITALS ACT 1927

Mount Henry Hospital (Traffic and Grounds) By-laws 1988

MADE by the Minister under sections 7 and 22.

## Part I—Preliminary

**Citation**

1. These by-laws may be cited as the *Mount Henry Hospital (Traffic and Grounds) By-laws 1988*.

**Commencement**

2. These by-laws shall come into operation on 1 April 1988.

**Interpretation**

3. (1) In these by-laws, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Administrator” means the person holding or acting in the office of chief executive officer (however designated) of the hospital;

“authorized person” means an officer or servant of the Board authorized in writing by the Administrator for the purpose of these by-laws;

“Board” means the Minister for Health being the Board, pursuant to section 7 of the Act, of the Mount Henry Hospital;

“driver”, in relation to a vehicle, includes rider;

“hospital” means the Mount Henry Hospital;

“parking facility” means any land or structure on the site containing a parking space or parking spaces;

“parking space” means a section whether in a parking facility or not which is marked by means of painted lines or metallic studs or similar devices for the purpose of indicating where a vehicle may be parked;

“permit” means parking permit issued under by-law 14;

“roadway” means part of the site which, although it is not a road within the meaning of the *Road Traffic Act 1974*, is set aside for use by vehicular traffic, but excludes a parking facility;

“sign” means marking, notice or sign marked, erected or displayed by or by authority of the Administrator;

“speed restriction sign” means a sign erected or marked in or about a roadway containing a numeral or numerals;

“the site” means the grounds attached to or belonging to the hospital;

“vehicle” has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1974*.

(2) Subject to sub-by-law (3) when these by-laws prohibit the doing of an act or thing without permission—

(a) that permission shall be in writing and may be given and revoked by the Administrator or by an officer or servant of the Board authorized by the Administrator to give and revoke that permission; and

(b) that permission shall be obtained before the act or thing is done.

(3) An officer or servant of the Board acting in the course of his employment has the permission referred to in sub-by-law (2) without that sub-by-law being complied with in respect of him.

## Part II—Grounds

**No entry without cause**

4. A person shall not enter or remain on the site without a reasonable excuse.

**Directions concerning use of certain areas**

5. (1) An authorized person may, by the display, erection or marking of a sign or notice, direct that a specified part of the site shall be open to members of the public or a specified section of the public subject to compliance with such conditions as may be specified.

(2) A direction given under sub-by-law (1) may be varied or cancelled by the Administrator.

(3) In this by-law "specified" means specified in the relevant direction given under sub-by-law (1).

(4) A person who contravenes a direction given under sub-by-law (1) commits an offence.

## Part III—Traffic Control

## Division 1—General

**Driving of vehicles**

6. (1) A person shall not, without permission, drive or bring a vehicle on any portion of the site unless that portion is a roadway or a parking facility.

(2) A person shall not, without permission, drive or bring a vehicle, the unladen weight of which exceeds 4 tonnes, on any portion of the site.

(3) A person shall not drive, use or stand a vehicle in any portion of the site contrary to any sign displayed in relation to that portion of the site.

**Driver to obey reasonable direction**

7. Notwithstanding anything in these by-laws, the driver of a vehicle shall obey any reasonable direction given to him by an authorized person in relation to the parking or movement of the vehicle.

**Speed limits**

8. (1) A person shall not drive a vehicle on a roadway—

(a) where no speed restriction sign is displayed—at a speed exceeding 25 kilometres an hour;

(b) where a speed restriction sign is displayed in relation to a portion of a roadway—at a speed exceeding the speed indicated on the speed restriction sign.

(2) Sub-by-law (1) does not apply to or in relation to an emergency vehicle.

**Give way**

9. The driver of a vehicle that is entering or preparing to enter a parking facility shall give way to any vehicle that is—

(a) leaving the parking facility; or

(b) travelling in the roadway in the vicinity of his vehicle.

**Roadway not to be used for instructions or repairs**

10. A person shall not on a roadway in the site—

(a) drive a vehicle for the purposes of giving or receiving driving instructions;

(b) except in an emergency, effect repairs or adjustments or both to a vehicle.

## Division 2—Parking

**Parking only in parking spaces**

11. A person shall not park a vehicle in the site except in a parking space.

**Signs to be obeyed**

12. A person shall not park, stand or move a vehicle in a parking facility in the site contrary to any direction contained in a sign.

**Parking in parking spaces**

13. (1) A person shall not park, stand or move a vehicle in a parking facility in the site contrary to any directions contained in a sign.

(2) Where a sign indicates that a parking facility or portion of a parking facility is set aside—

(a) for a specified vehicle or specified class of vehicles;

(b) for the vehicle of a specified person or specified class of persons;

(c) for parking of vehicles for a specified period of time; or

(d) for the parking of vehicles for a maximum period of time so specified,

a person shall not park a vehicle in the parking facility or portion of the parking facility unless—

(e) the vehicle is the particular vehicle or is within the class of vehicle so specified;

(f) the vehicle is the vehicle of the person or a person of the class so specified;

(g) the vehicle is parked within the period of time so specified;

(h) the vehicle is parked for a period that does not exceed the maximum period of time so specified,

as the case requires.

(3) Where a sign in a portion of a parking facility directs that a vehicle parked in that portion is required to display a permit in a specified position on the vehicle a person shall not park a vehicle in the portion of the parking facility unless a valid permit is displayed in accordance with directions in the sign.

(4) In this sub-by-law "specified" means specified in a sign.

**Permits**

14. (1) A person who desires to obtain a permit to park a vehicle in a parking facility shall apply to the Administrator.
- (2) An application for the purposes of sub-by-law (1) shall be in the form of the form approved by the Administrator.
- (3) A permit may be issued by the Administrator permitting parking in a specified portion of the site or for the purposes of parking anywhere on the site.
- (4) A permit is valid—
- (a) if issued in relation to a specified vehicle, for the purposes of parking only the vehicle so specified;
  - (b) if issued for the purposes of parking a vehicle owned by a specified person or class of persons, for the purposes of parking a vehicle owned only by a person of the class of persons so specified;
  - (c) if issued in relation to a vehicle of a specified class, for the purposes of parking only a vehicle of the class so specified;
  - (d) if issued for the purposes of parking a vehicle in a specified portion of a parking facility, for the purposes of parking a vehicle only in the portion of a parking facility so specified;
  - (e) if issued for the purposes of parking a vehicle during a specified period of time, for the purposes of parking a vehicle only during the period of time so specified.
- (5) Subject to sub-by-law (6), a permit expires on the day specified in the permit.
- (6) The Administrator may cancel a permit if—
- (a) a vehicle in respect of which the permit is issued is parked in the site in contravention of these by-laws or the terms of the permit issued in relation to the person or the vehicle specified in the permit;
  - (b) the person in relation to whom the permit is issued commits an offence against these by-laws;
  - (c) the person in relation to whom the permit is issued ceases to be entitled to be holder of the permit.
- (7) A person shall not park a vehicle in a parking facility without a valid permit.
- (8) In this by-law—  
“specified” means specified in the relevant permit.

**Part IV—Offences and Penalties****Definition**

15. In this Part—
- “alleged offender”, in respect of a vehicle on or in which an infringement notice has been left under by-law 18 by an authorized person includes registered owner of the vehicle;
- “infringement notice” means infringement notice referred to in by-law 18;
- “modified penalty” means modified penalty prescribed in Schedule 1 for an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws.

**Offences and penalty**

16. Subject to by-law 17 a person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of these by-laws commits an offence.
- Penalty: \$50.

**Modified penalties**

17. (1) A person who does not contest an allegation that he committed an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws may pay to the hospital within the time specified in the relevant infringement notice or within such extended time as the Administrator allows the modified penalty prescribed for the offence in Schedule 1.
- (2) The production of an acknowledgement from the hospital of the payment in accordance with sub-by-law (1) of the modified penalty concerned is a defence to a charge of the offence in respect of which that modified penalty was paid.

**Infringement notices**

18. (1) An authorized person who believes on reasonable grounds that a person has committed an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws may serve on that person an infringement notice by delivering it to the alleged offender or by affixing it to the vehicle of the alleged offender.
- (2) An infringement notice shall be in the form of Form 1 Schedule 2 and shall—
- (a) be identified by a serial number;
  - (b) identify the alleged offender by reference to his name and address or the vehicle make and registration number of his vehicle;
  - (c) state the by-law under which the offence is alleged to have been committed, and the brief description of offence and modified penalty set out opposite that by-law in Schedule 1; and
  - (d) inform the alleged offender in general terms that if he does not wish to have a complaint of the alleged offence heard and determined by a court of summary jurisdiction, then he may deliver the amount of the modified penalty to an authorized person within the time provided in the infringement notice, which shall not be less than 14 days.

**Modified penalties procedure**

19. (1) A person who does not contest an allegation that he has committed an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws may complete the infringement notice by signing the admission on that notice and forwarding the infringement notice and the amount of the modified penalty set out in Schedule 1 opposite the by-law alleged to have been breached to an authorized person specified in the infringement notice.
- (2) Upon receipt of a modified penalty under sub-by-law (1) sent within the time provided in the infringement notice or such further time as an authorized person allows, the authorized person shall issue to the person paying that modified penalty an acknowledgement.



**Withdrawal of infringement notice**

20. An authorized person, not being the person who issued the infringement notice, may by notice in the form of Form 2 in Schedule 2 served on the alleged offender withdraw an infringement notice.

**Removal and endorsement of infringement notices**

21. A person other than an authorized person who—  
 (a) makes an endorsement on or alteration to an infringement notice; or  
 (b) not being the driver registered owner or person in charge of a vehicle to which an infringement notice is attached, removes the infringement notice,  
 commits an offence.

**Other penalties for illegally parked vehicles**

22. (1) In addition to any other penalty, a vehicle parked in breach of these by-laws or a vehicle which is left on the site for more than 3 days may be removed by order of the Administrator to a storage place within the site.

(2) For the purpose of removing a vehicle under sub-by-law (1), a person authorized by the Administrator may take such action by way of unlocking, driving, towing or otherwise as is reasonably necessary.

**Authorized person may request name and address**

23. Where an offence under these by-laws is alleged to have been committed by the driver or person in charge of a vehicle then the registered owner of the vehicle shall, if required to do so by an authorized person, supply the name and address of the person driving or in charge of the vehicle at the time the offence is alleged to have been committed and in the event that he refuses to do so, he shall be deemed to be the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at the time the offence is alleged to have been committed.

Part V—General

**Other offences**

24. A person who—  
 (a) wilfully obstructs any officer or servant of the Board in the discharge of his duty under these by-laws;  
 (b) removes, damages, defaces or misuses a sign;  
 (c) disobeys or fails to comply with any notice or sign, including a traffic sign erected or displayed by an authorized person in accordance with these by-laws,  
 commits an offence.

**Repeal**

25. The *Mount Henry Hospital (Traffic and Grounds) By-laws\** are repealed.

HEALTH ACT 1911
Municipality of the City of Bayswater
Health By-law—Eating Houses

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on 28 April 1987 to make and submit for approval by the Governor the following by-law:

Part I—Preliminary
Arrangement

- 1. This by-law is divided into parts as follows—
Part I—Preliminary, clauses 1 and 2.
Part II—Registration of eating houses and licensing of proprietors, clauses 3-16.
Part III—Requirements applicable to eating houses, clauses 17-26.
Part IV—Exemptions and Penalties, clauses 27 and 28.

## Interpretation

2. In this by-law unless the context otherwise requires—

- “Act” means the Health Act, 1911, as amended;
- “Chief Health Surveyor” means the Chief Health Surveyor of the local authority and includes any person acting in that capacity;
- “Health Surveyor” means any person appointed by the local authority to be a health surveyor pursuant to the provisions of the Act;
- “licence” means a licence to conduct an eating house granted pursuant to the provisions of this by-law;
- “local authority” means the Municipality of the City of Bayswater;
- “registered premises” means any premises which are registered as an eating house under this by-law;
- “restaurant” means any eating house wherein meals are consumed by the public does not include tea-rooms or take-away food premises;
- “Schedule” means a schedule to this by-law;
- “take-away food premises” means any eating house other than a restaurant or tea rooms where meals are prepared and served in a state in which they may be taken away from the eating house and consumed in that state but does not include premises in which meals are prepared and served but not eaten on the premises where those premises also have provision or facilities for meals to be eaten on the premises;
- “tea room” means any eating house where the foods served for consumption on the premises are tea, coffee and similar beverages, all products of wholesale pastry cooks, sandwiches of all types, toast, salads, cold meats, boiled, scrambled and poached eggs, omelettes, saveloys and similar products, beef tea, and other extracts or soups, and food supplied in tins or similar containers which need only to be heated to be served for consumption and where no food is cooked on the premises;
- “Town Clerk” means the Town Clerk or the Acting Town Clerk for the time being of the Municipality of the City of Bayswater;

The terms “eating house”, “meals”, “prescribed date” and “proprietor” shall have the same meanings as are given to them in section 160 of Division 3 of Part V of the Act.

Part II—Registration of Eating Houses and Licensing of Proprietors  
Classification

3. For the purposes of this by-law eating houses are classified as—

- (1) restaurants;
- (2) take-away food premises; and
- (3) tea rooms.

Prescribed Date

4. The prescribed date for the purposes of section 162 of the Act is the date upon which this by-law comes into operation.

Licenses and Registration

5. No person shall occupy or use any premises, or be concerned in the management or control of any premises, as a restaurant, tea rooms or take-away food premises unless—

- (1) The premises are registered under this by-law as a restaurant, tea room or take-away food premises, as the case may be, and
- (2) The proprietor of the premises is the holder of a licence under this by-law authorising him to conduct on the premises the business of a restaurant, tea rooms or take-away food premises, as the case may be.

6. (1) Before any premises are registered under this by-law, the occupier thereof shall make application in the form prescribed in the First Schedule and shall forward the application, together with a plan and specification of the premises which shall show the proposed location of all fixtures, fittings and equipment, together with details of the same, and nominate the number and sex of every person, including the proprietor or proprietors engaged in the preparation, manufacture, processing, cooking or serving of meals, in respect of which the application is made to the Town Clerk.

(2) Should the application be approved the Local Authority shall upon payment by the applicant of the fee prescribed in the Seventh Schedule, issue to the applicant a certificate of registration in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule.

7. (1) Before any licence to conduct a restaurant, tea room or take-away food premises is issued under this by-law, the proprietor of such restaurant, tea room or take-away food premises shall make application to the Town Clerk for a licence in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule.

(2) Should the application be approved the Local Authority shall upon payment by the applicant of the fee prescribed in the Seventh Schedule, issue to the applicant a licence in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule.

(3) Where there are two or more proprietors of an eating house—

- (a) each proprietor shall make application for a licence in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule;
- (b) the licence shall be issued in the joint names of the applicants, but no licence shall be issued unless the Local Authority approves all the applicants; and
- (c) each proprietor named in the licence shall be severally responsible for compliance with all the obligations of a proprietor under the Act and this by-law.

8. (1) Every certificate of registration of premises registered as a restaurant, tea rooms or take-away food premises, and every licence issued to a proprietor shall be signed by the Town Clerk. Every proprietor of registered premises shall keep the certificate of registration and the licence on the registered premises and shall, when requested so to do by a Health Surveyor, produce to him the certificate of registration and also the licence issued to the proprietor in respect of such premises.

(2) The proprietor shall at all times provide and maintain a notice board on which is legibly inscribed, in letters 25 mm high, the name of the person licensed to carry on business on the premises, and such notice board shall be fixed and maintained free from obstruction in a prominent position at the entrance of the premises.

9. For the purpose of section 163 of the Act every certificate of registration of an eating house and every licence for the proprietor of an eating house shall be in force from the date of issue thereof until and inclusive of the thirty first day of December next ensuing unless the same be cancelled in the meantime in accordance with the provisions of the Act or the premises cease to be used as a restaurant, tea room or take-away food premises.

10. Applications for the renewal of a certificate of registration of an eating house or a licence for the proprietor of an eating house shall be made annually during the month of December. Such applications shall be in the form prescribed in the Fifth and Sixth Schedules respectively and shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in the Seventh Schedule.

11. Any person who makes a false statement in or in connection with an application under Clauses 6, 7 or 10 hereof shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

12. (1) Where any statement contained in an application for registration of premises under this by-law ceases to be true, the certificate of registration issued pursuant thereto shall forthwith become void and the holder of such certificate shall forthwith deliver up such certificate to the Town Clerk.

(2) If any proposed change in the registered premises would have the effect of making false a statement contained in an application for a certificate of registration of premises under this by-law the occupier of the premises may make application under Clause 6 hereof for a new certificate of registration, and where such application is approved the Council shall, without fee, issue a new certificate of registration accordingly.

13. The fees to be paid to the Local Authority on the registration of premises, on the issuing of a licence and on the renewal of any registration or licence under this by-law shall be those prescribed in the Seventh Schedule.

14. Where any person holding a licence issued pursuant to this by-law changes his place of abode, he shall within 7 days after such change give notice thereof in writing to the Town Clerk specifying in such notice his new place of abode, and he shall at the same time produce such licence to the Town Clerk, who shall endorse thereon and sign a memorandum specifying the particulars or such change.

15. Where the holder of a certificate or registration of an eating house sells or transfers or agrees to sell or transfer his interest in the registered premises to another person, he shall within 14 days from the date of such sale, transfer or agreement notify the Town Clerk thereof in writing stating the full name, address and occupation of such other person and shall deliver such certificate to the Town Clerk for cancellation.

16. Where the holder of a licence as the proprietor of an eating house ceases to manage and control the premises named in the licence he shall forthwith notify the Town Clerk thereof in writing and shall deliver such licence to the Town Clerk for cancellation.

### Part III—Requirements Applicable to Eating Houses Structural Requirements

17. Without prejudice to the requirements of the Act and of all by-laws and regulations made thereunder for the time being in force the following requirements apply to premises used or occupied as an eating house—

- (1) There shall be provided a kitchen, scullery and food stores to the satisfaction of the Chief Health Surveyor.
- (2) The kitchen of a restaurant shall have a floor area of not less than 16 m<sup>2</sup> or 25 per cent of the floor area of that portion of the premises in which food is served to patrons, whichever is the greater, and where a cool room, freezer, scullery, food store or cupboard is situated in the same room as the kitchen the floor area occupied by it shall be deemed not to be part of the floor area of the kitchen.
- (3) The kitchen of a tea rooms or take-away food premises shall have a floor area as directed by the Chief Health Surveyor. The floor area shall be assessed following the submission of a plan of the kitchen showing the proposed position and number of all fittings and fixtures therein.

18. The following number of sanitary conveniences shall be provided in the eating house for the sole use of male persons engaged in the preparation, manufacture, processing, cooking or serving of meals—

21. An adequate supply of hot and cold water, soap, nail brushes and clean towels or other approved means of hygienically drying hands shall be provided for the use of persons using sanitary conveniences but no towel shall be provided for common use.

22. A sign shall be provided and maintained at the entrance to each sanitary convenience to indicate for which sex its use is intended.

23. Access for patrons to sanitary conveniences shall not be permitted through a kitchen or room wherein meals are prepared, manufactured, processed, cooked or thawed.

24. A kitchen or room where meals are prepared, manufactured, processed or cooked shall not communicate directly by means of a door, window or other opening with a sanitary convenience.

25. No outside area shall be used in conjunction with an eating house for serving meals to the public unless the whole of the area used for such purpose and a space of 1.2m beyond it in all directions—

- is paved with impervious material or a material approved by the Chief Health Surveyor;
- has a fall of not less than 1 in 120 to an impervious channel discharging over a trapped gully and properly connected to a drain; and
- the surface of the paving is finished smoothly and evenly so as to afford no lodgment for liquids.

#### Proprietor's Obligations

26. The proprietor of every eating house shall—

- keep or cause to be kept clean and in good condition and repair the floors, walls, ceiling and all portions of the premises and all fittings, stoves, ranges, utensils, implements, shelves, counters, bins, cabinets, fixtures, sinks, drain-boards, drains, grease-traps, tubs, vessels and things of the like description used on the premises or in connection with the preparation or storage of food thereon.
- Provide all furniture, fixtures, counters, bins, sinks, drain-boards, grease-traps, tubs, vessels, fittings, utensils, implements and things for use on the premises as the Chief Health Surveyor may from time to time direct for the proper conduct of the business.
- Construct and arrange or cause to be constructed or arranged all furniture, fixtures, counters, bins, sinks, drain-boards, tubs, vessels, fittings, utensils and things in every kitchen, serving room and scullery on the premises so that the floor in every such room or place may at all times be kept in a thoroughly clean and sanitary condition.
- Not keep or use any floor covering that is absorbent or in such a condition as to allow the lodgment of dirt thereunder, in any area used for the storage or preparation of food.

- (5) Provide and properly maintain at all times suitable and effective means for keeping and keep every room or compartment of the premises free from dust, rats, mice, cockroaches, flies, spiders, bugs, ants, moths and all other vermin, and if in the opinion of a Health Surveyor effective means and methods of cleansing and eradication of vermin from the premises cannot be carried out effectively while the ordinary business of the establishment is carried on, then the Local Authority may order the temporary closure of the premises to the public until such time as such cleansing and eradication of vermin has been carried out to the satisfaction of the Chief Health Surveyor and the proprietor shall comply with such an order.
- (6) For the purposes of keeping the premises free from rats comply with the provisions of the City of Bayswater Health By-laws and the Model By-laws Series "A".
- (7) Keep all portions of the premises free from any unwholesome or offensive odour arising from the premises or the operations carried on thereon.
- (8) Provide, maintain and clean a hood for the exhaust ventilation of every stove, oven, cooking fire, cooking apparatus and similar appliance in accordance with the provisions of the Act and any regulations and by-laws made thereunder.
- (9) Provide and maintain on the premises and in good condition a sufficient number of waste receptacles with closely fitting lids, constructed of galvanised iron or other non-absorbent and non-corrosive material or high density polyethylene carts complying with the local authority's by-laws for the purpose of receiving garbage, waste matter and other refuse arising from the business.
- (10) Comply with any direction from the Local Authority as to the number and type of waste receptacles to be provided on the premises and the place or places where such receptacles shall be kept.
- (11) When required by the Local Authority provide a room for the storage and cleaning of waste receptacles and ensure that such room—
  - (a) is constructed of brick, stone or concrete with the walls rendered and steel trowelled to a smooth, even surface;
  - (b) has a concrete floor, graded and drained to a waste outlet to be approved by the Chief Health Surveyor;
  - (c) is ventilated by such means as the Chief Health Surveyor shall direct;
  - (d) is provided with a hose cock connected to the main water supply;
  - (e) is provided with an impervious roof and a flyproof door; and
  - (f) is of a sufficient size to store all waste receptacles used in connection with the eating house.
- (12) Forthwith after garbage, waste matter and other refuse is produced place the same in the waste receptacles provided and kept in accordance with sub-clause (9) and remove or cause the contents of such waste receptacles to be removed from the premises as directed by the Chief Health Surveyor.
- (13) Thoroughly cleanse waste receptacles provided and kept in accordance with sub-clause (9) hereof and renew or repair any or all of the aforesaid receptacles as often as is necessary or when required by a Health Surveyor so to do.
- (14) Cause all tea towels, dish cloths, table linen, place mats, and other table coverings to be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.
- (15) Not permit or suffer any table napkin or serviette which has been used as such or for any other purpose by any person to be placed for use by or to be used by any other person unless such table napkin shall have been thoroughly washed and cleansed since it was previously used.
- (16) Provide a hand basin, together with soap, nail brush and disposable hand towels to every kitchen to enable staff to wash their hands.
- (17) Provide and maintain at all times an adequate supply of hot and cold water to every hand basin.
- (18) Not cause, suffer, or permit any hand basin to be used for any purpose other than personal ablutions and shall not install any hand basin under a counter, table, cabinet console or console table.
- (19) Ensure that whenever a hermetically sealed container (not being one made wholly of glass or stoneware) has been opened the entire contents thereof are removed immediately therefrom and not permit the contents to be kept therein.
- (20) Not permit or suffer any food which is unsound, unwholesome, putrescent or weevilled to be used for food or for the preparation of food or meals.
- (21) Cause any food which is or has become unsound, unwholesome, putrescent or weevilled to be immediately withdrawn from sale, stock or use and placed in the waste food garbage bin.
- (22) Provide adequate and efficient means of refrigeration for the preservation of food.
- (23) Remove or cause to be removed any food which has been served to a person or placed on a table occupied by a person and which has not been consumed or removed by him immediately after that person has finished his refreshment and not permit any food so removed to be served again to any other person on the premises but to cause it immediately to be deposited in the waste food garbage bin, but this paragraph does not apply to—
  - (a) any of the following substances—sugar, pepper, salt, mustard, vinegar, sauces, spices or condiments which are contained in receptacles so that the contents cannot be handled;
  - (b) bread which is placed in a receptacle or container of a design which ensures that the contents are handled only when required.
- (24) Not gut, clean or scale any fish on any portion of the premises unless such portion of the premises shall have been constructed for such purpose and approved in writing by the Chief Health Surveyor and shall not store any fish in any kitchen or food store on the premises unless such fish has already been gutted, cleaned, scaled and washed.
- (25) Not allow, permit or suffer any live animal or bird to be kept in or upon any portion of the premises or allow or permit or suffer any animals or bird to be slaughtered and dressed or any poultry, pigeons or game to be plucked in any part of the premises.

- (26) Not allow, permit or suffer the preparation, manufacture, processing, cooking, storage, packing or service of any food in an eating house in which any work is carried on that may or is likely to contaminate such food or affect its wholesomeness or cleanliness.
- (27) Provide and maintain a suitable change room for employees if all of one sex, or suitable separate change rooms for each sex with each change room being at least 3m<sup>2</sup> in area with an additional 0.7m<sup>2</sup> of area for each male or female persons above for usually employed on the premises.
- (28) Not permit or suffer any hat or clothing to be placed or kept in any room open to the public or in any kitchen, scullery or food store provided that patrons may be permitted to hang their hats and coats in any room open to the public.
- (29) Not cause, suffer or permit any food contained in a package, tin or container or any cooking, eating or drinking utensil to be stored in any place other than a cabinet, cupboard or shelf.
- (30) Not use, keep or store or permit to be used, kept or stored any petrol, bottles or containers of liquified petroleum gas, kerosene, benzine, naphtha, alcohol, mineralised or methylated spirit or any volatile liquid (not being an article of food) in any kitchen or room where food is prepared, manufactured, processed, cooked or stored.
- (31) Not permit, suffer or cause to be made or done to or on the registered premises any alteration, addition or other work for any purpose affecting or likely to affect the suitability of the premises for the use specified in the licence granted under this by-law in respect of such premises without the previous consent in writing of the Chief Health Surveyor.
- (32) Not permit, suffer or cause any structural alterations to be made to the premises or any portion thereof without first having obtained permission in writing from the Local Authority.
- (33) Not permit or suffer a greater number of persons to be accommodated at any one time in any public room on the premises than will allow of a ratio of one person to every 1m<sup>2</sup> of the available floor area of such room.
- (34) Not permit to be used for any other purpose any cloth used for drying utensils or other articles used for the consumption of food.
- (35) Not allow any person to be engaged in the preparation, processing, cooking or serving of meals unless that person is wearing clean, washable or disposable clothing and has a cap which adequately covers the hair.
- (36) Not suffer or permit any food to be prepared, manufactured, processed, cooked or thawed in any room wherein any water closet or urinal or any wash hand basin for use in connection with the same is situated.
- (37) Cause all drinking straws to be protected from contamination by flies, dust or other sources.
- (38) Not cause, suffer or permit any spittoon or any article or thing for like use to be kept on the premises.
- (39) Cause all food to be at all times protected from the direct rays of the sun, and immediately upon delivery place any perishable food stuffs into a refrigerated cabinet.

#### Part IV—Exemptions and Penalties

##### Exemptions

27. The provisions of by-laws 17 (1) (2) (3), 18, 19, 20, 23 and 26 (27) do not apply to an eating house which operated immediately prior to the coming into operation of this by-law unless or until the premises are altered, extended or rebuilt.

##### Penalties

28. A person who commits a breach or fails to comply with any of the requirements of this by-law commits an offence and is liable to a maximum penalty of \$100.00 and where the breach is of a continuing nature to an additional daily penalty not exceeding \$4.00 for every day during which the breach is continued.

HEALTH ACT 1911  
Shire of Goomalling  
Mobile Rubbish Bin By-laws

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act 1911, as amended, a Local Authority may alter, amend or repeal any by-laws so made or adopted: Now, therefore, the Shire of Goomalling, being a Local Authority within the meaning of the Act, and having adopted the Model By-laws described as Series "A" as reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on 17 July 1963, both hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted by-laws shall be amended as follows.

1. The principal by-laws are amended by deleting By-laws 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 of Part 1 and substituting the following—

12. Interpretation

In this by-law and in By-laws 13 to 15 inclusive of this Part unless the context requires otherwise—

"building line" has the meaning given to it in and for the purposes of the Local Government Act 1960;

"Health Surveyor" means the Health Surveyor of the local Authority;

"collection time" means the collection time from time to time notified to the occupier of the premises by the local Authority or its contractor;

"kerb line" means the point where the road carriageway adjoins the road verge;

"receptacle" means a polyethylene cart fitted with wheels and a handle and with a lid and of a capacity of 240 or 120 litres supplied by the Local Authority or its contractor or other type of receptacle specified or approved by the Local Authority;

13. Refuse Receptacles and Collection

(1) The occupier of every premises in the district shall—

- (a) subject to paragraph (c) hereof, cause all refuse to be deposited in a receptacle;
- (b) at all times keep the lid of the receptacle closed except when depositing refuse in or cleaning the receptacle;
- (c) not deposit or permit to be deposited in a receptacle—
  - (i) more than 70 kg of refuse at any one time;
  - (ii) any material being or consisting of—
    - A. Hot or burning ashes
    - B. Oil
    - C. Liquid
    - D. Paint
    - E. Solvent
    - F. Bricks, concrete, earth or other like substances;
  - (iii) heavy material;
  - (iv) an object which is greater in length, width or breadth than the corresponding dimensions of the receptacle or which will not allow the lid of the receptacle to be tightly closed;
  - (v) refuse which is or is likely to become offensive or a nuisance or to give off an offensive or noxious odour or to attract flies or cause fly breeding unless it is first wrapped in absorbent or impervious material or placed in a sealed impervious container;
- (d) except for collection keep the receptacle on the premises located behind the building line, or other location approved by the Health Surveyor;
- (e) collection of Receptacle—
  - (i) prior to the collection time, place the receptacle between the kerb line and the premises 1 to 4 metres from the kerb line and such that it does not obstruct any footpath, cycleway or other carriageway. The receptacle may otherwise be placed at a position specifically approved by the Health Surveyor, and
  - (ii) after the contents of the receptacle have been removed, return the receptacle to its place of storage;
- (f) at all times keep the receptacle clean and whenever directed by the Health Surveyor to do so place and keep in the receptacle a deodorant material approved by the Health Surveyor;
- (g) notify the Local Authority within seven days after the event if the receptacle is lost, stolen, damaged or becomes defective.

(2) Any employee of Council or its contractor collecting refuse shall return receptacles to a location as close as possible to that where they were located immediately before being emptied but not so as to obstruct any footpath, cycleway, driveway, service road or other carriageway.

(3) In the case of residential premises consisting of more than three dwellings, units or flats or premises used for commercial or industrial purposes the Local Authority may require the use of a receptacle or receptacles other than a polyethylene cart fitted with wheels and a handle and the occupier of those premises shall comply with and observe the direction given by the Local Authority.

(4) The occupier of every premises in the district who is required under Sub-Bylaw (3) of this by-law to use a receptacle other than a polyethylene cart fitted with wheels and a handle shall—

- (a) cause all refuse to be deposited in a receptacle in a manner which is compatible with the type of receptacle used;
- (b) take all reasonable steps to prevent fly breeding in and the emission of offensive or noxious odour from the receptacle;
- (c) cause the receptacle to be located on the premises in a position where—
  - (i) it is screened so as not to be visible from a street but be readily accessible for the purpose of collection of the contents thereof;
  - (ii) it does not obstruct any footpath, cycleway, driveway, service road, or other carriageway on those premises;
  - (iii) it does not cause a nuisance to the occupiers of adjoining premises;

- (d) at all times keep the receptacle clean and whenever directed by the Health Surveyor to do so, place and keep in the receptacle a deodorant material approved by the Health Surveyor;
- (e) where the premises are used for the manufacture, preparation or sale of foods or any putrescible refuse emanates from the premises cause the receptacle to be cleaned with a suitable detergent and treated with a disinfectant at least once per week.
- (5) The Health Surveyor may direct that refuse of the type referred to in paragraph (e) of Sub-Bylaw (4) hereof or which emanates from premises referred to in that paragraph be collected and removed more often than once per week.
- (6) Where refuse emanating from premises is of a nature that the Health Surveyor considers requires to be treated before being placed in a receptacle he may give directions as to the manner in which it is to be so treated and the occupier of those premises shall comply with those directions.
14. Receptacle Ownership—  
A receptacle supplied by the Local Authority or its contractor remains the property of the Local Authority or its contractor, as the case may be.
15. Removal and Disposal of Refuse—
- (1) A person shall not unless he is authorised by the Local Authority to do so remove any house or trade refuse or other rubbish from any premises in the townsite of Goomalling.
- (2) Where Council provides approval pursuant to By-laws 15 (1) hereof, such rubbish or refuse shall be disposed of at a refuse disposal site approved by the Executive Director of Public Health pursuant to the provisions of the Health Act 1911.
2. By-law 18 of Part 1 of the principal by-laws is amended by deleting "cart" in the by-law heading and in line 2 and substituting "collection vehicle".

## POISONS ACT 1964

## POISONS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Poisons Amendment Regulations 1988*.

**Principal regulations**

## APPENDIX C

## POISONS AND HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES REQUIRED TO BE LABELLED WITH FIRST AID MEASURES

Except where otherwise stated, a poison or hazardous substance in this Appendix includes any derivative, compound, preparation or admixture included in relation to that item in a Schedule in Appendix A to the Poisons Act.

## Part 1

## Standard Statements

- (a) If poisoning occurs, contact a doctor or Poisons Information Centre.
- (b) If swallowed, and if more than 15 minutes from a hospital induce vomiting, preferably using Ipecac Syrup (APF).
- (c) If swallowed, do NOT induce vomiting. Give a glass of water.
- (d) Avoid giving milk or oils.
- (e) Avoid giving alcohol.
- (f) If skin contact occurs, remove contaminated clothing and wash skin thoroughly.
- (g) Remove from contaminated area. Apply artificial respiration if not breathing.
- (h) If swallowed, induce vomiting, preferably using Ipecac Syrup (APF) and give one atropine tablet every 15 minutes until dryness of the mouth occurs—if poisoned by skin absorption or through lungs, remove any contaminated clothing, wash skin thoroughly and give atropine tablets as above. Get to a doctor or hospital quickly.
- (i) If poisoning occurs get to a doctor or hospital quickly.
- (j) If swallowed, give 1-3 cups of olive oil or other cooking oil or milk. Get to a doctor or hospital quickly.
 

(Cresols or Phenols 25 per cent or less) If spilt on skin remove any contaminated clothing, wash thoroughly with soap and water, then methylated spirit.

(Cresols or Phenols above 25 per cent) If spilt on skin, remove any contaminated clothing, swab repeatedly with glycerine, PEG (polyethylene glycol) or PEG—methylated spirit mixture or if necessary methylated spirit alone.
- (k) Remove from contaminated area. Give oxygen and, if necessary, artificial respiration. Remove contaminated clothing and wash contaminated skin thoroughly. Get to a hospital or doctor quickly.
- (l) Give activated charcoal and keep patient quiet, in a dark place if possible.
- (m) If accidentally sucked, give milk or water, contact a doctor or Poisons Information Centre.
- (n) If sprayed on skin, wash thoroughly. If sprayed in mouth, give milk or water.
- (o) If swallowed do NOT induce vomiting. Give water or milk, then raw egg.
- (r) If swallowed, give raw egg if available, then if more than 15 minutes from a hospital induce vomiting, preferably using Ipecac Syrup (APF).
- (s) If in eyes, hold eyes open, flood with water for at least 15 minutes and see a doctor.

Note: Where there is conflict between the First Aid Statements of two or more poisons or hazardous substances present in the preparation the Permanent Head may issue by a notice a recommended First Aid Statement for that preparation.

#### FIRE BRIGADES ACT 1942

#### FIRE BRIGADES AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

##### Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Fire Brigades Amendment Regulations 1988*.

##### Principal regulations

2. In these regulations the *Fire Brigades Regulations 1943\** are referred to as the principal regulations.

[\*Reprinted in the Gazette 12 February 1973 at pp. 389-438. For amendments to 30 December 1987 see pp. 232-233 of 1986 Index to Legislation of Western Australia.]

##### Regulation 95 amended

3. Regulation 95 of the principal regulations is amended in paragraph (a) by inserting after "citizen" the following—

“ or a permanent resident of Australia as defined in the *Migration Act 1958* of the Commonwealth ”.

##### Regulation 163 amended

4. Regulation 163 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) by deleting "No person shall be registered on the roll of any brigade unless he is—" and substituting the following—

“ (1) Subject to subregulation (2), a person shall not be registered on the roll of a brigade unless that person is— ”;

(b) in paragraph (c) by deleting " Provided that the Board may, in special cases, consent to the enrolment of a person outside this age group"; and

(c) by inserting the following subregulation—

“ (2) Notwithstanding subregulation (1) (c), a person may be registered on the roll of a brigade—

(a) where the person is over the age of 45 years, if the Board so agrees in a particular case; and

(b) as a Probationary Volunteer Fireman, where the person is over the age of 16 years but not over the age of 17 years provided that the person shall not be transferred to the active volunteer grade or reserve volunteer grade under regulation 167 unless—

(i) the written consent of a parent or guardian of the person to the transfer has been received by the Chief Officer;

(ii) the brigade Captain is of the opinion that the person is a suitable person to be an active member of the brigade; and

(iii) the person has successfully completed a fire fighter study programme approved by the Board. ”.

##### Regulation 167 amended

5. Regulation 167 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) in subregulation (1) by inserting after "service" the following—

“ and in the case of a person not over the age of 17, after regulation 163 (2) (b) has been complied with ”;

(b) by repealing subregulation (3) and substituting the following subregulation—

“ (3) Where a new brigade is inaugurated the Board may enrol persons over the age of 17 as Active Volunteer Firemen notwithstanding that they have not served 3 months as Probationary Volunteer Firemen if the Board is satisfied that they have each had sufficient training to equip them as active members of the brigade. ”; and

(c) in subregulation (4) by deleting "17" and substituting the following—

“ 16 ”.

1.2 Qualifying Clauses:

1.2.1 The uses within the Service Trades/Industrial Area referred to as a Builders Storage Yard, Trade Display or a Garden Centre shall include the construction of a building in accordance with Clause 2.3.1 of this Schedule.

1.2.2 The use within both the Service Trades/Industrial Area and the Service Trades/Commercial Area referred to as Educational Establishment shall only be for industry related education.

1.2.3 The use within the Service Trades/Industrial Area referred to as Take Away/Fast Foods shall mean a lunch shop only.

1.2.4 The use within the Service Trades/Commercial Area referred to as Automotive Repairs shall be for comprehensive fitting stations only (e.g. tyre fitting/muffler fitting) and does not include Mechanical repairs alone. Mechanical repairs will be treated as a use within this use class only where it is part of a comprehensive development for other automotive services.

1.2.5 The use within the Service Trades/Industrial Area referred to as Office shall only be for offices having limited or infrequent contact with the public.

## 2. Additional Development Requirements—

### 2.1 Restricted Business/Civic Use Area—

The following development standards and requirements shall be complied with in this sub-area.

#### 2.1.1 Building Form—

2.1.1.1 The minimum floorspace of showroom premises open to the public shall be 200 m<sup>2</sup>.

2.1.1.2 Boundary fencing shall not be permitted.

2.1.1.3 Fencing other than boundary fencing shall be allowed only in exceptional circumstances.

#### 2.1.2 Materials—

2.1.2.1 External walls of all buildings shall be either concrete blockwork, faced brickwork or bagged brickwork or otherwise finished in such a manner as to give the same effect.

2.1.2.2 Roofing materials shall be sheet metal. Tiled roofs may be allowed where they are in keeping with the general design of a particular building.

2.1.2.3 Reflective glass shall not be permitted where its reflective value is equal to or greater than 16%.

#### 2.1.3 Colours—

2.1.3.1 External walls of all buildings shall be painted with paint which corresponds with the colour code 10C33 (AS 1433-1972). (Commonly known as Beige).

2.1.3.2 Sheet metal roofs which are visible to pedestrians shall be painted with paint which corresponds with the colour code 10C39 or 12B25 (AS 1433-1972). (Commonly known as Olive Green).

2.1.3.3 Verandah posts, exposed beams and trim fittings shall be painted with paint which corresponds with the colour code 06C39 (AS 1433-1972). (Commonly known as Mission Brown). Window and door frames shall be painted in a paint which corresponds with the colour code 10B25 (AS 1433-1972). (Commonly known as Olive Green).

### 2.2 Service Trades—Commercial Area

2.2.1 No vehicular access to or from lots within this sub-area shall be permitted from Yirrigan Drive or Northwood Drive.

2.2.2 The minimum floorspace for all developments other than offices and veterinary consulting rooms shall be 300 m<sup>2</sup>.

### 2.3 Service Trades/Industrial Area

The following development standards or requirements shall be complied with in this sub-area.

#### 2.3.1 Building Form

2.3.1.1 The building shall be constructed within the relevant building envelope set out in Plan 2 to this Schedule.

2.3.1.2 The building shall be constructed across the full width of the lot.

2.3.1.3 The building shall be single storey.

2.3.1.4 The front wall of the building may be set back from the front boundary of the lot provided that the setback area is paved in the same materials and in the same way as the footpath.

2.3.1.5 The facade of the building at the front of the lot shall substantially comply with the module dimensions shown on Plan 3 to this Schedule or multiples thereof. Horizontal divisions shall be as follows—

Sill Height (if required)—700 mm

Door Height—2 000 mm

Ceiling Height (sales/office)—2 700 mm

Front Fascia Height—1 115 mm

Ceiling Height (storage/work)—5 000 mm

Upper Fascia Height—1 200 mm

2.3.1.6 The roof height shall not extend above the height of the front fascias. See Plan 3 of this Schedule.

2.3.1.7 Generally the parapet walls along the side boundaries, and especially the outside walls of the end lots, shall be the same height as the front fascias for their entire length. There shall be no incremental stepping of the parapet walls.

2.3.1.8 A verandah shall extend from the front of the building to the edge of the footpath kerbing and shall comply with the requirements set out hereunder. See Plan 3 of this Schedule.

(a) It shall span the width of the lot measured from the inside edges of the side parapet walls;

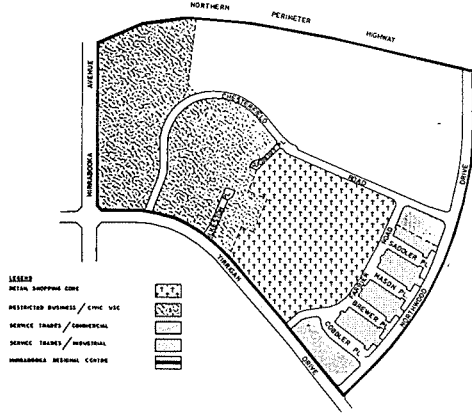

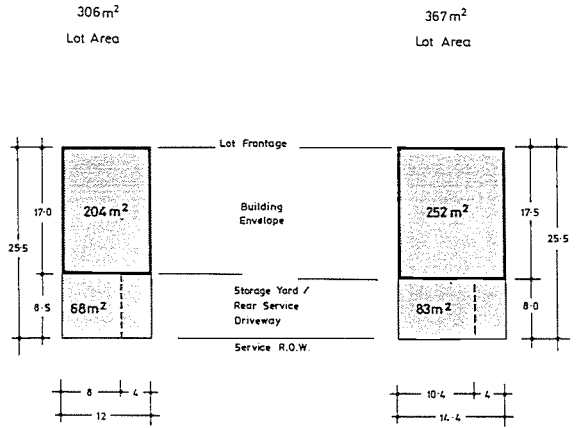

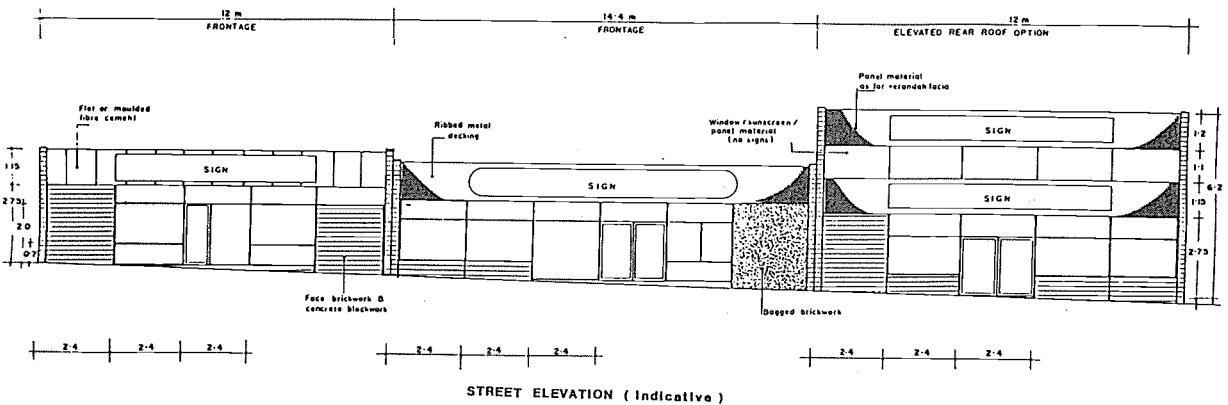

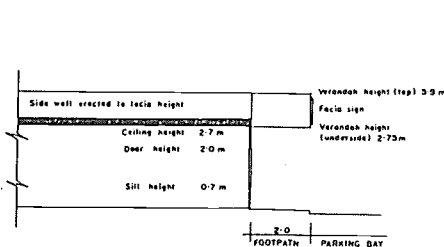

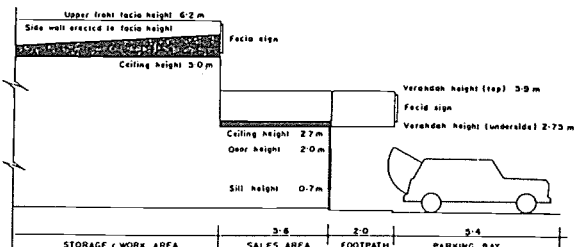

## (A) Financial Statements—

- (i) We have audited the accompanying accounts of the Shire of Laverton for the year ended 30 June 1987, in accordance with the requirements of the Local Government Audit Directions and the Australian Auditing Standards.
- (ii) The Debtors ledger of the Shire has not been properly maintained or reconciled, consequently we have been unable to obtain assurance that amounts shown on the balance sheet totalling \$258 873.02 as at 30 June 1987 are complete, accurate or collectable. The accounts affected in the balance sheet are as follows—

Included in the above balances are amounts totalling \$85 139.80 carried forward from prior periods and covered by our audit report for the year ended 30 June 1986.

- (iii) The rates adopted by the Shire of Laverton to allocate Public Works Overheads and Plant Operating costs to job cost centres on which labour and plant were employed during the year were inadequate, resulting in an underallocation of \$105 457.90 being \$42 616.52 (31%) of Public Works Overheads and \$62 841.38 (33%) of Plant Operating Costs. Consequently we believe that the amounts shown as expenditure on Schedules 4-14 of the financial statements have been understated in aggregate by \$105 457.90
- (iv) The Shire did not maintain a stores and materials ledger during the year and no physical count of stock on hand was made on 30 June 1987. As a result we were unable to determine either the quantity or value of such stocks as at balance date or whether the figure of \$597.50 shown in the balance sheet is an accurate reflection of such stocks.
- (v) As no physical stocktake of Fixed assets owned by the Shire has been performed as required by Local Government Accounting Directions paragraph 2b (5) and the Shire Clerk has not prepared a certificate as to the reliability of the Inventory Register we are unable to determine if the figures shown as Fixed Assets on the balance sheet as at 30 June 1987 are a true reflection of the assets actually owned by the Shire of Laverton as at that date.
- (vi) In our opinion, except for the matters referred to in the preceding paragraphs, the accompanying accounts are drawn up in accordance with the books of the council and fairly present the requirements of the Local Government Act and the Local Government Accounting Directions which are to be dealt with in preparing the Accounts.

## (B) Statutory Compliance

The Shire has not complied with the requirements of the Local Government Accounting Direction Paragraph 50 (2) to prepare quarterly accounts and also failed to produce monthly accounts as required by Paragraph 50 (1) for all months of the year ended 30 June 1987. In addition the Shire has not adopted a system of accrual accounting throughout the year as required by the Accounting Directions.

With the exception of the abovementioned matters and subject to matters raised in our management report we did not become aware of any other instances where the council did not comply with the statutory requirements of the Local Government Act and Local Government Accounting Directions.

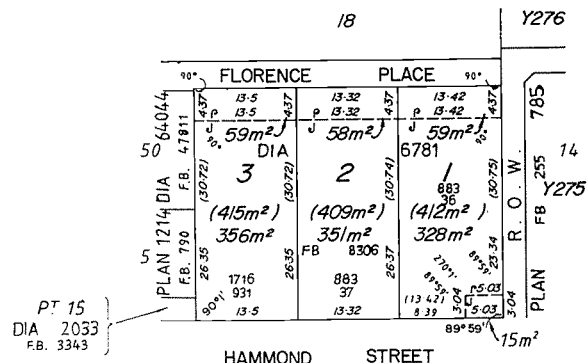

Parking Station No. 26 Hackett Drive commencing at the eastern side of Hackett Drive at a point 503 metres south of the City boundary in a southerly direction for 410 metres.

The hours referred to in clause 20 (a) of Parking Facilities By-law No. 29 are in the case of Parking Stations numbers 1, 2, 3, 4, 14, 19, 20, 21, 23, 24, 25 and 26 are 8.00 am to 6.00 pm Monday to Friday inclusive.

## By-laws Relating to Bees Kept on Residential Zoned Land

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on 15 February 1988 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws.

1. In this By-law, unless the context requires otherwise—

“Act” means Local Government Act 1960 (as amended).

“District” means the District of the Shire of Kalamunda.

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Kalamunda.

“Residential” means any land zoned Residential under Council’s District Planning Scheme.

“Shire Clerk” means the Shire Clerk/Chief Executive for the Municipality of the Shire of Kalamunda.

2. (a) No person shall keep bees in an area zoned for residential purposes within the Shire of Kalamunda, without first having obtained written approval of the Shire Clerk of the Council.

(b) Such approval is subject to the provision of a current Certificate of Registration as a beekeeper from the Department of Agriculture.

3. (a) No person shall keep more than two hives of bees on any land zoned for residential purposes within the Municipality of the Shire of Kalamunda.

(b) Subject to compliance with all Statutes and By-laws, Council may, upon written application, grant exemption to sub by-law (a) of this By-law, to apiarists on residential land who can demonstrate sound hive management.

(c) Approval which has been granted under sub-by-law (b) of this by-law may be withdrawn at any time if Council is of the opinion that a nuisance exists for occupiers of other residential premises.

4. A person shall not keep, or permit to be kept, bees in a bee hive on any residential zoned land within the District unless—

(a) prior to the siting of hives an adequate supply of water is provided not less than ten (10) metres from the proposed site of the bee hive; and

(b) the bee hive is screened in a manner which affords protection to neighbouring residents and passer by; and

(c) the bee hive is not less than five (5) metres from a boundary fence.

5. A person shall not keep bees in such a manner as to cause a nuisance to any other person.

6. Whenever, in the opinion of Council, a nuisance arises because of the keeping of bees, Council may order the withdrawal of approval and direct a landowner to remove bee hives from his property within a time specified in a written Notice.

7. Any person who fails to comply with a written notice referred to in by-law 6, or contravenes this by-law or any part thereof, commits an offence and shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding \$200.

be known as the "secondary" work programme, should only include work expected to involve a substantial exploration component—appraisal work should not be included.

## (b) Particulars of—

- (i) the technical qualifications of the applicant and of its employees;
- (ii) the technical advice available to the applicant;
- (iii) the financial resources available to the applicant, including evidence of the applicant's ability to fund the work programme proposed, a statement of other exploration plans and commitments over the next six years, and a copy of the latest annual report for each applicant company;
- (iv) where relevant, the viability of the consortium lodging the application, including evidence that a satisfactory settlement has been, or can be, reached on a Joint Operating Agreement (a copy of a Heads of Agreement dealing will generally suffice);
