## Local Government Act 1960

## ORDERS IN COUNCIL

**PRISONS ACT 1981**

**PRISONS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 2) 1988**

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Prisons Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1988*.

**Insertion of regulation 54C**

2. After regulation 54B of the *Prisons Regulations 1982\** the following regulation is inserted—

**Separation of prisoners**

" 54C. (1) The permanent head may, where he is of the opinion that the management, control or security of a prison or of the prisoners therein requires—

- (a) that prisoners of a particular category or description be confined in a separate part of the prison—
  - (i) by instrument in writing declare that a part of the prison specified in the instrument is set aside for the confinement of that particular category or description of prisoner;
  - (ii) from time to time determine the prisoners who shall be confined in that part of the prison; and
  - (iii) by order under section 35 of the Act make provision for the management, control, security and routine in that part of the prison and of the prisoners confined in that part;
- (b) that special provision be made for prisoners of a particular category or description—
  - (i) by order under section 35 of the Act make provision for the management, control, security and routine of such prisoners; and
  - (ii) from time to time determine the prisoners to whom those provisions shall apply.

(2) The permanent head may by instrument in writing amend, or revoke a declaration under subregulation (1) (a) (i) or may revoke the declaration and substitute another declaration for it.

(3) Nothing in subregulation (1) affects the application of these regulations to any prisoner but, subject to that limitation, the provisions as to management, control, security and routine—

- (a) applicable in a part of a prison set aside under subregulation (1) (a) (i) and to the prisoners confined in that part; or
- (b) applicable under subregulation (1) (b) to prisoners of a particular category or description,

may differ from those applicable in other parts or another part of the prison or to other prisoners or prisoners of another category or description. "

HOSPITALS ACT 1927

NARROGIN REGIONAL HOSPITAL (TRAFFIC AND GROUNDS) BY-LAWS 1988

MADE by the Minister under sections 7 and 22.

Part I—Preliminary

Citation

1. These by-laws may be cited as the *Narrogin Regional Hospital (Traffic and Grounds) By-laws 1988*.

Commencement

2. These by-laws shall come into operation on 1 July 1988.

**Interpretation**

3. (1) In these by-laws, unless the contrary intention appears—
- “Administrator” means the person holding or acting in the office of chief executive officer (however designated) of the hospital;
  - “authorized person” means an officer or servant of the Board authorized in writing by the Administrator for the purpose of these by-laws;
  - “Board” means the Minister for Health being the Board, pursuant to section 7 of the Act, of the Narrogin Regional Hospital;
  - “driver”, in relation to a vehicle, includes rider;
  - “hospital” means the Narrogin Regional Hospital;
  - “parking facility” means any land or structure on the site containing a parking space or parking spaces;
  - “parking space” means a section whether in a parking facility or not which is marked by means of painted lines or metallic studs or similar devices for the purpose of indicating where a vehicle may be parked;
  - “roadway” means a part of the site which, although it is not a road within the meaning of the *Road Traffic Act 1974*, is set aside for use by vehicular traffic, but excludes a parking facility;
  - “sign” means marking, notice or sign marked, erected or displayed by or by authority of the Administrator;
  - “speed restriction sign” means a sign erected or marked in or about a roadway containing a numeral or numerals;
  - “the site” means the grounds attached to or belonging to the hospital;
  - “vehicle” has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Act 1974*.
- (2) Subject to sub-bylaw (3) when these by-laws prohibit the doing of an act or thing without permission—
- (a) that permission shall be in writing and may be given and revoked by the Administrator or by an officer or servant of the Board authorized by the Administrator to give and revoke that permission; and
  - (b) that permission shall be obtained before the act or thing is done.
- (3) An officer or servant of the Board acting in the course of his employment has the permission referred to in sub-bylaw (2) without that sub-bylaw being complied with in respect of him.

**Part II—Grounds****No entry without cause**

4. A person shall not enter or remain on the site without a reasonable excuse.

**Directions concerning use of certain areas**

5. (1) An authorized person may, by the display, erection or marking of a sign or notice, direct that a specified part of the site shall be open to members of the public or a specified section of the public subject to compliance with such conditions as may be specified.
- (2) A direction given under sub-bylaw (1) may be varied or cancelled by the Administrator.
- (3) In this by-law “specified” means specified in the relevant direction given under sub-bylaw (1).
- (4) A person who contravenes a direction given under sub-bylaw (1) commits an offence.

**Part III—Traffic Control***Division 1—General***Driving of vehicles**

6. (1) A person shall not, without permission, drive or bring a vehicle on any portion of the site unless that portion is a roadway or a parking facility.
- (2) A person shall not, without permission, drive or bring a vehicle, the unladen weight of which exceeds 4 tonnes, on any portion of the site.
- (3) A person shall not drive, use or stand a vehicle in any portion of the site contrary to any sign displayed in relation to that portion of the site.

**Driver to obey reasonable direction**

7. Notwithstanding anything in these by-laws, the driver of a vehicle shall obey any reasonable direction given to him by an authorized person in relation to the parking or movement of the vehicle.

**Speed limits**

8. (1) A person shall not drive a vehicle on a roadway—
- (a) where no speed restriction sign is displayed—at a speed exceeding 10 kilometres an hour;
  - (b) where a speed restriction sign is displayed in relation to a portion of a roadway—at a speed exceeding the speed indicated on the speed restriction sign.
- (2) Sub-bylaw (1) does not apply to or in relation to an emergency vehicle.

**Give way**

9. The driver of a vehicle that is entering or preparing to enter a parking facility shall give way to any vehicle that is—
- (a) leaving the parking facility; or
  - (b) travelling in the roadway in the vicinity of his vehicle.



**Roadway not to be used for instructions or repairs**

10. A person shall not on a roadway in the site—
- (a) drive a vehicle for the purposes of giving or receiving driving instructions;
  - (b) except in an emergency, effect repairs or adjustments or both to a vehicle.

*Division 2—Parking***Parking only in parking spaces**

11. A person shall not park a vehicle in the site except in a parking space.

**Signs to be obeyed**

12. A person shall not park, stand or move a vehicle in a parking facility in the site contrary to any direction contained in a sign.

**Parking in parking spaces**

13. (1) A person shall not park, stand or move a vehicle in a parking facility in the site contrary to any directions contained in a sign.

(2) Where a sign indicates that a parking facility or portion of a parking facility is set aside—

- (a) for a specified vehicle or specified class of vehicles;
- (b) for the vehicle of a specified person or specified class of persons;
- (c) for parking of vehicles for a specified period of time; or
- (d) for the parking of vehicles for a maximum period of time so specified,

a person shall not park a vehicle in the parking facility or portion of the parking facility unless—

- (e) the vehicle is the particular vehicle or is within the class of vehicle so specified;
- (f) the vehicle is the vehicle of the person or a person of the class so specified;
- (g) the vehicle is parked within the period of time so specified;
- (h) the vehicle is parked for a period that does not exceed the maximum period of time so specified,

as the case requires.

- (3) In this sub-by-law “specified” means specified in a sign.

**Part IV—Offences and Penalties****Definition**

14. In this Part—

“alleged offender”, in respect of a vehicle on or in which an infringement notice has been left under by-law 17 by an authorized person includes registered owner of the vehicle;

“infringement notice” means infringement notice referred to in by-law 17;

“modified penalty” means modified penalty prescribed in Schedule 1 for an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws.

**Offences and penalty**

15. Subject to by-law 16 a person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of these by-laws commits an offence.

Penalty: \$50.

**Modified penalties**

16. (1) A person who does not contest an allegation that he committed an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws may pay to the hospital within the time specified in the relevant infringement notice or within such extended time as the Administrator allows the modified penalty prescribed for that offence in Schedule 1.

(2) The production of an acknowledgement from the hospital of the payment in accordance with sub-by-law (1) of the modified penalty concerned is a defence to a charge of the offence in respect of which that modified penalty was paid.

**Infringement notices**

17. (1) An authorized person who believes on reasonable grounds that a person has committed an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws may serve on that person an infringement notice by delivering it to the alleged offender or by affixing it to the vehicle of the alleged offender.

(2) An infringement notice shall be in the form of Form 1 in Schedule 2 and shall—

- (a) be identified by a serial number;
- (b) identify the alleged offender by reference to his name and address or the vehicle make and registration number of his vehicle;
- (c) state the by-law under which the offence is alleged to have been committed, and the brief description of offence and modified penalty set out opposite that by-law in Schedule 1; and
- (d) inform the alleged offender in general terms that if he does not wish to have a complaint of the alleged offence heard and determine by a court of summary jurisdiction, then he may deliver the amount of the modified penalty to an authorized person within the time provided in the infringement notice, which shall not be less than 14 days.

**Modified penalties procedure**

18. (1) A person who does not contest an allegation that he has committed an offence under Parts III and IV of these by-laws may complete the infringement notice by signing the admission on that notice and forwarding the infringement notice and the amount of the modified penalty set out in Schedule 1 opposite the by-law alleged to have been breached to an authorized person specified in the infringement notice.

(2) Upon receipt of a modified penalty under sub-by-law (1) sent within the time provided in the infringement notice or such further time as an authorized person allows, the authorized person shall issue to the person paying that modified penalty an acknowledgement.

**Withdrawal of infringement notice**

19. An authorized person, not being the person who issued the infringement notice, may by notice in the form of Form 2 in Schedule 2 served on the alleged offender withdraw an infringement notice.

**Removal and endorsement of infringement notices**

20. A person other than an authorized person who—

- (a) makes an endorsement on or alteration to an infringement notice; or
- (b) not being the driver registered owner or person in charge of a vehicle to which an infringement notice is attached, removes the infringement notice,

commits an offence.

**Other penalties for illegally parked vehicles**

21. (1) An addition to any other penalty, a vehicle parked in breach of these by-laws or a vehicle which is left on the site for more than three days may be removed by order of the Administrator to a storage place within the site.

(2) For the purpose of removing a vehicle under sub-by-law (1), a person authorized by the Administrator may take such action by way of unlocking, driving, towing or otherwise as is reasonably necessary.

**Authorized person may request name and address**

22. Where an offence under these by-laws is alleged to have been committed by the driver or person in charge of a vehicle then the registered owner of the vehicle shall, if required to do so by an authorized person, supply the name and address of the person driving or in charge of the vehicle at the time the offence is alleged to have been committed and in the event that he refuses to do so, he shall be deemed to be the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at the time the offence is alleged to have been committed.

**Part V—General****Other offences**

23. A person who—

- (a) wilfully obstructs any officer or servant of the Board in the discharge of his duty under these by-laws;
- (b) removes, damages, defaces or misuses a sign;
- (c) disobeys or fails to comply with any notice or sign, including a traffic sign erected or displayed by an authorized person in accordance with these by-laws,

commits an offence.

**Repeal**

24. *The Narrogin Regional Hospital (Traffic and Grounds) By-laws\** are repealed.

**Citation**

1. This notice may be cited as the *King George Sound Purse Seine Limited Entry Fishery Notice 1988*.

**Commencement**

2. This notice shall come into operation on 25 March 1988.

**Interpretation**

3. In this notice unless the contrary intention appears—
  - “approved form” means in a form approved by the Director;
  - “Fishery” means the King George Sound Purse Seine Limited Entry Fishery declared under clause 4;
  - “headrope length” means the distance measured along the headrope from where the net attaches to one end of the headrope to where it attaches to the other end of the headrope;
  - “purse seine net” means a net that can be run out from a fishing boat to form a wall around a shoal of fish with a headrope usually floating on the surface of the water and with a series of circular rings (purse rings) attached to a groundline through which is passed a purse line or purse string which when hauled closes the net to form a purse or artificial pond which retains the encircled fish.
  - “length” means length in relation to a fishing boat as determined in accordance with regulations made under the *Western Australian Marine Act 1982*;
  - “licence” means a licence authorising a boat to operate in the Fishery.

**Declaration of limited entry Fishery**

4. It is hereby declared that the fish described in item 1 of the Schedule shall constitute a Limited Entry Fishery in the waters described in item 2 of the Schedule to be called the *King George Sound Purse Seine Limited Entry Fishery*.

**Prohibition on taking fish**

5. A person shall not take or attempt to take any fish described in item 1 of the Schedule other than in accordance with this notice.

**Prohibition on selling or dealing**

6. A person shall not sell or deal or attempt to sell or deal in any way with any fish described in item 1 of the Schedule taken in contravention of this notice.

**Criteria to determine the boats which may operate in the Fishery**

7. The following criteria shall be applied to determine the boats which may operate in the Fishery—

- (a) to qualify for an “A” class licence—
  - (i) the boat, or a boat that it has replaced, shall have been used in the taking of fish described in item 1 of the Schedule by the means described in clause 14 prior to 30 April 1985 and shall have continued to operate in the Fishery up to and including 11 November 1987; and
  - (ii) in the three year period prior to 30 April 1985 a minimum catch of 50 tonnes of Pilchard (*Sardinops neopilchardis*) shall have been taken;

- (b) to qualify for a "B" class licence—
  - (i) the boat, or a boat that it has replaced, shall have been used in the taking of fish described in item 1 of the Schedule by the means described in clause 14 prior to 31 May 1986 and shall have continued to operate in the Fishery up to and including 11 November 1987; and
  - (ii) during the period from 1 May 1985 to 31 May 1986 a minimum catch of 50 tonnes of Pilchards (*Sardinops neopilchardis*) shall have been taken.

#### Application for a licence

8. (1) The owner of a boat which fulfils the criteria in clause 7 (a) or (b) may apply in accordance with subclause (2) for the appropriate licence authorising the boat to operate in the fishery.

(2) An application under subclause (1) shall—

- (a) be in the approved form;
- (b) be lodged in accordance with the instructions, if any;
- (c) be accompanied by the fee prescribed by regulations; and
- (d) shall provide—
  - (i) where the owner is a natural person the name and address of the owner, each part owner and any lessee;
  - (ii) where the owner is a limited liability company the names and addresses of the Directors and any lessee.

#### Details to be endorsed on licence

9. Where the Director grants or renews a licence authorizing a boat to operate in the Fishery that Licence shall state—

- (a) the name and licensed fishing boat number of the boat in respect of which it is issued or endorsed;
- (b) the name and address of the owner of that boat;
- (c) the licence number;
- (d) the day of issue;
- (e) the period for which the licence is valid;
- (f) whether it is an "A" or "B" class licence; and
- (g) any conditions imposed on the licence.

#### Access to Fishery determined by class of licence issued

10. (1) A boat with an "A" class licence shall have access to the Fishery for 12 months in each year.

(2) A boat with a "B" class licence shall have access to the Fishery from 25 March, 1988 to 30 September, 1988 and from 1 March, 1989 to 30 September, 1989.

(3) The Director may from time to time give notice of the names of—

- (a) licensees; and
- (b) boats and registration numbers of those boats

authorised to engage in the Fishery or in any specified operations in the Fishery by publishing that information in such manner as the Director deems appropriate.

#### Transfer of licences

11. (1) Subject to the prior written approval of the Director and subject to this clause the holder of an "A" class licence may transfer that licence provided the transferee is the holder of a "B" class licence.

(2) Where an "A" class licence is transferred in accordance with subclause (1) the "B" class licence referred to shall be cancelled.

(3) Subject to the prior written approval of the Director and subject to this clause the holder of an "A" class licence may transfer that licence provided the transferee has contracted to acquire both an "A" class licence and a "B" class licence.

(4) Where an "A" class licence is transferred in accordance with subclause (3) the "B" class licence referred to shall be cancelled.

(5) Subject to subclause (3), a "B" class licence shall not be transferable.

#### Cancellation and suspension of licence

12. The Minister may renew, remove, suspend, transfer or cancel, with or without conditions, any licence or endorsement under this notice.

#### Minister may close any part of the Fishery

13. Where any part of the Fishery is closed by the Minister a person shall not take any fish specified in item 1 of the Schedule during that closed period.

#### Permitted means of taking fish

14. A boat licensed to operate in the Fishery may only be used to take fish described in Item 1 of the Schedule by means of—

- (a) one purse seine net with a headrope length not exceeding 250 metres; or
- (b) one drop net; or
- (c) one lift net;

and by no other means.

#### Boat replacement

15. (1) A boat specified on a licence may, with the prior written approval of the Director, be replaced by another boat, the length of which does not exceed 12 metres.

(2) Where a boat replacement has taken place under this clause the licence shall be endorsed with the name and licensed fishing boat number of the replacement boat.

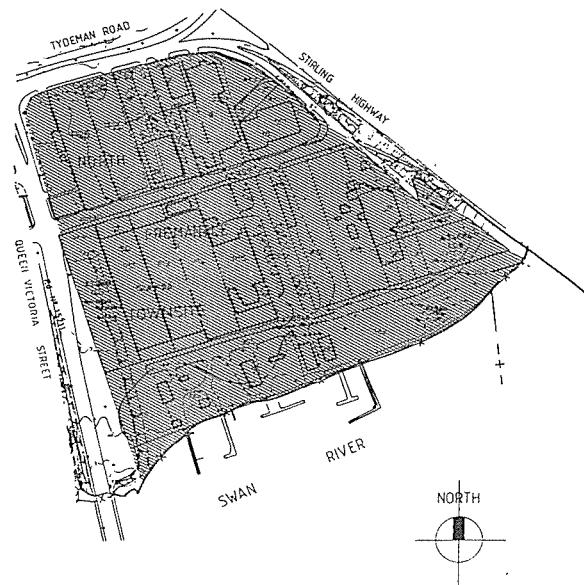

- (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 3.5.2 the use and development of land within the Development Zone bounded by Queen Victoria Street, Tydeman Road, Stirling Highway and the Swan River, North Fremantle, is to be in accordance with Development Plan No. 3.5.2.5 as set out in the Eighth Schedule hereto. Notwithstanding the above, the Council may approve a minor variation to the Development Plan but substantial modifications shall be deemed to be contrary to the scheme.
- (b) The objects of Development Plan No. 3.5.2.5 are—
  - (i) to regulate change in a major area of North Fremantle where opportunities and options for such change already exist, or may be anticipated to occur, and which because of its location and character requires to be planned in a comprehensive way;
  - (ii) to ensure that any future development, whether of a comprehensive nature or on a site-by-site basis, takes place and that planning decisions are made only within the established local planning framework provided by this Development Plan;
  - (iii) to ensure that planning issues of major relevance to this area, such as foreshore use and access, building form, and vehicle and pedestrian movement and access, are considered in the context of their individual and collective impacts on the area;
  - (iv) to reflect and reinforce the planning principles set out in the North Fremantle River Foreshore Plan, and to ensure that development in the Zone contributes to the implementation of that plan.

**1. Land Use.**

In exercising its discretion as to permissible uses in the Development Zone, the Council will have particular regard to the following—

The impact of the proposal on the amenity of North Fremantle.

The compatibility of the proposed use or uses with other existing or proposed uses within the Development Zone and its environs.

In the case of mixed-use developments, the relationship between uses with the development.

The Council would support medium density residential development that provides a range of housing that is consistent with the residential character and amenity of Fremantle.

The appropriateness of the location, and in particular the need for the use or uses to have a river-side location, or to be accessible to the regional road network.

Retail use should be incidental to other activities, and should only be permitted if the scale and type of use is appropriate to the site and is complimentary to the predominant use of the site.



The Council would support the development of commercial activities which would have a logical operational relationship with the River and a water-side location, for example, boat dealers and suppliers and maritime related technology and industries.

The possible environmental impacts of adjacent uses and activities on new developments within the Development Zone should be dealt with on-site.

## 2. Vehicle Access and Traffic Generation

In considering development proposals the Council will have regard to, and may impose conditions relating to:

The impact of the proposal on the local road network.

The impact of the proposal on the adjacent major road network and intersections.

The acceptability of the proposed means of vehicular access to the development, especially where it is to be taken from adjacent major roads.

In the case of major proposals, the Council may require the submission of a Traffic Impact Study covering the above matters.

## 3. Parking.

The Council will have regard to, and may impose conditions relating to—

The amount of car parking to be provided to serve the development.

The manner in which parking is to be provided, for example, surface-level or multi-storey facilities.

Parking provision should be in accordance with the requirements of the Council's adopted policy on parking for individual uses.

In the case of mixed-use developments, the Council may consider approving a reduced level of overall parking provision if it is satisfied that the dual-use of some parking facilities would be possible.

## 4. Landscaping and Open Space.

The Council will have regard to and may impose conditions relating to—

the extent and type of landscaping to be provided in any development, bearing in mind the type of use proposed;

the location of open space within the Development Plan area, and relationship to adjacent sites;

the contribution made to the overall provision and distribution of open space within the Development Plan area and in North Fremantle in general.

For the purpose of this Development plan, public open space means an area of land—foreshore, parkland, playground, landscaped gardens etc that is set aside for the use and enjoyment of the public. Water areas, access ways through the proposed development or open space areas not readily available to the public should not be included in the public open space calculations. At least 10% of the site should be set aside as public open space.

## 5. Pedestrian Access and Movement.

The Council will have regard to—

The means and location of pedestrian access to, and provision of pedestrian spaces within the proposed development.

The treatment of pedestrian space, including the use of hard and soft surfaces, and covered and uncovered areas.

The relationship to, and impact of development on footpaths adjoining the Development Plan area.

The relationship of proposed pedestrian routes and spaces with longer distance routes, in particular along the river foreshore.

## 6. Development Scale and Form.

In exercising its discretion in considering development proposals, the Council will have regard to the following—

A subdivisional approach to the development of the area would be supported as having the potential to reduce the overall scale of development, to reflect the present pattern of development in Fremantle, and to facilitate a staged approach to development.

The overall form of development should be consistent with the present form and scale of Fremantle's built environment. In respect of residential use in particular, this implies low and medium-rise and density developments offering a range of dwelling types, including family-capable housing.

The scale of development should be carefully considered in terms of its individual and/or collective impact on both local and more distant views. The height and bulk of buildings will be dealt with on the basis of a detailed analysis and assessment of visual impact statements.

The plot ratio will vary depending on the use. To encourage an interesting mix of development and densities, the plot ratio should not be even across the site. Water areas will not be included in the plot ratio calculations.

In order to ensure that the development of the land does relate to the social and economic structure of the existing North Fremantle Community, a demographic study may be requested by the Council prior to considering any major development.

The extent and form of any proposals to create new water-areas within the Development Zone should be a reflection of the preferred form and scale of development indicated above.

Regardless of the form and extent of water-areas and water-related use, the waters-edge, whether or not privately owned, should be public space.

Development of the foreshore should take account of the planning principles detailed in the North Fremantle River Foreshore Plan, and should contribute to the implementation of that Plan, both on this site, and in adjacent foreshore areas. In particular, a public foreshore route from the Fremantle Bridge to Rocky Bay should cross this site at the waters-edge.

In considering the impact of development proposals, the Council may require the submission of supporting illustrative and analytical material, including cross-sections, perspectives, models and photo-montages, to demonstrate the development's effect on the locality.

## 7. Heritage.

The Council will require any development proposals to be accompanied by a professionally prepared report, illustrated with maps and photographs from various periods, documenting the land use and development history of the site and identifying any places or objects or cultural significance.

The Council will impose conditions on the granting of planning consent, so as to ensure that any such places are conserved and that opportunities are created, during construction phases to enable the documentation and/or conservation of objects that are subsequently located.
