SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES ACT 1975

Variation of a Determination made by the Salaries and Allowances Tribunal

IT is notified for general information that the Determination of the Salaries and Allowances Tribunal published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 80) of 7 August 1987 is varied with effect from 1 January 1988 as follows.

DETERMINATION  
PART VII TELEPHONE RENTAL AND CALLS

Delete paragraphs 1 to 5 inclusive.

Insert the following paragraphs 1 to 6 inclusive.

" 1. *Private Residence*: Every Member of Parliament (other than Ministers, the President of the Legislative Council, the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly, the Leader of the Opposition in

the Legislative Assembly and the Chairman of Committees, and any other whose private telephone rentals and calls are paid in full from public funds) shall receive, as an allowance or emolument, payment to that Member by way of reimbursement, of the rental and 85 per centum of all charges for calls incurred by that Member in respect of one standard telephone in that Member's private residence or, where that Member reasonably maintains more than one residence by reasons of membership of Parliament, in each such residence.

2. *Electorate Offices, First Telephone:* Every Member of Parliament provided with an electorate office shall receive, as an allowance or emolument, payment to that Member by way of reimbursement, of the rental and all charges for calls incurred by that Member in respect of an approved telephone in that Member's electorate office and an extension of the same telephone to the Member's private residence.

3. *Electorate Offices, Second Telephone:* Where a Member of Parliament at the Member's expense arranges the installation of a second telephone in the electorate office, the Member shall receive as an allowance or emolument, payment to that Member by way of reimbursement, of the rental and all charges for calls incurred by the Member in respect of that second telephone.

4. *Electorate Offices, Facsimile Machines:* Where a Facsimile machine is installed in a Member's electorate office, either utilising the second telephone line in (3) above or as a third telephone line, the Member shall receive as an allowance or emolument, payment to that Member by way of reimbursement, of the rental and all charges for calls incurred by the Member in respect of that facsimile machine.

5. *Reimbursement of Telephone Charges:* In so far as a Member of Parliament pays or is charged with any telephone calls made by the Member from Parliament House, that Member shall receive, as an allowance or emolument, payment by way of reimbursement of all such charges.

6. *Definition:* In this Part, "calls" include all charges (other than international telegrams and calls) as usually included on Telecom Australia accounts rendered to subscribers. "

## POISONS ACT 1964

## Notice under section 24

I, COLIN REX JOYNER, acting under the provisions of section 24 of the *Poisons Act 1964*, do hereby cancel the notice issued under that section of the Act on 26 October 1984 and the amendment gazetted 19 December 1986 and impose the conditions, restrictions and limitations on the sale, supply, use and possession of the poisons which are specified in the Seventh Schedule of Appendix "A" to the *Poisons Act 1964* and also specified in the first column of the Schedule to this notice, as are set out directly opposite and corresponding to that poison in the second column of that Schedule.

In this notice unless the contrary intention appears—

"Department" has the meaning attributed to it in the *Public Service Act 1978*;

"Pesticides Regulations" means the Health (Pesticides) Regulations made under the *Health Act 1911*;

"primary producers" means persons whose land is used for all or any of the following businesses—

- (a) an agricultural business (but not a forestry or reforestation business); and
- (b) a grazing, horticultural, viticultural, apicultural, pig-raising or poultry farming business;

"research" means research approved by the Permanent Head.

The conditions, restrictions and limitations on the sale, supply, use and possession of the specified poisons imposed by this notice shall not affect—

- (a) the supply to and use by persons approved by the Permanent Head for research, or other specific purposes;
- (b) the sale by persons licensed to manufacture and distribute or sell by wholesale to retailers licensed in accordance with the *Poisons Act Regulations 1965*, to sell such poisons;
- (c) the sale by persons licensed to manufacture and distribute or sell by wholesale to commercial pesticide firms or pesticide operators licensed under the provisions of the Pesticide Regulations to use these poisons in accordance with the label registered or licence issued under the Pesticide Regulations;
- (d) the use and possession of poisons, registered as pesticides, contained in this Notice by registered commercial pesticide firms or licensed pesticide operators for use in accordance with licences issued under the Pesticide Regulations;
- (e) the sale by persons licensed to manufacture and distribute or sell poisons specified in the Seventh Schedule by wholesale or by retail to industrial users holding permits pursuant to section 25 of the Act.
- (f) the use and possession of poisons specified in the Seventh Schedule by industrial users holding permits pursuant to section 25 of the Act.

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Police Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1988*.

2. In these regulations the *Police Regulations 1979\** are referred to as the principal regulations.

**Regulation 808 amended**

3. Regulation 808 of the principal regulations is amended—
  - (a) in subregulation (3) by deleting "A" and substituting the following—  
" Subject to regulation 808C a "; and
  - (b) in subregulation (5) by deleting "A" and substituting the following—  
" Subject to regulation 808C a ".

**Regulation 808C repealed and a regulation substituted**

4. Regulations 808C of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—

**Certain members exempt from Promotional Assessment Course**

- " 808C. A member who—
- (a) held the rank of Senior Constable or Sergeant First Class before the coming into operation of the *Police Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1988*; and
  - (b) had qualified for promotion to the next rank under a promotional system existing prior to 1 January 1985,
- is eligible for promotion to that next rank without attending a Promotional Assessment Course notwithstanding any other regulation. "

**Regulation 812 amended**

## FISHERIES ACT 1905

Notice No. 325

PURSUANT to section 9 of the Act I hereby prohibit all persons other than the classes of persons specified in the First Schedule from taking or attempting to take fish by means of a fixed or drifting mesh or gill net in the waters specified in the Second Schedule at all times.

## First Schedule

1. Licensed professional fishermen whose licences are endorsed permitting them to use a fixed or drifting mesh or gill net in the waters specified in the Second Schedule; or

2. Licensed professional fishermen using a licensed fishing boat the licence for which is endorsed permitting it to use a fixed or drifting mesh or gill net in the waters specified in the Second Schedule.

3. Persons holding current recreational fishing licences specifying that the holders may use nets.

## Second Schedule

All waters to Shark Bay bounded by a line commencing at the high water mark of Quobba Point and extending south westerly to the high water mark on the northernmost point of Koks Island; thence southerly along the high water mark of Koks Island on its western shore to its southernmost point; thence southerly to the high water mark at Cape Ronsard on Bernier Island; thence southerly along the high water mark of Bernier Island on its western shore to Cape Couture; thence southerly to the high water mark at Cape Boullanger on Dorre Island; thence southerly along the high water mark of Dorre Island on its western shore to Cape St Cricq; thence southerly to the high water mark at Cape Inscription on Dirk Hartog Island; thence due east to the high water mark of the mainland near Long Point; thence northerly along the high water mark to the starting point.

##### Municipality of the Shire of Esperance

##### By-laws Relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades

##### Establishment of Brigades

1. (a) By resolution, the Council may establish, maintain and equip a bush fire brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954 and regulations thereunder, the brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws, and a name shall be given to the brigade. Details of the brigade and its officers shall be entered in the register of Bush Fire Brigades held by the Council.

(b) A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the Shire or for any specified area thereof.

##### Appointment of Officers

2. The Council on recommendation of each brigade shall appoint a captain, bush fire control officers, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of each brigade.

3. Members of each brigade shall elect a person to act as Secretary to the brigade and shall inform the Council accordingly.

##### Powers and Duties of Officers

4. The powers and duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as specified in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954 and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations.

##### Membership of Brigade

5. (1) The membership of a bush fire brigade may consist of the following—

- (a) subscribing members; and
- (b) firefighting members.

(2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who being interested in forwarding the objects of the brigade, pay an annual subscription at the rates prescribed from time to time by the brigade.

(3) Fire fighting members shall be those persons, being able bodied persons over 15 years who are willing to render service at any bush fire when called upon; and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the first schedule to these by-laws.

(4) Fees or subscriptions as prescribed under By-law 6 (2) may, at the discretion of the brigade, be payable by firefighting members.

(5) A subscribing member shall be eligible for enrolment as a firefighting member.

Finance

7. The expenditure incurred by the Council in the purchase of equipment, payment for services and generally for the purpose of the Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Council and records of such expenditure shall be maintained in accordance with municipal audit requirements.

Meetings of Brigades

8. Brigades meetings will be held as necessary.

9. By-laws relating to the establishment, maintenance and equipment of bush fire brigades adopted by the Esperance Road Board on 20 May 1953, published in the Government Gazette of 7 August 1953 and amended from time to time are hereby repealed.

## SOIL AND LAND CONSERVATION ACT 1945

SOIL AND LAND CONSERVATION (NULLARBOR-EYRE HIGHWAY SOIL  
CONSERVATION DISTRICT) ORDER 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under sections 22 and 23 of the Soil and Land Conservation Act 1945 and on the recommendation of the Minister for Agriculture.

**Citation**

1. This Order may be cited as the *Soil and Land Conservation (Nullarbor-Eyre Highway Soil Conservation District) Order 1988*.

**Interpretation**

2. In this Order—

- "appointed member" means a person appointed under clause 5 (1) (b), (c), (d), (e) or (f) to be a member of the committee;
- "committee" means the District Advisory Committee for the Nullarbor-Eyre Highway Soil Conservation District;
- "member" means a member of the committee;
- "the district" means the Nullarbor-Eyre Highway Soil Conservation District constituted by clause 3 of and the Schedule to this Order.

**Nullarbor-Eyre Highway Soil Conservation District**

3. All that portion of land described in the Schedule to this Order, is hereby constituted the Nullarbor-Eyre Highway Soil Conservation District.

**Establishment of District Advisory Committee**

4. Pursuant to section 23 (2) of the Soil and Land Conservation Act 1945 there is hereby established for the district a district advisory committee to be known as the District Advisory Committee for the Nullarbor-Eyre Highway Soil Conservation District.

**Constitution of committee**

5. (1) It is hereby determined, on the recommendation of the Minister, after consultation with the Shires of Dundas and Boulder, that the committee shall comprise 11 members of whom—

- (a) One shall be the Commissioner for Soil Conservation or his nominee;
- (b) one shall be appointed by the Governor on the nomination of the Shire of Dundas;
- (c) one shall be appointed by the Governor on the nomination of the Shire of Boulder;
- (d) one shall be appointed by the Governor, on the nomination of the Minister, to represent the Western Australian Farmers Federation Inc. formerly known as the Primary Industry Association of Western Australia;
- (e) two shall be appointed by the Governor, on the nomination of the Minister, to represent the Pastoralists and Graziers Association of Western Australia; and
- (f) five shall be appointed by the Governor, on the nomination of the Minister, and shall be actively engaged in land use in the district and of whom one shall be an officer of the Department of Conservation and Land Management.

(2) The Western Australian Farmers Federation Inc. formerly known as the Primary Industry Association of Western Australia and the Pastoralists and Graziers Association of Western Australia shall each submit to the Minister a panel containing the names of persons willing to be appointed as members of the Committee and where such a panel is submitted in accordance with this Order—

- (a) one person whose name appears on the panel submitted by the Western Australian Farmers Federation Inc. formerly known as the Primary Industry Association of Western Australia shall be nominated for appointment; and
- (b) two persons whose names appear on the panel submitted by the Pastoralists and Graziers Association of Western Australia shall be nominated for appointment.

(3) Subject to this clause each appointed member shall hold office for such period not exceeding three years as is specified in the instrument of his appointment and is eligible for reappointment.

(4) The Minister may grant leave of absence to an appointed member on such terms and conditions as the Minister determines.

(5) The Governor may terminate the appointment of an appointed member for inability, inefficiency or misbehaviour.

- (6) If an appointed member—
- (a) is or becomes an undischarged bankrupt or person whose property is subject to an order or arrangement under the laws relating to bankruptcy;
  - (b) has his appointment terminated by the Governor, pursuant to subclause (5);
  - (c) is absent, except on leave duly granted by the Minister, from three consecutive meetings of the committee of which he has had notice; or
  - (d) resigns his office by written notice addressed to the Minister,
- the office of that appointed member becomes vacant.

#### Proceedings of the committee

6. (1) The committee shall hold its meetings at such place on such days and at such intervals as the committee shall from time to time determine.
- (2) At any meeting of the committee—
- (a) a majority of the members constitute a quorum;
  - (b) the Chairman shall preside and where he is absent from the meeting the members may appoint one of their number to preside at that meeting;
  - (c) each member present is entitled to a deliberative vote; and
  - (d) where the votes cast on any question are equally divided the Chairman or the presiding member in terms of paragraph (b), shall have a casting vote.
- (3) The committee shall cause accurate minutes to be kept of the proceedings at its meetings.
- (4) To the extent that it is not prescribed, the committee may determine its own procedure.

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


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
