OFFENDERS PROBATION AND PAROLE ACT 1963

OFFENDERS PROBATION AND PAROLE AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Offenders Probation and Parole Amendment Regulations 1988*.

Commencement

2. These regulations shall come into operation on the day on which the *Acts Amendment (Imprisonment and Parole) Act 1988* comes into operation.

Principal regulations

3. In these regulations, the *Offenders Probation and Parole Regulations 1964** are referred to as the principal regulations.

[*Reprinted in the *Gazette of 25 January 1967* at pp. 243-254. For amendments to 28 April 1988 see page 313 of 1986 *Index to Legislation of Western Australia and Gazette* dated 11 December 1987.]

Regulation 7A amended

4. Regulation 7A of the principal regulations is amended—

- (a) in paragraph (b) (iii) and (v), by inserting after "Board" the following—
" for the purposes of the Act "; and
- (b) in paragraph (b) (vi), by inserting after "perform" the following—
" for the purposes of the Act ".

Regulation 21 revoked and a regulation substituted

5. Regulation 21 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulation is substituted—

- 21. (1) A parole order shall contain—
 - (a) the name of the prisoner;
 - (b) the date of the sentence to which the order relates and a description of the offence in respect of which the sentence was imposed;

- (c) the date on which the order is made;
 - (d) the date of release of the prisoner from prison on parole;
 - (e) the date on which the parole period will end;
 - (f) the requirements that the prisoner must comply with during the parole period;
 - (g) a declaration by the prisoner that the prisoner understands the requirements that must be complied with during the parole period and undertakes to comply with those requirements.
- (2) A parole order shall require—
- (a) that the prisoner abstain from violation of the law;
 - (b) that the prisoner carry out the lawful instructions of a parole officer;
 - (c) that the prisoner report, and be available for interview, as and when directed by a parole officer;
 - (d) that the prisoner does not change his or her place of employment or accommodation without the consent of a parole officer;
 - (e) that the prisoner undertakes treatment or counselling for any alcohol or drug problem if and as directed by a parole officer;
 - (f) that the prisoner reports to a parole officer within 72 hours of release from prison on parole;
 - (g) that the prisoner shall not leave or remain out of the State without a permit under section 41 (3c) of the Act,
- and those requirements are prescribed requirements for the purposes of section 41 (3) of the Act. ”.

Regulation 22 amended

6. Regulation 22 of the principal regulations is amended by inserting after “Board” the following—

“ except where the order is made by the secretary or a member on behalf of and in the name of the Board as authorized by section 40A (7) to (10) of the Act ”.

Regulation 24 revoked and a regulation substituted

7. Regulation 24 of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulation is substituted—

“ 24. Where a parole order is made by the Governor the Clerk of the Executive Council shall send the 3 copies of the order to the Board so that they can be dealt with in accordance with regulation 23 (a), (b) and (c). ”.

Regulation 25 revoked

8. Regulation 25 of the principal regulations is revoked.

Regulation 28A inserted

9. After regulation 28 of the principal regulations the following regulation is inserted—

“ 28A. Pursuant to section 39 (2) and (3) of the Act, where a prisoner is serving—

- (a) a non-parole period; or
- (b) in a case to which section 41 (2c) of the Act applies, an extended service period within the meaning of section 39 (4) of the Act,

a maximum of one day's reduction from the period for each ten days actually served by the prisoner undergoing the period may be granted by the chief executive officer if the chief executive officer is satisfied that the good conduct and industry of the prisoner throughout the period actually served merit the reduction. ”.

Regulation 29 amended

10. Regulation 29 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting “permanent head” and substituting the following—

“ secretary to the Board ”.

Regulation 29A inserted

11. After regulation 29 of the principal regulations the following regulation is inserted—

“ 29A (1) The Superintendent or person in charge of a prison, institution, or other place shall give written notification to the secretary to the Board whenever an offender is committed to the prison, institution, or place to serve a term of imprisonment in respect of which an order was made under section 37A of the Act.

(2) The notification required by subregulation (1) shall be given within 28 days after the date on which the offender was sentenced. ”.

Regulation 30 amended

12. Regulation 30 of the principal regulations is amended—

- (a) by deleting “(2) of section thirty-nine” and substituting the following—
“ (2) or (3) of section 39 ”; and
- (b) by deleting “of these regulations and shall add the period of any sentence referred to in subsection (2) of section thirty-eight of the Act” and substituting the following—
“ or 28A ”.

Regulation 31 amended

FISHERIES AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 3) 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

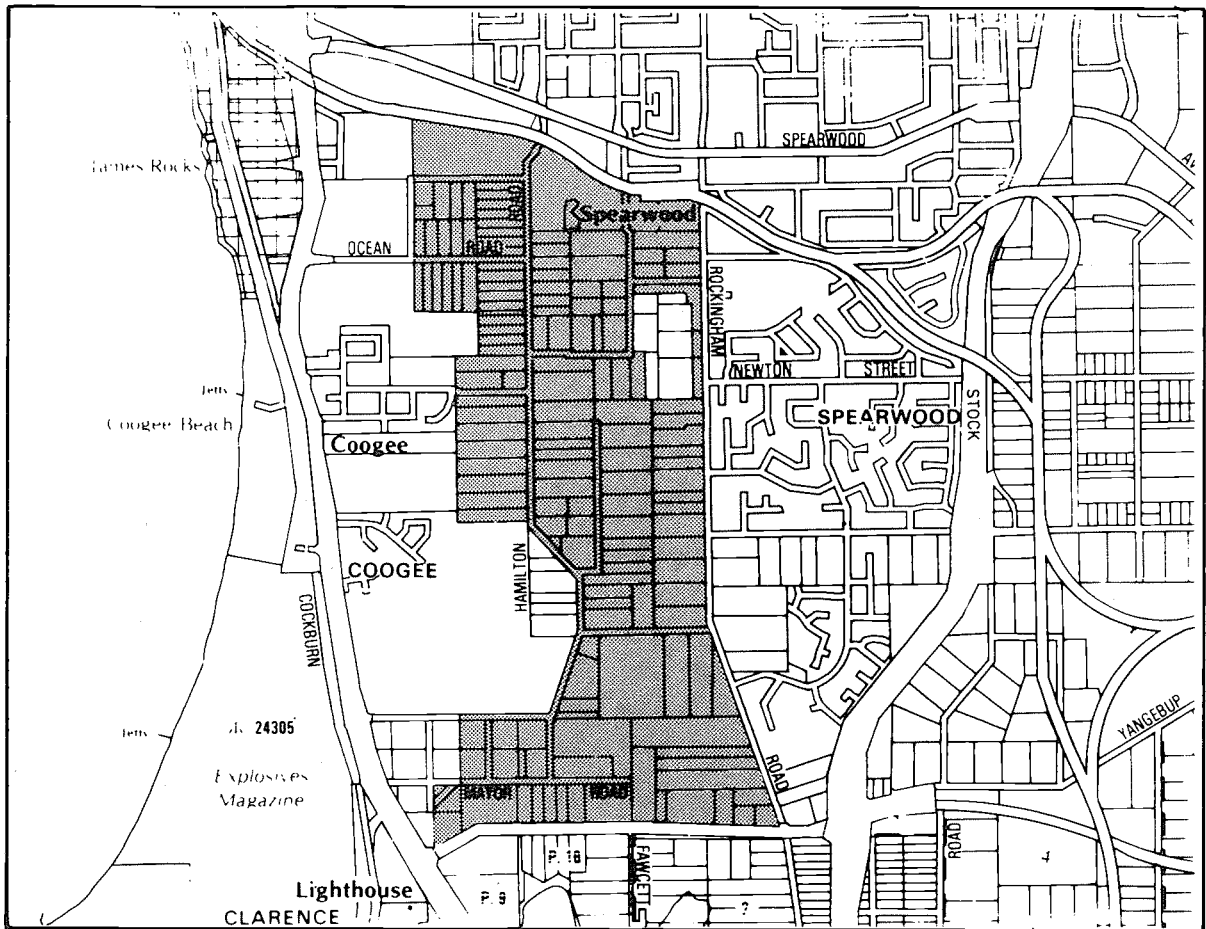

MINING ACT 1978

MINING AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 3) 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Mining Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 1988*.

Principal regulations

2. In these regulations the *Mining Regulations 1981** are referred to as the principal regulations.

[*Published in the Gazette of 13 November 1981 at pp. 4601-4676. For amendments to 17 March 1988 see page 306 of 1986 Index to Legislation of Western Australia and Gazettes of 26 June, 7 and 21 August, 2 October and 6 November 1987 and 5 February 1988.]

Regulation 2 amended

3. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended by inserting in the appropriate alphabetical position the following definition—

“ “royalty return” means a royalty return referred to in regulation 85B ”.

Regulation 85 repealed and regulations 85, 85A and 85B substituted

4. Regulation 85 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulations are substituted—

Interpretation of Division

“ 85. In this Division—

- (a) a reference to a mineral includes a reference to a material containing that mineral;
- (b) “realized value” in relation to a mineral means—
 - (i) if exported, the realized value of the mineral F.O.B.; or
 - (ii) if not exported the realized value of the mineral less any cost incurred by the person liable to pay the royalty in transporting the mineral, in the form in which it was sold, to the purchaser; and
- (c) “related corporation” means a corporation that would under section 7 (5) of the *Companies (Western Australia) Code* be deemed to be related for the purposes of that Code.

Monthly production report

85A. (1) The holder of a mining tenement, and the applicant for a mining tenement in respect of any land, shall within 30 days of the expiry of each month during which any mineral was produced or obtained from that tenement or land, furnish the Director General of Mines with a monthly production report regarding that month in the form No. 27 in the First Schedule.

(2) A person who contravenes subregulation (1) commits an offence.

Royalty return

85B. (1) The holder of, or applicant for, a mining tenement shall, on each occasion that he pays royalties to the Department forward with the royalties a royalty return, in a form approved by the Minister, showing in full the details required to calculate those royalties, including, where relevant—

- (a) the quantity of the mineral;
- (b) details, including relevant terms and other parties involved, of any sale, transfer, shipment or other disposal of the mineral;
- (c) the value, or realized value of the mineral;
- (d) the method of calculating the realized value of the mineral including details of any costs deducted to calculate the realized value;
- (e) the rate of royalty used where that rate is different from the rate set out opposite the mineral in the Table to regulation 86.

(2) A person who contravenes subregulation (1) commits an offence. ”.

Regulation 86 amended

5. Regulation 86 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) in subregulation (2)—

(i) by deleting the phrase commencing “(2) The rate of royalty” and ending “as the case may be:—” and substituting the following subregulation—

“ (2) The rate of royalty payable for a mineral referred to in the Table to this regulation is as set out opposite the mineral in column 1, 2 or 3 of that Table, unless otherwise provided in these regulations. ”;

(ii) by inserting above the Table the following—

“ TABLE ”; and

(iii) by deleting the sentence following the Table commencing “In this subregulation—”.

Regulation 86A repealed and a regulation substituted

6. Regulation 86A of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—

Time for payment of royalties to Department

“ 86A. Royalties shall be paid to the Department at Perth within 30 days after—

- (a) the expiry of the month during which the mineral was produced or obtained; or
- (b) where the royalty is based on realized value, within 30 days of realization of that value. ”.

Regulation 86F amended

7. Regulation 86F of the principal regulations is amended by deleting “f.o.r. or if exported f.o.b”.

Regulation 87 repealed and regulations 87, 87A, and 87B substituted

8. Regulation 87 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulations are substituted—

Minister may determine value of mineral for the purpose of calculating royalties

“ 87. (1) Where a royalty has been paid under regulation 86 and the Minister is of the opinion that the realized value on which the royalty was based was not a true or fair value on which to calculate the royalty because—

- (a) the value does not represent the market value of the mineral at the date the mineral was first sold, transferred or otherwise disposed of or the costs deducted to calculate the realized value by the person liable to pay the royalty are excessive having regard to the type of sale, transfer or disposal, the Minister shall determine the value of the mineral in accordance with the market value for that type of mineral, assessed at an arms length basis at the date the mineral was first sold, transferred or otherwise disposed of for that type of sale, transfer or other disposal; or
- (b) the first sale, transfer or other disposal of the mineral was to a corporation which is a related corporation to the holder of, or applicant for, the mining tenement and the holder or applicant has not shown to the satisfaction of the Minister within the time specified by the Minister that the sale, transfer or other disposal was a genuine commercial transaction and was not principally for the purpose of minimizing the royalty payable, the Minister shall determine the value of the mineral in accordance with the market value for that type of mineral assessed at an arm's length basis at the date the mineral was first sold, transferred or otherwise disposed of for the type of sale, transfer or other disposal that the Minister is of the opinion would have taken place if the related corporation had not been involved.

(2) Where a value is determined by the Minister under subregulation (1), the royalty shall be assessed at the relevant rate under regulation 86 as if that value was the realized value.

Notice of determination and assessment under regulation 87

87A. (1) Where the Minister makes a determination under regulation 87 he shall cause notice of that determination and an assessment of any royalties payable, after taking into account any monies already paid, to be served on the person by whom the royalties are payable.

(2) A person on whom notice is served under subregulation (1) shall pay to the Department at Perth the royalties assessed to be payable within 14 days of service of the notice.

Records

87B. (1) The holder of, or applicant for, a mining tenement shall keep or cause to be kept such records in respect of the mineral produced or obtained from that mining tenement, or from land the subject of an application for a mining tenement, as are necessary—

(a) to give a true and complete indication of—

- (i) the quality of the mineral; and
- (ii) any sale, shipment, transfer or other disposal of that mineral, including time, destination, value and quantity of each sale, shipment transfer or other disposal; and

(b) to substantiate the details and calculations on all royalty returns forwarded under regulation 85B in respect of the mineral,

and shall retain those records for a period of 7 years after the completion of the sale, shipment, transfer or other disposal of the mineral, or of the payment of the royalty, whichever is the later date.

(2) A person who contravenes subregulation (1) commits an offence. ”.
