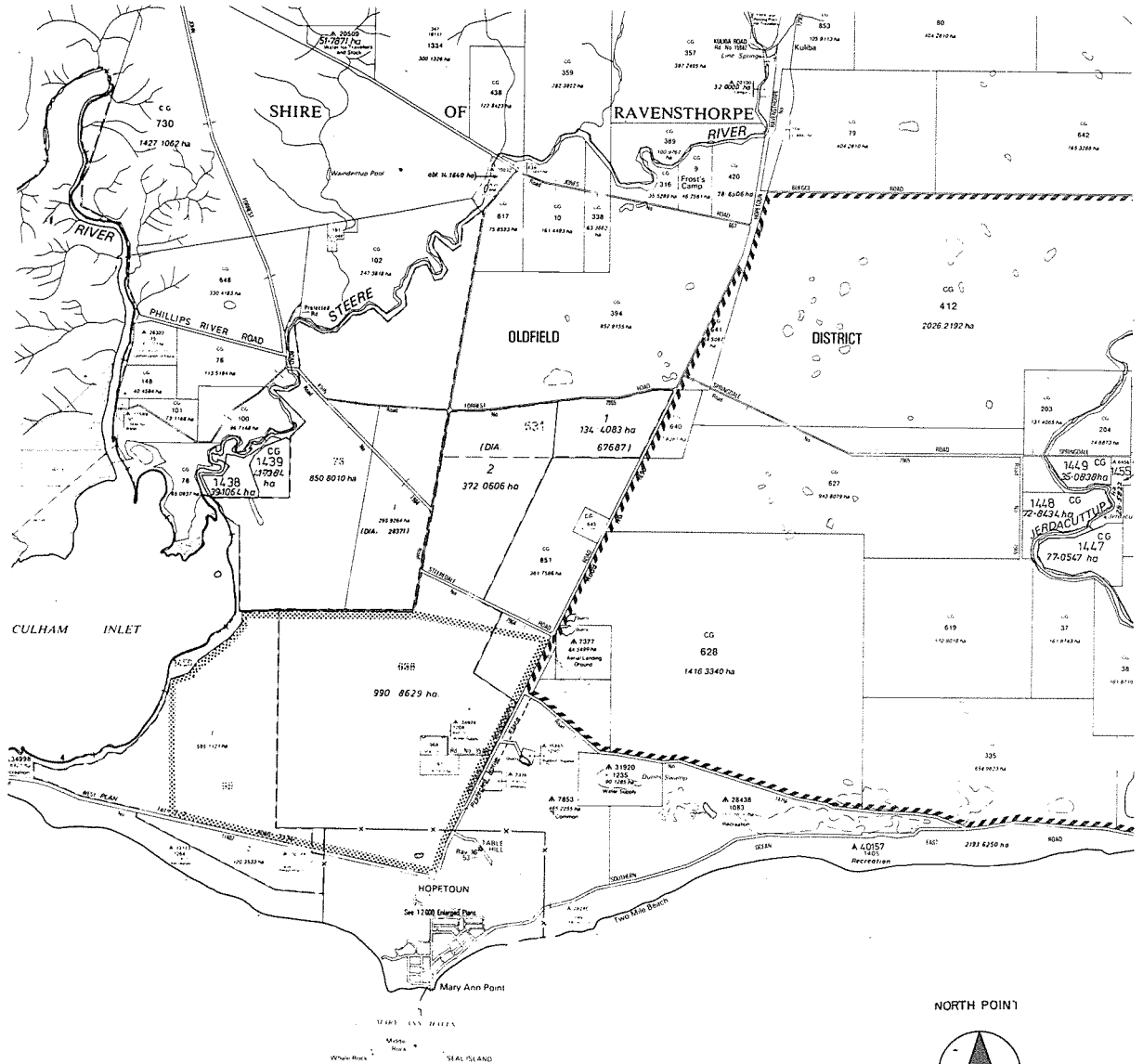

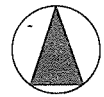

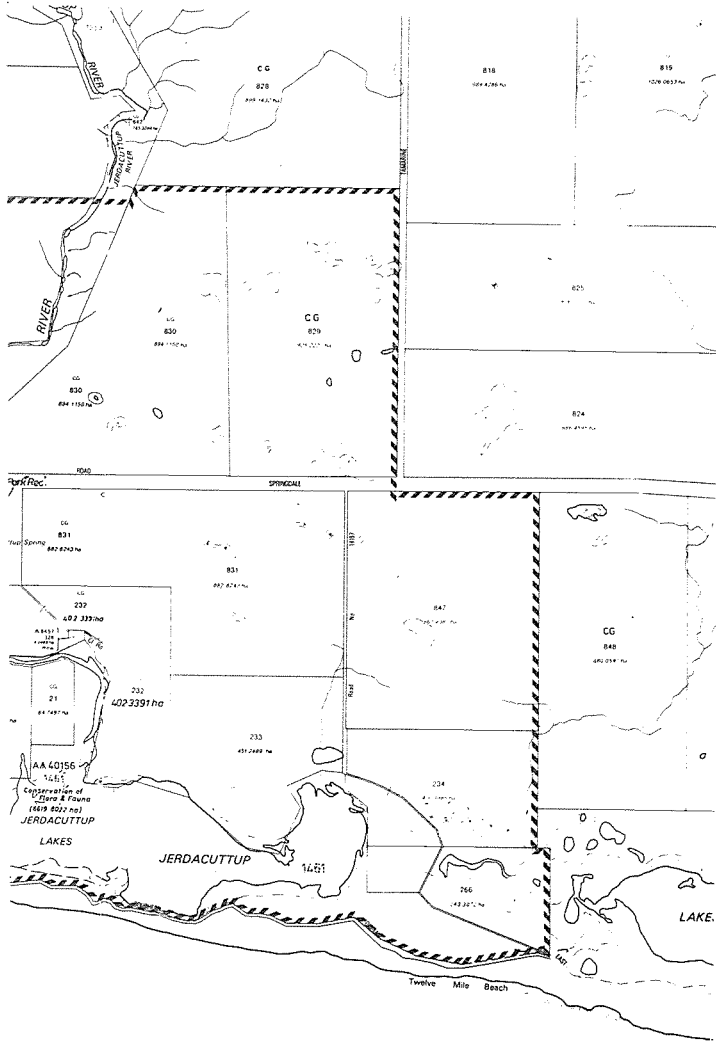

GAMING COMMISSION ACT 1987

GAMING COMMISSION AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 2) 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Gaming Commission Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1988*.

Principal regulations

2. In these regulations the *Gaming Commission Regulations 1988** are referred to as the principal regulations.

[*Published in the *Gazette of 29 April 1988 at pp. 1295-1304.*]

Schedule 1 amended

3. Schedule 1 to the principal regulations is amended—

(a) under the heading "Fee on application for a function permit for" by deleting item (f) and substituting the following item—

" (f) gaming—

(i) games played against the house with dice or cards,
 per table, per day authorized 25

(ii) generally, per day authorized 150 "; and

(b) under the heading "Fee on application for a permit of a continuing nature for" by deleting item (f) and substituting the following item—

" (f) gaming—

(i) games played against the house with dice or cards,
 per table, per day authorized 20

(ii) generally, per day authorized 120 ".

Schedule 4 amended

4. Schedule 4 to the principal regulations is amended by inserting after Part 2 the following—

"

PART 3—PERMITTED GAMING

RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF BEAT THE BANKER

Definitions

1. For the purposes of these rules—

"Full deck" means a deck of 52 cards made up of 4 suits each suit containing A, K, Q, J, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3 and 2;

"game" means the game commonly known as Beat the Banker.

Dealer shall conduct game

2. (1) A dealer shall be responsible for the conduct of each game and shall control all hands and cards, determine winners and oversee the collection of winnings.

(2) The dealer shall shuffle the cards after each round of play and shall not permit any player to handle the cards.

(3) A dealer shall not participate in a game otherwise than in his capacity as a dealer.

Game to be played with a full deck of cards

3. Each game shall be played with a full deck of cards.

Back of cards shall be identical

4. All cards in a deck shall have backs which are identical in colour and markings.

No more than 2 cards shall be dealt

5. No more than 2 cards shall be dealt to any player or the banker.

Point value of a hand

6. (1) The point value of a hand shall be the sum total of the point values of each card in the hand.

(2) The point value of cards in the deck shall be as follows—

(a) any card from 2 to 10 inclusive, shall have a point value equal to the face value of the card;

(b) any Jack, Queen or King shall have a point value of 10; and

(c) any Ace shall have a point value of 11.

New deck to be used whenever a table opened

7. Whenever a table is opened a new deck of cards shall be used.

Player may inspect cards

8. At the end of a round of play, a player who so requests shall be permitted to inspect the deck of cards used.

Circumstances in which new deck to be introduced

9. A new deck of cards shall be introduced at the end of a round of play—
- (a) if a majority of players request a change; or
 - (b) if a card or cards become mutilated.

Deck of cards shall be proven to be complete

10. Before a new deck of cards is introduced, the previous deck shall be proven to be complete by the dealer.

New deck shall be a different colour to a previous deck

11. A new deck of cards shall be a different colour to the deck used previously.

Dealer shall invalidate outcome of the game

12. The dealer shall invalidate the outcome of the game if at any time it is established that the deck in use contains an incorrect number of cards.

Minimum and maximum wager allowed

13. A sign showing the minimum and maximum wager allowed to be placed on a game, shall be displayed at or in the immediate vicinity of each table and so that it is conspicuous to players.

Winning hand

14. (1) A player's hand shall win if the point value of the hand is greater than the point value of the banker's hand.
 (2) The banker's hand shall win if the point value of the hand is equal to or greater than the point value of the player's hand.

Winning odds

15. A winning player shall be paid at odds of 1 to 1 except where the point value of the winning player's hand is 21 or 22 in which case odds of 2 to 1 shall be paid.

Persons under 18 years shall not participate

16. A person under the age of 18 years shall not—
- (a) participate in a game; or
 - (b) be involved in the dealing or conduct of game.

RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF CERTAIN DICE GAMES**Definition**

1. For the purpose of these rules—
 "dice game" means any of the games commonly known as Crown and Anchor, Money Game or Unders and Overs.

Dice

2. (1) Crown and Anchor shall only be played with 3 identical dice with the faces of each dice marked with the symbols of a crown, anchor, heart, diamond, club and spade.
 (2) Money Game and Unders and Overs shall only be played with 2 identical dice the faces of each dice being numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6.

Dealer

3. Each table shall be controlled by a dealer who shall not participate in any other way in the dice game.

Dealer shall roll dice

4. The dealer shall be the only person permitted to roll the dice or activate the dice cage.

Minimum and maximum wager allowed

5. A sign showing the minimum and maximum wager allowed to be placed on a dice game, shall be displayed at or in the immediate vicinity of each table and so that it is conspicuous to players.

Odds payable

6. Winning wagers shall be paid at odds not less than—
- (a) For the game of Crown and Anchor—
 - (i) if the symbol appears on the uppermost face of 3 dice..... 3 to 1
 - (ii) if the symbol appears on the uppermost fact of 2 dice..... 2 to 1
 - (iii) if the symbol appears on the uppermost face of 1 dice..... 1 to 1
 - (b) For the game of Unders and Overs—
 - (i) if the cumulative total of the uppermost surfaces of the 2 dice is 7..... 4 to 1
 - (ii) if the cumulative total of the uppermost surfaces of the 2 dice is either 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6..... 1 to 1
 - (iii) if the cumulative total of the uppermost surfaces of the 2 dice is either 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12..... 1 to 1
 - (c) For the game of Money Game—
 - (i) if the cumulative total of the uppermost surfaces of the 2 dice is 11..... 10 to 1
 - (ii) if the cumulative total of the uppermost surfaces of the 2 dice is 6 or 8..... 5 to 1
 - (iii) if the cumulative total of the uppermost surfaces of the 2 dice is 5 or 7..... 2 to 1
 - (iv) if the cumulative total of the uppermost surfaces of the 2 dice is 2, 3, 4, 9, 10 or 12..... 1 to 1

Odds payable shall be displayed

7. A sign showing the odds payable for a game, shall be displayed at or in the immediate vicinity of each table and so that it is conspicuous to players.

Persons under 18 years shall not participate

8. A person under the age of 18 years shall not—
- (a) participate in a dice game; or
 - (b) be involved in the dealing or conduct of a dice game.

RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF POKER WITH CARDS AND MANILA**Definitions**

1. For the purposes of these rules—
- “full deck” means a deck of 52 cards made up of 4 suits each suit containing A, K, Q, J, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3 and 2;
- “game” means—
- (a) a game of poker with cards which is not played against the house; or
 - (b) a game of Manila;
- “reduced deck” means a deck of 32 cards made up of 4 suits each suit containing A, K, Q, J, 10, 9, 8 and 7;
- “showdown” means the disclosure of cards at the completion of a final round of betting to determine a winner of a pot.

Dealer shall conduct game

(2) A dealer shall not participate in a game otherwise than in his capacity as a dealer.

New deck to be used when a table opened

5. Whenever a table is opened a new deck of cards shall be used.

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Wagin

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the First day of November and thereafter up to and including the Thirty-first day of March the following year, to have a firebreak clear of all inflammable material in accordance with the following—

(1) RURAL LAND

- (a) Firebreaks at least 2.5 metres wide shall be cleared of all inflammable material inside and adjacent to all external boundaries of all cleared land and inside and adjacent to boundaries which adjoin cleared roads; and
- (b) Firebreaks at least 2.5 metres wide shall be cleared of all inflammable material parallel to and 20 metres distant from boundaries which adjoin railway reserves; and
- (c) Firebreaks at least 2.5 metres wide shall be cleared of all inflammable material completely surrounding all crops on land adjoining railway reserves; and
- (d) Firebreaks at least 2.5 metres wide shall be cleared of all inflammable material at a distance of 20 metres from the perimeter of all buildings and haystacks, or groups of buildings and haystacks and shall completely encircle such buildings and haystacks; and
- (e) The area between the buildings and haystacks and the firebreaks mentioned in (d) above shall be cleared of all inflammable material by the 15th December.

(f) FUEL STORAGE SITES

- (f) The land within a perimeter of 6 metres outside the external boundary of the land normally occupied by any drums or tanks used for the storage of fuel, or the foundations or supports or any structure supporting such drums or tanks, whether containing fuel or not, shall be cleared of all inflammable material.

FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT

A person shall not operate any harvesting machine or header in any crop during the prohibited burning times unless—

- (1) One hand held water filled fire extinguisher (minimum capacity 7½ litres) is fitted in a readily accessible position on the machine.
- (2) A readily mobile fire fighting unit of a minimum of 400 litres capacity powered by an engine driven pump is in attendance in or adjacent to the entrance of the paddock being harvested.

(2) TOWN LAND

- (g) Where the area of land is 0.202 hectares (half an acre) or less all inflammable material on the land shall be removed from the whole of the land; and

- (h) Where the land exceeds 0.202 hectares (half an acre) in area, firebreaks at least 2 metres wide shall be cleared of all inflammable material immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than 30th October, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

“Inflammable Material” is defined for the purpose of this Order to include bush (as defined in the Bush Fires Act), timber, boxes, cartons, paper and like inflammable material, rubbish and also any combustible matter, but does not include green standing trees, or growing bushes and plants in gardens, or lawns.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not more than \$400, or a penalty of \$40 may be incurred by issue of an infringement Notice, and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

By-laws Relating to Firebreaks

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 18th August 1988 to make and submit for confirmation of the Governor, the following amendment to the By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd October 1988 and amended in the *Government Gazette* of the 2nd December 1983 and the 2nd August 1985 are further amended in the following manner.

- (ii) Firebreaks of at least 3 metres in width within 200 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel tanks/drum ramps or groups of buildings, haystacks and fuel tanks/drum ramps in such a manner as to completely encircle the buildings, haystacks and fuel tanks/drum ramps.

- (iii) Firebreaks of at least 20 metres in width immediately inside all external boundaries of that land on which bush has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning.
- (iv) Firebreaks of at least 20 metres in width in such positions as to divide land of more than 400 hectares on which bush has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning into separate sections of no more than 400 hectares completely surrounded by a firebreak of at least 20 metres in width.
- (v) Firebreaks to completely cover the whole of the land on which fuel drums, whether full or empty are stored".
