## POISONS ACT 1964

## POISONS (SCHEDULED SUBSTANCES) AMENDMENT ORDER (No. 3) 1988

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

**Citation**

1. This order may be cited as the *Poisons (Scheduled Substances) Amendment Order (No. 3) 1988*.

**Commencement**

2. This order shall come into operation on the day that it is published in the *Government Gazette*.

#### By-law Relating to Trading in Public Places

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality records having resolved on 17 November 1988, to make and submit for confirmation by His Excellency the Governor the following By-law.

1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

“public place” includes a street, way and place which the public are allowed to use, whether the street, way or place is or is not on private property.

“trading” means selling or hiring of goods, wares, merchandise or services, or offering goods, wares, merchandise or services for sale or hire, in a street or other public place and includes displaying goods, wares or merchandise for the purpose of offering them for sale or hire, inviting offers for sale or hire, soliciting orders or carrying out of any other transaction therein, but does not include the setting up of a stall, or the conducting of business at a stall, under the authority of a licence issued under By-laws made under section 242.

2. This By-law shall not apply to—

(a) the selling or offering for sale of newspapers or magazines; or

3. No persons shall carry on trading in any public place unless that person is acting within the specifications of a current licence issued under this By-law and for which all fees and charges have been paid.

4. An application for a licence shall be in writing in the form set out in the fourth schedule to this By-law and shall contain such other information as the Council may require.

5. In considering an application for a licence the Council shall have regard for any relevant Policy statements and for the desirability of the proposed activity and its location and for the circumstances of the case and may refuse to issue a licence in which case it shall provide the applicant with reasons in writing.

6. The Council may issue a licence specifying such requirements, terms and conditions as the Council sees fit, including—

- (a) the place to which the licence applies;
- (b) the days and hours when trading may be carried on;
- (c) the number, type, form and construction, as the case may be, of any stand, table, structure or vehicle which may be used for trading;
- (d) the particulars of the goods or services or transaction in respect of which trading may be carried on;
- (e) the number of persons and the names of persons permitted to carry on trading and any requirements concerning personal attendance at the place of trading and the nomination of assistance, nominees or substitutes;
- (f) whether and under what terms the licence is transferable;
- (g) any prohibitions or restrictions concerning the causing of any nuisance, the use of signs, the making of noise and the use of amplifiers, sound equipment, sound instruments and lighting apparatus;
- (h) any requirements concerning the display of the licence holders name and other details of the licence, the care, maintenance and cleansing of the place of trading and the vacating of the place when trading is not taking place;
- (i) any requirements regarding the acquisition by the licence holder of public risk insurance;
- (j) the period, not exceeding twelve months, during which the licence is valid.

7. The amount of the charges and fees shall be calculated and payable in accordance with the Schedule hereto.

8. The Council may revoke a licence if—
- (a) the licensee or Assistants specified in a licence does not comply with any of the requirements, terms or conditions imposed by the Council when issuing the licence, or;
  - (b) the Council or a Crown agency, instrumentality or Department requires access to the place to which a licence applies for the purpose of carrying out works on, over or under that place.

9. Where a licence is revoked the Council shall, if requested, provide the licence holder with reasons in writing and shall refund the charge of having first deducted the charge applicable to the period from the issuing of the licence to its revocation.

10. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of the By-law commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty for each offence of not more than \$1 000 or 6 months imprisonment.

RETAIL TRADING HOURS ACT 1987

RETAIL TRADING HOURS ORDER 1989

MADE by the Minister for Labour.

**Citation**

1. This Order may be cited as the *Retail Trading Hours Order 1989*.

**Duration**

2. This Order has effect for the period commencing on the day on which it is published in the *Government Gazette* and ending on 31 December 1989.

**Interpretation**

3. In this Order—

“Public Holiday” means a public holiday under section 5, section 7 or section 8 of the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1972* but does not include Anzac Day, Christmas Day or Good Friday;

“school term” means a school term determined by the Minister charged with the administration of the *Education Act 1928* under that Act.

**Exemption periods.**

4. (1). In any year during the period commencing on the first-mentioned day in each of the following paragraphs and ending at the close of business on the second-mentioned day in each of those paragraphs, namely—

- (a) the day of publication in the *Government Gazette* to the second Sunday in February;
- (b) the Saturday preceding Labour Day to the following Monday;
- (c) the Saturday following the end of the first school term to the Sunday preceding the second school term;
- (d) where Anzac Day falls on a Friday—the Saturday following that day to the following Sunday;
- (e) where Anzac Day falls on a Saturday—the Sunday following that day to the following Monday;
- (f) where Anzac Day falls on a Sunday—the Saturday preceding that day and the Monday following that day;
- (g) where Anzac Day falls on a Monday—the Saturday preceding that Monday to the following Sunday;
- (h) the Saturday following Good Friday to Easter Monday;
- (i) the Saturday preceding Foundation Day to Foundation Day;
- (j) the Saturday following the end of the second school term to the Sunday preceding the third school term;
- (k) the Saturday following the end of the third school term to the Sunday preceding the fourth school term;
- (l) the Saturday preceding the Queen's Birthday public holiday to the Queen's Birthday public holiday;
- (m) the first Monday in December to Christmas Eve;
- (n) Boxing Day to the last day of December;

general retail shops other than specified general retail shops in the areas or localities specified in Column 1 of the Schedule are exempted from the *Retail Trading Hours Act 1987* on the days specified in the Schedule subject to the conditions as to hours of closing specified opposite and corresponding to those areas or localities in Column 2 of the Schedule.

(2) In subclause (1)—

“specified general retail shops” means general retail shops—

- (a) in, on or from which motor vehicles are sold; or
- (b) in, on or from which spare parts for motor vehicles are sold by way of retail sale in conjunction with the sale of motor vehicles. ”

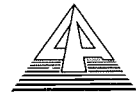
