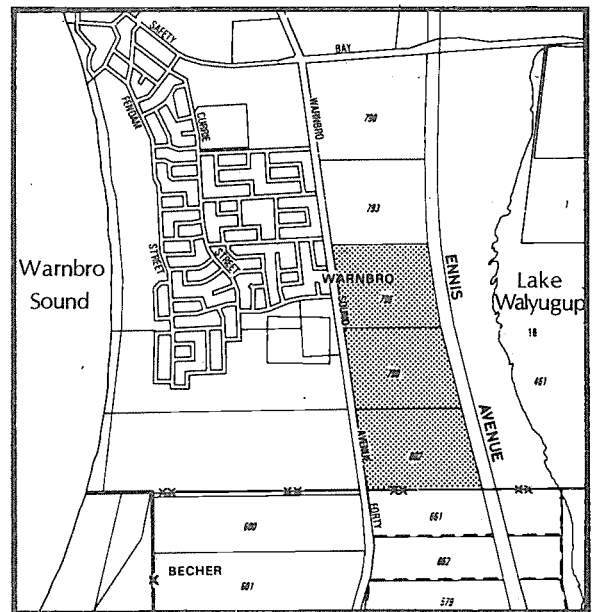

2. Order No. 20A of 1985 is repealed.

Commencement

3. This Order shall take effect from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Variation of Annual Percentage Rate—exemption

4. Sections 40 (1) (c), 40 (2) and 70 (1) (b) of the Credit Act and clause 8 of Form 4 of the Credit Regulations 1984 do not have effect in relation to regulated loan contracts under which the credit provider is a Credit Union registered under the Credit Unions Act 1979.

Conditions of exemption

5. The exemption under clause 4 shall be subject to the following conditions—

(a) The statements prescribed for the purpose of Section 32 (1) and (2) of the Credit Act 1984 containing the following words immediately below the heading "Things you must know", "This offer provides that the credit provider can vary the annual percentage rate and thereby increase or decrease the credit charge and your repayments".

(b) The statement prescribed for the purpose of Section 34 of the Credit Act containing at the end of the ninth line of clause 2 thereof, the additional words "and whether such rate may be varied by the credit provider".

(c) The statement prescribed for the purpose of Section 34 of the Act containing the following clauses—

8. Can any of the conditions of the contract be changed by the credit provider?
Yes, but only if your contract says so.

8A Can the credit provider change the annual percentage rate?

Yes, if your contract says so. The rate may be increased or decreased. This may result in some increase or decrease in your repayments if the term of your contract is not varied. If the rate is increased, you may elect to extend the term of your contract and continue to make the existing payments for the extended term or pay the increased payments for the remainder of the existing term of your contract.

8B Can I pay out my contract if my credit provider increases the annual percentage rate?

Yes, you may elect to do this and refinance the loan. You should compare the annual percentage rate of the credit providers to ensure you are getting the best rate.

- (d) Where in accordance with a provision of a regulated loan contract the credit provider exercises a right under the contract to vary by increasing the annual percentage rate the credit provider shall give to the debtor a notice in writing stating—
- (I) the annual percentage rate at the time of the notice together with the annual percentage rate to which the credit provider proposes to vary the contract.
 - (II) the amount of each instalment to be paid under the contract as varied.
 - (III) the number of instalments remaining to be paid under the contract as varied.
 - (IV) the amount by which the credit charge is varied.
 - (V) that the debtor may choose to continue to pay instalments at the rate agreed to at the date of contract and including a statement specifying—
 - (a) the number of instalments remaining to be paid under the contract in the event that no variation is made to the amount of the instalment.
 - (b) the revised term of the contract.
 - (c) the amount of each instalment, where that instalment is the same except the last, together with the amount of the last instalment.
- (e) Where the annual percentage rate is varied in accordance with paragraph (d) of this clause, the credit provider shall agree to permit the debtor to vary the contract in the manner specified in paragraph (d) (V) without any deferral charge payable by the debtor.
- (f) A regulated loan contract does not contain a provision which entitles a credit provider to vary by increasing the annual percentage rate prior to the date upon which the amount financed is advanced to the debtor or at his direction.
- (g) Where in accordance with a provision of a regulated loan contract the credit provider exercises a right under the contract to vary by increasing the annual percentage rate the variation shall not have effect prior to the expiration of a period of 28 days after notice of the variation has been given to the debtor in writing.
- (h) That any variation in the annual percentage rate of an existing credit contract shall not have the effect of increasing the annual percentage rate in credit contracts negotiated by the credit provider at the date the variation takes effect.
- (i) Where in accordance with a provision of a regulated loan contract the credit provider exercises a right under the contract to vary by decreasing the annual percentage rate the credit provider shall give notice to the debtor stating:—
- (I) the annual percentage rate at the time of the notice together with the annual percentage rate to which the credit provider will vary the contract and the date from which the variation will have effect.
 - (II) that the debtor may choose to either continue to pay instalments at the existing rate or to decrease the amount of those instalments so that the existing term of the contract does not vary in which case the debtor should contact the credit provider to make the appropriate arrangements.
- (j) A notice pursuant to paragraph (i) of this clause may be given in the form of an announcement referring to all loan contracts of a particular category and:—
- (I) published in *The West Australian* newspaper;
 - (II) published in a newsletter of the credit provider circulated to each debtor to whom the variation applies; or
 - (III) included on a financial statement sent to each debtor to whom the variation applies.

CREDIT ACT 1984

ORDER UNDER SECTION 19

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Credit (Credit Union—Establishment Fees) Order No. 20D of 1989.

Term of Exemption

2. This Order shall take effect on and from 1 April, 1989 and shall remain in force until 30 September 1989.

Establishment of Fees (exemption)

3. Sections 44, 75 and 82 of the Credit Act do not have effect in relation to a regulated loan contract under which a Credit Union registered under the Credit Unions Act 1979 is the credit provider to the extent that the contract provides for the payment of a fee known as an establishment fee and provides for such fee to be deducted from the amount financed.

4. Section 103 (1) (a) of the Credit Act insofar as it refers to a payment received shall not have effect in relation to a payment of a fee made in accordance with this Order.

 REAL ESTATE AND BUSINESS AGENTS (GENERAL) AMENDMENT

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Real Estate and Business Agents (General) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1989*.

Principal regulations

2. In these regulations the *Real Estate and Business Agents (General) Regulations 1979** are referred to as the principal regulations.

Regulation 2 amended

3. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the definition of "the Act" and substituting the following definition—

" "Ministry" means the Ministry of Consumer Affairs of the State. "

Regulation 11AA amended

4. Regulation 11AA of the principal regulations is amended by deleting paragraph (c) and substituting the following paragraph—

" (c) of or towards the costs and expenses of educating persons who are licensed or registered under the Act or are concerned in the administration of the Act or the public generally prescribed in regulation 11B—50%. "

Regulation 11B repealed and a regulation substituted—

5. Regulation 11B of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—

Prescribed costs and expenses under section 130 (1) (b) (iii)

" 11B. Costs and expenses incurred for the following purposes are prescribed for the purposes of section 130 (1) (b) (iii) of the Act—

- (a) educational courses culminating in the examinations prescribed by regulation 6 or the qualifications prescribed by regulation 6A;
- (b) educational courses, seminars and workshops conducted by the Board or the Ministry;
- (c) all other educational courses in connection with the functions of persons licensed or registered under the Act conducted by—
 - (i) the Building Owners and Managers Association in the State;
 - (ii) Curtin University of Technology in the State;
 - (iii) the Real Estate Institute of Western Australia Incorporated; or
 - (iv) the Technical and Further Education Division of the Education Department of the State;
- (d) participation by members and officers of the Board in national annual real estate licensing authorities conferences;
- (e) the holding in the State, in turn by rotation, of the national annual real estate licensing authorities conference;
- (f) participation by members and officers of the Board in special work groups formed through the national conferences of licensing authorities to inquire into matters affecting the operations of real estate agents, business agents and sales representatives;
- (g) participation by members and officers of the Board, the Ministry or educational institutions in deliberations on common core education programmes for qualification for grant of licences or certificates of registration;
- (h) research and re-writing of education programmes for qualification for grant of licences or certificates of registration;
- (i) capital equipment and facilities for use in conjunction with the conduct of educational courses referred to in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c).
