- is not Crown Land within the meaning of that expression in Section 5 of the Act; and
- is specified in the proclamation, is Crown Land for the purposes of the Petroleum Act, 1967-81 and is land to which that Act applies, so long as the proclamation remains in force:

Now, therefore, I the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in the exercise of the powers under Subsection (2) of Section 15 of the Petroleum Act, 1967-81, do hereby declare that the land of the Crown comprising Reserve Nos 24275, 24437, 35593 & 35594 classified as Class "C" and set apart for the purposes of Education, Water and Camping, a Gravel Pit and the Conservation of Flora respectively pursuant to the provisions of the Land Act, 1933 is Crown Land for the purpose of the Petroleum Act, 1967-81 and is land to which the Petroleum Act, 1967-81 applies so long as this proclamation remains in force, subject to—

The proposed petroleum operations being undertaken in accordance with appropriate conditions determined in consultation with the authorities in which the reserves are vested.

(i) the pack is labelled with the warning statement—WARNING—THIS MEDICATION MAY BE DANGEROUS WHEN USED IN LARGE AMOUNTS OF FOR A LONG PERIOD; or CAUTION—THIS PREPARATION IS FOR THE RELIEF OF MINOR AND TEMPORARY AILMENTS AND SHOULD BE USED STRICTLY AS DIRECTED. PROLONGED USE WITHOUT MEDICAL SUPERVISION COULD BE HARMFUL; and

(ii) packed in blister or strip packaging or in containers with a child-resistant closure; and

(iii) in a primary pack containing not more than 25 such tablets or capsules. ";

1. This Notice may be cited as the *Shark Bay Prawn Limited Entry Fishery Notice 1989*.

Commencement

2. This notice shall come into operation on the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.

Interpretation

3. In this notice unless the contrary intention appears—
“approved form” means in a form approved by the Director;
“area” means an area described in item 2 of the Schedule;
“boat units” means boat units calculated in accordance with clause 15;
“Fishery” means the Shark Bay Prawn Limited Entry Fishery declared under clause 4;
“headrope length” means the distance measured along the headrope from where the otter trawl net attaches to one end of the headrope to where it attaches to the other end of the headrope;
“licence” means a licence authorising a boat to operate in the Fishery;
“otter board” means one of the boards used on an otter trawl net to keep the mouth of the net at maximum width while under tow;
“prawns” means all species of decapod crustacea of the family *Penaeidae*;
“standard trawl net” means an otter trawl net with a headrope length exceeding five metres, but not exceeding 14.63 metres;
“try net” means an otter trawl net with a headrope length not exceeding five metres.

Declaration of limited entry fishery

4. (1) It is hereby declared that prawns shall constitute a limited entry fishery in the waters described in item 1 of the Schedule to be called the *Shark Bay Prawn Limited Entry Fishery*.
(2) The waters referred to in subclause (1) shall be divided into areas as described in item 2 of the Schedule.

Prohibition on taking prawns

5. A person, other than a person to whom section 32 (5) of the Act applies, shall not take, or attempt to take, prawns by any means in the waters described in item 1 of the Schedule other than in accordance with this notice.

Prohibition on selling or dealing

6. A person shall not sell or deal or attempt to sell or deal in any way with prawns taken in contravention of this notice.

Criteria to determine the boats which may operate in the Fishery

7. The criteria that shall be applied to determine the boats which may operate in the Fishery are—
 - (a) that immediately before the coming into operation of this notice the owner or person in charge of a boat was the holder of a licence authorising the boat to be used to take prawns in the Shark Bay Prawn Fishery from 21 March 1988 to 15 November 1988; or
 - (b) that the boat replaces a boat to which paragraph (a) applied.

Application for a licence

8. The owner of a boat which fulfils the criteria in clause 7 (a) or (b) may apply in accordance with clause 19 for a licence authorising the boat to operate in the Fishery.

Details on Licence

9. A licence shall contain the following details—
 - (a) the name and licensed fishing boat number in respect to which it is issued;
 - (b) the name and address of the owner or licensee of that boat;
 - (c) the licence number;
 - (d) the day of issue;
 - (e) the period for which the licence is valid; and
 - (f) any conditions imposed on the licence.

Closure of the fishery

10. (1) A person, other than a person to whom section 32 (5) of the Act applies, shall not take, or attempt to take prawns—
 - (a) during the periods commencing on 1 January and ending at 1700 hours on 15 April and commencing at 0800 hours on 15 November and ending on 31 December in any year, in any waters of the Fishery;
 - (b) during the period commencing at 1700 hours on 15 April and ending at 0800 hours on 25 April in any year, in that area of the Fishery described in item 2 (a) of the Schedule;
 - (c) during the period commencing at 0800 hours on 25 April and ending at 0800 hours on 1 August in any year, in that area of the Fishery described in item 2 (b) of the Schedule;
 - (d) during the period commencing at 0800 hours on 1 August and ending at 0800 hours on 15 November in any year, in that area of the Fishery described in item 2 (c) of the Schedule.

Authorised means of operating in the Fishery

11. (1) A person shall not take, or attempt to take, prawns by any means from a licensed boat in the Fishery other than by—

- (a) two standard trawl nets; and
- (b) one try net.

(2) A standard trawl net may—

- (a) have attached to each end of the headrope a single otter board the measurements of which do not exceed 2.44 metres in length and 0.91 metres in breadth and have shoes which do not exceed 150 millimetres in width and 25 millimetres in depth; and
- (b) have attached to it one ground chain the links of which do not exceed 10 millimetres in diameter.

Stowage of otter boards and otter trawl nets

12. Unless otherwise authorised in writing by the Director, otter boards and otter trawl nets carried by or attached to a boat shall be secured to the boat and be kept out of the water between 0800 hours and 1700 hours on each day of operation.

Transfer of licence

13. With the prior written approval of the Director a licence granted under this notice may be transferred and the licence shall be endorsed accordingly.

Cancellation and suspension of licence

14. The Minister may renew, remove, suspend, transfer or cancel, with or without conditions, any licence or endorsement issued under this notice.

Boat replacement

15. (1) For the purpose of this clause—

“Code” means the Uniform Shipping Laws Code Adopted by the Marine and Ports Council of Australia and published in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* on 11 May, 1981;

“B” means “breadth” as defined in the Code;

“D” means “depth” as defined in the Code;

“IEP” is installed engine power in kilowatts of the boat’s engine as certified by the supplier;

“ML” means “measured length” as defined in the Code measured in accordance with Appendix A to Section 1 of the Code:

(2) Subject to the prior written approval of the Director a boat licensed to operate in the Fishery may be replaced by a boat provided that the replacement boat does not exceed 375 boat units calculated in accordance with the following formula—

Boat modification

16. The owner of a boat licensed to operate in the Fishery shall not, without the prior written approval of the Director, repower the boat by—

- (a) changing the configuration of the existing engine, gearbox, propeller, propeller shaft or other components; or
- (b) installing a new engine.

Engine seals

17. (1) The owner of a boat licensed to operate in the Fishery shall—

- (a) on the written instruction of the Director cause the suppliers of an engine for the boat to install a lead seal on the fuel pump of such engine; and
- (b) authorise the Director to install any such further lead seals as the Director may require.

(2) The owner of the boat the engine of which has installed a seal in accordance with subclause (1) (a) or (b) shall—

- (i) not permit the removal or allow any interference to such seal without the prior written approval of the Director; and

By-laws Relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades. BY-laws relating to the Establishment, Maintenance and Equipment of Bush Fire Brigades appearing in the Government Gazette on 1 March 1940 for Road District of Broomehill are hereby revoked.

Establishment of brigade

- 1. (a) By resolution, the Council may establish, maintain and equip a Bush Fire Brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954 and Regulations thereunder, the Brigade shall be formed in accordance with these By-laws; and a name shall be given to the Brigade. Details of the Brigade and its officers shall be entered in the register of Bush Fire Brigades held by the Council. (b) A Bush Fire Brigade may be established for the whole of the Shire or for any specified area thereof.

Appointment of officers

- 2. The Council shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the Brigade. 3. Members of the Brigade shall elect a person to act as Secretary to the Brigade and shall inform the Council accordingly. 4. The Council may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purposes of the Brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot approved by the captain.

Powers and duties of officers

- 5. The powers and duties of all officers appointed under these By-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act 1954 and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and Regulations.

Membership of brigade

- 6. (1) The membership of a Bush Fire Brigade may consist of the following— (a) Subscribing members; and (b) fire fighting members; (2) Subscribing members shall be those persons, who being interested in forwarding the objects of the Brigade, pay an annual subscription to the funds of the Brigade at the following rates. is found to contain less than 11.75 per cent total milk solids, as determined by the aforementioned Standard Method during any testing period on a second or succeeding occasion after 1 January 1987 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of that testing period will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found to contain less than 3.2 per cent milk fat, as determined by one of the aforementioned methods during any testing period on a second or succeeding occasion after 1 January 1987 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of that testing period will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Authority or its authorised agent on a certain day to contain antibiotic or other inhibitory substance on a second occasion after 1 January 1987 or a second occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Authority or its authorised agent on a certain day to contain antibiotic or other inhibitory substance on a third or succeeding occasion after 1 January 1987 or on a third or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by the dairyman for the duration of that testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Authority or its authorised agent on a certain day to contain added water on the first occasion after 1 January 1987 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for that one day will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Authority or its authorised agent on a certain day to contain added water on a second or succeeding occasion after 1 January 1987 or on a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk.

is found by the Authority or its authorised agent on a certain day to contain added solids on the first occasion after 1 January 1987 or on the first occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of two testing periods.

is found by the Authority or its authorised agent on a certain day to contain added solids on a second or succeeding occasion after 1 January 1987 or a second or succeeding occasion in any subsequent quota year, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk for a minimum of four testing periods.

is found by the Authority or its authorised agent on a certain day from 1 February 1987, to have a bacterial count over 50 000 bacteria per millilitre, milk supplied by that dairyman will not be accepted by the Authority as market milk or special products milk as follows:

- on the fourth occasion in any twelve month period—for one day;
- on the fifth occasion in any twelve month period—for two days in that month;
- on the sixth occasion in any twelve month period—for three days in that month;
- on the seventh occasion in any twelve month period—for five days in that month;

and on the eighth or succeeding occasion in any twelve month period for the duration of the testing period in which that day occurs.

Where milk delivered by a dairyman is acceptable as market milk or special products milk and the abovementioned prices for market milk or special products milk apply—

market milk or special products milk delivered by a dairyman to the Authority is accepted by the Authority at the dairyman's registered dairy produce premises.

market milk or special products milk delivered by a dairyman and accepted by the Authority is disposed of by the Authority to the dairy produce factory at the point of acceptance by the Authority.

Provided that nothing in the Dairy Industry Act 1973-1983, requires the Authority to accept all or any milk delivered to it by any person; and milk delivered to and accepted by the Authority may be disposed of by the Authority to milk vendors or other persons.

THE MAXIMUM PRICES—

to be charged by milk vendors to milk vendors and milk distributors,

to be charged by milk distributors to milk shops,

shall be at the undermentioned rates and shall apply in the dairy areas and districts mentioned for market milk which is sold in—

Amending Statute No. 8

Amendments to Statute No. 4—Student Guild

Statute No. 4 is amended by the deletion of the existing sections 5, 6 and 11 and the substitution of the following clauses in their place—

5. Membership

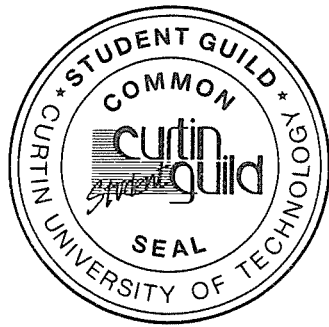
- (1) Subject to the provisions of the Act and subsection (2) of this section, all enrolled students shall be members of the Guild.
- (2) The following persons or classes of persons shall not be eligible to be members:
 - (a) persons who are not enrolled students of the University;
 - (b) enrolled students who are members of the full-time academic staff of the University;
 - (c) such persons and classes of persons as the University Council declares by resolution to be ineligible for membership of the Guild.
- (3) A member shall cease to be a member when he or she ceases to be an enrolled student or becomes ineligible to be a member or in such other circumstances as shall be prescribed by Guild regulations.

6. Subscriptions

- (1) Members of the Guild shall pay to the Guild such subscriptions as are from time to time determined by the Guild and approved by the University Council. Different subscriptions may be determined and approved in respect of different classes of students or different classes of membership of the Guild.
- (2) A student who is an enrolled student at another tertiary institution may be exempted by the Guild from all or part of the Guild subscriptions having regard to the student's total enrolment.
- (3) The Guild may refund in whole or in part the amount of the subscriptions to persons who withdraw or change their enrolment or who are enrolled at another tertiary institution.

11. Seal

- (1) The Common Seal of the Guild shall be in the following form—



- (2) The Guild Council shall provide for the safe custody of the Common Seal which shall only be used by the authority of a resolution of the Guild Council and in the presence of the President of the Guild who shall sign every instrument to which the seal is affixed and every such instrument shall be countersigned by some other person appointed by the Guild Council.

Schedule

Statute No. 19—
Business and Administration Foundation

Whereas—

- (a) The Division of Business and Administration is a part of the University.
- (b) The University has agreed to accept donations to be applied solely for the purposes of the Business and Administration Foundation as herein described.
- (c) Funds donated for the purposes of the Business and Administration Foundation are to be kept apart from the other funds and property of the University and made the subject of the Business and Administration Foundation.
- (d) This Statute is to establish the Business and Administration Foundation.

Accordingly it is enacted as follows—

1. Definitions

- 1.1 In this Statute unless the context otherwise requires—

“Board” means the Board of Management of the Foundation;

“Council” means the Council of the Curtin University of Technology;

“Division” means the Division of Business and Administration;

“Donor” means any person who has donated monies, property or assets to the foundation and includes a duly nominated representative of a Donor;

“Person” includes a partnership, association, corporation or company whether incorporated or unincorporated;

“The Fund” means the Business and Administration Foundation established by this Statute and includes all property, both real and personal, from time to time held by the University on account of or for the Foundation pursuant hereto and all investments representing such property or any part thereof and any income arising therefrom;

“Year” means each period of twelve (12) months ending on 31 December.

2. The Fund

2.1 The Fund hereby constituted shall be known as the Business and Administration Foundation.

2.2 The Fund shall be kept apart in the accounts and records of the University from the other funds and property of the University and applied solely in accordance with the terms of this Statute.

2.3 Subject to sub section 2.2 The Fund shall be invested by the University in accordance with the Act.

3. Objects

3.1 The objects of the Foundation shall be to—

- (a) provide supplementary funds for the Division with the aim of furthering and enhancing the activities of the Division as a centre of excellence in business education;
- (b) preserve, improve and develop the Division's standards, services, staffing, property and facilities;
- (c) provide a link between the Division, the community, commerce and industry;
- (d) support the advancement of knowledge in business and administration.

3.2 For the purpose of carrying out the objects of the Foundation the Board may from time to time authorise grants or the expenditure of monies being part of the Foundation for—

- (a) the acquisition by construction, purchase or lease of suitable premises for the Division's activities, and the improvement of existing facilities and premises;
- (b) the improvement of staffing levels in the Division including visiting staff;
- (c) the provision of consultancy, research and extension activities in connection with the activities of the Division;
- (d) the acquisition and enhancement of specialised equipment for use in the activities of the Division;
- (e) any other purpose which is consistent with the object of furthering and enhancing the Division as a centre of excellence in business education.

4. Donations

4.1 Donations to the Foundation may be accepted from any source including donations by way of—

- (a) lump sum contributions;
- (b) donations in instalments;
- (c) interest from amounts deposited with the University or otherwise;
- (d) transfers or bequests of property or assets;

- (e) a proportion of any surplus derived from the income earning activities of the Division, as determined by the Divisional Resources Board from time to time.
5. Donors
- 5.1 Any Donor that is a body corporate may, by notice to the Board, nominate any person to represent it for any of the purposes of this Statute and may from time to time change its representative.
- 5.2 The Secretary shall keep a register of all Donors and nominated representatives.
6. Board
- 6.1 The Board shall be appointed by the Council and shall consist of—
- (a) up to five members, at least one of whom shall be a member of the Council and not more than four of whom may be donors;
- (b) the Chairperson of the Divisional Advisory Council;
- (c) a member of the Divisional Advisory Council;
- (d) the Deputy Vice-Chancellor of the Division *ex officio*; and
- (e) a nominee of the Deputy Vice-Chancellor from the staff of the Division.
- 6.2 The Board shall elect a Chairperson from among their members.
- 6.3 Each member of the Board shall hold office for a period of three years from the date of appointment and shall be eligible for reappointment.
- 6.4 The Council may approve the appointment of an alternate member for any member of the Board for a stated period or for any absence due to illness.
- 6.5 The office of a member of the Board shall be vacated if the member gives written notice of resignation to the Secretary.
7. Powers and Responsibilities of the Board
- The Board
- 7.1 Shall have power to manage all the affairs of the Foundation.
- 7.2 Shall be responsible to the Council for the general management and administration of the Foundation.
- 7.3 May establish such specialist and advisory committees as it deems necessary from time to time composed of such members of the Board or other persons as the Board may decide.
- 7.4 Shall provide the Council with a financial statement and a report on the affairs and operations of the Foundation in the previous year by 31 March each year.
- 7.5 Shall nominate a person to act as Secretary of the Foundation. The Secretary shall perform such duties as may from time to time be required by the Board.
8. Proceedings of the Board
- 8.1 The Board may meet together for the despatch of business adjourn and otherwise regulate its meetings as it thinks fit and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise determined one half of the members of the Board shall form a quorum.
- 8.2 The Chairperson of the Board may at any time and the Secretary upon the request of at least two members thereof shall convene a meeting of the Board. At least one meeting of the Board shall be held each year. Unless otherwise agreed by the Board at least seven (7) days notice of any meeting shall be given by the Secretary.
- 8.3 Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes, each member having one vote, and in the case of an equality of votes the Chairperson shall have a second or casting vote.
- 8.4 The Chairperson shall act as Chairperson of any meeting of the Board. If the Chairperson is not present at the time appointed for holding the meeting, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairperson of such meeting.
9. Annual General Meeting
- 9.1 An Annual General Meeting shall be held each year for the purpose of receiving and considering the Board's annual report on the affairs and operations of the Foundation for the previous year and the audited financial statements in respect thereof and such other matters as may be dealt with in accordance with this Statute.
- 9.2 All Donors shall be entitled to attend any Annual General Meeting.
- 9.3 The Chairperson of the Board shall be Chairperson of the Annual General Meeting.
10. Dissolution
- 10.1 The Council may on the prior recommendation of the Board resolve that the Foundation be dissolved and the Foundation shall be deemed to be dissolved on the repeal of this Statute.
- 10.2 In the event that the Foundation is dissolved any monies or assets then forming part thereof shall be disbursed by the Council for the benefit of the Division.
