- (c) the powers and duties of the Chief Executive Officer under section 73 in any case where waste has been or is being discharged from any premises into any land and waters;

(d) the powers and duties of the Chief Executive Officer under section 114.

In this delegation the terms "land and waters" means land and waters within the management area declared under section 4 of the Swan River Trust Act, 1988.





MINES REGULATION ACT 1946

MINES REGULATION AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (No. 2) 1989

MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Mines Regulation Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1989.

Principal Regulations

2. In these regulations the Mines Regulation Act Regulations 1976* are referred to as the principal regulations.

[*Reprinted in the Gazette on 14 September 1984 at pp. 2945-3071. For amendments to 7 March 1989 see p. 319 of 1987 Index Legislation of Western Australia and Gazettes of 14 October 1988 and 24 February 1989.]

Regulation 6.9 amended

- 3. Regulation 6.9 (2) of the principal regulations is amended—
 - (a) in paragraph (a)-
 - (i) by deleting "locomotive or"; and
 - (ii) in subparagraph (ii) by inserting before "he" the following-
 - " in the case of a winding engine, "; and
 - (b) in paragraph (c) by inserting before "any" the following-
 - " subject to regulation 20.7, ".

Regulation 20.7 repealed and regulations 20.7, 20.7A, 20.7B, 20.7C and 20.7D substituted

- 4. Regulation 20.7 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulations are substituted— $\,$
 - 20.7 (1) Subject to subregulation (2) and regulation 6.9 (1)—
 - (a) a person shall not drive, operate or have charge of a locomotive on a mine railway unless he is a certified locomotive driver; and

- (b) a person shall not employ or permit a person to drive, operate or have charge of a locomotive on a mine railway unless the person so employed or permitted is a certified locomotive driver.
- (2) A person undergoing instruction may drive or operate a locomotive while under the supervision of a certified locomotive driver.
- (3) In this regulation and regulations 20.7A and 20.7B "certified locomotive driver" means the holder of—
 - (a) a locomotive driver's certificate of competency issued under regulation 20.7B;
 - (b) an unrestricted A class locomotive driver's certificate of competency issued under the former Inspection of Machinery Act 1921 or the former Machinery Safety Act 1974.

Application for a locomotive driver's certificate of competency

20.7A. An application by a person for the issue of a locomotive driver's certificate of competency shall be made in the form determined by the State Mining Engineer and shall be accompanied by—

- (a) evidence of the age of the applicant;
- (b) a medical certificate, made out in the form determined by the State Mining Engineer, as to the physical condition of the applicant;
- (c) a statement identifying the types and sizes of locomotives driven or operated by the applicant prior to undertaking the examination referred to in regulation 20.7B (1) (d) and the locations in which the locomotives were driven or operated;
- (d) a testimonial from a certified locomotive driver or drivers verifying that the applicant has obtained the experience under direct supervision specified in regulation 20.7B; and
- (e) a payment of a fee of \$20.

Issue of a locomotive driver's certificate of competency

20.7B (1) The State Mining Engineer shall issue a locomotive driver's certificate of competency where he is satisfied that the applicant—

- (a) can read and write the English language;
- (b) is medically fit to drive and operate locomotives on mine railways;
- (c) has had experience under direct supervision of a certified locomotive driver as specified in subregulation (2) for—
 - (i) in the case of a person who holds a certificate of competency issued under the Occupational Health, Safety and Welfare Regulations 1988 for the driving of steam locomotives or for the operation of internal combustion engines, at least 6 months;
 - (ii) in the case of a person who holds certificates of competency under those Regulations for both the driving of steam locomotives and the operation of internal combustion engines, at least 3 months; and
 - (iii) in any other case, at least 9 months;
- (d) has passed a written and oral examination, prescribed by the State Mining Engineer after considering the advice of an examinations advisory panel in the Department, about the parts of diesel locomotives, including braking systems, and their operation; and
- (e) was on the date of that examination at least 21 years of age.
- (2) The experience under direct supervision of a certified locomotive driver—
 - (a) must have included driving or assisting to drive a diesel locomotive with an engine having a combined cylinder area over 0.064 square metres for at least 12 hours every week and for at least 3 months on main line operations; and
 - (b) must have been obtained prior to the date of the examination referred to in subregulation (1) (d).

Cancellation or suspension of a locomotive driver's certificate of competency

20.7C. (1) The State Mining Engineer may cancel or suspend a locomotive driver's certificate of competency if he is satisfied on reasonable grounds that the holder of the certificate—

- (a) obtained the certificate by fraud;
- (b) is not a fit and proper person to hold the certificate; or
- (c) is not medically fit to drive and operate locomotives on mine railways,

but before exercising this power, the State Mining Engineer shall give the person concerned an opportunity to make a written submission.

- (2) A person whose locomotive driver's certificate of competency is cancelled or suspended shall return the certificate to the State Mining Engineer.
- (3) In this regulation and regulation 20.7D "locomotive driver's certificate of competency" means— $\,$
 - (a) a locomotive driver's certificate of competency issued under regulation 20.7B;
 - (b) an unrestricted A class locomotive driver's certificate of competency issued under the former Inspection of Machinery Act 1921 or the former Machinery Safety Act 1974.

Replacement of locomotive driver's certificate of competency

20.7D Where the State Mining Engineer is satisfied that a locomotive driver's certificate of competency issued to a person has been lost or destroyed, he shall issue a duplicate certificate to that person on payment of a fee of \$20.

Regulation 20.9 repealed and a regulation substituted

- 5. Regulation 20.9 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—
 - 20.9. (1) Every train controller, member of a train crew or other person employed in any capacity where he requires a full knowledge of the operating rules, signals and signals codes shall present himself to a medical practitioner registered under the *Medical Act 1894* for examination as to his hearing, vision and fitness generally at least once in every 2 years and more frequently if required by a medical practitioner or an inspector, and in the case of an examination of a locomotive driver, the medical practitioner must be approved by the State Mining Engineer.
 - (2) The results of a medical examination shall be recorded in the form determined by the State Mining Engineer and forwarded to the owner or manager, or agent of the owner or manager, of the mine at which the person examined is employed.
 - (3) Where a medical practitioner records under subregulation (2) the opinion that the person examined is not medically fit to carry out duties in a specified class of employment
 - a person shall not after that employ the person concerned or permit him to be employed in that class of employment; and
 - (b) the person concerned shall not after being notified of the opinion recorded, perform any work in that class of employment.
