#### HEALTH ACT 1911

##### Shire of Beverley

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Health Act 1911 the Shire of Beverley, being a local authority within the meaning of the Health Act 1911, having adopted the Model By-laws described as Series "A" made under the Health Act 1911 and as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act 1954 in the *Government Gazette* on 17 July 1963 and as amended from time to time, has resolved and determined that the adopted By-laws shall be amended as follows—

1. By deleting By-law 19 of Part 1 and inserting the following new By-law in its place—

##### Method of Disposal of Rubbish

19 (1) In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires, "Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Beverley.

(2) It shall be the duty of the local authority to ensure household rubbish deposited at a site under its control is—

- (a) distributed in such a manner that no layer of rubbish is deeper than 1.8 metres; and
- (b) covered each day with a layer of earth at least 230 millimetres.

(3) No person other than an authorised employee of the Council or a person authorised in writing by the Council shall enter or be on any land used by the Council for the deposit of refuse, garbage, or rubbish except for the purpose of depositing of refuse, garbage or rubbish thereon.

(4) A person using a vehicle for disposing of material on land set aside by the Council for the depositing of refuse garbage or rubbish shall cause the vehicle to be removed from the land immediately such vehicle has been emptied of material.

(5) No person on any land used by the Council for the deposit of refuse, garbage or rubbish shall—

- (a) deposit any refuse, garbage or rubbish other than at a position on the land designated by the Council.
- (b) light or cause to be burnt any refuse, garbage or rubbish unless authorised by the Council.
- (c) deposit any motor vehicle body, large tree trunks and limbs, old machinery, toxic or hazardous wastes, oils, liquid wastes, or other material not easily compressible except at a place set aside by the Council for the purpose and except in accordance with such conditions as the Council may from time to time impose.
- (d) deposit any agriculture chemical container unless in accordance with the Health (Pesticides) Regulations.

(6) (a) No person other than an authorised employee of the Council or a person authorised in writing by the Council shall interfere with or remove any material or thing, whatsoever from any land used by the Council for the deposit of refuse, garbage or rubbish.

(7) No person shall in any way obstruct or hinder an authorised employee of the Council in the execution of his duties pursuant to these By-laws.

(8) A person who deposits or disposes of any refuse, garbage, liquid waste or rubbish at a place other than a place set aside by the Council for the purpose, commits an offence.

(9) Any person contravening these By-laws commits an offence.

- 67B. (1) In relation to an appeal, the magistrate may—  
(a) by summons require the attendance at the hearing of any person whose evidence appears to the magistrate to be material to the determination of the appeal;  
(b) by summons require the production of any book, document or other record that appears to the magistrate to be material to the determination of the appeal;  
(c) inspect any book, document or other record produced at a hearing and retain it for such reasonable period as he or she thinks fit, and make copies of it or any of its contents;  
(d) require any person attending at the hearing to answer any question put to that person (whether by the magistrate or by a party to the appeal);  
(e) receive any affidavit.  
(2) The magistrate may administer an oath or affirmation to a person attending at the hearing.  
(3) A person shall not, without lawful excuse, refuse or fail—  
(a) to attend at a hearing;  
(b) to be sworn or make an affirmation; or  
(c) to answer a question or produce a book, document or record,  
when required to do so under this regulation.

## Magistrate not bound by rules of evidence, technicalities, etc.

- 67C. The magistrate, when hearing an appeal—  
(a) is not bound by the rules of evidence and may inform himself or herself on any matter in such manner as he or she thinks fit; and  
(b) shall act according to the substantial merits of the case without regard to technicalities and legal forms.

## Conduct of appeal

- 67D. (1) The magistrate may give such directions, not inconsistent with these regulations, relating to the conduct of the appeal as he or she thinks fit.  
(2) Without limiting the generality of subregulation (1), the magistrate may give a direction—  
(a) that a person shall not be present at the hearing unless—  
(i) in the opinion of the magistrate, he or she is directly interested in the proceedings; or  
(ii) he or she has been authorized by the magistrate to be present;  
and  
(b) as to the persons who may be parties to the proceedings.

## Power to question informally etc.

- 67E. (1) Without limiting the generality of regulation 67C (a) or regulation 67D, the magistrate may—  
(a) restrict or bar the questioning of a patient by any party to the appeal and instead personally question the patient in an informal setting in the presence of the parties and a person who is known to the patient and whose presence may encourage the patient to speak freely; and  
(b) receive and act upon—  
(i) the evidence of a medical practitioner employed in the Department as to statements made to that medical practitioner by a patient concerning any matter giving rise to a complaint under regulation 39; and  
(ii) the opinion of the medical practitioner as to the mental state and credibility of the patient at the time the statements referred to in subparagraph (i) were made.

(2) In subregulation (1), “patient” means any person receiving treatment in, or attending for treatment at, any approved hospital or service facility established and maintained under section 19 (1) of the Act.

## Person shall obey directions

- 67F. A person shall not refuse or fail to obey a direction given under regulation 67D.

## Determination on balance of probabilities

- 67G. The magistrate shall determine any matter in issue upon the balance of probabilities.

## Magistrate may affirm, reverse or modify decision

- 67H. (1) The magistrate may affirm, reverse or modify any decision or award of punishment against which an appeal is brought, and the decision of the magistrate shall be final.  
(2) Where under subregulation (1), the magistrate reverses or modifies a decision or award of punishment, the magistrate may make such further orders relating to the employment, remuneration and other employee benefits of the appellant as he or she thinks necessary to give effect to the reversal or modification. ”

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from land as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer in writing on or before November 1989, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The Firebreaks Inspection officers will commence inspection of firebreaks and fire hazards early in the season.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$400 or a prescribed penalty of \$40 on service of an infringement notice, and a person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed by this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

#### BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

Shire of Pingelly

Firebreaks Order 1989/90

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, owners occupiers of property within the Shire of Pingelly are hereby required to provide and maintain firebreaks as follows—

"Firebreak" means ground from which all inflammable material has been removed and on which no inflammable material is permitted during the Firebreak period.

"Firebreak Period" means the time between 14th November in any year and 15th April in the following year.

"Fuel Depot" means any land, ramp, yard, or building used for the storage of inflammable liquid or gas.

"Residential Area" means any land zoned residential under the Shire of Pingelly Town Planning Scheme.

"Rural Land" means all land within the Shire of Pingelly not defined as Townsite land.

"Townsite Land" means all land within the boundary of the Pingelly Townsite.

All owners or occupiers of land within the Shire of Pingelly shall provide and maintain firebreaks during the Firebreak period. On rural land, firebreaks to be not less than two metres wide as follows—

- (A) Inside all external boundaries of the land.
- (B) In such positions as to divide properties of more than 400 hectares into separate sections of no more than 400 hectares completely surrounded by a firebreak.
- (C) Within fifteen metres of the perimeter of all buildings and remove all inflammable material from within two metres of all such buildings.

Areas of Standing crop or hay, are to be surrounded by firebreaks not less than two metres wide.

Every haystack or hayshed is to be surrounded by a firebreak not less than five metres in width.

On townsite land, where a property or adjoining properties having the same ownership or control and are used as a single holding:

- (A) all lot/s with an area of 2 000 square metres or less, shall be either:
  - i) cleared of all inflammable material from the whole of the land,
  - ii) have the grass maintained to a height not greater than 10 cms.
- (B) all lot/s with an area greater than 2 000 square metres shall provide and maintain firebreaks not less than 2 metres in width inside all external boundaries of the land.

#### BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

(Section 33)

Shire of Kalamunda

Notice to all owners and/or occupiers of Land in the Shire of Kalamunda

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before 30 November 1989, to remove from the land owned or occupied by you all inflammable material or to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the land or the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including 31 March 1990.

You shall on or before 30 November 1989, or within fourteen days of the date of your becoming the owner or occupier, should this be after 15 November 1989.

(1) On Townsite Land or Land subdivided for Residential Purposes—clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least three metres wide immediately inside external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land. Keep gardens free of unnecessary leaves and rubbish, and lop any trees that can endanger your house in the event of a fire.

(2) Rural/Special Rural Land—clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least three metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and within thirty metres of the perimeter of any haystack, building or group of buildings, so positioned as to completely surround such haystack building or group of buildings.

(3) Fuel Dumps and Depots—removal all inflammable material from all land where fuel drum ramps or dumps are located and where fuel drums, whether containing fuel or not, are stored to a distance of at least five metres outside the perimeter of any drum, ramp or stack of drums.

Around fuel depots, all inflammable material must be removed for a continuous distance of fifteen metres from the depot or to the external boundary of the land whichever is nearer.

Where there is a stationary pump or engine, all grass or other inflammable material must be cleared for a distance of five metres completely surrounding the site.

If it is considered impracticable to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material from the land as required, application may be made in writing to the Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to put in place alternative fire hazard reduction measures. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer the requirements of this Order shall be complied with. Failure to comply with these requirements renders the offenders to the penalties prescribed in the Bush Fires Act 1954.

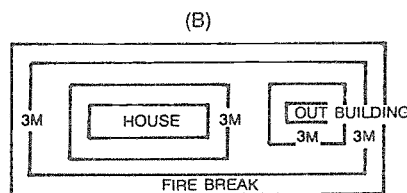
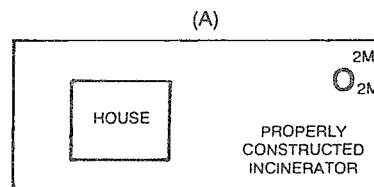

If permission is not granted by the council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not more than \$1 000 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

The following sketches have been prepared to show how the fire rules should be applied. Burning permits to be obtained from the Council Rangers Department 9.00 am to 4.00 pm weekdays only. Fines of up to \$1 000 are applicable where burning is carried out without the required burning permit.

Important Information Relating to Your Responsibility as a Landholder in the Shire of Busselton

WITH reference to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954-79, you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this order.

This work must be carried out by 22 December 1989 and kept maintained throughout the summer months until the close of the Restricted Burning Period 1990.

An inspection of firebreaks and hazard removal will be carried out in all areas of the Shire by an Authorised Officer on or after 22 December 1989.

Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of this order may be issued with an infringement notice (Penalty \$40) or prosecuted with an increased penalty, and additionally, Council may carry out the required work at cost to the owner or occupier.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks as required by this notice or natural features render firebreaks unnecessary, you may apply to the Council or

its duly authorised officer not later than the 8th day of December 1989, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

A. Rural Land—All land other than a pine plantation and that listed as Urban.

1. You shall clear of all inflammable material firebreaks at least 2 metres wide;

(a) a firebreak not less than 2 metres wide must be constructed within a perimeter of 20 metres of all homesteads, buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas on the land.

(b) In the case of haystacks the firebreak must not be closer than 6 metres of the haystack.

(c) Where the area of the land exceeds 121 hectares (approx. 300 acres), additional firebreaks so as to divide the land into areas of not more than 121 hectares (approx. 300 acres), which are completely surrounded with a firebreak.

B. Special Rural Land—The owners of all existing small rural holdings zoned as Special Rural under Town Planning Schemes must maintain clear of all flammable material a firebreak not less than two (2) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land.

C. Urban Land—Residential, Commercial and Industrial land within a townsite or within any area subdivided for residential purposes.

1. Where the area of land is 2 024 sq m (approx ½ acre) or less remove all flammable material on the land except living trees, shrubs and plants from the whole of the land, and

2. Where the area of land exceeds 2 024 sq m (approx ½ acre) clear of all flammable materials firebreaks of at least 2 metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

D. Fuel and or Gas Depots—In respect of land owned or occupied by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquid or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or supports are constructed, you shall maintain the land clear of all flammable materials.

E. Pine Plantations—Firebreaks not less than 10 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which pines are planted; not less than 10 metres in width along

those portions of pine plantations which enjoy a common boundary with a road reserve, and not less than 10 metres in width in such positions that no part or compartment of a pine plantation shall exceed 28 hectares in an area.

F. Eucalypt and Protea—Fire breaks not less than 5 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which Eucalypts and Protea are planted; not less than 5 metres in width along those portions of Eucalypt and Protea plantations which enjoy a common boundary with a road reserve, and not less than 5 metres in width in such positions that no part or compartment of a Eucalypt and Protea plantation shall exceed 28 hectares in an area.

Special Notice to Land Owners and Occupiers—The Council forwards a copy of this Firebreak order with rate assessments each year. The notice is also published in the Busselton-Margaret Times.

The aim of the Council is to eliminate destructive bush fires and to this aim, some areas of the Shire are subject to a District Fire Protection Plan where large scale hazard removal and roadside burning is carried out by the Shire's Bush Fire Brigades and Council workforce.

The requirements of this order are considered to be the minimum standard of fire prevention work required to protect not only individual properties but the district generally. In addition to the requirements of this Order, Council may issue separate special orders on owners or occupiers if hazard removal is considered necessary in some specific areas.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not more than \$1 000 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

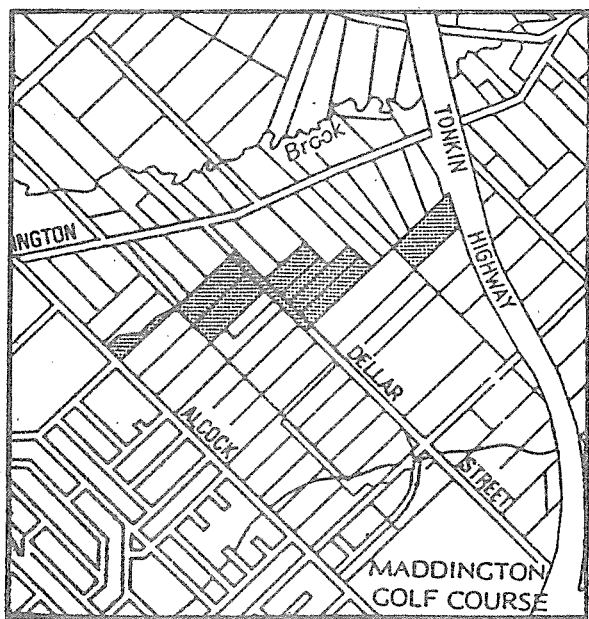

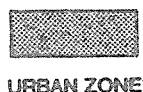

4. Every owner or occupier of land upon whom a notice is served under By-law 3 of these By-laws shall comply with such notice within the time specified therein specified.

5. Where the owner or occupier does not clear the land or remove the refuse, rubbish or disused material as required by the notice given by the Council, the Council may, without payment or any compensation in respect thereof, clear or remove it and dispose of it at the expense of, and recover in a court of competent jurisdiction the amount of the expense, from the owner or occupier to whom the notice was given.

6. Any person who fails to comply with any notice served under By-law 3 of these by-laws commits an offence against these by-laws and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty commensurate with the Act section 190 (7) (d) (i) and (ii).
