RETAIL TRADING HOURS ACT 1987

RETAIL TRADING HOURS EXEMPTION ORDER (No. 37) 1989

Made by the Minister for Consumer Affairs.

Citation

1. This order may cited as the Retail Trading Hours Exemption Order (No. 37) 1989.

Exemption

2. The operator of the filling station known as the Kelmscott Transport and Agency at 259 Railway Avenue, Kelmscott, may sell or allow to be sold diesel fuel to trucks at that filling station by Key-Lock System during such hours as the operator thinks fit and for this purpose the *Retail Trading Hours Act 1987* does not apply to that filling station.

CROWN LAW

SUPREME COURT ACT 1935 AND ADMINISTRATION ACT 1903 NON-CONTENTIOUS PROBATE AMENDMENT RULES 1989

Made by the Judges of the Supreme Court under the Supreme Court Act 1935 and the Administration Act 1903.

Citation

1. These rules may be cited as the Non-contentious Probate Amendment Rules 1989.

Commencement

2. These rules shall come into operation on the day on which the Wills Amendment Act 1989 comes into operation.

Principal Rules

3. In these rules the Non-contentious Probate Rules 1967* are referred to as the principal rules.

Rule 20 amended

- 4. Rule 20 of the principal rules is amended—
 - (a) by inserting after the rule designation "20." the subrule designation "(1)"; and
 - (b) by inserting the following subrule—

 (2) Nothing in rules 15, 16, 17 or 18 applies to any document to which rule 20A applies.
 ".

Rule 20A inserted

5. After rule 20 of the principal rules, the following rule is inserted—

Additional requirements where Part X of the Wills Act 1970 is relevant

- " 20A. (1) Where it appears that Part X of the Wills Act 1970 may apply to any document of a testamentary nature the applicant, in addition to any other requirements relating to an application for a grant, shall by affidavit, accompanied by such document or documents, set forth—
 - (a) the gross value of the estate wherever situated;
 - (b) all material facts relating to the circumstances in which the document is said to have come into existence, or to have been altered, revoked or revived and of the intention of the deceased relating thereto; and
 - (c) the full names, ages and addresses of all persons who may be prejudiced by—
 - (i) the application of that Part where the applicant seeks to apply that Part; or
 - (ii) the non-application of that Part where the applicant seeks not to apply that Part,
 - and, for each such person, the reason why it is said that the person may be prejudiced.
 - (2) The applicant shall exhibit to an affidavit the consents of all persons who may be prejudiced as on such terms and subject to such conditions as the Registrar thinks fit, mentioned in subrule (1) (c) but the Registrar may,/dispense with the consent of a person who may be so prejudiced if he is satisfied that—
 - (a) the person-
 - (i) is not of full age or is incapable of consenting by reason of mental illness, defect or infirmity; or
 - (ii) cannot be found; or
 - (b) it is otherwise just or expedient to do so.
 - (3) Where the gross value of the estate wherever situated exceeds \$100 000 and the Registrar has reason to believe that one or more of the provisions of Part X of the Wills Act 1970 may apply, the Registrar shall, upon being satisfied that all inquiries that he thinks fit to make have been answered, give a direction that—
 - (a) the application be brought before a Judge by summons or before the Court on motion;
 - (b) a notice of the summons or motion referred to in paragraph (a) be given to such person or persons, other than the applicant, as the Registrar thinks fit. ".

1990 ELECTION OF ONE SENATOR BY THE MEMBERS OF CONVOCATION

PEARLING ACT 1912 PEARLING AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1990

Made by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Pearling Amendment Regulations 1990.

Principal regulations

2. In these regulations the $Pearling\ Regulations\ 1926^*$ are referred to as the principal regulations.

Regulation 21 amended

- 3. Regulation 21 of the principal regulations is amended—
 - (a) by inserting after the regulation designation "21." the following subregulation designation—
 - " (1) ";
 - (b) by deleting "and shall have received a certificate to the effect that he was not at the time of the said examination suffering from any disease, complaint or infirmity likely to render the occupation of diving specially dangerous to him" and substituting the following—
 - "in accordance with Appendix A of Australian Standard 2299-1979
 "Underwater air breathing operations" and has received a certificate from that medical practitioner to the effect that—
 - (a) the medical practitioner has examined him in accordance with Appendix A of that Australian Standard; and
 - (b) in the opinion of the medical practitioner, he is fit to work as a professional diver using a diving apparatus for 12 months from the date of the certificate. "; and
 - (c) by inserting after subregulation (1) the following subregulation-
 - " (2) That part of the Appendix referred to in subregulation (1) which provides that medical examinations for commercial divers are to be carried out 6 monthly does not apply in respect of examinations carried out under this regulation."

FISHERIES AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1990

Made by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries Amendment Regulations 1990.

Principal regulations

2. In these regulations the Fisheries Regulations 1938* are referred to as the principal regulations.

Regulation 12EB repealed

3. Regulation 12EB of the principal regulations is repealed.

Regulation 14A amended

- 4. Regulation 14A of the principal regulations is amended—
 - (a) in subregulation (1) by deleting "in an export establishment registered in pursuance of the Exports (Fish) Regulations (Statutory Rules, 1949, No. 54 and amendments thereto) made under the provisions of the Customs Act 1901 and its amendments and the Commerce (Trade Descriptions) Act 1905 and its amendments, of the Parliament of the Commonwealth" and substituting the following—
 - " at a processing establishment in respect of which there is in force under Part IIIB of the Act a processor's licence authorizing the processing of rock lobster ";
 - (b) in subregulation (2) by deleting "an export establishment registered as mentioned in subregulation (1) and such tail was removed from the carapace of the rock lobster, or the rock lobster was cut up or otherwise processed in that boat" and substituting the following—
 - " a processing establishment referred to in subregulation (1) ";
 - (c) in subregulation (4) by deleting "an export establishment registered as mentioned in subregulation (1) of this regulation" and substituting the following—
 - " a processing establishment referred to in subregulation (1) ";
 - (d) in subregulation (5) by deleting "an export establishment registered as mentioned in subregulation (1)" and substituting the following—
 - " a processing establishment referred to in subregulation (1) "; and
 - (e) in subregulation (6) by deleting "\$200" and substituting the following—

 " \$750 ".

Regulation 30 amended

- 5. Regulation 30 of the principal regulations is amended—
 - (a) in subregulation (1) by deleting "subregulation (2)" and substituting the following—
 - " subregulations (2) and (3) ";
 - (b) by inserting after subregulation (3) the following subregulations—
 - " (4) A licence to process farm fish (wholesale) authorizes the holder to process farm fish that is to be sold on a wholesale or retail hasis
 - (5) A licence to process farm fish (retail) authorizes the holder to process only farm fish that is to be sold by the holder of that licence on a retail basis.
 - (6) Notwithstanding regulation 3F, the fee set out opposite a licence specified in the Table to this regulation to sell farm fish of any length taken from waters on the property of the holder of the licence, is the fee payable for that licence for the period of time (not exceeding one month) specified on the licence by a licensing officer. "; and
 - (c) in the Table to regulation 30-
 - (i) by deleting the item "Licence to process farm fish 175" and substituting the following items—

(ii) in the item commencing "Licence to sell to a person who holds a development licence," to delete paragraph (a) and substitute the following paragraph—




