ROAD TRAFFIC (INFRINGEMENTS) REGULATIONS 1975

Citation

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Infringements) Regulations 1975.
 - [2. Regulation 2 repealed in Gazette 11 April 1986 p. 1383.]

Offences and penalties

- 3. (1) The offences described in the First Schedule are prescribed for the purposes of section 102 of the Act and the amount appearing in the final column of that Schedule, directly opposite an offence, is the prescribed penalty in respect of that offence, if dealt with under that section.
- (2) In column 1 of the First Schedule a reference to a provision that creates an offence when read with—
 - (a) section 107 of the Act;
 - (b) regulation 1901 of the Road Traffic Code 1975;
 - (c) regulation 106 of the Vehicle Standards Regulations 1977 or;
 - (d) any combination of those provisions,

shall be taken to include a reference to the provision with which it is to be read.

- (3) Every offence not referred to in subregulation (1) that is created by—
 - (a) the Road Traffic Code 1975;
 - (b) the Vehicle Standards Regulations 1977;
 - (c) the Road Traffic (Driver's Licences) Regulations 1975;
 - (d) the Road Traffic (Licensing) Regulations 1975; or

(e) section 107 (1) of the Act as read with any of the regulations referred to in paragraphs (a) to (d),

is prescribed for the purposes of section 102 of the Act and the prescribed penalty for each such offence, if dealt with under that section, is \$25.

Prescribed officers

4. For the purposes of section 102 (3) and (5) of the Act, a prescribed officer is any commissioned officer of Police and, in a district to which section 110 of the Act applies, the traffic inspector, or where there is more than one, the senior traffic inspector for the district.

Payment of penalties not to be accepted in respect of incomplete infringement notices

- 5. (1) Subject to subregulation (2), an officer specified in an infringement notice as an officer to whom payment of a prescribed penalty may be made shall not accept payment of the prescribed penalty unless it appears to him that the number and particulars of the offender's motor driver's licence have been indorsed on the infringement notice by a member of the Police Force, an officer of the Crown Law Department authorized in that behalf by the Board or other person authorized by the Board.
- (2) Subregulation (1) applies only to an infringement notice issued in respect of an offence of which the driving or use of a motor vehicle was an element but the standing, parking or leaving of a vehicle was not an element.

Offence of adding to, or altering infringement notice

- 6. A person who-
 - (a) not being a member of the Police Force, an officer of the Crown Law Department authorized in that behalf by the Board or other person authorized by the Board, makes an indorsement of the particulars referred to in regulation 5 (1) on an infringement notice; or
 - (b) not being a member of the Police Force, makes any alteration to an infringement notice other than an indorsement permitted by regulation 5 (1),

commits an offence.

Penalty: \$100.
