HEALTH ACT 1911
Shire of Boddington
Mobile Rubbish Bin By-laws

Whereas under the provisions of the Health Act 1911 a Local Authority may alter, amend or repeal any by-laws so made or adopted: Now, therefore the Shire of Boddington being a Local Authority within the meaning of the Act, and having adopted the model by-laws described as Series "A" as reprinted in the *Government Gazette* on 17th July 1963, doth hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted by-laws shall be amended as follows:

1. The principal by-laws are amended by deleting By-laws 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 of Part 1 and substituting the following:

12. Interpretation.

In this by-law and in By-laws 13 to 15 inclusive of this Part unless the context requires otherwise—

“Building line” has the meaning given to it in and for the purpose of the Local Government Act 1960.

“Health Surveyor” means the Health Surveyor of the Local Authority.

“Collection time” means the collection time from time to time notified to the occupier of the premises by the Local Authority or its Contractor.

“Kerb line” means the point where the road carriageway adjoins the verge.

"Receptacle" means—a polyethylene cart fitted with wheels and a handle and with a lid and a capacity of 240 or 120 litres supplied by the Local Authority or its Contractor or other type of receptacle specified or approved by the Local Authority.

13. Receptacle.

1. The occupier of every premises in the town sites of Boddington and Ranford shall—
 - (a) Subject to paragraph (c) hereof, cause all refuse to be deposited in a receptacle;
 - (b) At all times keep the lid of the receptacle closed except when depositing refuse in or cleaning the receptacle;
 - (c) not deposit or permit to be deposited in a receptacle—
 - (i) more than 70kg of refuse at any one time;
 - (ii) any material being or consisting of—
 - (a) hot or burning ashes
 - (b) oil
 - (c) liquid
 - (d) paint
 - (e) solvent
 - (f) bricks, concrete, earth or other like substances;
 - (iii) heavy material
 - (iv) any object which is greater in length, width or breadth than the corresponding dimensions of the receptacle or which will not allow the lid to be tightly closed;
 - (v) refuse which is or likely to become offensive or a nuisance or to give off an offensive or noxious odour or to attract flies or cause fly breeding unless it is first wrapped in absorbent or impervious material or placed in a sealed impervious container;
 - (d) except for collection keep the receptacle on the premises located behind the building line, or other location approved by the Health Surveyor;
 - (e) collection of receptacle—
 - (i) prior to the collection time, place the receptacle between the kerb line and the premises 1 to 4 metres from the kerb line and such that it does not obstruct any footpath, cycleway or other carriageway. The receptacle may otherwise be placed at a position specifically approved by the Health Surveyor, and
 - (ii) after the contents of the receptacle have been removed, return the receptacle to its place of storage;
 - (f) at all times keep the receptacle clean and whenever directed by the Health Surveyor to do so, place and keep in the receptacle a deodorant material approved by the Health Surveyor;
 - (g) notify the Local Authority within seven (7) days after the event if the receptacle is lost, stolen damaged or becomes defective.
2. Any employee of Council or its Contractor collecting refuse shall return receptacles to a location as close as possible to that where they were located immediately before being emptied but not so as to obstruct any footpath, cycleway, driveway, service road or other carriageway.
3. In the case of residential premises consisting of more than three dwellings, units or flats or premises used for commercial or industrial purposes the Local Authority may require the use of a receptacle other than a polyethylene cart fitted with wheels and a handle and the occupier of these premises shall comply with and observe the direction given by the Local Authority.
4. The occupier of every premises in the district who is required under Sub-bylaw (3) of this by-law to use a receptacle other than a polyethylene cart fitted with wheels and a handle shall—
 - (a) cause all refuse to be deposited in a receptacle in a manner which is compatible with the type of receptacle used;
 - (b) take all reasonable steps to prevent fly breeding in and the emission of offensive or noxious odour from the receptacle;
 - (c) cause the receptacle to be located on the premises in a position where—
 - (i) it is screened so as not to be visible from a street but be readily accessible for the purpose of collection of the contents thereof;

- (ii) it does not obstruct any footpath, cycleway, driveway, service road, or other carriageway on those premises;
 - (iii) it does not cause a nuisance to the occupiers of adjoining premises;
 - (d) at all times keep the receptacle clean and whenever directed by the Health Surveyor to do so; place and keep in the receptacle a deodorant material approved by the Health Surveyor;
 - (e) where the premises are used for the manufacture, preparation or sale of foods or any putrescible refuse emanates from the premises cause the receptacle to be cleaned with a suitable detergent and treated with a disinfectant at least once per week.
5. The Health Surveyor may direct that refuse of the type referred to in paragraph (e) of Sub-bylaw (4) hereof of which emanates from premises referred to in that paragraph be collected or be removed more often than once per week.
6. Where refuse emanating from premises is of a nature that the Health Surveyor considers requires to be treated before being placed in a receptacle he may give directions as to the manner in which it is to be so treated and the occupier of those premises shall comply with those directions.

14. Receptacle Ownership.

A receptacle supplied by the Local Authority or its Contractor remains the property of the Local Authority or its Contractor as the case may be.

15. Removal and Disposal of Refuse

- (1) A person shall not unless he is Authorised by the Local Authority to do so remove any house or trade refuse or other rubbish from any premises in the townsites of Boddington and Ranford.
- (2) Where Council provides approval pursuant to By-law 15 hereof;
 - (1) such rubbish or refuse shall be disposed of at a refuse disposal site approved by the Executive Director of Public Health pursuant to the provisions of the Health Act 1911.
 - (2) By-law 18 of Part 1 of the principal by-law is amended by deleting "cart" in the by-law heading and in line 2 substituting "collection vehicle".

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Poisons Amendment Regulations 1990*.

Principal regulations

2. In these regulations the *Poisons Regulations 1965** are referred to as the principal regulations.

Regulation 2 amended

3. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the definition of “Poisons Cupboard” and substituting the following definition—

“ “Poisons Cupboard” means a substantially made cupboard provided with an effective locking device and, except in the case of a cupboard used for the storage of a drug of addiction, having the word “Poison” conspicuously painted on the outside of the cupboard; ”.

Regulation 36 amended

4. Regulation 36 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) by repealing subregulation (1) and substituting the following subregulation—

“ (1) Subject to the Act and these regulations, a person shall not sell or supply a Fourth Schedule drug to any person unless—

(a) he or she—

(i) is satisfied that the person to whom the drug is sold or supplied is authorized under regulation 40 (1) to procure the drug; and

(ii) receives from that person a written order in accordance with regulation 40 (1a) or makes a record under regulation 41B;

(b) the person to whom the drug is sold or supplied is the holder of a prescription written by a medical practitioner, dentist or veterinary surgeon prescribing the drug according to the requirements of these regulations; or

(c) satisfied that the person to whom the drug is sold or supplied is under medical treatment with the drug and requires emergency treatment with the drug and does not sell or supply to that person more than—

(i) 3 days medication of the drug; or

(ii) where the drug is supplied in prepacked individual packs, one individual standard pack. ”;

and

(b) by inserting after subregulation (1) the following subregulation—

“ (1a) A person who has received a written order under subregulation (1) (a) (ii) shall keep that order for at least 2 years from the time he or she received it and produce it at any time during the 2 years from the time he or she received it when required to do so by the Executive Director. ”.

Regulation 40 amended

5. Regulation 40 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) in subregulation (1), by inserting after “procure” the following—

“ , in accordance with subregulation (1a), ”;

(b) by inserting after subregulation (1) the following subregulation—

“ (1a) A person authorized under subregulation (1) to procure a Fourth Schedule drug shall, unless a record is made under regulation 41B in relation to the procurement of the drug, provide a written order to the person from whom he or she is attempting to procure the drug, setting out—

(a) the name, address and signature of the authorized person;

(b) the date of the order; and

(c) the name and quantity of the drug. ”.

Regulation 41 repealed and a regulation substituted

6. Regulation 41 of the principal regulations is repealed and the following regulation is substituted—

“ 41. A person who sells or supplies a Fourth Schedule drug under regulation 36 (1), other than to the holder of a prescription under regulation 36 (1) (b), may deliver that drug, or cause it to be delivered only—

(a) to the person to whom he or she sold or supplied the drug; or

(b) in accordance with the written directions of a person referred to in paragraph (a). ”.

By-law Relating to Trading in Public Places

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on 22 January, 1990 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law relating to Trading in Public Places.

1. Interpretation: In this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Council” means the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Ashburton.

“Public Place” includes a street, way and other place which the public are allowed to use, whether the street, way or place is or is not on private property.

“Trading” means selling/or hiring of goods, wares, merchandise or services, or offering goods, wares, merchandise or services for sale or hire, in a street or other public place and includes displaying goods, wares or merchandise for the purpose of offering them for sale or hire, inviting offers for sale or hire, soliciting orders or carrying out any other transactions therein.

“Community Association” means an institution, association, club, society or body, whether incorporated or not, the objects of which are of a charitable, benevolent, religious, cultural, educational, recreational, sporting or other like nature and the members of which are not entitled or permitted to receive any pecuniary profit from the transaction thereof.

2. This by-law shall—

(a) apply to all Townsites within the Shire of Ashburton;

(b) not apply to the selling or offering for sale of newspapers or magazines unless they are sold or offered for sale from a stall;

(c) not apply to community associations in relation to fees payable.

3. No person shall carry on trading in any public place unless that person is acting within the specifications of a current licence issued under this by-law and for which all fees and charges have been paid.

4. An application for a licence shall be in writing and shall contain such information as the Council may require.
5. In considering an application for a licence the Council shall have regard for any relevant policy statements, and for the desirability of the proposed activity and its location and for the circumstances of the case, and may refuse to issue a licence, in which case it shall provide the applicant with reasons in writing.
6. The Council may issue a licence specifying such requirements, terms and conditions as the Council sees fit, including—
 - (a) the place to which the licence applies;
 - (b) the days and hours when trading may be carried on;
 - (c) the number, type, form and construction, as the case may be, of any stand, table, structure or vehicle which may be used for trading;
 - (d) the particulars of the goods or services or transaction in respect of which trading may be carried on;
 - (e) the number of persons and the names of persons permitted to carry on trading, and any requirements concerning personal attendance at the place of trading and the nomination of assistants, nominees or substitutes;
 - (f) whether and under what terms the licence is transferrable;
 - (g) any prohibitions or restrictions concerning the causing of any nuisance, the use of signs, the making of noise and the use of amplifiers, sound equipment, sound instruments, and lighting apparatus;
 - (h) any requirements concerning the display of the licence holder's name and other details of licence, the care, maintenance and cleansing of the place of trading or the vacating of the place when trading is not taking place;
 - (i) any requirements regarding the acquisition by the licence holder of public risk insurance;
 - (j) the period not exceeding 12 months during which the licence is valid.
7. The amount of the charges and fees shall be calculated and payable in accordance with the Schedule hereto.
8.
 - (a) The Council may revoke a licence in the event that the licence holder breaches any provision of this by-law or fails to comply with any requirement, term or condition of the licence or
 - (b) The Council or a Crown agency, instrumentality or Department requires access to the place to which a licence applies for the purpose of carrying out works on, over or under that place.
9. Where a licence is revoked the Council shall if requested, provide the licence holder with reasons in writing and shall refund the charge having first deducted the charge applicable to the period from the issuing of the licence to its revocation.
10. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of the by-laws commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty for up to \$1 000 or imprisonment for six (6) months.

- 14 (2) This By-law shall not apply to a blind or partially blind person and trainers accompanied by a *bona fide* guide dog.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT 1960, AS AMENDED*Shire of Murray***By-law Relating to the Conduct of Proceedings and the Business of the Council**

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 30th day of November 1989, to revoke the Standing Orders By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* on 17th December 1968 and 24th March 1969, and to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law—

PART I—PRELIMINARY**Standing Orders**

1. The proceedings and business of the Council shall be conducted according to this by-law, the clauses of which shall be referred to as "the Standing Orders".

Interpretation

2. In this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Act" means the Local Government Act 1960, and amendments;

"Chairman" includes any member presiding at any meeting of the Council in a manner prescribed by the Act;

"Clause" means a clause of the by-law;

"Clerk" means the Shire Clerk or Acting Shire Clerk;

"Committee" means any Standing or Occasional Committee appointed in accordance with the provisions of section 179 of the Act;

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Murray;

"Councillor" means a member of the Council other than the President;

"Meeting" includes any Ordinary or Special Meeting of the Council or a Committee held in pursuance of the Act and convened as therein required;

"Member" means the President or a Councillor of the Council;

"Minutes" means Minutes of the Council;

"Municipality" means the municipality of the Shire of Murray.

PART II—MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL

Ordinary Meetings

4. Ordinary meetings of the Council shall be held at such time as the Council may from time to time determine, provided that at least one ordinary meeting shall be held in each calendar month with the exception of January during which no meetings will be held.

Meeting Day and Time

5. (1) The Council shall resolve the days and times each month when Council meetings shall be held, at the first meeting held after the annual election.

(2) No alteration to the days or times of Council meetings, other than a temporary alteration to remain in force for not more than one month, shall be made unless at least two months' notice of the motion to alter such days or times shall be given and such alteration shall be agreed to by an absolute majority of the Council.

Notice of Meetings

6. Notice of all meetings of the Council shall be given to Members as follows—

(1) Council meetings other than those convened under s.172(2) or s.172(3) of the Act, The Notice shall be in writing and shall be signed by or on behalf of the Clerk and shall state the place, date and hour of holding the meeting and shall state the business to be transacted. The Notice shall be served on each of the Members at least forty-eight hours before the time of commencement of the meeting.

(2) Special meeting convened under s.172(2) of the Act. The provisions of the preceding sub-clause shall apply, except that the notice shall be signed either by the President or Clerk.

- (3) Special meeting convened under s.172(3) of the Act. The Notice shall be in writing and shall be signed by the three Councillors calling the meeting and shall state the place, date and hour of holding the meeting and shall state the business to be transacted. The Notice shall be served on each of the other Members at the times and in the manner specified in s.172(3) of the Act.
- (4) A Notice of meeting shall be served on each Member—
 - (a) by delivering it to him personally; or
 - (b) by post either to his place of abode or usual place of business, if any, within the municipal district.

Notice of Adjourned Meeting

7. When a meeting of the Council is adjourned to a day and hour other than the next ordinary meeting of the Council, Notice of the adjourned meeting shall, if time permits, be sent in the manner provided by clause 6 of this by-law to each Member, specifying the nature of the business to be transacted.

Failure to Receive Notice not to Invalidate Proceedings

8. The validity of a document or the service of it is not affected by an error, misdescription or irregularity which is not reasonably likely to mislead, or which in fact does not mislead.

President to Preside

9. The President, if present, shall preside at all meetings of the Council and in his absence, or if after being present he retires, the Deputy President shall preside but if he is not present, or after being present retires, then one of the Councillors chosen by majority vote of the Councillors then present shall preside.

Quorum

10. (1) Except in cases where s.173(4) of the Act applies, the number of Members of the Council necessary to form a quorum—

- (a) where the total number of Members is an even number, is one half of that total;
- (b) where the total number of Members is an odd number, is the integer nearest to, but greater than, one half of that total.

(2) Subject to clause 12, every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the summons as a quorum is constituted.

Quorum must be Present

11. The Council shall not transact business at a meeting unless a quorum is present.

Absence of Quorum

12. If at any meeting a quorum be not present within half an hour after the time appointed for that meeting, the President, or in his absence the Deputy President, or in his absence the majority of the Members present, or any one Member, if only one be present, or the Clerk if no Member be present, may adjourn the meeting to any date not later than seven days from the date of the adjournment.

Meeting Counted Out

13. If at any time during any meeting of the Council a quorum is not present the Chairman shall thereupon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of five minutes, and if a quorum be not present at the expiration of that period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out, and the Chairman shall adjourn it to some future date.

Names Recorded

14. At any meeting at which there is not a quorum of members present, or at which the Council is counted out for want of a quorum, the names of the Members then present shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

Business

15. No business shall be transacted at any meeting of the Council other than that specified in the notice relating thereto except—

- (1) Matters which the Acts permits to be dealt with without notice;
- (2) Matters which this by-law permits to be dealt with without notice.

**PART III—BUSINESS AT MEETINGS
DIVISION 1—ORDER OF BUSINESS**

Order of Business

16. The order of business at any Ordinary Meeting shall, unless for the greater convenience of the Council altered by resolution to that effect, be as nearly as practicable as follows, that is to say—

- (1) Confirmation of Minutes
- (2) Announcements by the Chairman, without discussion.
- (3) Reports by Councillors without discussion.
- (4) Questions of which due notice has been given, without discussion.
- (5) Correspondence
- (6) Petitions and Memorials.
- (7) Notice of intention to move the suspension of Standing Orders at the conclusion of the meeting.
- (8) Minutes of Committees.
- (9) Reports of officers.
- (10) Orders of the Day, including considering and ordering upon any business left over from the previous meeting and any business that the Chairman may think desirable to bring under the notice of the Council and may have directed to be entered as an order of the day.
- (11) Motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (12) Notice of motions for consideration at the following meeting.
- (13) Motions without notice.

Order of business at Special Meeting

17. The order of business at any Special Meeting of the Council shall be the order in which that business stands in the notice of the meeting.

Business at Adjourned Meeting

18. At an adjourned meeting of the Council no business shall be transacted other than such as shall have been specified on the notice of the meeting of which it is an adjournment, and which remains undisposed of, save and except in the case of an adjournment to the next ordinary meeting of the Council, when the business undisposed of at the adjourned meeting shall have the precedence at such ordinary meeting of the Council.

DIVISION 2—MINUTES

19. The minutes of any preceding meeting of the Council, whether ordinary or special, not previously confirmed shall be submitted as the first business at all ordinary meetings of the Council and no discussion thereon shall be permitted except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes shall then, if found to be correct, be signed by the Chairman and he shall sign and date each page.

Minute Book

20. Pasting or otherwise permanently affixing the minutes to the leaves of a book shall be sufficient recording of the minutes in the Minute Book.

Reading of Minutes may be Dispensed With

21. The reading at the next ordinary meeting of the Council of the minutes of a previous meeting may be dispensed with when members have been supplied with copies of the minutes at least three days before the holding of the next ordinary meeting of the Council.

DIVISION 3—QUESTIONS

Definition "Question"

22. In clauses 23-25 inclusive, the expression "question" means a request for information or an enquiry.

Question with Notice

23. Any Councillor desiring to ask a question at any meeting of the Council shall give notice thereof in writing to the Clerk at least four normal working hours before the hour fixed for the commencement of the meeting and shall direct the question to the Chairman.

Questions and Answers to be Brief

24. Every question and answer shall be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible, and no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

Questions Without Notice

25. A question requesting general information from an officer present at the meeting may be asked without notice, but the officer shall have the right to ask that—

- (1) the question be placed on notice for the next meeting of the Council; or
- (2) the answer to the question be given to the Member who asked it prior to the next ordinary meeting of the Council.

Provided that, if the answer to the question without notice cannot be given at the meeting at which it is asked, the Member asking the question may request that the answer be given to the appropriate Committee and the Chairman may, if he shall think fit, so direct.

DIVISION 4—MINUTES OF COMMITTEES**Report to Council**

26. (1) Each Standing Committee shall cause to be prepared minutes of all its proceedings and transactions, which shall be entered in a Minute Book, and submitted to the next ordinary meeting of the Council, including recommendations to Council numbered consecutively.

(2) Committee minutes shall be confirmed prior to consideration by Council, members of the Committee concerned only to vote upon the matter, and upon confirmation the minutes shall be signed by the Chairman of the meeting to which they relate, or in the absence of the Chairman of the Committee, by a Committee member present and voting on the confirmation of the Committee minutes.

Items to be Numbered

27. The minutes of every Committee shall be divided into items, which shall be numbered consecutively.

Minutes to be Sent Out

28. All minutes of Committees to be presented at any meeting of the Council shall be sent to each member of the Council at least 48 hours before the scheduled commencement time of the meeting at which they will be presented.

Recommendations may be Questioned

29. During the consideration by the Council of a recommendation of a Committee a Councillor may, through the Chairman, question the Chairman or any member of the Committee upon any matter arising directly out of, or having relevance to, the recommendation.

Adoption of Recommendations

30. A recommendation made by or contained in the minutes of Committee may be—

- (1) adopted by the Council, without amendment or modification; or
- (2) rejected by the Council and replaced by an alternative resolution; or
- (3) referred back to the Committee for further consideration.

Recommendations become Resolutions

31. If the Council adopts a recommendation or recommendations contained in the minutes of a Standing Committee, without amendment or modification, the recommendation or recommendations so adopted shall be deemed to be a resolution or resolutions of the Council as the case may be.

DIVISION 5—NOTICES OF MOTIONS**Notices of Motion to be in Writing**

32. (1) Unless the Act or this by-law otherwise provides, a Member may only bring forward at a meeting such business as he considers advisable in the form of a motion of which notice has been given in writing to the Clerk.

(2) Notice of meeting shall be given either—

- (a) at the last previous Council meeting, or
- (b) at least four clear days before the meeting at which it is brought forward.

Subject of Notice of Motion

33. Every notice of motion shall relate to some question affecting the constitution, administration or condition of the municipality or the Council, and the Chairman shall rule out of order any motion which does not comply with this clause.

Motion to Lapse

34. Every such motion as is mentioned in clause 33 shall lapse unless—

- (1) the Member who gave notice thereof, or some other Member authorised by him in writing, is present to move the motion when called on; or
- (2) the Council by resolution agrees to defer consideration of the motion to a later stage or date.

DIVISION 6—DEPUTATIONS**Detailed Memorial Required**

35. (1) Deputations wishing to be received by the Council shall be requested in the first instance to send to the Clerk a memorial in Writing and the Clerk shall bring the memorial before the Committee concerned. The Committee shall be authorised, if it sees fit, to receive the deputation and report to the Council. If the Committee is of the opinion that the memorial is one which should be brought before the Council, the Committee shall so report and, if the Council shall so order, the deputation shall be invited to attend.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (1) of this clause, the Chairman of a Committee may invite or allow a person or persons to attend a meeting of the Committee, subject to a memorial first being submitted to the Clerk.

36. A deputation shall not exceed five in number and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Council or a Committee of the Council, except in reply to questions from members of the Council or Committee, and the matter shall not be further considered or discussed by the Council or the Committee until the deputation has withdrawn.

PART IV—CONDUCT OF MEETINGS**DIVISION I—RULES OF DEBATE****Members to Address the Chairman**

37. Any Member moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereof shall, except where prevented by sickness or physical disability raise his hand and address the Chairman.

Titles to be Used

38. A speaker, in referring to any other Member present, shall designate him by the title of President or Councillor, as the case may be.

Priority of Speaking

39. Where two or more Members indicate their intention to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which of them is entitled to priority.

Chairman to be Heard

40. Whenever the Chairman indicates his intention to speak during a debate, any Member then speaking or offering to speak shall cease speaking and the Council shall be silent so that the Chairman may be heard without interruption.

The President to Take Part in Debates

41. Subject to the provisions of this by-law, it shall be competent for the President to take part in a discussion upon any question before the Council Provided that he shall address the Council before the right of reply is exercised.

Speaking Twice/Right of Reply

42. Except where this clause is suspended under clause 43, a member shall not speak twice on the same question except—

- (1) in reply, upon an original motion of which he was the mover;
- (2) in reply, upon an amendment last debated of which he was the mover;
- or
- (3) by way of personal explanation, in accordance with Division 3—Personal Explanations—clauses 52, 53 and 54.

43. The mover of a motion, other than a formal motion, shall have the right of reply. After the mover of the motion has commenced his reply no other Member shall speak on the question. It shall not be competent for any new matter to be introduced by the mover when speaking in reply, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers.

Suspension

44. The Council may, by resolution moved without notice, suspend the operation of clause 42 hereof, and thereupon such clause shall be suspended until such time as the Council shall similar resolution, otherwise decide.

No Speech After Certain Events

45. No Member shall speak on any motion or amendment

- (1) after the mover has replied; or
- (b) after the question has been put.

Mover and Seconder have Spoken

46. (1) A Member moving a motion or amendment, after first obtaining a seconder if necessary in accordance with this by-law, shall speak to the motion or amendment, and the seconder shall then speak, otherwise they shall be deemed to have spoken thereon. Provided that where the Chairman moves a motion or amendment he shall first vacate the chair and the Deputy President, or in the absence of the Deputy President such other Member as may be elected by the meeting, shall preside over the meeting during such time as the motion or amendment is being debated.

(2) A Member shall not speak on any motion or amendment or in reply for a longer period than ten minutes without the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate.

(3) An extension shall not be permitted under this clause beyond a total of twenty minutes.

DIVISION 2—POINT OF ORDER**Point of Order to be Heard**

47. A Member when addressing the chairman shall not be interrupted except upon a point of order, in which event he shall cease speaking until the Councillor raising the point of order has been heard thereon and the question of order has been disposed of, whereupon the Member so interrupted, if permitted, may proceed.

Acceptable Points

48. A Member expressing a difference of opinion with or contradicting a speaker shall not be recognised as raising a point of order. The following shall be recognised as breaches of order—

- (1) Discussion of a question not before the Council.
- (2) The use of offensive or insulting language.
- (3) The violation of any by-law or Standing Order of the Council.

Precedence to Questions of Order

49. Notwithstanding anything contained in this by-law to the contrary all questions of order at any time arising shall, until decided, suspend the consideration and decision of every other question.

Rulings by Chairman

50. The Chairman, when deciding a point of order or practice, shall give his decision, and argument or comment shall not be permitted thereon and his decision shall be final in that particular case, unless a majority of the Members then present shall, upon motion made forthwith, dissent therefrom.

DIVISION 3—PERSONAL, EXPLANATION**Personal Explanation**

51. A Member making a personal explanation shall confine it to a succinct explanation of a material part of his former speech which may have been misunderstood and to the explanation itself and shall not advert to matters not strictly necessary for that purpose or seek to strengthen his former argument by new matter or by replying to other Members.

Personal Explanation—Member to be Heard

52. A Member desirous of making a personal explanation of matters referred to by any Member then speaking shall be entitled to be heard forthwith if the Member then speaking consents at the time, but if the Member who is speaking declines to give way the explanation must be offered at the conclusion of the speech.

Ruling on Questions of Personal Explanation

53. The ruling of the Chairman on the admissibility of a personal explanation shall be final and conclusive and shall not be open to discussion or dissent.

DIVISION 4—MOTIONS**Substance of Motion to be Stated**

54. Any Member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state its substance before he addresses the Council thereon and, if so required by the Chairman shall put the motion or amendment in writing.

Motions and Amendments to be Seconded

55. A motion or amendment shall not be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless seconded, but a Member may require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Council by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

Nominations for Positions of President, Deputy President, Committee Member, or Chairman of Committee

56. Nomination for the position of President or Deputy President or, in the case of Standing and Occasional Committees appointed under section 179 of the Act, Committee Member or Chairman of Committee, need not be seconded, it being permissible for a nominee for these positions to be self-nominated.

Consent of Seconder Required to Accept Alteration

57. It shall not be competent for the mover of a motion to alter the same without the consent of his seconder.

Member may Require Question to be Read

58. Any Member may require the question or matter under discussion to be read for his information at any time during a debate, but not so as to interrupt any other Member whilst speaking.

Permissible Motions During Debate

59. When a motion is under debate, no further motion shall be moved except a motion—

- (1) that the motion be amended;
- (2) that the Council do adjourn;
- (3) that the debate be adjourned;
- (4) that the question be now put;
- (5) that the Council do proceed with the next business;
- (6) that the Council do sit behind closed doors; or
- (7) that the meeting be now closed.

Division of Motions

60. The Chairman may at his discretion, or the Council may by resolution without debate, order a complicated motion to be divided and put in the form of two or more motions.

Withdrawal of Motions

61. A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover with the consent of the Council which shall be signified without debate and it shall not be competent for any Member to speak upon the motion or amendment after the mover has asked permission for its withdrawal, unless that permission is refused.

Limitation of Withdrawal

62. A motion shall not be withdrawn until any amendment proposed thereto has been withdrawn or negated, except with the consent of the Council which shall be signified without debate.

No Digression

63. A Member shall not speak otherwise than upon the question then before the Council, except to make a personal explanation.

DIVISION 5—AMENDMENTS**Nature of Amendments**

64. An amendment to a motion shall not negate the motion and shall take one or more of the following forms—

- (1) that certain words be omitted therefrom;
- (2) that certain words be omitted therefrom and other's substituted;
- (3) that words be added.

Amendments to Relate to Motion

65. Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.

66. Every amendment shall be read before being put to the vote.

One Amendment at a Time

67. Only one amendment shall be discussed at a time, but as often as an amendment is lost, another amendment may be moved, before the original motion is put to the vote, except that where an amendment is carried, one further amendment to the original motion as amended, and no more, may be moved.

Notice of Further Amendments

68. In speaking to an amendment a Member may give notice of his intention to move a further amendment.

Amended Motion Treated as Original Motion

69. Where an amendment is carried the original motion as amended shall, for all purposes of subsequent debate, and subject only to clause 68, be treated as an original motion.

DIVISION 6—VOTING**All Members to Vote**

70. At every meeting of the Council, every Member present in the Chamber shall vote except—

- (1) where the Act otherwise provides, or
- (2) in the matter of confirmation of Committee Minutes, and if any Member who is entitled to vote fails to do so the Chairman shall call upon him to vote.

Equality of Votes

71. Where there is any equal division of votes upon any question the question shall be resolved in the negative.

Method of Taking the vote

72. The Chairman shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion as to whether the affirmative or the negative has the majority by a show of hands. The Chairman may declare the number of votes for and against all motions and those details will be recorded in the Council minutes.

Division may be Called

73. The result of voting openly shall be determined by a count of raised hands but on the result being declared any Member may call for a division.

Division Procedure

74. Upon a division being called for, the Chairman may if he thinks fit order that the division bell be rung and after the lapse of one half minute from the bell ceasing to ring a Member shall not be permitted to enter or leave the chamber until after the division has been taken.

Division—How Taken

75. The division shall thereupon be taken by those voting in the affirmative passing to the right of the Chair and those voting in the negative to the left of the Chair.

Recording of Voting

76. The names of Members who voted on the question on which there is a division shall be recorded by the Clerk in respect of every division, together with details of whether they voted in the affirmative or the negative.

DIVISION 7— GENERAL**Rescission of Resolution**

77. A resolution of any meeting of the Council shall not be revoked, rescinded or altered at the same or any subsequent meeting, except in the manner provided by section 177 of the Act.

Negatived Motions

78. A motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived by the Council shall not again be entertained within a period of three months, except with the consent of an absolute majority of the Council.

Suspension of Standing Orders

79. In cases of urgent necessity any Standing Order of the Council may be suspended on a motion duly made and seconded, but that motion shall not be declared carried unless an absolute majority of the Council, or a two-thirds majority of those present and voting on the question, whichever is the lesser number, have voted in favour of the motion.

Motion for Suspension of Standing Orders

80. Any Member moving the suspension of a Standing Order shall state the reasons for the motion, but discussion thereon shall not otherwise take place.

Production of Documents

81. (1) Any Member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the Council relating to the question or matter under discussion.

(2) On giving to the Clerk not less than four ordinary working hours notice a Member shall be entitled to have laid on the Council table for the duration of a meeting any document or record of the Council, and the Clerk, on receiving that notice, shall lay the document on the Council table at the commencement of the meeting.

PART V—DEBATE ON PERMISSIBLE MOTIONS**DIVISION I—THAT COUNCIL DO ADJOURN****That Council Do Adjourn**

82. (1) A Member may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Member or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the Council do now adjourn, and that motion shall state the time and date to which the adjournment is to be made.

(2) On a motion to adjourn, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second, and the mover of the motion (if any) which was then under debate may speak for not more than five minutes, but no other debate shall be allowed.

Limit to Further Motion

83. Where a motion for the adjournment of the Council is negatived, no similar motion shall be moved until after the question then under discussion, or the next on the notice paper, or any other which may be allowed precedence, shall have been disposed of.

Who May Move Motion

84. (1) A Member who has not spoken on the question then before the Council may move the adjournment of the Council.

(2) A Member shall not, at the same sitting of the Council, move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the Council.

Resumption of Adjourned Meeting

85. On a motion for the adjournment of the Council being carried, the debate on the question (if any) under debate when the motion was moved shall be continued immediately upon the Council resuming after the adjournment.

Names of Speakers to be Recorded

86. On a motion for the adjournment of the Council being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject (if any) under consideration at the time of the adjournment and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same subject but this clause does not deprive a mover of the right reply.

DIVISION 2—THAT DEBATE BE ADJOURNED**Motion for Adjournment of Debate**

87. (1) A Member may, at the conclusion of a speech of any other Member, move without notice that the debate be adjourned to a later hour of the same meeting or to a subsequent meeting of the Council.

(2) On a motion that the debate be adjourned, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second, and no other debate shall be allowed, but if the question then before the Council is a recommendation from a Committee, the Chairman of the Committee concerned, or in his absence a member thereof, may speak for not more than five minutes.

Who May Move for Adjournments

88. (1) A Member who has not spoken on the question may move the adjournment of the debate.

(2) A Member shall not, at the same sitting of the Council, move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the same debate.

Speaker on Resumption of Adjourned Debate

89. On resuming an adjourned debate, the Member who moved its adjournment shall be entitled to speak first.

Names of Speakers Recorded

90. On a motion for the adjournment of a debate being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under debate and they shall not be permitted to speak on any resumption of the debate on that subject, but this clause does not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

Counting Out of Council During Debate of Motion

91. Where the debate on any motion, moved and seconded, is interrupted by the Council being counted out, that debate may, on a motion with notice, be resumed at the next meeting at the point where it was so interrupted.

DIVISION 3—THAT THE QUESTION BE PUT**Motion that Question be put**

92. A Member may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Member, move without notice and without comment that the question under consideration be now put and upon that motion being formally seconded it shall immediately be voted upon, without debate.

Who may Move, Majority, etc

93. A motion that the question under consideration be put shall be moved by a Member who has not already spoken on the question and that motion shall not be carried without the consent of a two-thirds majority of the members then present.

Right of Reply

94. When it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration be put, the mover of the question under consideration shall, if debate has ensued and if otherwise entitled to do so, be permitted to speak in reply for not more than five minutes before the question is put, but subject thereto the question shall be at once put.

Motion and Amendment Included

95. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question be put, the question to be so put includes the main question as well as any amendment thereto.

**DIVISION 4—THAT THE COUNCIL PROCEED WITH
NEXT BUSINESS****Motion that Council Proceed with Next Business**

96. A Member may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Member move, without notice and without comment, that the Council do proceed with the next business and upon that motion being formally seconded it shall be immediately put, without debate.

Who may Move

97. A motion that the Council proceed with the next business shall be moved by a Member who has not already spoken on the question.

Question Considered Dropped

98. Where the Council decides to proceed with the next business, the question which was then under discussion shall be considered as dropped.

Limitation of Time Between Motions

99. During the same debate on any question a motion that the Council do proceed with the next business shall not be moved within one hour after a similar motion has been lost.

DIVISION 5—THAT MEETING BE CLOSED**Motion that the Meeting be Closed**

100. (1) A Member may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Member or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the meeting of the Council be now closed.

(2) On a motion that the meeting be closed, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second and the mover of the question (if any) then under debate may speak for not more than five minutes, but no other debate shall be allowed.

When Motion Lost

101. If a motion that the meeting of the Council be closed is lost, a similar motion shall not be moved until both the matter then under discussion and the next item on the notice paper have been concluded, or alternatively any other items, not exceeding two, as nominated by the Chairman as having precedence.

Who may Move Motion

102. (1) A Member who has not spoken on the question then before the Council may move that the meeting be closed.

(2) A Member shall not at the same meeting of the Council move or second more than one motion that the meeting be closed.

Procedure—Question Under Debate when Meeting Carried

103. On a motion that the meeting be closed being carried, the debate on the question (if any) under debate when that motion was moved shall stand adjourned to its place on the notice paper for the next meeting of the Council.

Record of Speakers

104. On a motion that the meeting be closed being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under consideration up to the closing of the meeting and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same motion, but this clause does not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

**DIVISION 6—THAT COUNCIL DO SIT BEHIND
CLOSED DOORS****That Council Do Sit Behind Closed Doors**

105. Ordinary and Special Meetings of the Council shall be open to the public except on such occasions as the Council by resolution which may be moved without notice, directs otherwise.

Business Behind Closed Door

106. (1) After the carrying of a resolution under clause 105 of this by-law, the business at that meeting of the Council shall not be open to the public but shall proceed behind closed doors, until the Council by resolution decides that the meeting shall be open to the public.

(2) Upon the carrying of such a resolution, the Chairman shall direct all persons other than Members and servants of the Council to leave the Council Chambers and every person shall forthwith comply with such direction.

(3) Any person failing to comply with a direction pursuant to subclause (2) of this clause commits an offence and may, with the use of reasonable force if necessary, be removed from the Council Chambers.

(4) After the carrying of a resolution made under clause 105 the business at the meeting of the Council shall proceed behind closed doors until the Council, by resolution, decides to proceed with open doors.

(5) While a resolution made under this clause is enforced, the operation of clause 42—Speaking Twice/Right of Reply shall be suspended, unless the Council, by resolution, otherwise determines.

(6) Any resolution mentioned in this subclause may be moved without notice.

Confidential Matters

107. All matters and questions considered or discussed by the Council other than in meetings open to the public and all matters and questions considered or discussed by Committees of the Council shall be treated as strictly confidential and shall not, without the authority of the Council or of the Committee (as the case may be), be disclosed to any person other than the President Councillors or officers of the Council (and in the case of officers only so far as may be necessary for the performance of their duties) prior to the discussion of that matter at a meeting of the Council held with open doors.

Reading of Resolutions Passed

108. Upon the public again being admitted to the meeting in accordance with clause 106 the Clerk shall, unless the Council by resolution otherwise decides, read out the resolutions passed by the Council whilst it was proceeding behind closed doors, and details of any divisions taken.

PART VI—DISTURBANCE AND BREACH OF ORDER**No Adverse Reflection on Council**

109. A Member shall not at any meeting comment adversely upon a resolution of the Council, except on a motion that the resolution be rescinded or amended.

No Adverse Reflection on Member

110. A Member shall not comment adversely upon the character or actions of another Member, nor impute any motive to a Member, unless the Council resolves without debate that the question then before the Council cannot otherwise be adequately considered.

Record of Words Spoken

111. Any Member may require the Clerk to take down any particular words used by a Member immediately upon their being used, if such words are considered by the Member to be in contravention of Clause 110.

Demands for Withdrawal

112. If any Member commits a breach of clause 109 or 110, the Chairman may require him unreservedly to withdraw any offending comment and to make a satisfactory apology, and if the Member declines or neglects to do so the Chairman may direct such Member to cease speaking and may call on the next speaker.

Disturbance by Members or Persons of the Public

113. (1) A Member shall not make any undue noise or disturbance or converse aloud while any other person is addressing the Council, excepting—

- (a) to raise a point of order, or
- (b) to call attention to want of a quorum.

(2) A person, not being a Member, shall not at any meeting of the Council interrupt the proceedings of the Council.

(3) Any person interrupting the proceedings of the Council shall, when so directed by the Chairman, forthwith leave the Council Chambers.

Continued Irrelevance, etc.

114. The Chairman may call the attention of the Council to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order or decorum on the part of a Member and may direct that Member, if speaking, to discontinue his speech, and thereupon the Member shall cease speaking.

Respect for Chairman and Speaker

115. When the Chairman is putting any question a Member shall not walk out of or across the Chamber and shall not, whilst any other Member is speaking, pass between the speaker and the chair.

Chairman to Preserve Order

116. The Chairman shall preserve order and may call any Member to order wherever, in his opinion, there is cause for so doing.

Members may Direct Attention to Breaches of Order

117. Every Member shall be entitled to direct the attention of the Chairman to an infraction of the Standing Orders by the Chairman any other Member, or to draw the attention of the Chairman to any matter of which the latter may take notice under clause 114.

Retraction or Apology on any Matter

118. Whenever the Chairman has decided that any motion, amendment or other matter before the Council is out of order in accordance with the Standing Orders, it shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in the Meeting by any Member is similarly decided to be out of order in accordance with the Standing Orders, that Member shall be called upon by the Chairman to make such explanation, retraction or apology as the case may require.

Continued Breach of Order

119. When a Member persists in any conduct which the Chairman decides is out of order in accordance with the Standing Orders, or refuses to make any explanation, retraction or apology required by the Chairman under clause 118, the Chairman may direct that Member to refrain from taking any further part in the then meeting of the Council other than by recording his vote, and the Member shall comply with such direction.

Serious Disorder

120. (1) If at a meeting of the Council the Chairman is of the opinion that, by reason of disorder or otherwise, the business of the Council cannot effectually be continued, he may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes whereafter the Council shall reassemble and decide whether business is to be proceeded with, and that question shall be decided forthwith and without debate.

(2) Where after any proceeding under subclause (1) of this clause the Chairman is again of the opinion that the business of the Council cannot effectually be continued, he may close the meeting.

PART VII—COMMITTEES**DIVISION I—STANDING COMMITTEES****Appointment of Standing Committees**

121. In addition to such Occasional Committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be a Finance and Administration Committee, a Health Building and Planning Committee, and a Works Committee, and such other Standing Committees as the Council resolves at the first meeting of the Council

held after the annual election each year, when the Council shall also resolve the days and times each month when Standing Committee meetings shall be held.

Composition of Committees

122. Each Standing Committee shall comprise at least four Councillors, with the provision for the President as *ex officio* member if he indicates his intention to be a member in accordance with sections 182(2a) and (2b) of the Act, provided however that the total membership of a Standing Committee shall be less inclusive of the *ex officio* member, than one half of the total number of the Members of the Council. In the event of a Member not being able to attend a meeting of the Committee to which he has been appointed, he shall advise the Clerk who shall then endeavour to arrange for a deputy to attend in the absent Member's stead.

Attendance by Members as Observers

123. In addition to the right to attend meetings of Standing Committees to which they are appointed, Members have the right to attend other Standing Committee meetings as an observer. Members may also be permitted by the Chairman of the Committee to speak on any matter under consideration by the Committee, but shall not be entitled to vote.

Term of Office

124. Subject to Clause 124, the members of each Standing Committee shall be appointed at the first meeting of the Council held after the annual election each year, and shall hold office until midnight of Election Day in any year.

Council may Change Membership

125. The Council may, by resolution carried pursuant to a notice of motion by a simple majority, or on a motion without notice by an absolute majority, change the membership any Committee, or appoint substitutes for Members absent pursuant to leave granted by the Council.

Duties of Committees

126. The powers and duties of Standing Committees shall be such as the Council from time to time defines.

DIVISION 2—OCCASIONAL, COMMITTEES

Appointment of Occasional Committees

127. The Council may appoint Occasional Committees to perform any duty which may be lawfully entrusted by it to a Committee.

Number of Members

128. An Occasional Committee may comprise any number of members not exceeding the largest minority of the total number of members of Council.

Attendance by Members as Observers

129. In addition to the right to attend meetings of Occasional Committees to which they are appointed, Members have the right to attend other Occasional Committee meetings as an observer. Members may also be permitted by the Chairman of the Committee to speak on any matter under consideration by the Committee, but shall not be entitled to vote.

Standing Committee not to Interfere

130. A Standing Committee shall not interfere in any matter which has, for the time being, been entrusted to an Occasional Committee.

Details of Appointment

131. An Occasional Committee shall not be appointed, except on a motion setting out—

- (1) the duties proposed to be entrusted to such Committee; and
- (2) either—
 - (a) the names of the Members of whom, with the President, it is intended to constitute the Committee; or
 - (b) the number of members intended to constitute the Committee and a provision that they be elected by a separate motion.

DIVISION 3—GENERAL

Calling of Meetings

132. The Clerk shall call a meeting of any Committee when requested to do so by the President or the Chairman or any two members of that Committee.

Standing Orders to Apply *Mutatis Mutandis*

133. Except in so far as they limit the number of times a member may speak or require meetings to be conducted with open doors, these Standing Orders shall be observed at meetings of Committees, but the Chairman of a Committee may have and exercise both a deliberative and, in the case of equality of votes, a casting vote.

Quorum of Committee

134. At any meeting of a Committee the number of members necessary to form a quorum—

- (1) where the total number of the members of the Committee is an even number, is one half of that total plus one; or
- (2) where the total number of the members of the Committee is an odd number, is the integer nearest to but greater than one half of that total.

Meeting Lapses if No Quorum

135. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the summons as a quorum is constituted, but if a quorum is lacking one half hour after the appointed time of the meeting, the meeting shall lapse.

PART VIII—GENERAL**Representation on Public Bodies**

136. Whenever it becomes necessary to nominate a Member of the Council to represent the Council on a public body or State instrumentality, that nomination shall be made by Council.

Motions Affecting Expenditure

137. Where a motion or amendment would have the effect of incurring expenditure not provided for in the estimates, that motion or amendment shall not be moved other than in the form of a reference of the question to the Finance and Administration Committee.

Meetings of Electors

138. The Standing Orders apply, so far as is practicable, to any meeting of electors but, where there is any inconsistency between the provisions of this by-law and the provisions of section 171 of the Act, the latter shall prevail.

Petitions

139. Apart from those petitions to the Governor and others specifically prescribed under the Act (which shall be in the form prescribed), petitions and requests to Council of a general nature will be received by Council, provided that the meaning and legibility of the petitions and requests are clear.

Cases Not Provided for in Standing Orders

140. The Chairman shall decide all questions of order, procedure, debate or otherwise, in respect of which no provision or insufficient provision is made in this by-law, taking as a guide the procedure of the Western Australian Parliament in that behalf. The decisions of the Chairman in all such cases shall be final in that particular case unless a majority of the Members then present, by resolution made forthwith and without discussion dissent therefrom.

Penalty

141. Any person committing a breach of these Standing Orders is liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Enforcement

142. The Chairman is authorised and required to enforce the Standing Orders and the Council may prosecute for any breach thereof.

The Municipality of the Shire of Kojonup

By-laws Relating To Trading in Public Places

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all the other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 27th February, 1989, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor, the following by-laws relating to Trading in Public Places within the townsites of Kojonup and Muradup.

1. In this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Act” means the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended) or re-enacted;

“public place” includes a street, way, park, reserve and other place which the public are allowed to use, whether the street, way, park, reserve or other public place is, or is not on private property;

“trading” means selling or hiring of goods, wares, merchandise or services or offering goods, wares, merchandise or services for sale or hire, in a public place and includes displaying goods, wares or merchandise for the purpose of offering them for sale or hire, soliciting orders or carrying out any other transaction therein, but does not include the setting up of a stall, or the conducting of business at a stall, under the authority of a licence issued under by-laws made under section 242 of the Act.

“Community Association” means an institution, association, club, society or body, whether incorporated or not, the objects of which are of a charitable, benevolent, religious, cultural, educational, recreational, sporting or other like nature and the members of which are not entitled or permitted to receive any pecuniary profit from the transactions thereof.

“Council” means the Municipality of the Shire of Kojonup.

Words and expressions not defined in these by-laws have the meanings respectively given to them in and for the purpose of the Local Government Act 1960.

2. This by-law shall not apply to—
 - (a) the selling or offering for sale of newspapers or magazines;
 - (b) the selling or offering for sale of vegetable produce from a stall on the property on which that produce is grown;
 - (c) any Community Association.
3. No person shall carry on trading in any public place unless that person is acting within the specifications of a current licence issued under this by-law and for which all fees and charges have been paid.
4. An application for a licence shall be in writing and shall contain such information as the Council may require.
5. In consideration of an application for a licence, the Council shall have regard for any relevant policy statements and for the desirability of the proposed activity and its location and for the circumstances of the case, and may refuse to issue a licence, in which case it shall provide the applicant with reasons in writing.
6. The Council may issue a licence specifying such requirements, terms and conditions as the Council sees fit, including—
 - (a) the place to which the licence applies;
 - (b) the days and hours when trading may be carried on;
 - (c) the number, type, form and construction, as the case may be, of any stand, table, structure or vehicle which may be used for trading;
 - (d) the particulars of the goods or services or transaction in respect of which trading may be carried on;
 - (e) the number of persons and the names of persons permitted to carry on trading, and any requirements concerning personal attendance at the place of trading and the nomination of assistants, nominees or substitutes.
 - (f) whether and under what terms the licence is transferable;
 - (g) any prohibitions or restrictions concerning the causing of any nuisance, the use of signs, the making of noise and the use of amplifiers, sound equipment, sound instruments and lighting apparatus;
 - (h) any requirements concerning the display of the licence holders name and other details of the licence, the care, maintenance and cleansing of the place of trading and the vacating of the place when trading is not taking place;
 - (i) any requirements regarding the acquisition by the licence holder of public risk insurance;
 - (j) the period, not exceeding 12 months, during which the licence is valid;
7. The amount of the charges and fees shall be calculated and payable in accordance with the Schedule hereto.
8. Where a licence is revoked, the Council shall, if requested, provide the licence holder with reasons in writing and shall refund the charges having first deducted the charge applicable to the period from the issuing of the licence to its revocation.
10. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of the by-law commits an offence and is liable to conviction to a penalty for each offence of not more than \$1,000 or six months imprisonment.
