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

SUSPENSION OF SECTION 25

Correspondence No. 263

Bush Fires Board, Perth, 8th March 1991.

It is hereby notified that the Hon. Minister administering the Bush Fires Act, 1954, has approved pursuant to the powers contained in section 25 of the said Act, the suspension of the operation of Section 25B that relates to a fire to be lit, or which is lit, for the purpose of destroying garden refuse

or rubbish or any like purpose during the declared prohibited and Restricted Burning Times on land set aside for the purpose in the Municipal district of the Shire of Wyndham-East Kimberley. This notice shall have effect until revoked and is issued subject to the following conditions—

Specific Conditions

(a) Kununurra Rubbish Disposal Site, Reserve No. 28875, and

(b) Wyndham Rubbish Disposal Site, Reserve No. 27724.

- 1. All burning of rubbish to be confined to the area that Council have provided for the purpose and that a sign be maintained at the site to inform the public that dumping in any other area is prohibited.
- 2. A sign warning of the prohibition of unauthorised lighting of fires to be erected and maintained in good condition at the site.
- 3. That all grass and bush of an inflammable nature save standing live trees on the site be burnt or removed on a radius of 100 metres before the first fire is lit.
- 4. The accumulated rubbish to be lit regularly by such persons specifically authorised to do so by the Shire Clerk.
- 5. The Fire Control Officer of the area or Shire Clerk to be informed each day when burning is to be carried out.
- 6. That an Officer or member of the West Australian Volunteer Fire Brigade in the area be notified prior to lighting on each and every occasion.
- 7. No fire to be lit on land subject to the Suspension on a day for which the fire danger forecast given by the Bureau of meteorology in Perth in respect to the location is "Very High" or "Extreme".

- 6. Shall not be used for the processing of marron (*Cherax tenuimanus*) unless a licence is held under Section 39C of the Fisheries Act.

ROCK LOBSTER POT (SOUTH COAST) NOTICE 1991 Notice No. 481

FD 282/70

MADE by the Minister under sections 10, 11 and 23A of the Act. Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the Rock Lobster Pot (South Coast) Notice 1991. Commencement

2. This notice shall come into operation on 14 November 1991.

Area of application

3. Every pot used or intended to be used in the waters situated on the south coast of the State bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the high water mark and $115^{\circ}08'$ east longitude extending south to the intersection of $115^{\circ}08'$ east longitude and $34^{\circ}24'$ south latitude; thence west along $34^{\circ}24'$ south latitude to the outer limit of the Australian Fishing Zone; thence along that boundary in an easterly direction to its intersection with 129° east longitude; thence north along 129° east longitude to the high water mark; thence in a westerly direction along the high water mark to the commencing point, shall conform with the provisions of this Notice.

Entrance or neck of pot

4. Unless otherwise authorised by the Director, every pot shall have only one entrance or neck which shall be positioned on the upper surface of the pot, having the mouth or entrance parallel to the base of the pot.

Beehive pots

5. Every beehive pot shall—

- (i) have inserted therein a device that creates an escape gap that is as nearly as practicable rectangular in shape and when measured internally shall measure not less than 305 millimetres in length and not less than 54 millimetres in height;
- (ii) be constructed of steel flat-bar having a width of not less than 20 millimetres and a thickness of not less than 5 millimetres or more than 6 millimetres, and shall be constructed in accordance with diagram 1 in the schedule;
- (iii) be located at least 150 millimetres away from the attachment point or points of the hauling rope and not between the attachment points if there are two;
- (iv) be positioned on the side of the pot so that the longer side of the gap is generally parallel to the base of the pot and the lower internal edge of the escape gap is not more than 110 millimetres from the base of the pot and shall be positioned in accordance with diagram 2 in the schedule;

(v) not have any obstruction positioned in such a way as to restrict the movement of rock lobsters through the escape gap or to reduce the internal measure of the escape gap, but in the case of a pot constructed of cane or sticks one wire may pass vertically across the escape gap.

Batten pots

6. (a) Every batten pot shall have inserted therein a device that creates an escape gap that is as nearly as practicable rectangular in shape, and when measured internally shall measure not less than 305 millimetres in length and not less than 54 millimetres in height.

(b) The escape gap shall be—

- (i) positioned on a side, other than the base, in rear half of the pot or at the end opposite the hauling rope attachment point or points in accordance with diagram 3 in the schedule;
- (ii) located at least 150 millimetres away from the attachment point or points of the hauling rope and not between the attachment points if there are two.

(c) when fitted to the pot, the longer side of the escape gap shall be generally parallel to the base of the pot and the lower internal edge of the escape gap shall be no more than 110 millimetres from the base of the pot.

(d) The escape gap shall be constructed of—

- (i) steel flat-bar having a width of not less than 20 millimetres and a thickness of not less than 3 millimetres and not more than 6 millimetres and shall be constructed in accordance with diagram 4 in the schedule;
- (ii) aluminium having a width of not less than 20 millimetres and a thickness of not less than 4 millimetres and not more than 6 millimetres and shall be constructed in accordance with diagram 5 in the schedule; or
- (iii) fibreglass with a thickness of not less than 3 millimetres and not more than 6 millimetres with reinforcing on the lip of the gap having a thickness of not less than 5 millimetres and not more than 8 millimetres and having a width of not less than 30 millimetres. The widest measurement of the lip of the gap is not to exceed 12 millimetres and shall be constructed in accordance with diagram 6 in the schedule.

(e) The material to which the escape gap is attached in the horizontal plane must not—

(i) exceed 13 millimetres in thickness; and

(ii) be within 5 millimetres of the internal edge of the escape gap.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (e) (i), where the escape gap is attached internally to the framework running horizontally along the bottom of the pot and the bottom internal edge of the escape gap is not within 10 millimetres of the attachment material, then the material to which the gap is attached can be greater than 13 millimetres but not more than 25 millimetres in thickness.

Plastic pots

7. (a) Every plastic pot shall have inserted therein a device that creates an escape gap that is as nearly as practicable rectangular in shape and the escape gap when measured internally shall measure not less than 305 millimetres in length and not less than 54 millimetres in height.

(b) The escape gap shall be positioned—

- (i) on a side, other than the base, in the rear half of the pot or at the end of the pot opposite the hauling rope attachment point or points;
- (ii) so that the longer sides of the gap are generally parallel to the base of the pot and the lower internal edge of the escape gap is no more than 110 millimetres from the base of the pot in accordance with diagram 7 in the schedule;
- (iii) at least 150 millimetres away from the attachment point or points of the hauling rope and not between the attachment points if there are two.
- (c) The escape gap shall be constructed of-
 - (i) the materials and to the specifications set out in clause 6 (d) (i), (ii) and (iii); or
 - (ii) plastic having a thickness of not less than 3 millimetres and not more than 6 millimetres.

(d) The material to which the escape gap is attached in the horizontal plane must not—

(i) exceed 13 millimetres in thickness; and

(ii) be within 5 millimetres of the internal edge of the escape gap.

Other pots

8. (a) Every pot other than a beehive pot, batten pot or plastic pot shall have inserted therein a device that creates an escape gap that is as nearly as practicable rectangular in shape and when measured internally shall measure not less than 305 millimetres in length and not less than 54 millimetres in height.

(b) The escape gap shall be positioned-

- (i) on a side, other than the base, in the rear half of the pot or at the end of the pot opposite the hauling rope attachment point or points;
- (ii) so that the longer sides of the gap are generally parallel to the base of the pot and the lower internal edge of the escape gap is no more than 110 millimetres from the base of the pot;
- (iii) at least 150 millimetres away from the attachment point or points of the hauling rope and not between the attachment points if there are two.

(c) Escape gaps shall be constructed of the materials and the specifications set out in clause 6 (d) (i), (ii) and (iii).

(d) The material to which the escape gap is attached in the horizontal plane must not—

(i) exceed 13 millimetres in thickness; and

(ii) be within 5 millimetres of the internal edge of the escape gap.

Conditions applicable to all pots

9. (a) A pot shall not have any form of chamber or partition within the pot capable of containing rock lobster other than that formed by the external frame of the pot.

(b) The escape gap fitted to pots shall not have any obstruction positioned in such a way as to restrict the movement of rock lobsters through the escape gap or to reduce the internal measurements of the escape gap, except as provided in clause 5 (v).

Determination of position by reference to the Australian Geodetic Datum

10. 

(Clause 5 (ii)) (Steel Flat Bar)






DIAGRAM 6 - BATTEN POTS (Clause 6(d) (iii)) (Fibreglass)





DIAGRAM 7 - PLASTIC POTS (Clause 7 (b)) Alternative location of escape gap

WORKERS' COMPENSATION AND REHABILITATION ACT 1981 WORKERS' COMPENSATION BOARD AMENDMENT RULES 1991

Made by the Chairman of the Workers' Compensation Board. Citation

1. These rules may be cited as the Workers' Compensation Board Amendment Rules 1991 and shall come into effect on 8 March 1991.

Principal Rules

2. In these rules the Workers' Compensation Board Rules 1982* are referred to as the principal rules.

[*Published in the Government Gazette on 8 April 1982 at pp. 1250-1275 with Corrigendum published on 7 May 1982 at p. 1463. Amendments published on 11 June 1982 at pp. 1937 and 1938, 12 August 1983 at pp. 2951 and 2952, 6 January 1984 at p. 19, 7 September 1984 at p. 2887, 4 August 1989 at p. 2496, 11 August 1989 at pp. 2678 and 2679 with Corrigenda published on 1 September 1989 at p. 3071 and 1 December 1989 at pp. 4430 and 4431, 16 February 1990 at pp. 1118 and 1119, 27 April 1990 at pp. 2095-2108 and 14 December 1990 at p. 6182.]

New Rule 21A

3. The principal rules are amended by inserting a new rule in the following terms:—

" Medical Panels

21A. (1) An application to the Chairman under section 70 of the Act for a matter to be referred to a medical panel shall be in Form 9A in Appendix A and shall be signed by the applicant and such medical certificates, medical reports, or other documents as are desired to be referred to the medical panel shall be filed with the application.

(2) Within 7 days after the service of the application referred to in subrule (1) the respondent to the application shall file such medical certificates, medical reports, or other documents as are desired to be referred to the medical panel.

(3) Where under sections 70 or 145 of the Act, the Chairman or the Board (as the case may be) makes an order referring a matter to a medical panel, the Chairman or the Board (as the case may be) shall appoint 3 medical practitioners to constitute the panel and shall supply each of them with a copy of the order in the form of Form 9B in Appendix A, the terms of reference, and any medical certificates, medical reports, or other documents to be considered by the panel.

(4) All appointments to a medical panel under this rule shall be from the Register of Specialists maintained under section 146 of the Act.

(5) An order that the worker attend and be examined by a medical panel shall be in the form of Form 9C in Appendix A but if the Chairman or the Board (as the case may be) is satisfied the worker is unfit to travel to attend the panel the order may require that the examination be at a place convenient to the worker.

(6) The Chairman or the Board (as the case may be) may make such orders as he or it thinks fit as to the worker's expenses of attending a medical panel.

(7) Except with the leave of and in accordance with any directions by the medical panel, no party (except for the worker in person) is entitled to appear before a medical panel, either in person or by an agent or solicitor, and no party (the worker included) may call witnesses or adduce any evidence before the panel.

(8) A certificate of a medical panel under section 70 (3) of the Act shall be in the form of Form 9D in Appendix A and shall be sent to the Registrar as soon as practicable after the examination of the worker by the panel.

(9) On receiving the certificate of a medical panel under section 70 (3) of the Act or the determination of a medical panel under section 145 of the Act the Registrar shall send a copy to each of the parties.

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
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
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
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
