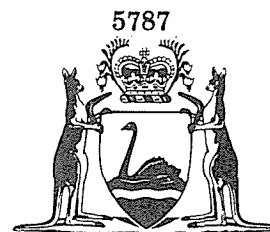

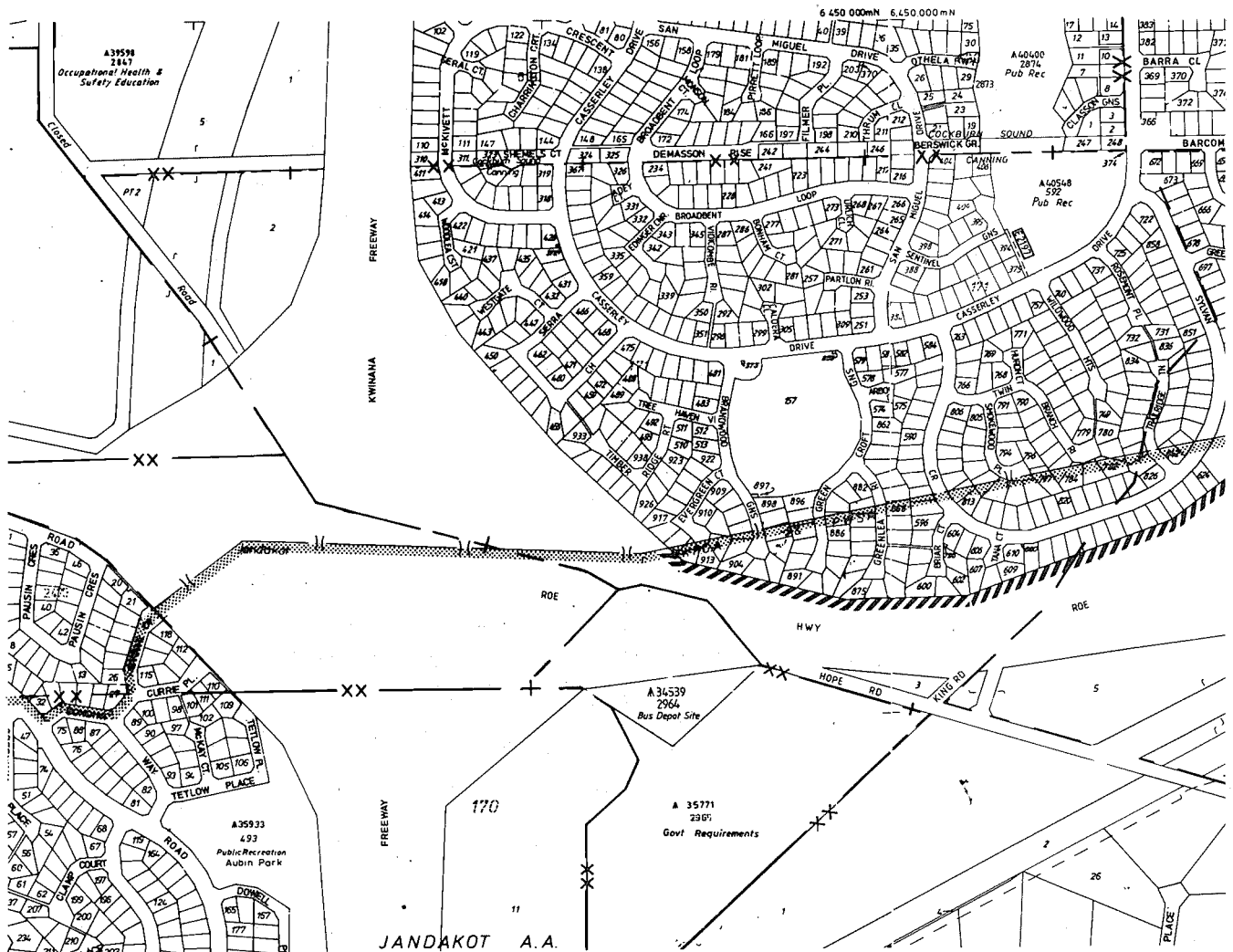

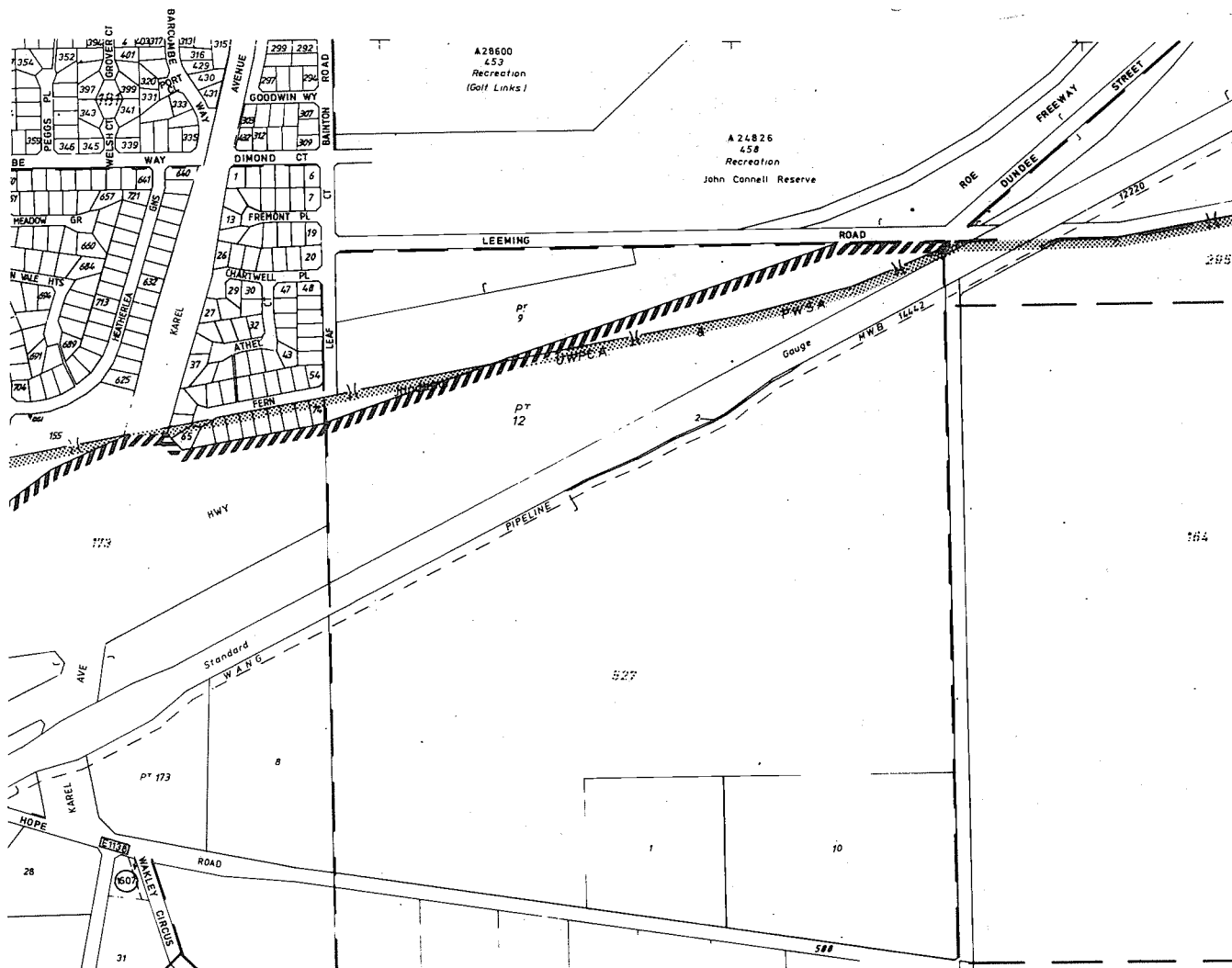

Whereas it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 15 and subsection (2) and (3) of section 152 of the Petroleum Act 1967 that notwithstanding the Land Act 1933 or any other Act the Governor, by proclamation, may declare that any land of the Crown or part thereof reserved for or dedicated to any public purpose under any Act and howsoever classified that—

- (a) is not Crown Land within the meaning of that expression in section 5 of the Act; and
- (b) is specified in the proclamation, is Crown Land for the purposes of the Petroleum Act 1967 and is land to which that Act applies, so long as the proclamation remains in force.

Now, therefore, I the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in the exercise of the powers under subsection (2) of section 15 of the Petroleum Act 1967, do hereby declare that the land of the Crown comprising Reserve No. 10876 classified as Class "C" and set apart for the purpose of Stock Route and Reserve No. 25495 classified in Class "C" and set apart for the purpose of Government requirements pursuant to the provisions of the Land Act 1933 is Crown Land for the purpose of the Petroleum Act 1967 and is land to which the Petroleum Act 1967 applies so long as this proclamation remains in force.

Pursuant to section 37 of the Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976, the Agriculture Protection Board hereby lists the classes of animals that are for the time being the subject of a declaration made under section 35 of that Act, together with the matters specified pursuant to subsection (2) of that Section in relation to each class.

Table A: Native pest animals—Category A7. A management programme for each species outlines the area and conditions under which controls may be applied. Programmes are for the whole of the State or as indicated for each species.

Pursuant to section 37 of the Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976, the Agriculture Protection Board hereby lists the classes of plants that are for the time being the subject of a declaration made under section 35 of that Act, together with the matters specified pursuant to subsection (2) of that Section in relation to each class—

Aquarium Plants; P1; Whole of the State.

Plants of any class used or grown in aquariums unless they are plants that are on premises for the time being accredited by the Chief Agriculture Protection officer as premises free from any snails capable of acting as intermediate hosts for the Fluke *Fasciola hepatica*, or are in the course of being moved from such premises.

“Member” means any member of the Council for the time being and shall include the Mayor;

“Meeting” includes any Ordinary or Special meeting of the Council or a Committee held in pursuance of the Act and convened as therein required;

"Mayor" includes the Deputy Mayor or any member presiding at any meeting of the Council in manner prescribed by the Act.

PART II—MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL.

Mayor

4. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires the term "Mayor" shall in the absence of the Mayor include the Deputy Mayor or the Councillor chosen to preside at any meeting of the Council.

Mayor to Preside

5. The Mayor if present, shall preside at all meetings of the Council, and, in the Mayor's absence, or if, after being present, the Mayor retires, the Deputy Mayor shall preside, but if the Deputy Mayor is not present or if after being present, the Deputy Mayor retires, then one of the councillors chosen by the councillors then present shall preside.

Notice of Ordinary and Committee Meetings

6. (1) Notice of all meetings of the Council shall be given to members of the Council as follows—

- (a) Council meetings other than those convened under s. 172 (2) or s. 172 (3) of the Act. The Notice shall be in writing and shall be signed by or on behalf of the Clerk and shall state the place, date and hour of holding the meeting and shall state the business to be transacted. The notice shall be served on each of the members of the Council at least three clear days before the time of commencement of the meeting.
- (b) Special Meeting convened under s. 172 (2) of the Act. The provisions of the preceding subclause shall apply except that the notice shall be signed either by the Mayor or the Clerk.
- (c) Special Meeting convened under s. 172 (3) of the Act. The Notice shall be in writing and shall be signed by the three Councillors calling the meeting and shall state the place, date and hour of holding the meeting and shall state the business to be transacted. The notice shall be served on each of the other members of the Council at the times and in the manner specified in section 172 (3) of the Act.
- (d) A notice of meeting shall be served on each member of the Council—
 - (i) by delivering it to him personally;
 - (ii) by post either to the place of abode or to the usual place of business (if any) within the municipal district;
 - (iii) communicated person to person.

(2) When a meeting of the Council is adjourned to a day and hour other than the next Ordinary Meeting of the Council notice of the adjourned meeting shall, if time permits, be sent in the manner provided by Clause 6 of this by-law, to each member of the Council, specifying the nature of the business to be transacted.

Quorum

7. (1) Except in cases where section 173 (4) of the Act applies the number of members necessary to form a quorum shall be—

- (a) Where the total number of members of the Council is an even number, one-half of that number; and
- (b) Where the total number of members of the Council is an odd number, the integer nearest to but greater than one-half of the total.

(2) Subject to clause 8, every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the notice of meeting as a quorum is constituted.

Absence of Quorum

8. If at the expiration of half an hour from the time fixed for the commencement of a meeting of the Council a quorum is not present, the Mayor, or, in the Mayor's absence the Deputy Mayor, or in the Deputy Mayor's absence the majority of the Councillors present, or any Councillor alone, or in the absence of the Mayor and all the Councillors the Clerk may adjourn the meeting to any date not later than seven days from the day of the adjournment.

Count Out

9. If at any time during any meeting of the Council a quorum is not present the Mayor shall thereupon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of five minutes, and if a quorum be not present at the expiration of that period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out, and the Mayor shall adjourn it to some future date.

Names to be Recorded

10. At any meeting at which there is not a quorum of members present, or at which the Council is counted out for want of a quorum, the names of the members then present shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

Disturbances

11. (1) A person, not being a Councillor, shall not at any meeting of the Council interrupt the proceedings of the Council.

(2) Any person interrupting the proceedings of the Council shall, when so directed by the Mayor, forthwith leave the Council Chambers.

(3) Any person who, being ordered to leave the Council Chambers, fails to do so commits an offence and may, by order of the Mayor, be removed from the Council Chambers.

Distinguished Visitors

12. A distinguished visitor present at a meeting of the Council may be invited by the Mayor to sit beside the Mayor or at the Council table.

Media

13. At all meetings of the Council media reporters shall be permitted to attend but shall withdraw during any period when the Council is sitting behind closed doors.

Order of Seating at Council Meetings

14. Seating of Councillors at the Council table in the Council Chamber shall be arranged in order of seniority as follows:—

- (a) The Deputy Mayor is seated in the first seat to the right hand side of the Mayor as the Mayor faces Councillors.
- (b) The most senior Councillor is seated in the first left hand seat (excluding the Mayor and Deputy Mayor).
- (c) The next most senior Councillor to be seated in the second right hand seat, the third most senior in the second left hand seat, and thereafter diagonally across the table in order of seniority.
- (d) Seniority is defined as unbroken length of service since election to Council. Where two Councillors have the same election date, alphabetical order shall apply.

PART III—BUSINESS AT MEETINGS.**DIVISION 1—ORDER OF BUSINESS.****Order of Business at Ordinary Meeting**

15. The order of business at an ordinary meeting of the Council shall unless for the greater convenience of the Council altered by resolution to that effect be as nearly as practicable as follows:—

- (i) Attendances, Apologies and Applications for Leave of Absence
- (ii) Declarations of Interests
- (iii) Confirmation of Minutes
- (iv) Business Deferred from Previous Meeting
- (v) Announcements by the Mayor without Discussion
- (vi) Petitions and Memorials
- (vii) Reports of Committees
- (viii) Answers to Public Questions Deferred from Earlier Meetings
- (ix) Public Questions and Answers to those Questions
- (x) Delegates Reports
- (xi) Reports of Officers
- (xii) Motions of Which Previous Notice has Been Given
- (xiii) Notices of Motion for Consideration at the Following Meeting, if Given During the Meeting
- (xiv) Urgent Items Without Notice
- (xv) Items for Consideration with Closed Doors
- (xvi) Date of Next Meeting

Question Time

16. (1) In accordance with the order of business as mentioned in clause 15 each ordinary meeting of the Council shall allow a period not exceeding 15 minutes for the asking of questions of the Council by members of the public and answers to those questions.

(2) Each question asked in accordance with the provisions of sub-bylaw (1) hereof shall not exceed two (2) minutes in duration.

(3) Questions asked in accordance with the provisions of this clause shall be answered at the meeting at which that question was asked, by the Mayor or, with the permission of the Mayor, by a Councillor or an officer of the Council provided that if it is not possible to answer the question asked at that meeting the answer thereto may be deferred to the next ordinary meeting of the Council.

(4) Deferred answers to public questions shall have priority over public questions at the next ordinary meeting of the Council.

(5) Questions and answers shall be recorded in the minutes but any member of the public may ask for a written response to a question and upon receiving such a request the Clerk shall so respond.

Order of Business at Special Meeting

17. The order of business at a special meeting of the Council shall be the order in which that business stands in the notice of the meeting.

DIVISION 2—MINUTES.**Confirmation of Minutes**

18. The minutes of any preceding meeting, whether of an ordinary or a special meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at a meeting of the Council in order to proceed to their confirmation, and discussion, other than discussions as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, shall not be permitted, and when confirmed, the Mayor shall sign and date each page of the minutes in confirmation of the fact that they have been found correct.

Minute Book

19. Minutes of meetings of the Council shall be kept in accordance with Section 188 (1) of the Act and the pasting or otherwise permanently affixing of the minutes between the cover of a book shall be a sufficient recording of the minutes in the Minute Book.

Reading of Minutes May be Dispensed With

20. The reading at the next ordinary meeting of the Council of the Minutes of a previous meeting may be dispensed with when members have been supplied with copies of the minutes at least three days before the holding of the next ordinary meeting of the Council.

Tape Recordings

21. Meetings of Council are to be recorded on magnetic tape to assist with the preparation of minutes. The Town Clerk may make tapes available to any Councillor or Senior staff only. Tapes are to be stored for a length of time as Council directs by resolution from time to time. No other person is permitted to tape Council proceedings. Tapes may not be re-recorded and shall be listened to only. Tapes are not to be removed from the Council Administration Building and the tapes and machine when in use are to be under the supervision of an officer nominated by the Town Clerk.

DIVISION 3—PETITIONS, MEMORIALS & DEPUTATIONS**Petitions**

22. Every petition shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Council only by a Councillor. A Councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall become acquainted with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Council, and thereupon sign the petition at the beginning thereof and record the number of signatures thereon.

23. The only motion which shall be entertained by the Council on the presentation of any petition shall be:

- (1) that the petition shall be tabled; or
- (2) that the petition be not tabled; or
- (3) that the petition be tabled and referred to the appropriate committee for consideration and report; or
- (4) that the petition be dealt with under urgent items without notice if the Mayor determines that the matter is of extreme urgency.

Deputations

24. (1) Any person or persons wishing to be received as a deputation by the Council or a standing committee of the Council shall, in the first instance, send to the Clerk a statement, setting out in concise terms the subject matter to be raised by the deputation.

(2) Where the Clerk receives a request pursuant to sub-clause (1) hereof, the statement shall be referred to the Mayor or to the Chairman of the relevant Committee for approval to receive the deputation, and if approval is given the deputation shall be received at the next meeting of the Council or the Committee.

(3) Where the Mayor or the Chairman declines to approve the request the Clerk shall lay the statement before the Council or the relevant Committee at the next meeting, and the Council or the Committee may resolve to receive the deputation.

(4) A deputation shall not exceed three in number and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Council or a Committee of the Council, except in reply to questions from members of the Council or Committee and the matter shall not be further considered by the Council or the Committee until the deputation has withdrawn.

DIVISION 4—QUESTIONS.**Questions**

25. Any Councillor desiring to ask at any meeting of the Council, a question which requires research by officers of the Council, shall give notice thereof in writing to the Clerk at least twenty-four hours before the hour fixed for the commencement of the meeting.

26. Every question and answer shall be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible, and no discussion shall be allowed therein.

DIVISION 5—CORRESPONDENCE.**Reception of Correspondence**

27. Discussion shall not be permitted on any motion that any correspondence be tabled or that any correspondence or any part thereof be referred to any Committee of the Council.

DIVISION 6—NOTICE OF MOTIONS.**Form to be Taken**

28. (1) A Councillor may bring forward at a meeting such business as he considers advisable, in the form of a motion, of which notice has been given in writing to the Clerk, either at the last previous meeting or at any time thereafter, being not less than three clear days before the meeting at which it is brought forward.

(2) Every notice of motion shall relate to some question affecting the constitution, administration, or condition of the municipality or the Council.

(3) The Mayor shall rule out of order any motion which does not comply with sub-clause (2) of this clause.

Motion Shall Lapse

29. Every such motion as is mentioned in clause 28 shall lapse, unless—

- (a) the Councillor who gave notice thereof, or some other Councillor authorised by the Councillor in writing, is present to move the motion when called on; or
- (b) the Council on a motion agrees to defer consideration of the motion to a later stage or date.

Urgency of Motions

30. A motion moved without due notice as required by clause 28 shall be in such form as to refer the matter for investigation and report by a committee to Council except:—

- (1) where the Mayor is satisfied that the urgency of the matter is such as to warrant immediate action by Council, or
- (2) where the Mayor is satisfied that in the circumstances it would be more appropriate to refer the matter for investigation and report directly to Council.

DIVISION 7—PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS.

31. (1) Any Councillor may have access to any records of the Council upon request to the Town Clerk during normal working hours, providing that the records relate to business of the Council.

(2) On giving to the Clerk not less than twenty-four hours notice, a Councillor shall be entitled to have laid on the Council table for the duration of a meeting, any document or record of the Council, and the Clerk, having received that notice, shall lay the document on the Council table at the commencement of the meeting.

(3) All papers laid upon the Council table as aforesaid shall be deemed to be public unless otherwise ordered by resolution of the Council.

DIVISION 8—REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

Definition

32. The minutes of the meetings of all standing committees shall record all recommendations to be presented to Council for adoption, and shall be deemed to be the report of the Committee to Council pursuant to this Division.

Reports of Committees—Items Numbered

33. The reports of every Committee shall be divided into items, which shall be numbered consecutively.

Procedure on Reports of Committees

34. Upon the consideration by the Council of any reports or recommendations of a committee, the chairman shall, without further motion, put the report or recommendations seriatim, in their numerical order, unless the Council shall otherwise determine. Each recommendation that shall be adopted by the Council shall forthwith become a resolution of the Council.

Amendment of Recommendations

35. A recommendation made by or contained in a report of a committee may be—

- (1) adopted by the Council without amendment or modification;
- (2) rejected by the Council in its entirety;
- (3) subject to Clause 36 hereof amended or modified and adopted with such amendments or modifications; or
- (4) referred back to the committee for further consideration.

Where Substance Altered

36. Where in the opinion of the Mayor an amendment or modification of a recommendation alters the substance or effect of the recommendation the Mayor shall require a new motion to be put forward prefaced by the words... "I move that the Committee recommendation be rejected and that..."

Withdrawal of Recommendation of Committee

37. The Chairman or other member of a Committee bringing up a recommendation may, with the consent of the Council, withdraw any such recommendation.

Recommendations may be Questioned

38. During the consideration by the Council of a recommendation of a committee a councillor may through the Mayor question the chairman or any member of the committee upon any matter arising directly out of or having relevance to the recommendation.

PART IV — CONDUCT OF MEETINGS**DIVISION 1—RULES OF DEBATE****Members to Rise to Address the Mayor Where Possible**

39. Every member of the Council desiring to speak shall rise and address the Mayor, except where any member of the Council is unable conveniently to stand by reason of sickness, infirmity, or physical impairment, shall, under such circumstances, be permitted to sit while speaking.

Point of Order

40. A Councillor who is addressing the Mayor shall not be interrupted except upon a point of order, in which event the Councillor shall be seated until the Councillor raising the point of order has been heard thereon and the question of order has been disposed of, whereupon the Councillor so interrupted, may, if permitted, proceed.

41. A Councillor rising to express a difference of opinion with, or to contradict, a speaker shall not be recognised as raising a point of order.

Motions and Amendments to be Seconded

42. (1) A motion or amendment shall not be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless seconded, but a Councillor may require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Council by directing the Mayor's attention to the infraction thereof.

(2) A nomination to a position within the Council, a Committee, Community organisation or public body is not required to be seconded.

Substance of Motion to be Stated

43. Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state its substance before he addresses the Council thereon and, if so required by the Mayor, shall put the motion or amendment in writing.

Titles to be Used

44. A speaker, in referring to any other Councillor present, shall use the title of Mayor or Councillor, as the case may be.

Priority of Speaking

45. Where two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time, the Mayor shall decide which of them is entitled to priority.

Mayor to be Heard

46. Whenever the Mayor rises during a debate any Councillor then speaking or offering to speak shall sit down and the Council shall be silent so that the Mayor may be heard without interruption.

Mayor to take part in Debate

47. Subject to the provisions of this clause it shall be competent for the Mayor to take part in a discussion upon any question before the Council, provided that the Mayor shall address the Council before the right of reply is exercised.

Speaking Twice

48. Except where this clause is suspended under Clause 88 or Clause 49 a Councillor shall not speak twice on the same question except—

- (a) in reply, upon an original motion of which the Councillor was the mover;
- (b) in reply, upon an amendment last debated of which the Councillor was the mover;
- (c) by way of personal explanation.

49. The Council may, by resolution moved without notice, suspend the operation of Clause 48 hereof and thereupon such clause shall be suspended until such time as the Council shall, by similar resolution, otherwise decide.

50. The Mayor shall forthwith call to order any Councillor committing a breach of Clause 48.

Personal Explanation

51. A Councillor making a personal explanation shall confine it to a succinct explanation of a material part of his former speech which may have been misunderstood, and to the explanation itself, and shall not refer to matters not strictly necessary for that purpose nor seek to strengthen his former argument by new matter or by replying to other Councillors.

No Speech After Certain Events

52. No Councillor shall speak on any motion or amendment—

- (a) after the mover has replied; or
- (b) after the question has been put.

Mover and Seconder deemed to have Spoken

53. A Councillor who does not exercise the right to speak when moving or seconding a motion or an amendment shall be deemed to have spoken thereon.

Speaking in Reply

54. A Councillor speaking in reply shall not introduce any new matter but shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers.

Limit of Speeches

55. (1) Subject to sub-clause (3) hereof a Councillor moving a motion or an amendment shall not speak for a longer period than 10 minutes and when speaking in reply a Councillor shall not speak for a longer period than five minutes.

(2) Subject to sub-clause (3) hereof any other Councillor speaking for or against a motion shall not speak for a longer period than five minutes.

(3) The Council may consent to an extension of time in respect of sub-clauses (1) and (2) which consent shall be signified without debate.

Confidential Business

56. Except as otherwise provided for in this clause all matters dealt with or brought before a standing Committee of Council shall be available to the public after consideration by the standing Committee or Council.

Where any of the matters listed in this clause are involved the matter may be classified as confidential and until such item has been dealt with by Council at a meeting held with open doors and the Council by resolution declares the matter to be no longer confidential, then the matter shall be treated as strictly confidential and shall not be disclosed to any person other than the Mayor, Councillors or Officers of the Council and in the case of Officers only so far as may be necessary for the performance of their duties.

The following items may be classified as confidential—

- (a) personnel matters including salary negotiations, but not details of agreed salary classifications and conditions of employment;
- (b) industrial relations;
- (c) contractual matters;
- (d) legal advice and matters pertaining to a legal action or dispute;
- (e) the personal hardship of any resident or ratepayer;
- (f) reports or correspondence relating to dealings with the Parliamentary Commissioner; unless the Parliamentary Commissioner authorises public disclosure;
- (g) consideration of Awards, Honours or Presentations;
- (h) matters affecting the security of Council property.

Question May be Referred Back

57. Where the question before the meeting is a recommendation from a Committee of the Council, a Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, move without notice that the question be referred back to the Committee; and on any such motion, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak, other than formally to second and the Chairman of the Committee concerned, or in the absence of the Chairman a member thereof, may speak for not more than five minutes, but no other debate shall be allowed.

DIVISION 2—MOTIONS**Division of Motions**

58. The Mayor may, or the Council by motion without debate may, order a complicated motion to be divided and put in the form of two or more motions.

Withdrawal of Motions

59. A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover, with the consent of the seconder.

Motions Affecting Expenditure

60. Where a motion or amendment would have the effect of incurring expenditure not provided for in the budgets that motion or amendment shall not be moved other than in the form of a reference of the question to the Finance Committee.

Rescission of Resolution

61. A resolution of any meeting of the Council shall not be revoked, rescinded, or altered at the same or any subsequent meeting, except in the manner provided by Section 177 of the Act.

Negatived Motions

62. Except with the consent of the Council a motion to the same effect as any non-procedural motion which has been negatived by the Council shall not again be entertained within a period of one month.

Suspension of Standing Orders

63. In cases of urgent necessity, any Standing Order of the Council may be suspended on motion duly moved and seconded, and carried by a majority of the Council.

64. Any Councillor moving the suspension of a Standing Order shall state the object of the motion, but discussion shall not otherwise take place thereon.

PART V—PERMISSABLE MOTIONS DURING DEBATE

65. When a motion is under debate, no further motion shall be moved except a motion pursuant to Clauses 49 or 55 or a motion—

- (a) that the motion be amended;
- (b) that the meeting does adjourn;
- (c) that the debate be adjourned;
- (d) that the question be now put;
- (e) that the meeting proceed with the next business;
- (f) that the Council sit behind closed doors; or
- (g) that the meeting be now closed.

DIVISION 1—THAT THE MOTION BE AMENDED**Amendment to Relate to Motion**

66. Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved.

Amendment to be Read or Stated

67. Every amendment shall be read or stated before being moved.

One Amendment at a Time

68. (1) Only one amendment shall be discussed at a time, but as often as an amendment is lost, another amendment may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote, except that where an amendment is carried, one further amendment to the original motion, as amended, and no more, may be moved.

(2) In speaking to an amendment a Councillor may give notice of intention to move a further amendment.

Effect of Carrying Amendment

69. Where an amendment is carried, the original motion as amended shall, for all purposes of subsequent debate and subject only to by-law 59, be treated as an original motion.

DIVISION 2—"THAT THE MEETING DO ADJOURN"

70. (1) A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the meeting do now adjourn, and the motion shall state the place, time and date to which the adjournment is to be made.

(2) On a motion to adjourn, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second, and the mover of the motion (if any) which was then under debate may speak for not more than five minutes, but no other debate shall be allowed.

71. Where a motion for the adjournment of the meeting is negatived, no similar motion shall be moved until after the question then under discussion or, if there is not question under discussion, the next matter on the notice paper or any other matter which may be allowed precedence shall have been disposed of.

72. (1) A Councillor who has spoken on the question then before the Council shall not move the adjournment of the meeting.

(2) A Councillor shall not, at the same sitting of the Council, move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the meeting.

Debate to be Continued After Resumption

73. On a motion for the adjournment of the meeting being carried, the debate on the question (if any) under debate when that motion was moved shall be continued immediately upon the meeting resuming after the adjournment.

Record of Speakers to be Taken

74. On a motion for the adjournment of the meeting being carried, a record shall be taken of all Councillors who have spoken on the subject under consideration at the time of the adjournment and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same subject provided however that the mover of any motion under consideration at the time of the adjournment shall retain the right of reply.

DIVISION 3—"THAT THE DEBATE BE ADJOURNED"

75. A Councillor may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor move, without notice, that the debate be adjourned to a later hour of the same meeting or to a subsequent meeting of the Council.

Mover or Committee Member May Speak

76. On a motion that the debate be adjourned the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second and no other debate shall be allowed; but if the question then before the Council is a recommendation from a Committee, the Chairman of the Committee concerned, or, in the absence of the Chairman, a member thereof may speak for not more than five minutes.

Restriction on Councillors to Move

77. (1) A Councillor who has spoken on the question under debate shall not move the adjournment of the debate.

(2) A Councillor shall not, at the same sitting of the Council, move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the same debate.

First to Speak After Resumption

78. On resuming an adjourned debate the Councillor who moved its adjournment shall be entitled to speak first.

Record of Speakers to be Taken

79. On a motion for the adjournment of a debate being carried, a record shall be taken of all Councillors who have spoken on the subject under debate at the time of the adjournment and they shall not be permitted to speak on any resumption of the debate on that subject provided however that the mover of the motion under consideration at the time of the adjournment shall retain the right of reply.

Debate to be Resumed at Same Point

80. Where the debate on any motion, moved and seconded, is interrupted by the Council being counted out, that debate may, on motion without notice, be resumed at the next meeting, at the point where it was so interrupted.

DIVISION 4—"THAT THE QUESTION BE NOW PUT"

81. A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, move, without notice and without comment, that the question under consideration be now put, and upon that motion being formally seconded, the same shall immediately be put, without debate.

82. A motion that the question under consideration be put shall not be moved by a Councillor who has already spoken on the question.

83. When it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration be put, the mover of the question under consideration shall, if debate has ensued and if otherwise entitled to do so, be permitted to speak in reply for not more than five minutes before the question is put, but subject thereto, the question shall at once be put.

84. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question be put, the question to be so put includes the main question as well as any amendment thereto.

DIVISION 5—"THAT THE MEETING PROCEED WITH THE NEXT BUSINESS"**May be Moved Without Notice**

85. A Councillor may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor move, without notice and without comment, that the Council do proceed with the next business and, upon that motion being formally seconded, it shall be immediately put, without debate.

Question Shall be Dropped

86. Where the Council decides to proceed with the next business, the question which was then under discussion shall be considered as dropped.

One Hour Restriction

87. During the same debate on any question, a motion that the Council do proceed with the next business shall not be moved within one hour after a similar motion has been negatived.

DIVISION 6—THAT THE COUNCIL SIT BEHIND CLOSED DOORS**Council Meeting Not Open to Public**

88. Ordinary and Special Meetings of the Council shall be open to the public except on such occasions as the Council by resolution which may be moved without notice directs otherwise.

Business Behind Closed Doors

89. After the carrying of a resolution under clause 88 of this by-law, the business at that meeting of the Council shall not be open to the public but shall proceed behind closed doors until the Council may by resolution decide that the meeting shall be open to the public.

Speeches on Motion to Exclude Public, Etc.

90. The member of the Council moving a motion that the public be excluded from a meeting of the Council or part thereof, or that a meeting be open to the public, may speak in support thereof for not more than five minutes, but the seconder shall not be permitted to speak beyond formally seconding the motion.

Right of Reply Governed

91. Upon a motion being made that a meeting of the Council, or part thereof, be not open to the public, the mover of the question then under debate, if any, may, without prejudice to his/her right of reply, be heard in reply on the motion (that the meeting or part thereof be not open to the public) for five minutes, after which the question shall be put at once without debate.

Unqualified Persons to Leave Meeting

92. Upon the carrying of a resolution under Clause 88, the Mayor shall direct all persons other than members and officers of the Council to leave the meeting and all such persons shall forthwith comply with such direction unless otherwise directed by Council.

Mayor May Order Removal

93. Any person failing to comply with a direction under Clause 92 shall commit a breach of this By-law and in addition to any penalty to which that person may be liable in respect of such breach may by order of the Mayor be removed from the Council Chamber.

94. While a resolution made under Clause 88 hereof is in force the operation of Clause 48 shall be suspended, except where the Council by resolution decides that Clause 48 shall apply.

Reading of Resolutions Passed

95. Upon the public again being admitted to the meeting in accordance with Clause 89 the Clerk shall unless the Council by resolution otherwise decides read out the resolutions passed by the Council whilst it was proceeding behind closed doors and details of any divisions taken or interests declared.

96. Resolutions passed by the Council whilst it was proceeding behind closed doors and details of any divisions taken or interests declared shall be recorded in the minutes.

DIVISION 7—"THAT THE MEETING BE CLOSED"**May be Moved Without Notice**

97. (1) A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor or on the conclusion of any business, move, without notice, that the meeting of the Council be now closed.

(2) On a motion that the meeting be closed, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second and the mover of the motion (if any) then under debate may speak for not more than five minutes; but no other debate shall be allowed.

On Motion Being Negatived

98. If a motion that the meeting of the Council be closed is negatived, a similar motion shall not be moved until after the question then under discussion or if there is no question under discussion, the next matter on the notice paper or any other matter which may be allowed precedence shall have been disposed of.

99. (1) A Councillor who has spoken on the question then before the Council shall not move that the meeting be closed.

(2) A Councillor shall not at the same meeting of the Council, move or second more than one motion that the meeting be closed.

Debate to be Adjourned

100. On a motion that the meeting be closed being carried, the debate on the question (if any) under debate when that motion was moved shall stand adjourned to its place on the notice paper for the next meeting of the Council.

Record of Councillors to be Taken

101. On a motion that the meeting be closed being carried, a record shall be taken of all Councillors who have spoken on the subject under consideration up to the closing of the meeting and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same subject provided however that the mover of any motion under consideration at the time of the adjournment shall retain his right of reply.

DIVISION 8—VOTING

All Councillors to Vote

102. At every meeting of the Council, save where the Act otherwise provides every Councillor present in the Council Chamber when a motion is put shall vote, and if any Councillor who is entitled to vote fails to vote, the Mayor shall call upon the Councillor to vote.

Method of Taking Votes

103. The Mayor shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question, first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and may do so as often as is necessary until satisfied as to whether the affirmative or the negative has the majority.

Division May be Called

104. The result of voting shall be determined on the count of raised hands, but may be determined on the voices unless a Councillor calls for a show of hands but any Councillor may call for a division on any question.

Division How Taken

105. (1) Upon a division being called for, the Mayor may order that the division bell be rung, and after the lapse of one minute from the bell ceasing to ring a Councillor shall not be permitted to enter or leave the Council Chamber, until after the division has been taken.

(2) A division shall be taken by those voting in the affirmative passing to the right of the chair and those voting in the negative to the left of the chair.

Record of Voting

106. The names of the members who voted on the question on which there is the division shall be recorded by the Clerk in respect of every division together with details of whether they voted in affirmative or negative.

PART VI—DISTURBANCE & BREACH OF ORDER

Conduct of Councillors

107. A Councillor shall not make any noise or disturbance or converse aloud, except to raise a point of order, while any other person is addressing the Council.

108. The Mayor may call attention to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order or decorum on the part of a Councillor and may direct that Councillor, if speaking, to cease speaking, and thereupon the Councillor shall cease speaking and shall resume his/her seat.

109. When the Mayor is putting any question, a Councillor shall not walk out of or across the Chamber, and shall not, whilst any other Councillor is speaking, pass between the speaker and the Chair.

110. The Mayor shall preserve order, and may call any Councillor to order, whenever, in the Mayor's opinion, there is cause for so doing.

111. Every Councillor shall be entitled to direct the attention of the Mayor to any infraction of the Standing Orders by any other Councillor and to draw the attention of the Mayor to any matter of which the latter may take notice under Clause 108.

Rulings by Mayor

112. The Mayor, shall decide all questions of order or practice, and the Mayor's decision shall be final and argument or comment shall not be permitted thereon unless, in any particular case, a majority of the Councillors then present shall, upon motion made forthwith, resolve that a different ruling shall be substituted for the ruling given by the Mayor.

113. Whenever the Mayor has decided that any motion, amendment or other matter before the Council is out of order, it shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in the Council, by any Councillor, is similarly decided to be out of order, that Councillor shall be called upon by the Mayor to make such explanation, retraction or apology as the case may require.

Continued Breach of Order

114. Where a Councillor persists in any conduct which the Mayor decides is out of order, or refuses to make any explanation, retraction or apology required by the Mayor under Clause 113, the Mayor may direct that Councillor to refrain from taking any further part in that meeting of the Council, other than by voting, and the Councillor shall comply with such direction.

Serious Disorder

115. (1) If at a meeting of the Council the Mayor is of the opinion that by reason of disorder or otherwise the business of the Council cannot effectually be continued, he may adjourn the meeting for a period of 15 minutes, whereafter the Council shall reassemble and decide whether business is to be proceeded with and that question shall be decided forthwith and without debate.

(2) Where after any proceeding under sub-clause (1) hereof the Mayor is of the opinion that the business of the Council cannot effectually be continued, he may close the meeting.

No Digression

116. A Councillor shall not speak otherwise than upon, or digress from, the question then before the Council, except to make a personal explanation.

No Adverse Reflection on Council

117. A Councillor shall not reflect adversely upon a resolution of the Council, except on a motion that the resolution be rescinded.

No Adverse Reflection on Councillor or Officer

118. During the proceedings of any meeting of the Council or of any committee of the Council a Councillor shall not reflect adversely upon the character of another Councillor or Officer nor impute any motive to a Councillor or Officer, unless the Council resolves, without debate, that the question then before the Council cannot otherwise adequately be considered.

119. Any Councillor may require the Clerk to take down any particular words used by a Councillor immediately upon their being used.

Demand for Withdrawal

120. If any Councillor in the opinion of the Mayor commits a breach of Clauses 117 and 118, the Mayor may require the Councillor unreservedly to withdraw any offending comment and to make a satisfactory apology and, if the Councillor declines or neglects to do so, the Mayor may direct such Councillor to cease speaking and resume his seat and may call on the next speaker.

PART VII — COMMITTEES

DIVISION 1—STANDING COMMITTEES

121. (1) The Council may appoint Standing Committees to perform any duties which may lawfully be entrusted by it to a Committee.

Composition

(2) Each Standing Committee shall comprise four Councillors one of whom may be the Mayor.

Terms of Appointment

(3) Subject to Clause 122 hereof, the members of each Standing Committee shall be appointed for each year, at the first meeting of the Council held after the annual election and shall hold office until after the first Saturday in May each year.

Committee Members may be Changed

122. The Council may, by resolution carried pursuant to a notice of motion, by a simple majority, or on a motion moved without notice, by an absolute majority, change the membership of any committee or appoint substitutes for Councillors absent pursuant to leave granted by the Council.

123. Meetings of Committees shall not be open to the public except where a Committee by resolution decides otherwise.

Duties of Standing Committees

124. The duties of the Standing Committees shall be such as the Council from time to time prescribes and shall be recorded in the Policy Manual of Council.

DIVISION 2—OCCASIONAL COMMITTEES

125. (1) The Council may appoint Occasional Committees to perform any duties which may lawfully be entrusted by it to a committee.

(2) The number of members of an Occasional Committee shall be less than one half of the total number of members of the Council.

(3) A Standing Committee shall not interfere in any matter which has for the time being been entrusted to an Occasional Committee.

(4) An Occasional Committee shall not be appointed except on a motion setting out—

(a) the duties proposed to be entrusted to such Committee; and

(b) either—

(i) the names of the Councillors of whom it is intended to constitute the Committee; or

(ii) the number of Councillors intended to constitute the Committee and a provision that they be elected by a separate motion; or

(iii) the number of Councillors required to make up a quorum.

DIVISION 3 —GENERAL**Calling Committee Meetings**

126. The Clerk shall call an ordinary meeting of any committee when requested so to do by the Mayor or the Chairman or any two members of that committee and shall give notice of the meeting as provided by Clause 6 hereof.

Conduct of Committees

127. The Standing Orders shall apply to Committees except those clauses listed in Schedule I of this by-law.

Quorum of Committees

128. (1) At any meeting of a committee, a quorum shall consist of not less than three members.

(2) Every meeting shall proceed to business as soon after the time stated in the summons as a quorum is constituted; but if a quorum is lacking fifteen minutes after the appointed time of the meeting, the meeting shall lapse.

Minutes of Committees

129. (1) Each Standing Committee shall record minutes of all its proceedings and transactions.

(2) The minutes of each meeting shall be confirmed at the next meeting of the committee and shall be signed and dated by the Chairman on each page thereof.

Minutes Shall be Report

130. Subject to Clause 19, the Clerk shall keep a Minute Book, in which shall be entered the minutes of all committees and Council meetings. The minutes of each committee shall be deemed to be the report of the committee to Council.

Resignation of Seat on Committee

131. Any member of a committee may resign his seat on the committee by notice in writing signed by him and addressed to the Clerk and when delivered to the Clerk, his seat on the committee shall become vacant. Council may from time to time fill a vacancy on a committee.

PART VIII—MISCELLANEOUS**Common Seal**

132. The Town Clerk shall be responsible for the care and custody of the Common Seal. The Mayor and Town Clerk or the person or persons for the time being acting in such capacity, shall execute documents in accordance with Section 189 of the Act and a list of all documents so executed be reported to the Finance Committee on a monthly basis.

Representation on Public Bodies

133. Whenever it becomes necessary to appoint a Councillor to represent the Council on a public body or a State instrumentality, notice of the necessity to make that appointment shall if time permits be given at the meeting of the Council immediately preceding the meeting at which it is intended to make the appointment.

Regulation Governing Admission of Public

134. Any member of the public attending a meeting of the Council shall be seated in the public gallery, unless invited to occupy some other position by the Mayor.

Meetings of Ratepayers and Electors

135. The Standing Orders shall so far as practicable apply to meetings of ratepayers and electors except for the following—

- (1) No person shall vote at a meeting of ratepayers or electors unless his name is on the current Electoral Roll.
- (2) Subject to the Act the Mayor shall preside at meetings.
- (3) The Mayor may require questions to be submitted in writing.
- (4) All questions if answered at the meeting shall be answered by the Mayor or with the permission of the Mayor by a Councillor or an Officer of the Council.
- (5) If any question cannot readily be answered at the meeting the answer shall be given in writing by the Council as soon as reasonably practicable thereafter.
- (6) If required by the Mayor the mover of a motion shall submit the motion in writing.
- (7) The Mayor may close a meeting when the Mayor decides to do so.
- (8) Subject to the Act and to this by-law the conduct of a meeting of ratepayers or electors shall be at the sole discretion of the Mayor.

Enforcement of Standing Orders

136. The Mayor is authorised and required to enforce the Standing Orders.

137. Any person who commits an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction of a penalty not exceeding \$500.

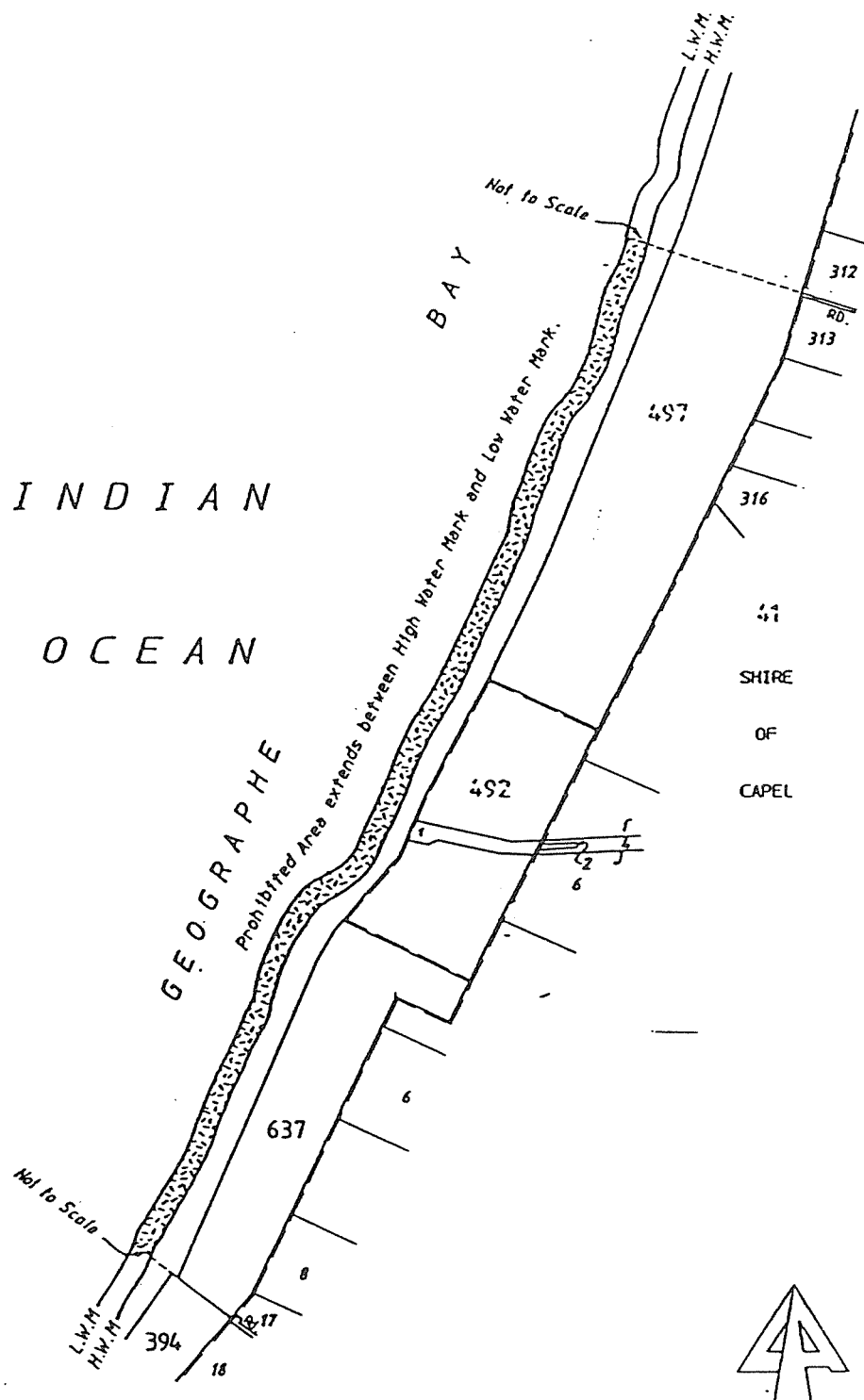

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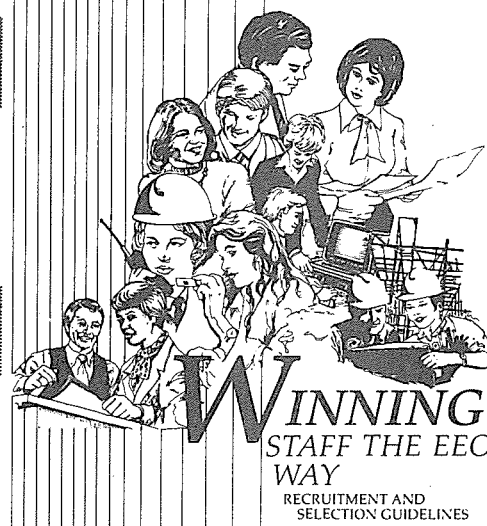
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
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
