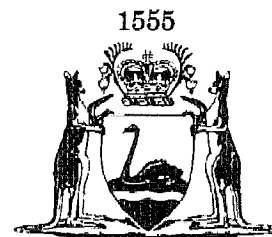

SANDALWOOD (LIMITATION OF REMOVAL OF SANDALWOOD)
ORDER 1992

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under section 2.

Citation

1. This order may be cited as the *Sandalwood (Limitation of removal of sandalwood) Order 1992*.

Limitation

2. The quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period commencing on 1 January 1992 and ending on 30 June 1992 is limited to a total of 977 tonnes.

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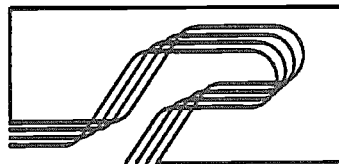
