RADIATION SAFETY ACT 1975

RADIATION SAFETY (TRANSPORT OF RADIOACTIVE SUBSTANCES) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1992

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Radiation Safety (Transport of Radioactive Substances) Amendment Regulations 1992.

Principal regulations

- 2. In these regulations the Radiation Safety (Transport of Radioactive Substances) Regulations 1991* are referred to as the principal regulations.

Regulation 7 amended

- 3. Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is amended
 - (a) by deleting "Subject to the International Regulations," and substituting the following
 - (1) Subject to the International Regulations and to subregulation (2),

and

- (b) by inserting after subregulation (1), the following subregulation
 - (2) Where a vehicle with less than 2 tonne tare weight is carrying only packages of Type A, as defined in paragraph 134 (c) of the Code, the carrier shall ensure that the vehicle bears 4 placards of the type described in paragraph 443 of the International Regulations, but with minimum dimensions of 150 mm by 150 mm.

Regulation 8 amended

- 4. Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is amended -
 - (a) by deleting "Subject to the International Regulations," and substituting the following
 - " (1) Subject to the International Regulations and to subregulation (2),

and

- (b) by inserting after subregulation (1) the following subregulation
 - (2) A consignor complies with International Regulation, paragraph 443, if the requirements of regulation 7 (2) of these regulations are complied with in relation to a vehicle with less than 2 tonne tare weight, carrying Type A packages.




