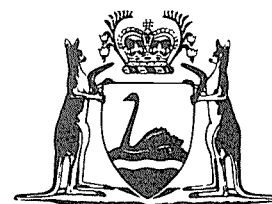

MINES REGULATION ACT 1946**MINES REGULATION (EXEMPTION) ORDER (No. 8) 1992**

Made by Lieutenant Governor and Deputy of the Governor in Executive Council under section 5 (2).

Citation

1. This order may be cited as the *Mines Regulation (Exemption) Order (No. 8) 1992*.

Exemption

2. The Darlot Gold Project (in this order referred to as "the mine") located approximately 110 kms north of Leonora and managed by Sundowner Minerals NL is hereby exempted from the provisions of section 38 (1) (c) of the *Mines Regulation Act 1946* for a period ending on 31 March 1993 on condition that—

- (a) a person shall not be employed to work in or about the mine for more than 14 consecutive days;
- (b) where a person is employed to work in or about the mine for a period of 14 consecutive days, the person shall not be employed again to work in or about the mine until that person has taken a break of not less than 7 consecutive days; and
- (c) a person shall not be employed to work in or about the mine for more than 12 consecutive hours in any shift other than to deal with an emergency causing, or threatening to cause, a hazard or danger to the health or safety of any person in or about the mine.

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
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
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
