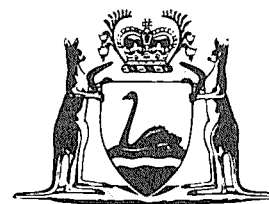

Notice to all owners and/or occupiers of land in the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River.

With reference to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this order.

RURAL AREAS:

This work must be carried out by 22nd December 1992, and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 12th April 1993.

TOWNSITES:

This work must be carried out by 1st December 1992, and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 12th April 1993.

An inspection of firebreaks and hazard removal will be carried out in all areas of the Shire by an authorised officer (Townsites, after 1st December 1992; Rural after 22nd December 1992).

The Penalty for non-compliance with this notice is a maximum fine of \$1 000, and notwithstanding prosecution, Councils may enter on the land and carry out required works at the owner/occupier's expense.

A. RURAL LAND:

1. A firebreak not less than 2 metres wide must be constructed inside and within 100 metres of the boundary of each property where the boundary is adjacent to or adjoins a construction or used surveyed road. (Firebreaks constructed on road verges do not constitute a legal firebreak under Bush Fires Act and Council approval is required prior to construction of additional firebreaks on roadside verges.)

2. A firebreak not less than 2 metres wide must be constructed within a perimeter of 20 metres of all homesteads, buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas on the land.

3. Where uncleared land abuts a boundary, a firebreak not less than 2 metres wide must be constructed inside and within 100 metres of such boundaries.

B. SPECIAL RURAL LAND:

1. The owners of all existing small rural holdings zoned special rural as Special Rural in Town Planning Schemes must construct a firebreak not less than 2 metres wide, immediately inside all boundaries.

2. A firebreak not less than 2 metres wide must be constructed within a perimeter of 20 metres of all homesteads, buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas on the land.

3. Ungrazed pasture land can constitute a fire hazard and orders will be issued under section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, if the hazard is not abated.

C. PRIVATE HARDWOOD/SOFTWOOD PLANTATIONS:

Any area planted pines or eucalyptus species exceeding five (5) hectares but not exceeding fifteen (15) hectares.

1. Firebreaks not less than two (2) metres wide around the perimeter of land on which plantation is established.

2. Firebreaks not less than ten (10) metres wide, two (2) metres of which must be cleared of all flammable material, on the boundary. The remaining eight (8) metres must be maintained in a low fuel condition, that is, short grass may be considered "low fuel", where the plantation is adjacent to or adjoins a constructed, used surveyed road or enjoys a common boundary.

Plantations exceeding fifteen (15) hectares to comply with the Bush Fires Board recommendation.

D. TOWNSITES—GRACETOWN AND PREVELLY PARK

In respect of land owned or occupied within these townsites or any area subdivided for other purposes, you shall:

1. Remove all flammable material (including ground fuel built-up) on the whole of the land except living standing trees, or
2. Construct a firebreak of not less than 1.5 metres wide immediately inside both side and rear boundaries, together with a firebreak not less than 3 metres in width around all buildings on the land. All fuel residue material from firebreaks that are constructed to be removed from the block.

E. ALL OTHER TOWNSITES (including Molloy Island)

In respect of land owned or occupied by you within any townsite or any area subdivided for other purposes, you shall:

1. Where the area of land is up to and including 4 000 sq.m., remove all flammable material on the land except living standing trees, from the whole of the land, and
2. Where the area of land exceeds 4 000 sq.m., clear of flammable materials, firebreaks of at least 2 metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.

F. FUEL AND/OR GAS DEPOTS

In respect of land owned or occupied by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquids or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or support is constructed, you shall have the land clear of all flammable materials.

If it is considered impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove flammable materials from the land as required by the Notice, you may make written application to the Council not later than the 15th day of November 1992, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. This application must be countersigned by the Bush Fire Control Officer for the area in which the land is situated to signify his agreement to the variation. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO LAND OWNERS AND OCCUPIERS

The Council forwards a copy of this Firebreak Order each year. The Notice is also published in the Margaret River Mail and copies are available at the office counter.

This work **MUST** be carried out by 1st December, 1992 and kept maintained throughout the summer months until 31st March, 1993.

An inspection of firebreaks and hazard removal will be carried out in all areas of the Shire by an Authorised Officer.

Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of this order may be issued with an Infringement Notice (Penalty \$80) or prosecuted with an increased penalty, and additionally, council may carry out the required work at cost to the owner or occupier.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks or remove flammable materials as required by this notice or if natural features render firebreaks unnecessary, you may apply to the council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 15th day of November, 1992, for

permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act.

1. Rural Land:

- (a) On land which is divided by or abuts a formed or partly formed road or railway reserve, a firebreak not less than 2 metres wide shall be provided within 60 metres of the boundary of the road or railway reserve. Breaks are not permitted on road reserves without Council approval.
- (b) A firebreak 2 metres wide shall be provided immediately surrounding and within 20 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas situated on the land. Haystack means any collection of hay including fodder rolls placed or stacked together.
- (c) A cleared area of at least a 6 metre radius shall be provided around all combustion pumping engines.

2. Eucalyptus and Pine Plantations:

- (a) Firebreaks not less than 10 metres in width around the perimeter of land on which trees are planted.
- (b) Not less than 10 metres in width along those portions of plantations which enjoy a common boundary with a road reserve.
- (c) Not less than 6 metres in width in such positions that no part or compartment of a plantation shall exceed 28 ha in area.
- (d) Where 10 metre breaks are required in accordance with this section of Council's Fire Break Order, pruning of overhang shall be carried out up to a height of five (5) metres above the firebreak (Ground Level).
- (e) In addition to the breaks specified, plantations traversed by SEC power transmission lines have additional obligations under the Electricity Act.

3. Townsites Land: (Includes Residential, Commercial and Industrial Land).

Townsites: Donnybrook, Balingup, Kirup, Mullalyup, Newlands, Preston and Noggerup.

- (a) Where the area of land is 2 024 sqm (approx 1/2 acre) or less, remove all flammable material on the land except living trees, shrubs and plants from the whole of the land, and
- (b) Where the area of land exceeds 2 024 sqm (approx 1/2 acre) clear firebreaks at least two metres wide, immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land.
- (c) The Council, on the recommendation of a Bush Fire Control Officer, may vary these conditions in certain circumstances.

4. Special Rural and Special Residential Land

The owners of all existing small rural holdings zoned as "Special Rural" or "Special Residential" under Town Planning Schemes, must maintain free of all flammable material a firebreak not less than 2 metres in width immediately inside all external boundaries of the land, and a 20 metre wide fuel free zone around all buildings on the land.

5. Fuel and/or Gas Depot

In respect of land owned by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquids or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or support is constructed, you shall have the land clear of all flammable materials.

7. Welding, Cutting and Grinding Equipment

Persons shall not operate welding, cutting or grinding apparatus of any kind during the Prohibited Burning Times on land which is under crop, pasture or stubble unless at least one fire extinguisher is provided and there is compliance with any other fire controls required by the Fire Control Officer.

 5. Within 100 metres of the perimeter of all buildings, bulk and drum fuel deposits and haystacks on the land so as to completely surround the building, fuel deposit and haystack and;
 6. Prepare firebreaks of not less than twenty metres wide around the perimeter of any scrub or timber which has been logged, chained or otherwise prepared for burning.
- (B) TOWNSITE LAND (i.e. land within any townsite)
1. Clear of all flammable material the whole of the area where—
 - (i) The area of land is 2 024 square metres ($\frac{1}{2}$ acre) or less or;
 - (ii) The land is used for the storage of inflammable liquids, or;
 - (iii) There is a hotel or tavern situated thereon.
 2. If the area of land exceeds 2 024 square metres ($\frac{1}{2}$ acre) clear of all inflammable material firebreaks of at least 2 metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of land and also immediately surrounding all buildings or haystack situated on the land.

All firebreaks required by the foregoing must be prepared in—

ZONE 2—On or before 30 September 1992 and thereafter maintained clear of all inflammable material until 15 March 1993.

ZONE 4—On or before 21 October 1992 and thereafter maintained clear of all inflammable material until 29 March 1993.

If it is considered impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks in the position required by this notice, the approval of the Council or its duly authorised Officer must be obtained to provide them in an alternative position.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine not exceeding \$400 and a person in default is liable whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the dates required by this notice.

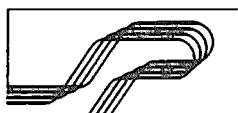
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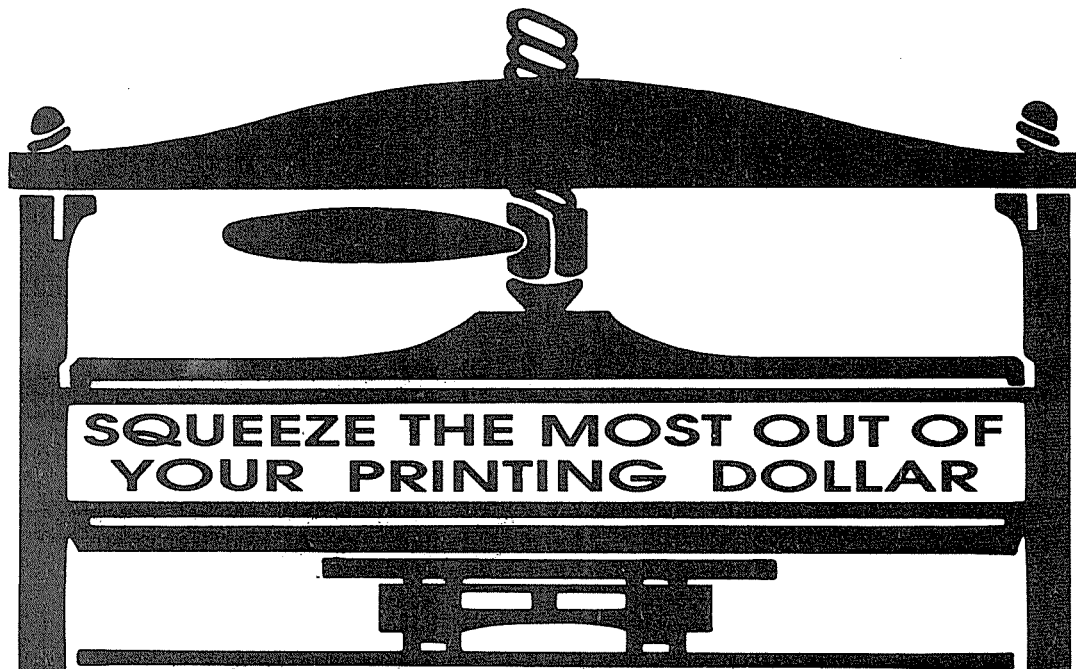
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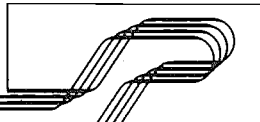
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This Standing Committee of the Legislative Council was established in late 1989 to consider and report on -


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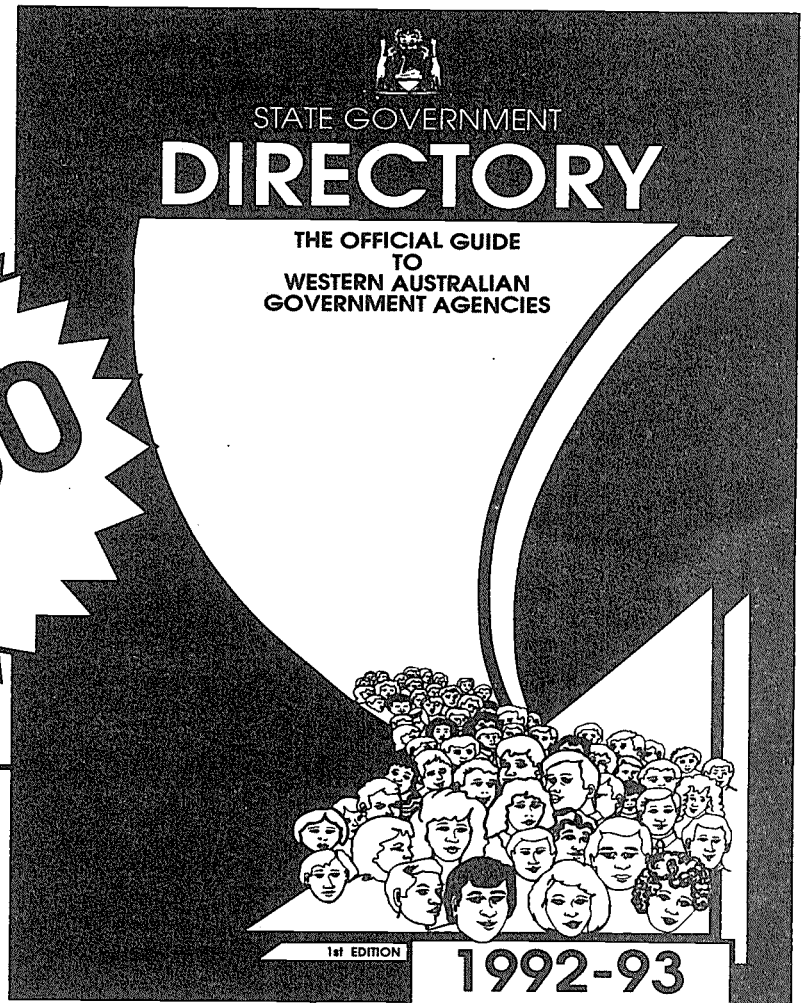
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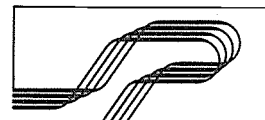
