TOBACCO CONTROL (EXEMPTION) NOTICE (No. 15) 1992

Made by the Minister for Health under section 14 after consultation with the Minister for Sport and Recreation.

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the Tobacco Control (Exemption) Notice (No. 15) 1992.

Exemption

- 2. (1) Subject to the conditions set out in clause 3, the Western Australian Cricket Association (Incorporated) and its agents and servants and all persons entitled to the use in Western Australia of Benson and Hedges trademarks and brand names and their agents and servants are exempted from the operation of sections 5 and 8 of the *Tobacco Control Act 1990* during the periods 1 October 1992 to 30 April 1993, 1 October 1993 to 30 April 1994, 1 October 1994 to 30 April 1995, and 1 October 1995 to 30 April 1996 in respect of signs, clothing and items (other than the items referred to in subclause (2)) that—
 - (a) are publicly displayed at the Western Australian Cricket Association ground at Nelson Crescent, East Perth ("the WACA ground") during cricket test matches, World Series Cricket matches and Sheffield Shield cricket matches held at the WACA ground; and
 - (b) promote, bear or contain Benson and Hedges trademarks or brand names.
- (2) All persons are exempted from the operation of sections 5 and 8 of the *Tobacco Control Act 1990* during the periods referred to in subclause (1) in respect of itinerary cards, official tour programs, media guides and commemorative ports and wines promoting, bearing or containing—
 - (a) Benson and Hedges trademarks or brand names; and
 - (b) except in the case of the commemorative ports and wines, details of cricket fixtures in Australia during the 1992/1993, 1993/1994, 1994/1995 and 1995/1996 cricket seasons.

Conditions

- 3. The conditions subject to which the exemption referred to in clause 2 (1) is granted are that—
 - (a) the signs, clothing and items referred to in clause 2 (1) shall be limited to—
 - (i) 4 perimeter signs, each not exceeding 22.496 metres in length and 0.914 metres in height;
 - (ii) one scoreboard sign not exceeding 10 metres in length and one metre in height;
 - (iii) one sign (other than a perimeter sign or a scoreboard sign) not exceeding 6 metres in length and 6 metres in height;
 - (iv) one drinks trolley;
 - (v) any number of flags;
 - (vi) 2 on-grass signs, each not exceeding 6 metres in length and 6 metres in height; and
 - (vii) clothing worn by the players during the cricket matches referred to in clause 2 (1) (a);
 - (b) all signs, clothing and items (other than a flag or an on-grass sign) shall display the health warning—
 - (i) "SMOKING CAUSES LUNG CANCER"; or
 - (ii) "SMOKING CAUSES HEART DISEASE",
 - together with the statement "Health Authority Warning";
 - (c) the area exclusively devoted to the display of the health warning referred to in paragraph (b) and the statement "Health Authority Warning" shall be not less than 25% of the area devoted to the display of the Benson and Hedges trademark or brand name;
 - (d) the health warning referred to in paragraph (b) shall—
 - (i) appear directly beneath the Benson and Hedges trademark or brand name and directly adjacent to the statement "Health Authority Warning";

- (ii) appear in white Helvetica Bold capitals on a black background; and
- (iii) occupy, together with the statement "Health Authority Warning", not less than 80% of the area exclusively devoted to the display of the health warning and statement;
- (e) the letters of the statement "Health Authority Warning" shall-
 - (i) appear in Helvetica Medium capitals and Helvetica Medium lower case type; and
 - (ii) not exceed half the height of the letters used for the health warning referred to in paragraph (b);

and

(f) all signs, clothing and items (including flags and on-grass signs) shall be removed from public display by 30 April 1993, 1994, 1995 and 1996 respectively.

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
