#### BUSH FIRES ACT 1954 SUSPENSION OF SECTION 25

Bush Fires Board, Perth.

Correspondence No. S128.1.

It is hereby notified that I, Graham Edwards administering the Bush Fires Act 1954, hereby revoke all previous orders under section 25B of the said Act with relation to the Westonia Rubbish Disposal Site situated on Reserve 15494 and 15981 and pursuant to the powers contained in section 25B of the said Act, approved the suspension of the operations of section 25 that relate to a fire to be lit or which is lit, for the purpose of destroying garden refuse or rubbish or any like purpose during the declared Prohibited and Restricted Burning Times on land set aside for the purpose in the Municipal District of the Shire of Westonia. This notice shall have effect until revoked and is issued subject to the following specified conditions:

Westonia Rubbish Disposal Site Situated on Reserve 15494 and 15981.

#### Specified Conditions

- 1. All dumping of rubbish to be confined to the area that Council have provided for the purpose and that a sign be maintained at the site to inform the public that dumping in any other area is prohibited.
- 2. A sign warning "Unauthorised Lighting of Fires Prohibited" to be erected and maintained in good condition at the site and be located at the main entry to the rubbish site.
- 3. Fires to be lit only by such persons as specifically authorised to do so by the Shire Clerk.
- 4. A wire mesh fence at least 2 metres in height is to surround the actual rubbish pit area and be maintained in sound condition throughout the period of suspension.
- 5. No fires to be lit on land subject to this suspension on a day for which the fire danger forecast as issued by the Bureau of Meteorology in Perth in respect of the locality is "Extreme" or "Very High".
- 6. A firebreak being at least 3 metres in width and running along and inside the fence mentioned in 4 above, is to installed prior to any fire being lit.
- 7. That all flammable material save standing trees for a radius of 20 metres of the site be burnt and removed before the first fire is lit.
- 8. The accumulated refuse to be burnt regularly between the hours of 4 pm and midnight of the same day. The fire is to be extinguished by midnight of the same day.
- 9. A fire fighting unit consisting of a tank with a minimum of 900 litres of water with 5kw motor 38 mm pump and 30 metres of 19 mm rubber hose mounted on a 4WD vehicle to be in attendance. Not less than two fire fighters to be on site whilst the burn is being carried out.
- 10. The area is not to be left unattended until the site is declared safe by the Shire Clerk of Officer so authorised.

#### RETAIL TRADING HOURS ACT 1987

PETROL ROSTER ORDER 1993

Made by the Minister for Consumer Affairs.

#### Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Petrol Roster Order 1993.

#### Commencement

This Order shall come into operation on 1 February 1993.

#### Petrol Roster

3. Shopkeepers of zoned filling stations specified in the Schedule shall be open during the days and times respectively specified in that Schedule for the sale of fuel and requisites.

#### Fuel and Requisites to be sold

- 4. All forms of fuel and the following requisites, namely—
  - (a) oil:
  - (b) lubricants;
  - (c) tyres;

- (d) batteries:
- (e) distilled water; and
- (f) such other requisites as the shopkeeper has in stock at the filling station, shall be sold by shopkeepers of the zoned filling stations specified in the Schedule during the days and times so specified.

#### Edith Cowan University Edith Cowan University Act 1984 Statute No. 25

Edith Cowan University Building Fund

The purpose of this Statute is to establish, and specify the objects, purpose and administration of the Edith Cowan University Building Fund.

#### 1. Definitions

- (a) Unless the contrary intention appears, words and expressions defined in the University's Interpretation Statute, Statute No. 1, shall have the same meaning where used in this Statute.
- (b) In this Statute unless the contrary intention appears-
  - "the Act" means the Edith Cowan University Act 1984 and any amendments thereto.
  - "Building Fund" means the Edith Cowan University Building Fund established by this Statute.
  - "Fund" and "Funds" means all property, both real and personal, from time to time held by the University on account of or for the Building Fund pursuant hereto and all investments representing such property or any part thereof and any income arising therefrom.

#### 2. The Building Fund

The Building Fund hereby constituted shall be known as the Edith Cowan University Building Fund.

#### 3. Objects

The objects of the Building Fund shall be to provide funds for the planning, construction, renovation, repairs and maintenance of University buildings, recreational facilities, University grounds and related purposes.

#### 4. The Fund

- (a) The Funds shall be kept apart in the accounts and records of the University from the other funds and property of the University and applied solely in accordance with the terms of this Statute.
- (b) Subject to subsection (a) the Funds shall be invested by the University in accordance with the Act.
- (c) Expenditure from the Building Fund shall be for the purpose of carrying out the objects of the Building Fund and shall be by resolution of Council.

#### 5. Donations

Donations to the Building Fund may be accepted from any source including (without limitation) the University, which donations may be made, by way of—

- (a) lumpsum donations;
- (b) donations in instalments;
- (c) interest from amounts deposited with the University or otherwise; and
- (d) donations or bequests of real or personal property or assets of any kind or by any other means whatsoever.

#### 6. Dissolution

- (a) The Council may resolve that the Building Fund be dissolved and the Building Fund shall be deemed to be dissolved on the repeal of this Statute.
- (b) In the event that the Building Fund is dissolved any moneys or assets then forming part of the Building Fund shall be disbursed by the Council in such manner it shall consider appropriate and consistent with the Act.

- 5.13.4 In addition to the Subdivsion Guide Plan, the Scheme provisions for a specific Rural Residential Zone shall stipulate—
- (a) The facilities which the purchasers of the lots will be required to provide (eg. their own potable water supply, liquid and solid waste disposal system, etc.);
- (b) Proposals for the control of land uses and development which will ensure that the purpose or intent of the zone and the rural environment and amenity are not impaired.
- 5.13.5 Development in the Rural Residential Zone shall comply with the following requirements—
- (a) In addition to a Building Licence, the Council's prior approval to commence development is required for all development including a private dwelling house and outbuildings;
- (b) Not more than one private dwelling house per lot shall be erected;
- (c) The Council may, by notice served upon individual landowners or upon a subdivider of land within this zone, require the preservation of specified vegetation and thereafter no landowner or subdivider shall cut, remove or otherwise destroy any vegetation so specified unless the Council rescinds the notice or order;
- (d) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Scheme and what may be shown in the Subdivision Guide Plan, the State Planning Commission may approve a minor variation to the subdivisional design but further breakdown of the lots so created shall be deemed to be contrary to the provisions of the Scheme. ".
- (vi) by renumbering clauses 5.13, 5.14 and 5.15 to 5.14, 5.15 and 5.16 respectively.
- (vii) by introducing a new Schedule VI after Schedule V as follows-

#### SCHEDULE VI

RURAL RESIDENTIAL ZONE—PROVISIONS FOR SPECIFIED AREAS Rural Residential Zone No. 1— Point Henry Peninsula Lots 206, 127 and 116 Provisions

1.0 Subdivision Guide Plan

Subdivision of Rural Residential Zone No. 1 is to be generally in accordance with the plan entitled "Subdivision Guide Plan—Rural Residential Zone No. 1", as signed by the Shire Clerk.

- 2.0 Minimum Lot Size and Setbacks
  - 2.1 Minimum lot sizes shall be as shown on the plan entitled "Subdivision Guide Plan—Rural Residential Zone No. 1."
  - 2.2 Minimum setbacks for building envelopes shall be 20 metres from road frontages and 15 metres from all other boundaries.
- 3.0 Objective

The objective of Rural Residential Zone No. 1 is to create rural-residential retreats in a coastal area with emphasis on minimising impact on the landscape and natural vegetation. Foreground views visible from Point Henry Road, roads to the beaches and visually significant areas including Tooleburrup Hill and the coastline generally are to be particularly protected.

- 4.0 Keeping of Stock and Intensive Agriculture
  - 4.1 The keeping of stock animals shall not be permitted.
  - 4.2 Intensive agricultural pursuits shall not be permitted.
  - 4.3 The keeping of horse(s) shall not be permitted.
- 5.0 Building Envelopes
  - 5.1 All buildings on a lot shall be erected within the Building Envelope defined on the Subdivision Guide Plan. Notwithstanding this requirement—
    - (a) Council may permit a variation of the Building Envelope if it is shown to the satisfaction of Council that the proposed location of the Building Envelope will not be detrimental to the landscape or the environment;
    - (b) Building Envelopes as shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan shall be delineated on site by landowners and approved by Council prior to the commencement of any clearing whatsoever, and Council may require an alternative Building Envelope if it considers the Envelope delineated would be detrimental to the landscape or environment.
  - 5.2 Building Envelopes shall satisfy the following requirements-
    - (a) Building Envelopes shall not exceed ten per cent (10%) of the lot area, or 3 000 sq.m., whichever is the lesser;
    - (b) Building Envelopes shall be located having regard for the suitability of the soil for effluent disposal, wind protection, and the objective to minimise erosion and the visual prominence of buildings;

(c) Building Envelopes on lots adjacent to Point Henry Road, the roads to the beaches and reserved land shall be located so that any building within the Envelope shall not be visually prominent when viewed form such roads or reserved land.

#### 6.0 Landscape Protection

- 6.1 Non reflective camouflage colours and materials which blend with the landscape to the satisfaction of Council shall be used on the external roofs and external walls of all buildings.
- 6.2 Driveways shall be located and constructed to the satisfaction of Council having regard for the objective to minimise soil erosion and the visibility of driveways.
- 6.3 Buildings shall not exceed three and a half metres (3.5 m) in height from natural ground level to the apex of the roof unless it can be shown to the satisfaction of Council that a higher building will not be visually obtrusive.

#### 7.0 Vegetation Preservation

- 7.1 Within each rural residential lot no indigenous trees or vegetation shall be felled or removed except where—
  - (a) the trees or vegetation are dead, diseased or dangerous;
  - (b) the vegetation is within an approved house site;
  - (c) the establishment of a firebreak is required under a regulation or by-law;
  - (d) a driveway is to be constructed in a location approved by Council.
- 7.2 Removal of indigenous trees or substantial vegetation for any purposes other than the above exceptions, shall require the written consent of Council and as a condition of granting consent, Council may require the planting and maintenance, for a period of at least 3 years, of endemic native trees and shrubs of species and in locations approved by Council.
- 7.3 Parkland clearing is permitted within the Building Envelope provided that flammable material is controlled within 20 metres of all buildings.
- 7.4 Where vegetation is permitted to be felled or removed the ground shall be minimally disturbed so that soil erosion is avoided.

#### 8.0 Services

- 8.1 No dwelling shall be constructed or approved for construction unless water storage tank(s) of minimum total capacity of 92 000 litres and an approved method of effluent disposal have been incorporated into the approved plans.
- 8.2 No dwelling shall be occupied unless water storage tank(s) of minimum total capacity of 92 000 litres and an approved method of effluent disposal have been installed and are operating.
- 8.3 Water supply and effluent disposal for each lot are the responsibility of the lot purchaser(s).
- 8.4 Water supply tanks and effluent disposal systems shall be located within the Building Envelope. Guidelines for water storage relating to tank size and area of roof catchment are available.

#### 9.0 Signs

- 9.1 Prior to subdivision the subdividing owner shall erect advisory sign(s) to the satisfaction of Council to inform future owners of the special conditions imposed on the land within Rural Residential Zone No. 1.
- 9.2 No signs shall be erected without Council's prior written consent except for a lot and home owner identification sign no larger than 0.1 sq.m. in area.

#### 10.0 Fences

Boundary fences shall not be erected.

#### 11.0 Fire Control

- 11.1 Strategic Fire Breaks as nominated on the Subdivision Guide Plan, shall be provided as a condition of subdivision and constructed to a standard approved by the Council and Bush Fires Board.
- 11.2 Where a lot is traversed by a Strategic Fire Break shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan, the owner(s) of the lot shall be responsible for maintaining such firebreak to the satisfaction of the Council.
- 11.3 To maintain access for fire fighting purposes a well maintained access track and sufficient clearing around all building structures shall be required by Council.
- 11.4 Clearing of firebreaks along fencelines other than for Strategic Fire Breaks will not be permitted unless for safety reasons to comply with Council and Bush Fires Board requirements.

- 11.5 It is the responsibility of the lot owner to ensure that all buildings are constructed of materials that are relatively fire resistant.
- 11.6 Council will require all subdividing landowners to contribute to a special fund which will be administered by Council and solely used for the construction of the 25 000 litre standpipe facilities and fire fighting equipment which will be provided as a condition of subdivision approval. Either the northern or southern facility shall be provided as part of the first stage of subdivision. The remaining facility is to be provided at a subsequent stage as determined by the Council in consultation with the Bush Fires Board.
- 11.7 Council will thereafter require all owners of a lot to annually contribute to the special fund which will be administered by Council and used for the maintenance of the standpipe facilities and fire fighting equipment.

#### 12.0 Staging Provisions

- 12.1 Within each landowners holdings, subdivision will be staged.
- 12.2 Each stage, within each landowners holdings, shall consist of not more than 25 lots and subsequent stages will not be approved until at least 50% of the lots of the previous stage have been sold to individual landowners. ".
