FISHERIES ACT 1905**KIMBERLEY TRAP FISHERY NOTICE 1993**

Notice No. 607

FD 25/91.

Made by the Minister under sections 9 and 10.

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the *Kimberley Trap Fishery Notice 1993*.

Interpretation

2. In this notice unless the contrary intention appears—

“authorised boat” means a boat licensed under Regulation 2 of the *Fisheries Regulations 1938** and that licence is endorsed to permit the boat to be used to take fish by means of traps in the Fishery;

“fish” means all species of fish excluding crustaceans;

“Fishery” means the taking of fish by means of traps in the waters described in the Schedule;

“pull” in relation to a trap has the meaning it has acquired by usage, namely to bring a trap from the seabed to the surface of the sea;

“set” in relation to a trap means to set, position, release, leave or allow to remain in the waters of the Fishery with or without bait;

“surface float” means a float that has a diameter of not less than 150 millimetres that is marked with legible characters not less than 6 centimetres high and 1 centimetre wide showing the initial letter and the distinguishing number allotted in respect of the licensed fishing boat under subregulation (4) of Regulation 2 of the *Fisheries Regulations 1938**;

“trap” means any device used for the taking of fish other than hook and line, trawl net, gillnet, haulnet, purse seine net or pointed instrument.

Authorised persons

3. A person who is the holder of a professional fisherman’s licence issued under Regulation 3 of the *Fisheries Regulations 1938** operating from an authorised boat may take or attempt to take fish by means of traps in the Fishery.

Permitted means of operating in the Fishery

4. A person operating in the Fishery from an authorised boat—
 - (a) may use, carry, set or pull a maximum of 20 traps from that boat;
 - (b) shall attach a surface float to each trap; and
 - (c) shall not pull any trap which—
 - (i) does not have a surface float attached; or
 - (ii) has a surface float attached which is not marked with the distinguishing number of that boat.

Determination of position by reference to the Australian Geodetic Datum

5. (1) Where, for the purpose of this notice it is necessary to determine a position on the surface of the Earth by geographical coordinates, that position shall be determined on the Australian Geodetic Datum which is defined by an ellipsoid having a semi-major axis (equatorial radius) of 6 378 160 metres and a flattening of 1/298.25 and fixed by the position of the origin being the Johnston Geodetic Station in the Northern Territory of Australia.

(2) The Johnston Geodetic Station referred to in subclause (1) shall be taken to be situated at 25°56'54.5515" south latitude and at 133°12'30.0771" east longitude and to have a ground level elevation of 571.2 metres above the ellipsoid referred to in that subclause.

All Western Australian waters off the north coast of Western Australia east of 120° east longitude.

4. Shall comply with the requirements of any Town Planning Scheme or Interim Development Order gazetted under the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act 1928 (amended) or the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act 1959 (amended).
5. Shall be registered as an export establishment pursuant to the provisions of the Parliament of the Commonwealth Export Control Act 1982, and orders made thereunder, more specifically the Prescribed Goods (General) Orders and the Fish Orders, should you wish to process fish for export.
6. Shall not be used for the processing of marron (*Cherax tenuimanus*) unless a licence is held under section 39C of the Fisheries Act 1905.
7. Live koonacs and/or yabbies shall not be purchased from any person other than a person authorised under Part V of the Fisheries Act 1905.
8. Shall not be used to process koonacs and/or yabbies other than by cleaning and packing whole.
9. Shall not consign package koonacs or yabbies unless each container is marked with the species it contains, the place of packaging and the destination of the consignment.

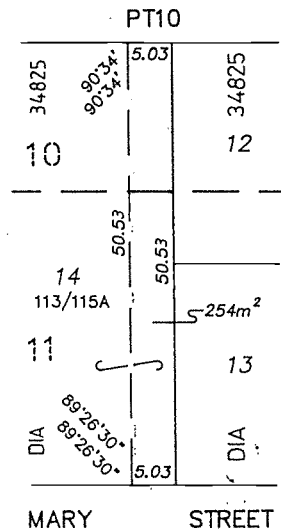

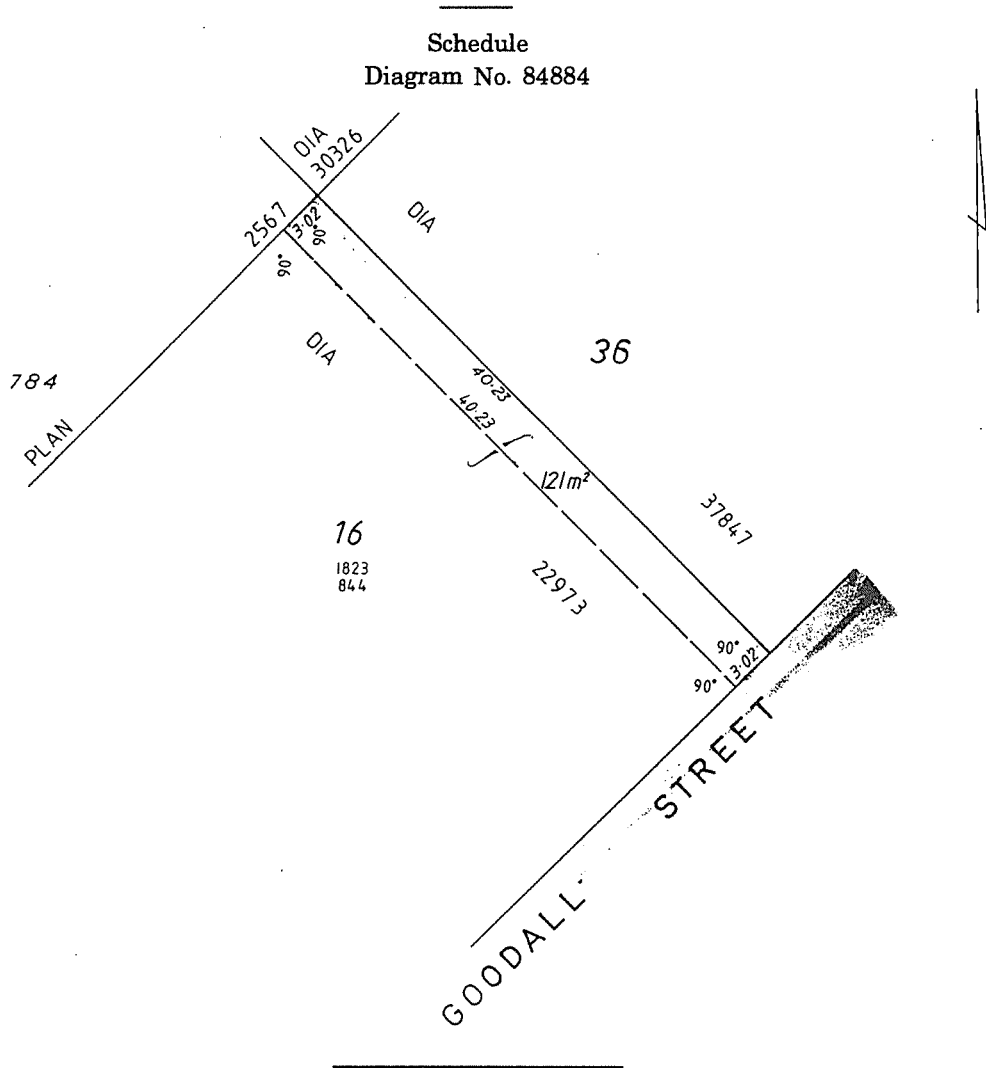

Penalty

A penalty of 10 per cent will be applied in respect of rates if the amount was due and payable on or before 31 October 1993 and the amount is in arrears on—

- (1) The 31st January 1994; or
- (2) The expiration of a period of three months from the date of service of the notice in the current financial year; whichever is the relevant date.

Rubbish Service Charges

(a) Annual rubbish charge—

LG701**BUSH FIRES ACT 1954***Shire of Waroona*

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of Land

Pursuant to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954 you are hereby required to carry out fire prevention work on land owned or occupied by you in accordance with the provisions of this order. This work must be carried out on or before 30th November 1993 and kept maintained throughout the summer months until the close of Restricted Burning Period 1994.

An inspection of firebreaks and hazard removal will be carried out in all areas of the Shire by authorised Officers on or after 30th November 1993. Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of this order may be issued with an infringement notice (Penalty \$40) or prosecuted with an increased penalty, and, additionally, Council may carry out required work at cost to the owner occupier.

A. Rural Land

Firebreaks not less than two (2) metres wide must be provided in the following positions—

- (a) within 60 metres inside and along the boundaries of all land including that which is uncleared, so as to form a continuous break around the holding.

(NOTE: Firebreaks constructed on road verges do not constitute a legal firebreak.)

- (b) Not more than 100 metres and not less than 20 metres from the perimeter of all groups of buildings, haystacks and fuel installations provided on that land.

NOTE 1: 10 round bales constitute a haystack; 5 large oblong bales constitute a haystack; 200 small oblong bales constitute a haystack.

NOTE 2: Irrigation Area owners or occupiers may be exempt from all or part of the requirements of the above if, in the opinion of the Fire Control Officer responsible for the area in which the land is located, there is no need to construct breaks on the irrigated land or non-irrigated land, not exceeding 20 hectares in area if surrounded by irrigated land.

B. Rural/Residential Land

The owners of all existing small rural holdings zoned "Rural/Residential" under Town Planning Schemes, must maintain clear of all flammable materials, a firebreak not less than two (2) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land.

C. Urban Land (Residential, Commercial, Industrial and Rural land within Waroona/Hamel Townsites)

In respect of land owned or occupied by you within the above townsites or any area subdivided for other purposes, you shall—

- (a) where the area of land is 2 024 sq m (approx. 1/2 acre) or less, remove all flammable material on the land except living standing trees, from the whole of the land; and
- (b) where the area of land exceeds 2 024 sq m (approx. 1/2 acre) provide firebreaks of at least two (2) metres wide immediately inside all external boundaries of the land and also immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land. Where several adjoining lots are held or used by the owner/occupier, the firebreaks may be provided inside, along the external boundaries of the group of lots.

D. Preston Beach Townsite

Owners and occupiers of plots within Preston Beach townsite are required to reduce fire hazards by means of slashing vegetation.

E. Fuel and/or Gas Depots

In respect of land owned or occupied by you on which is situated any container normally used to contain liquid or gas fuel, including the land on which any ramp or supports are constructed, you shall maintain the land clear of all flammable materials.

F. Fire Protection of Private Hardwood/Softwood Plantations

Definitions and Specifications

Plantation—

Any area of planted Pines or Eucalyptus species exceeding 3 ha.

Windbreaks—

Will be defined as planted areas not exceeding 15 metres in depth within an unrestricted length.

Firebreaks—15 metres Boundary Break—

The first row of trees must be at least 15 metres from the outside edge of the break.

The outer 10 metres of the firebreak must be cleared of all flammable material on the ground, and will have a 10 metre vertical clearance, i.e., with no overhanging branches. The remaining 5 metres must be maintained in a low fuel condition, i.e., short grass may be considered a low fuel.

Minimum Firebreak Standards—

The following firebreak standards will apply for plantations—

- * Firebreaks constructed 15 metres wide (as per definition) on the boundaries of plantations or on such other location as may be agreed between the Waroona Shire Council and the plantation owner.
- * Firebreaks clear of all flammable material 6 metres wide should surround compartments of approximately 30 hectares.

- * All firebreaks must be maintained in trafficable condition and trees on both sides of breaks progressively pruned to a minimum height of 4 metres to allow unrestricted access of maintenance and fire fighting equipment and so as to maintain an effective width of firebreak.
- * Where power lines pass through plantation areas firebreaks as per SEC specifications must be provided.

G. General Provisions

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks as required by this notice or natural features render firebreaks unnecessary you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer not later than the 1st day of November 1993 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions (strategic breaks) or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by the Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act. Burning is permitted on Sundays and Public Holidays, at the discretion of relevant fire control officers.

Prohibited Burning Times

The prohibited burning times for the Waroona District are—

- Zone 4—Irrigation Area—December 22 to February 14 (inclusive).
- Zone 6—(a) Coastal Area—December 15 to February 28 (inclusive).
- (b) Central Area—December 15 to February 28 (inclusive).
- Zone 8—(a) Dry Sand Area—December 15 to March 14 (inclusive).
- (b) Hills Area—December 15 to March 14 (inclusive).

Fire Permits must be obtained from your relevant fire control officer for burning off during the following periods—

- Zone 4—November 9 to December 21
February 15 to March 29.
- Zone 6—November 2 to December 14
March 1 to April 12.
- Zone 8—November 2 to December 14
March 15 to April 26.

Prior to commencement of burn you are required to notify the Council Office of times, dates and location numbers.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

Shire of Mt Marshall

Firebreak Order 1993/94

Notice is hereby given that all owners and/or occupiers of land within the Shire of Mt Marshall must prepare firebreaks, complying with the following schedule, on or before 1 October 1993 for croplands and maintain such firebreaks in a condition unable to carry a fire until 15 March 1994.

1. Agriculture Lands

Breaks of not less than three (3) metres in width must be provided immediately within the property boundary or as close as possible. (A three [3] metre break is required for burning off in accordance with the Bush Fires Act).

2. Townsites

All townsites lots within the Shire of Mt Marshall shall be cleared of all debris of an inflammable nature and be maintained free of such material.

3. Fuel Ramps and Depots

All grass and similar inflammable material to be cleared from areas where drum ramps or bulk fuel are located and where drums, full or empty, are stored and such areas be maintained clear of grass and similar inflammable materials.

4. If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material from land as required by the notice you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions. If permission is not granted by Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

5. Failure to comply with this notice shall subject the offender to the penalties prescribed in the Bush Fires Act 1954.

6. If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such must be in accordance with the relevant provision of the Bush Fires Act 1954.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

Shire of Moora

1993/94 Fire Break Notice

1. FIRE BREAKS

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 23rd day of October, 1993 to plough, scarify, cultivate or otherwise clear and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material until the 26th day of March, 1994 in the following positions and of the following dimensions on the land owned or occupied by you.

2. RURAL LAND

Firebreaks must be provided not less than two metres in width inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the properties owned or occupied by you, where this is not practicable the firebreaks must be provided as near as possible to, and within, such boundaries with the exception that firebreaks can be modified or not required if after consultation with the Brigade Captain and neighbours it is decided that a natural barrier or man made structure will act as a firebreak.

3. FARM BUILDINGS AND UNATTENDED ELECTRIC MOTORS AND HAYSTACKS

Firebreaks at least three metres in width completely surrounding and not more than twenty metres from the perimeter of any building, group of buildings or haystacks. All inflammable material must be removed from an area two metres in width immediately surrounding the building. All inflammable material must be removed from an area three metres in width immediately surrounding an unattended electric motor site.

4. UNATTENDED FUEL OPERATED MOTORS

All inflammable material must be removed from an area three metres in width immediately surrounding an unattended fuel operated motor whether the motor is intended to be used or not.

5. TOWNSITES

On or before the 23rd October, 1993 all town lots within the townsites of Moora, Miling, Watheroo, Bindi Bindi, and Coomberdale are required to be treated as follows—

- (a) Where the area of land is less than 3 000 square metres remove all inflammable material from the whole of the land.
- (b) Where the area of land is 3 000 square metres or more a firebreak must be provided not less than two metres in width inside and along the whole of the external boundaries of the properties owned or occupied by you and all inflammable material must be cleared two metres distance from all buildings and/or haystacks situated on the land and maintained free of such material until 26th March 1994.

6. FUEL PUMPS (FUEL DEPOTS)

On or before the 23rd day of October 1993 all grass and similar material is to be cleared from such areas where drum ramps are located and where drums, full or empty, are stored and such areas are to be maintained clear of grass and similar inflammable material until the 26th day of March 1994.

7. INCINERATORS.

Residents of townsites throughout the Shire are reminded that incinerators for the burning of waste material should be of an approved type and be in good condition. Open drums etc. are not acceptable.

8. PENALTY

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of up to \$400.00 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work in this notice, if it is not carried out by the Owner or Occupier by the date required by this notice.

NOTE: Attention of landowners is drawn to the fact that this order allows for provision of firebreaks in situations other than immediately within property boundaries subject to approval. The Chief Fire Control Officer and Councillors appointed Fire Control Officers have been authorised to act for Council in this matter.

INFRINGEMENT NOTICES WILL BE ISSUED TO OWNERS OR OCCUPIERS WHERE NO OR INSUFFICIENT FIREBREAKS ARE PROVIDED.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN MARINE ACT 1982 RESTRICTED SPEED AREAS—ALL VESSELS

Department of Marine and Harbours,
Fremantle WA, 3 September 1993.

Acting pursuant to the powers conferred by section 67 of the Western Australian Marine Act 1982, the Department of Marine and Harbours by this notice revokes sub-paragraphs 6 (i), (ii) and (iii) of the notice published in the *Government Gazette* on 25 October 1991 relating to restricted speed areas for all vessels on the Blackwood River.

Provided that this revocation will apply only to official *bona fide* competitors, competing in the 1993 Blackwood 250 between the hours of 0900 and 1230 on Monday, 4 October 1993, and will not apply to normal traffic.

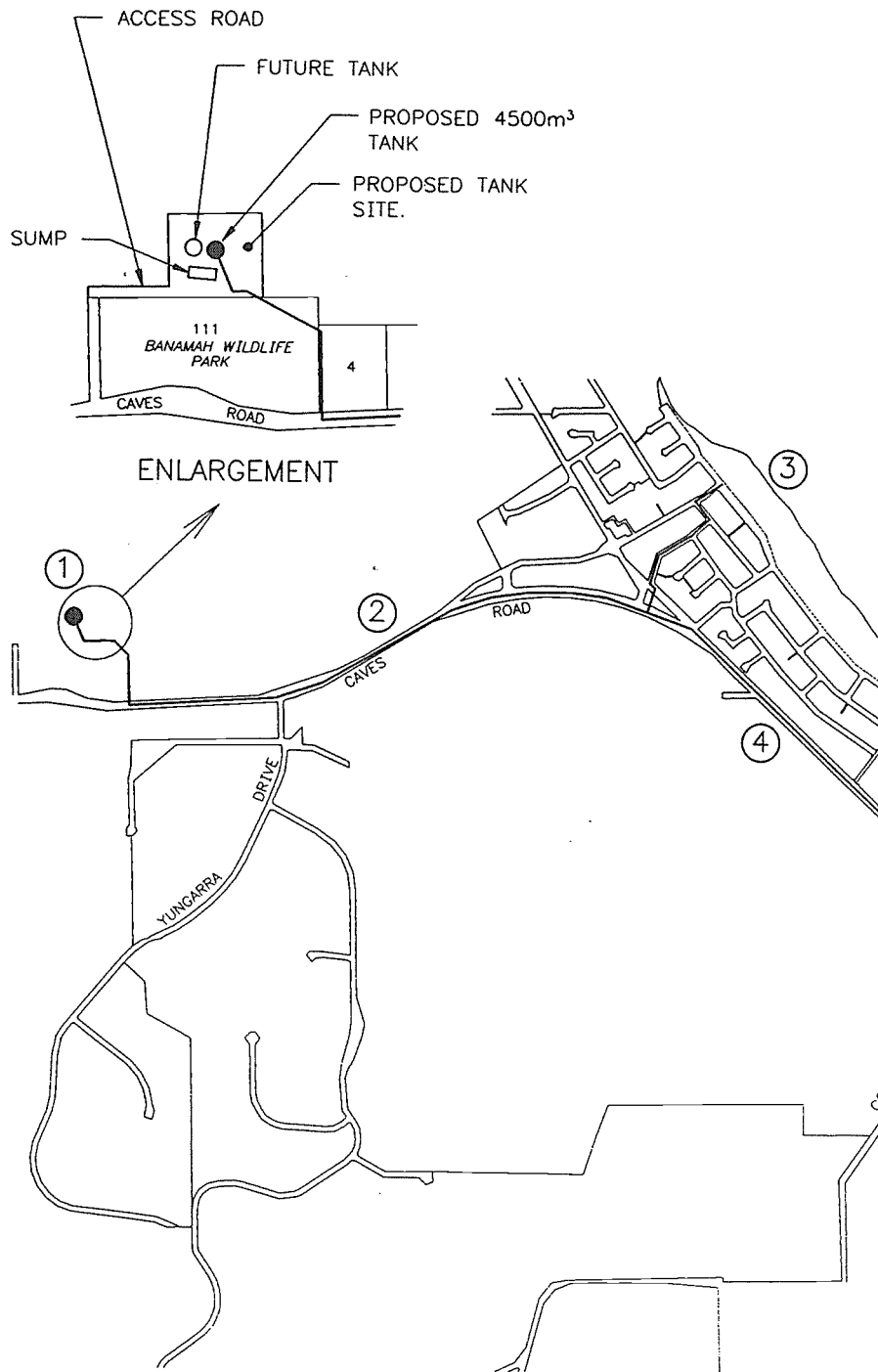

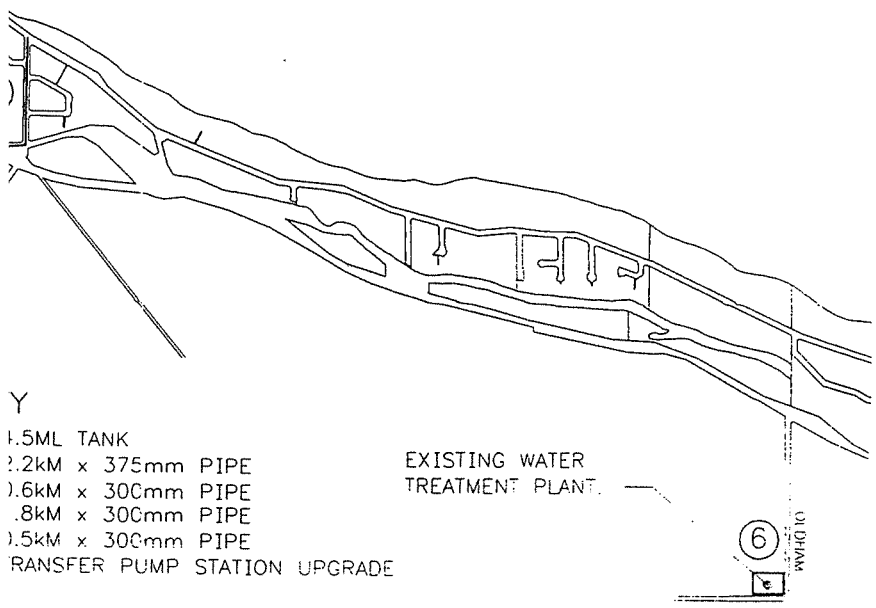

Delete existing Rule 108 (c) (iii) and insert 108 (c) (iii) which reads—

- (iii) not be issued to any person under the age of sixteen (16) years or to any person who has reached the age of sixty five (65) years provided that a Trainee Reinsperson's licence may be issued to any person who has reached the age of fifteen (15) years.

Delete existing Rule 498 (b) and insert 498 (b) which reads—

- (b) where a sample from a horse is found to contain a substance described in this Rule in excess of maximum quantity or ratio appearing opposite the substance then the horse shall be deemed to have had administered to it a drug or drug capable of producing that substance:

Substance	Maximum Quantity or Ratio
Arsenic	0.3 micrograms per millilitre total in urine.
Carbon Dioxide	35.0 millimoles of Total Carbon Dioxide per litre in plasma.
Cortisol	250 ng/ml in plasma, 1 000 ng/ml in urine.
Dimethyl Sulphoxide	15.0 micrograms per millilitre in urine or 1.0 micrograms per millilitre in plasma.
Nandrolone	Free and conjugated 5A estrane—3B, 17A—diol to 5 (10)—estrane—3B, 17A—diol in urine at a ratio of 1.
Theobromine	2.0 micrograms per millilitre in urine.

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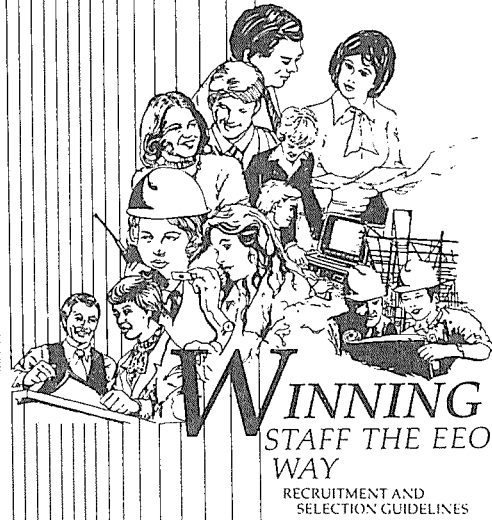
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
