BUSINESS NAMES ACT 1962

DIRECTION BY THE MINISTER FOR FAIR TRADING

I, Peter Gilbert Da Conceicao Foss, Minister for Fair Trading for the State of Western Australia, being the Minister for the time being administering the Business Names Act 1962, pursuant to the power conferred by section 9 of that Act direct that the Commissioner for Corporate Affairs shall not, except with the consent of the Minister for the time being administering the Business Names Act 1962, accept for registration any business name that—

1. (a) contains—

- (i) a word or an abbreviation of a word contained in an item in either column 1 or column 2 below and one or more words or abbreviations of words contained in column 3 below.
- (ii) the word "24th", "Twenty-Fourth" or "XXIVth" and the word "Olympic" or "Olympics" or "Games"; or
- (iii) the word "27th", "Twenty-Seventh" or "XXVIIth" and the word "Olympiad"; or
- (iv) the phrase "Share the Spirit"; or
- (v) The word "Sydney" and the number "2000" or the words "Two Thousand"; or
- (vi) the word "Gold" and the number "2000" or the words "Two Thousand"; or
- (vii) the word "Games" and the number "2000" or the words "Two Thousand"; or
- (viii) the phrase "Games City"; or
- (ix) the phrase "Summer Games"; or
- (x) the phrase "Sydney Games"; or
- (xi) the phrase "Millennium Games"; or
- (xii) the phrase "Gold Games".

- (b) contains a word or an abbreviation of a word contained in column 1 or column 2 which, in the context in which it is proposed to be used, suggests a connection with the Summer Games of the Twenty-Seventh Olympiad to be conducted under the auspices of the International Olympic Committee ("Sydney Olympic Games"), or the Paralympic Games to be held in Sydney in the year 2000 and conducted under the auspices of the International Paralympic Committee ("Sydney Paralympic Games"); or

- (c) in the context in which it is proposed to be used, otherwise suggests a connection with the Sydney Olympic Games or the Sydney Paralympic Games.

- (a) in relation to a name that suggests a connection with the Summer Games of the Twenty-Seventh Olympiad—the Sydney Organising Committee for the Olympic Games; or
- (b) in relation to a name that suggests a connection with the Paralympic Games to be held in Sydney in the year 2000—
 - (i) where the application is lodged prior to the registration of a company to be known as the Sydney Paralympic Organising Committee Limited—the Director-General of the Premier's Department of New South Wales; or
 - (ii) where the application is lodged after the incorporation of that company—the Sydney Paralympic Organising Committee Limited.

Upon receipt of a question the President may at his discretion accept or reject the question or determine that it requires research and be answered in writing subsequent to the meeting. The President may answer the question or nominate a member or officer to answer. No debate or discussion will be permitted on any question or answer.
 - 180.2 To facilitate question time the Agenda for the Ordinary Meeting will be made available to the public on the 2nd day prior to the meeting. ”

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960*The Municipality of the Shire of Northampton***By-Laws Relating to the Removal and Disposal of Obstructing Vehicles**

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 18 February 1994 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws.

1. These By-laws may be cited as the Shire of Northampton Removal and Disposal of Obstructing Vehicles By-laws.

2. In these By-laws:

“Act” means the Local Government Act 1960;

“appointed place” means a yard or other piece of land set aside as a place to which obstructing vehicles may be removed, pursuant to these By-laws;

“authorised person” means a person appointed by Council to seize vehicles pursuant to these By-laws;

“obstruction” means to impede or hinder in passing;

“public place” includes a street, way or place which the public are allowed to use, whether the street, way or place is or is not on private property.

3. A vehicle that is parked in any portion of a public place wherein vehicles may lawfully be parked is not obstructing for the purposes of these By-laws unless—

(a) the vehicle is so parked for any period exceeding twenty-four hours without the consent in writing of the Clerk of the Council; or

(b) the vehicle is so parked during any prohibited or restricted periods, if by any sign, the parking of vehicles is prohibited or restricted.

4. A vehicle which is parked in any portion of a public place wherein vehicles may not lawfully be parked is deemed to be causing an obstruction.

5. A person shall not park a vehicle in a public place so as to obstruct any portion of that place.

6. A person who parks a vehicle in a public place contrary to the provisions of by-law 5 of these By-laws commits an offence.

7. The Council may appoint a person as an authorised person for the purposes of these By-laws.

8. The Council may appoint a yard or other piece of land as a place to which vehicles may be removed pursuant to these By-laws and shall give notice in the *Gazette* and in a newspaper circulating in the district of the situation of any appointed place.

9. Where an authorised person or a member of the Police Force finds a vehicle parked in a public place contrary to the provisions of by-law 5 of these By-laws the authorised person or member of the Police Force may remove the vehicle therefrom and use such force as is necessary to enter the vehicle for the purpose of so removing it and shall thereupon place it in an appointed place.

10. Where an authorised person places a vehicle in an appointed place pursuant to by-law 9 of these By-laws the authorised person shall enter in a register to be provided by the Council for that purpose details of the time and date, a description of the vehicle and of the place from which it was removed and shall notify the Clerk of the Council.

11. The Clerk of the Council shall exhibit on the notice board of the Council a notification that a vehicle therein described has been placed in the appointed place and shall, unless the vehicle is sooner recovered, keep that notification exhibited for a period of not less than seven days.

12. (1) A person may recover a seized vehicle from an appointed place by paying to the Clerk of the Council:

(a) the cost incurred by the Council in removing the vehicle thereto;

(b) an impounding fee and, if applicable, a subsequent custody fee as shown in the First Schedule, and upon payment of that cost and fee, if the Clerk is satisfied that the person is the owner of the vehicle or is a person entitled to possession of the vehicle, shall permit that person to remove it.

(2) Every person who removes a vehicle from an appointed place without the authority of the Clerk commits an offence.

13. Where a vehicle, placed in an appointed place in accordance with the provisions of these By-laws, has not been recovered by the owner or person entitled thereto within one month from the day upon which it was there placed, the Council may cause the vehicle to be offered for sale by public auction or by public tender and thereupon accept the best offer made, and where no offer is made for the purchase of the vehicle the Council may cause it to be destroyed.

14. A person is not entitled to any claim by way of damages or otherwise against the authorised person, member of the Police Force, or the Council in respect of any vehicle seized and dealt with under the provisions of these By-laws or against any person who purchases a vehicle sold by Council under the provisions of by-law 13 of these By-laws.

15. (1) The proceeds of the sale of a vehicle under the provisions of by-law 13 of these By-laws shall be applied by the Council—

(a) firstly, in meeting the costs of the sale;

(b) secondly, in meeting the cost of the removal of the vehicle to the appointed place and fees under the provisions of by-law 12(1)(b) and those sums shall be paid into the Municipal Fund.

(2) Any surplus of the proceeds of the sale shall be paid by the Council into its Trust Fund and may be paid to any person who satisfies the Council that the person was the owner of the vehicle at the time of its sale by the Council.

(3) Any surplus of the proceeds of the sale may, if not paid to the owner within ten years, be paid into the Municipal Fund on condition that the Council shall repay it to a person claiming and establishing a right to the repayment.

16. Where the proceeds of the sale of any vehicle under the provisions of by-law 13 of these By-laws after deduction of the moneys authorised to be applied by the Council thereto by by-law 15 does not cover the costs of the removal, custody and disposal of that vehicle, the Council may recover the balance of these costs from the owner of that vehicle in a court of competent jurisdiction.

17. A person committing a breach of these By-laws is liable upon conviction in a court of law to a penalty not exceeding \$500.

First Schedule

1. Removal Fee under the provisions of By-law 12(1)(a), the cost incurred by Council in removing the obstructing vehicle.

2. Impounding Fee under the provisions of By-law 12(1)(b) of Twenty Dollars (\$20.00).

3. Custody Fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each day or part of a day that the vehicle remains in the appointed place after the expiration of five working days.

Standing Orders By-laws

In pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 14 February 1994 to amend the By-laws relating to Standing Orders published in the *Government Gazette* on 30 October 1963 and amended from time to time by—

1. Deleting by-law 88 (1) and substituting the following—

“ 88 (1) In addition to such Occasional Committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be Standing Committees of the Council namely for—

- (a) Works and Services.
- (b) Planning and Development.
- (c) Financial and Community Services.

2. Deleting by-law 89 (1) and substituting the following—

“ 89 (1) Subject to any resolution of the Council passed after the coming into operation of the Standing Orders, the duties of Standing Committees shall be—

- (a) Works and Services Committee the oversight of—
 - (i) construction and maintenance of streets, ways, drains, bridges and other public places;
 - (ii) sweeping and watering of streets;
 - (iii) construction of street shelters and street signs;
 - (iv) construction of crossings over footpaths and any constructional matters—connection with streets;
 - (v) rubbish collection services;
 - (vi) water supply and maintenance;
 - (vii) matters relating to staff within the Works and Services division;
 - (viii) airport maintenance.

- (b) Planning and Development Committee the oversight of—
- (i) all matters relating to strategic planning and development approval, including town planning, schemes and zoning, land subdivision, heritage matters, townscape and all other matters dealing with town planning;
 - (ii) all matters relating to building, including administration of the Building Code of Australia, building licensing, building regulation, construction and maintenance of council buildings and property;
 - (iii) all matters relating to public and environmental health, including meat inspections, food premises, pollution, public buildings, liquid wastes, offensive trades, street trading;
 - (iv) matters relating to staff within the Planning and Development division.
- (c) Financial and Community Services Committee the oversight of—
- (i) the finances of the Council;
 - (ii) items of non budgeted expenditure recommended by any committee;
 - (iii) estimates of receipts and expenditure for each financial year;
 - (iv) investments, debt servicing, new loans;
 - (v) administration of Council property and the sale and leasing thereof;
 - (vi) all matters relating to the delivery of rangers services;
 - (vii) all matters relating to the delivery of library services;
 - (viii) all matters relating to the arts;
 - (ix) tourism development;
 - (x) parks, gardens, reserves, enclosed ovals and childrens play-grounds;
 - (xi) street trees and landscaping;
 - (xii) matters relating to community services and development including provision of recreation services;
 - (xiii) corporate services including Country Urban Councils' Association, Western Australian Municipal Association and Regional Council matters;
 - (xiv) matters relating to staff within the Financial and Community Services Divisions;
 - (xv) public relations;
 - (xvi) sister city relationships ”.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960**CITY OF ROCKINGHAM MILLAR ROAD REFUSE AND RECYCLING FACILITY
BY-LAW 1994**

Under the powers conferred upon it by the *Local Government Act 1960*, the Council of the City of Rockingham resolved on 21 December 1993 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law.

Citation

1. This By-law may be cited as the *City of Rockingham Millar Road Refuse and Recycling Facility By-law 1994*.

Definitions

2. In this By-law, unless the context requires otherwise—

“Act” means the *Local Government Act 1960*;

“authorised staff member” means a person employed by the Council and authorised in writing either by the Council or the Town Clerk to carry out duties and functions at or in respect of the Millar Road Facility;

“City” means the municipality of the City of Rockingham;

“Council” means the Council of the City;

“Millar Road Facility” means the property and buildings—

(a) located at Lot 2170 Millar Road Rockingham, being the whole of the land comprised in Certificate of Title Volume 1464 Folio 465; and

(b) used for the disposal, treatment and recycling of waste material;

“Site Controller” means an authorised officer of the Council charged with the conduct of operations at the Millar Road Facility and includes any person acting in that position; and

“Town Clerk” means the Town Clerk of the City or the person acting from time to time in that capacity.

Application

3. The operations of the Millar Road Facility are to be conducted in accordance with this By-law and each person within the Millar Road Facility is subject to the provisions of this By-law.

Speed Limit

4. A driver of any vehicle within the Millar Road Facility must observe all speed limit restrictions relating to the Millar Road Facility.

Obeying Instructions

5. Each person within the Millar Road Facility must obey a lawful instruction given by the Site Controller or an authorised staff member.

Failure to Obey Instructions

6. (1) If the Site Controller or an authorised staff member believes on reasonable grounds that a person has failed to—

(a) comply with a provision of this By-law; or

(b) obey a lawful instruction of the Site Controller or an authorised staff member, he or she may direct the person to leave the Millar Road Facility immediately.

(2) A person who fails to comply with a direction under subclause (1) commits an offence.

Disposal of Waste

7. A person must not place or dispose of any waste material at the Millar Road Facility other than in accordance with a notice or an instruction of the Site Controller or an authorised staff member.

Removal of Waste

8. A person must not remove any waste material from the Millar Road Facility unless authorised to do so by the Site Controller.

Lighting of Fires

9. A person must not light, or attempt to light, any fire within the Millar Road Facility unless authorised to do so by the Site Controller.

Damage to Property

10. A person must not damage, deface or otherwise interfere with any building, equipment or other property of the Council within or near the Millar Road Facility.

Flora and Fauna

11. Unless authorised to do so by the Site Controller, a person must not—
- (a) dig up, remove, damage or otherwise interfere with any flora; or
 - (b) trap, chase, worry, remove or otherwise interfere with any fauna.

Opening Hours

12. (1) The Council, by resolution, may from time to time set and alter the hours of operation of the Millar Road Facility.
- (2) The hours of operation set under subclause (1) are to be displayed for public information at the public entrance to the Millar Road Facility.

Entry Fee

13. (1) In this clause the "prescribed fee or charge" means the relevant fee or charge, or both, payable for admission to the Millar Road Facility, in the scale of fees and charges set by the Council by resolution under s.191A of the Act.
- (2) In setting a scale of fees or charges under subclause (1), the Council may specify one or more classes of persons for which differing fees or charges or both apply.
- (3) Except where authorised by the Council or the Town Clerk, a person must not enter the Millar Road Facility to dispose of or dump waste without paying the prescribed fee or charge.

Hazardous Materials

14. (1) A person must not dispose of or dump at the Millar Road Facility any liquid, toxic or hazardous material declared by the Health Department of Western Australia to be of a class which is required to be disposed of and treated at a declared facility suitable for that class of material.
- (2) If a person disposes of or dumps material in breach of subclause (1)—
- (a) the Council may remove the material and make good any damage caused by its disposal or dumping at the Millar Road Facility; and
 - (b) the costs of removal and making good any damage may be recovered from that person in a court of competent jurisdiction.

Offences and Penalties

15. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of this By-law commits an offence and is liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding \$400.00.

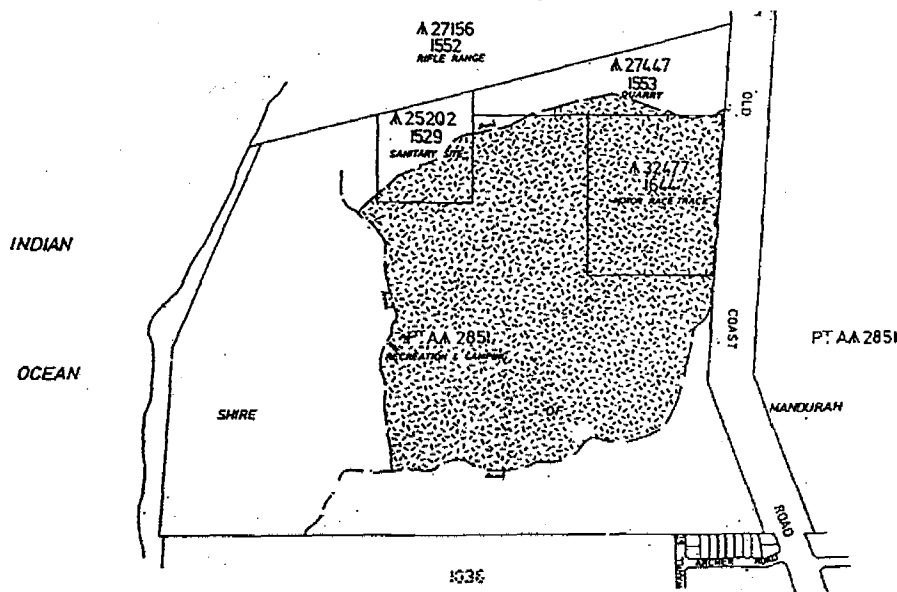
