

- (ii) may be erected, placed or displayed pursuant to a licence or other approval granted by the Council prior to the approval of this Scheme, hereinafter in this part referred to as 'existing advertisements', may, except as otherwise provided, continue to be displayed or be erected and displayed in accordance with the licence or approval as appropriate.

7.3 Consideration of Applications

Without limiting the generality of the matters which may be taken into account when making a decision upon an application for consent to erect, place or display an advertisement, Council shall examine each such application in the light of the objectives of the Scheme and with particular reference to the character and amenity of the locality within which it is to be displayed, including its historic or landscape significance and traffic safety, and the amenity of adjacent area which may be affected.

7.4 Exemptions from the Requirement to Obtain Consent

Subject to the provisions of the Main Roads (Control of Signs) Regulations 1983 and notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 7.1.1. the Council's prior consent is not required in respect of those advertisements listed in Schedule 5 which for the purpose of this Part are referred to as 'exempted advertisements'. The exemptions listed in Schedule 5 do not apply to places, buildings, conservation areas or landscape protection zones which are either:

- (i) listed by the National Trust;
- (ii) listed on the register the National Estate;
- (iii) included in local authority town planning schemes because of their heritage or landscape value.

7.5 Discontinuance

Notwithstanding the scheme objectives and clause 7.4, where the Council can demonstrate exceptional circumstances which cause an exempted or existing advertisement to seriously conflict with the objectives of this part, it may be notice in writing (giving clear reasons) require the advertiser to remove, relocate, adapt, or otherwise modify the advertisement within a period of time specified in the notice.

7.6 Derelict or Poorly Maintained Signs

Where, in the opinion of the Council, an advertisement has been permitted to deteriorate to a point where it conflicts with the objectives of the Scheme or it ceases to be effective for the purpose for which it was erected or displayed, Council may by notice in writing require the advertiser to—

- (i) repair, repaint or otherwise restore the advertisement to a standard specified by Council in the notice, or
- (ii) remove the advertisement.

7.7 Notices

- 7.7.1 'The advertiser' shall be interpreted as any one or any group comprised of the land owner, occupier or licensee.
- 7.7.2 Any notice served in exceptional circumstances pursuant to Clause 7.5 or pursuant to Clause 7.6 shall be served upon the advertiser and shall specify:
 - (i) the advertisement(s) the subject of the notice;
 - (ii) full details of the action or alternative courses of action to be taken by the advertiser to comply with the notice;
 - (iii) the period, not being less than 60 days, within which the action specified shall be completed by the advertiser.
- 7.7.3 Any person upon whom a notice is served pursuant to this Part may within a period of 60 days from the date of the notice appeal to the Hon Minister for Planning or the Town Planning Appeal Tribunal in accordance with Part V of the Act, and where any such appeal is lodged the effect of the notice shall be suspended until the decision to uphold, quash or vary the notice is known and shall thereafter have effect according to that decision.

7.8 Scheme to Prevail

Where the provisions of this Part are found to be at variance with the provisions of the Council's Signs, Hoarding and Bill Posting By-laws, the provisions of the Scheme shall prevail.

7.9 Enforcement and Penalties

The offences and penalties provisions specified in Clause 6.3 and 6.6 of the scheme apply to the advertiser in this part.

RULES OF TROTTING

Notice of Amendment

Notice is hereby given that at a meeting of the Committee of the Western Australian Trotting Association held at Gloucester Park, East Perth, on the 22nd day of March 1994, it was resolved by an absolute majority of the members of the Committee that the Rules of Trotting be amended as follows.

Delete existing Rules 260, 261, 262 and insert the following-

Owner or Trainer With One or More Horses Engaged in a Race

- 260. (a) Except with the special approval of the Stewards, an owner or trainer who has a horse engaged in a race and who desires to drive in that race shall drive that horse which he owns or trains.
 - (b) Except with the special approval of the Stewards, the order of priority set out below shall apply in relation to an owner or trainer who has more than one horse engaged in a race and who desires to drive in that race—

Firstly, he shall drive the horse he owns and trains;

Secondly, he shall drive the horse which he owns but which is trained by some other person;

Thirdly, he shall drive the horse trained by him but not owned by him.

(c) For the purpose of this Rule-

"owner" includes any part owner and any lessee; and

"owns" includes leases;

"trainer" includes any driver who in the absence of a trainer shall be temporarily in charge of a horse.

Driver Changes—Offences

- 261. (a) Except with the special approval of the Stewards, application for which shall be made on good and substantial grounds only, the same driver shall drive his horse throughout a meeting.
 - (b) No change shall be made to the driver nominated to drive a horse at any time after the acceptance of the horse's nomination without the special approval of the Stewards.
 - (c) Where-
 - (i) any person drives a horse in breach of Rule 260 or this Rule; or
 - (ii) any person, other than the driver nominated or approved to drive that horse, drives a horse,
 - the Stewards may-
 - (iii) disqualify from the race and for such further period as they think fit, the horse and any other horse in that race owned or trained by the driver; and
 - (iv) punish the driver, the owner and the trainer in any manner referred to in Rule 11.

Driver Changes—Special Approval

- 262. (a) Special approval of the Stewards to the change of a nominated or approved driver shall be sought no later than—
 - (i) for a race that is subject of TAB betting, forty eight (48) hours before the commencement of the meeting; and
 - (ii) for all other races one (1) hour before the first race of the meeting concerned.
 - (b) The Stewards may grant special approval to the change of a nominated or approved driver sought later than the times referred to in Rule 262(c).
 - (c) Where special approval is sought later than the Change of Driver deadline published from time to time by the Controlling Body, the Stewards may, in granting special approval, impose a fine or other penalty including suspension or disqualification.
 - (d) If any special approval is granted by the Stewards during a race meeting then the approval shall be publicly announced by the club concerned as soon as possible thereafter.

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
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
