Made by the Minister under sections 9, 10 and 11.

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the Ningaloo Marine Park (Recreational Fishing) Amendment Notice 1994.

Principal Notice

2. In this notice the Ningaloo Marine Park (Recreational Fishing) Notice 1991* is referred to as the principal notice.

Clause 2 amended

- 3. Clause 2 of the principal notice is amended-
 - (a) in the line beginning "rock lobster" by deleting "and";
 - (b) in the line beginning "sanctuary zone" by deleting "." and substituting "; and"; and
 - (c) inserting in alphabetical order the following-
 - "throw net" means a net which has a length not exceeding 3 metres measured from the centre of the retrieval to the lead line and has a mesh size not exceeding 25 millimetres. ".

Clause 6 amended

- 4. Clause 6 of the principal notice is amended-
 - (a) in subclause (3) by deleting "Notwithstanding subclause 6.(1)(c)" and substituting the following—
 - " Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (c) of subclause 6(1) "; and
 - (b) by inserting after subclause (3) the following subclause—
 - (4) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (b) of subclause 6(1) and paragraph (c) of subclause 6(2) a person may take or attempt to take mullet (*Mugilidae* family) by means of a throw net in any waters of a general use zone or recreation zone. ".



Department of Transport, 24 May 1994.

Acting pursuant to the powers conferred by Regulation 48A(1)(c) of the Navigable Waters Regulations, the Department of Transport, by this notice cancels the notice published in the Government Gazette of 25 June 1993 regarding a water ski area at Exmouth and substitutes the following—

(6) Shire of Exmouth

(ii) Exmouth. All the waters contained within the area commencing at the prolongation of the southern edge of the Launching Ramp at Town Beach, thence in a due east direction for two kilometres, thence due south for two kilometres, thence due west to the foreshore, but providing that no vessel towing a skier will come within 50 metres of the foreshore except in the take off and landing area which is situated 120 metres south of the southern edge of the boat ramp and extends south for 50 metres. Parasailing in the area is limited to commercial craft operating a winch launch and recovery system, and only one commercial operator may use the area at any one time. No vessel towing a parasail is permitted within 200 metres of the foreshore or within 100 metres of any person, vessel or object in the water.


