 - " "throw net" means a net which has a length not exceeding 3 metres measured from the centre of the retrieval to the lead line and has a mesh size not exceeding 25 millimetres. "

- (a) in subclause (3) by deleting "Notwithstanding subclause 6(1)(c)" and substituting the following—
 - " Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (c) of subclause 6(1) "; and

 - " (4) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (b) of subclause 6(1) and paragraph (c) of subclause 6(2) a person may take or attempt to take mullet (*Mugilidae* family) by means of a throw net in any waters of a general use zone or recreation zone. "
