The State Energy Commission of Western Australia CHANGE IN HIGHER HEATING VALUE OF GAS

It is hereby notified for public information that, in accordance with the provisions of section 8 of the Gas Standards Act 1972, the Minister for Energy approved on 5 May 1994 an alteration to the minimum standard of heating value of natural gas supplied by The State Energy Commission of Western Australia (the Commission) and that as from the date of publication of this Notice the standard shall not be more than 42.3 megajoules per cubic metre and not less than 37.3 megajoules per cubic metre at a temperature of fifteen (15) degrees celsius and at a pressure of 101.325 kilopascals. Notwithstanding the said standard the Commission may supply gas outside the said limits for periods of up to one hour a day provided the gas has a higher heating value which is not more than 44.0 and not less than 36.6 megajoules per cubic metre of the gas at a temperature of fifteen (15) degrees celsius and at a pressure of 101.325 kilopascals.

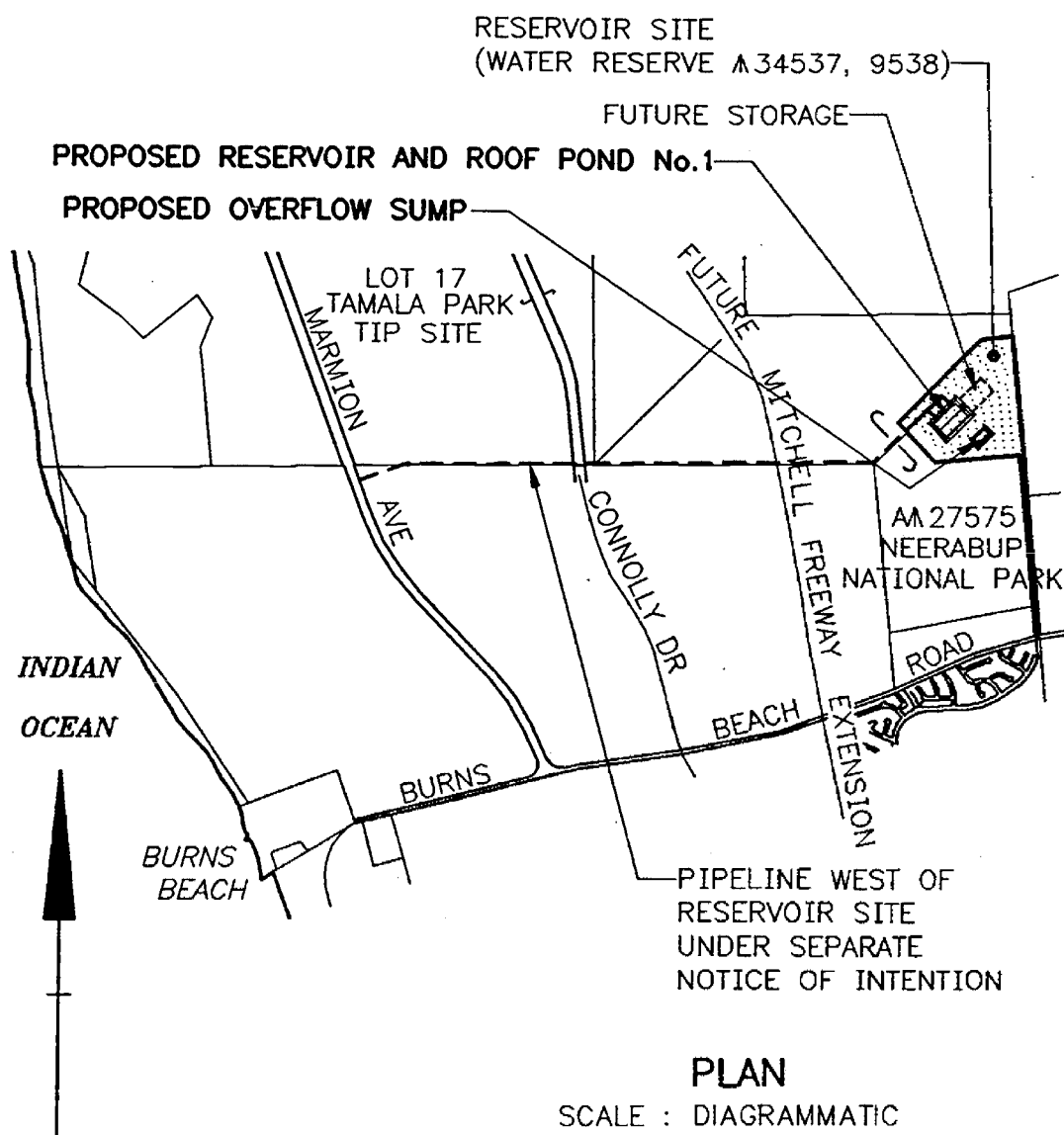
