Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under section 5.

**Citation**

1. This order may be cited as the *Fire Brigades (Metropolitan Fire District) Order 1994*.

**Metropolitan Fire District**

2. The boundaries of the Metropolitan District are adjusted so that the boundaries are in accordance with the description in the Schedule.

### SUPREME COURT ACT 1935

#### SUPREME COURT AMENDMENT RULES (No. 2) 1994

Made by the Judges of the Supreme Court.

#### Citation

## Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Rates and Charges (Rebates and Deferments) Amendment Regulations 1994*.

## Commencement

2. These regulations come into operation on 1 July 1994.

3. In these regulations the *Rates and Charges (Rebates and Deferments) Regulations 1992*\* are referred to as the principal regulations.
