EXOTIC DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT 1993

SECTION 24 — DECLARATION OF IMPORT RESTRICTION ORDER

IMPORT RESTRICTION ORDER

Made by the Minister for Primary Industry under section 24 of the *Exotic Diseases of Animals Act 1993*.

Avian Influenza has been diagnosed in Queensland.

The entry or importation into Western Australia of —

- (a) any bird; or
- (b) any animal product derived from a bird,

originating in the area of Queensland specified in the Schedule, or in any other area of that State which the Queensland Department of Primary Industries has caused to be defined as an infected, restricted or control area for the purpose of an outbreak or suspected outbreak of Avian Influenza, is prohibited, unless the prior approval of the Chief Veterinary Officer to the entry or importation has been obtained.

SCHEDULE

CONTROL ZONE

Land within the following boundaries —

- the Forest Hill — Fernvale Road from its intersection with Wyatt's Road to the Brisbane River
- the Brisbane River from its intersection with the Forest Hill — Fernvale Road to the mouth of Lockyer Creek
- between the mouth of Lockyer Creek and Roseborough Road
- along Roseborough Road and Mahon Road to Lockyer Creek at the western boundary of Lot 131 RP CA 3115
- along Lockyer Creek to Nunn Road
- along Nunn Road to Wyatt's Road
- along Wyatt's Road to its intersection with the Forest Hill — Fernvale Road

Section 41 — Certification of an exotic disease outbreak

DISEASE CONTROL ORDER

Made by the Minister for Primary Industry under section 41 of the *Exotic Diseases of Animals Act 1993*.

It is hereby certified that an outbreak of Avian Influenza has occurred within the State of Queensland.

For the purposes of the Act, Avian Influenza is defined as an exotic disease.
