In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the above mentioned Act and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 18th day of October 1993, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-Law.

- 1 In this By-law, the By-law relating to parking facilities, published in the Government Gazette on 9 December, 1983, and amended 30 August, 1985; 3 August, 1990 and 23 August, 1991 is referred to as the principal By-law.
- 2 The principal By-law is amended by adding after the definition of "Sign" the following new definition—
 - "Specified Place" means a yard or other piece of land set aside by the Council as a place to which obstructing vehicles may be removed."
- 3 The principal By-law is amended by Deleting clause 6 and replaced with-
- "6 (1) Where under this By-law the standing or parking of vehicles in a street is controlled by a sign then that sign should be read as applying to the part of a street which—
 - (a) lies beyond the sign and in the direction of any arrows that may be included in that sign:
 - (b) lies between the sign and the next sign beyond that sign;
 - (c) is that side of the carriageway of the street nearest to sign; or
 - (2) If a sign specifies that the standing or parking of vehicles is prohibited or restricted in a specified street or streets or in streets bounded by streets nominated in a sign, the sign shall be read as applying to all parts of such street or streets specified on that sign."
- 4 The principal By-law is amended by adding after Part 5 Penalties and before the First

" PART 6—OBSTRUCTING VEHICLES

- 49. A vehicle that is parked in any portion, of a public place wherein vehicles may lawfully be parked is not obstructing, unless—
 - (a) the vehicle is so parked for any period exceeding twenty-four hours, without the consent in writing of the Clerk of the Council;

- (b) the vehicle is so parked during any prohibited or restricted periods, if by any sign, the parking of vehicles is prohibited or restricted.
- 50. A vehicle which is parked in any portion of a public place wherein vehicles may not lawfully be parked is deemed to be causing an obstruction.
- A person shall not park a vehicle in a public place so as to obstruct any portion of that place.
- The Council may appoint a person as an authorised person for the purpose of clauses 49-58.
- 53. Where an authorised person or a member of the police force finds a vehicle parked in a public place, contrary to the provision of clause 51, he/she may remove the vehicle there from and use such force as is necessary to enter the vehicle for the purpose of so removing it and shall, thereupon, place it in an appointed place.
- 54. Where an authorised person places a vehicle in an appointed place, pursuant to clause 53, he/she shall enter in a register to be provided by the Council for that purpose, details of the time and date, a description of the vehicle, and of the place from which it was removed; and shall notify the Clerk of the Council.
- 55. Clerk of the Council shall notify the last known owner in writing that vehicle therein described has been placed in the appointed place.
 - 55.1 A person may recover a seized vehicle from an appointed place, by paying to the clerk of the Council:-
 - (a) the cost incurred by the Council in removing the vehicle thereto:
 - (b) an impounding fee, and if applicable, a subsequent custody fee as shown in the Fourth Schedule; and upon payment of that cost and fees, the Clerk if satisfied that the person is the owner of the vehicle or is a person entitled to possession of the vehicle, shall permit him to remove it.
 - 55.2 Every person who removes a vehicle from an appointed place without the authority of the Clerk commits an offence.
- 56. Where a vehicle, placed in an appointed place has not been recovered by the owner or person entitled thereto within one month from the day upon which it was thereplaced, the Council may cause the vehicle to be offered by sale by public auction or by public tender and thereupon accept the best offer made; and where no offer is made for the purchase of the vehicle, the Council may cause it to be destroyed.
- 57. A person is not entitled to any claim, by way of damages or otherwise, against the authorised person, member of the Police Force, or the Council in respect of any vehicle seized and dealt with under these clauses or against any person who purchases a vehicle sold by Council under Clause 56.
 - 57.1 The proceeds of the sale of a vehicle under the provisions of clause 56 shall be applied by the Council -
 - (a) firstly, in meeting the costs of the sale;
 - (b) secondly, in meeting the cost of removal of the vehicle to the appointed place and fees under the provision of clause 55.1(b) and these sums shall be paid into the Municipal Fund.
 - 57.2 Any surplus of the proceeds of the sale shall be paid by the Council into its Trust Fund, and may be paid within ten years, to any person who satisfies the Council that the person was the owner of the vehicle at the time of its sale by the Council.
 - 57.3 Any surplus of the proceeds of the sale, may if not paid to the owner within ten years, be paid into the Municipal Fund.
- 58. Where the proceeds of the sale of any vehicle under the provisions of clause 56, after deduction of the monies authorised to be applied by the Council thereto by clause 57 does not cover the costs of the removal, custody and disposal of that vehicle, the Council may recover the balance of these costs from the owner of that vehicle in a court of competent jurisdiction.
- 59. A person committing a breach of clauses 49 58 is liable upon conviction in a court of law to a penalty not exceeding \$500.00. "

FEES RELATING TO OBSTRUCTING VEHICLES

- 3 A Custody Fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) per day for each or part of a day that the vehicle remains in the appointed place after the expiration of five (5) working days.






