(e) Where in the opinion of the Shire Engineer, or any other Authorised Officer of Council, the waste material taken to the recycling depot is unsuitable for recycling, the Shire Engineer or any other Authorised Officer may direct that the waste be deposited at the Davis Road Refuse Disposal Site and the appropriate tipping fees be paid or the use of free entry into the site as per item 1 of the Schedule in paragraph (a), shall apply.	
(f) Any person loitering on the Davis Road Refuse Disposal Site at any time, or trespassing on the tip site outside normal operating hours, or when visiting the tip site fails to comply with any instruction given by the Shire Engineer or any other Authorised Officer of Council, commits an offence.	
(g) Sewage deposited at the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River Septage Disposal Site at Wallis Road will incur a disposal fee of \$9.44/kL."

Flammable material is defined for the purpose of this notice to include vegetation, timber, boxes, cartons, paper and like materials, rubbish and any other combustible matter, but does not include green standing trees, garden plants, growing bushes or maintained lawns, stacked wood heaps or buildings.

- d) If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks on the land in the situations required by this Notice or by the date required by this Notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly Authorised Officer for variations by the Order.   - 2.1 During the period from 15th December, to the 31st May inclusive you shall have fire breaks at least 20 metres wide, if provided by burning, cultivating or spraying or 60 metres wide, if provided by being closely grazed or mowed to the satisfaction of a Bush Fire Control Officer in such positions as are necessary to completely surround the perimeter of any homestead building (excluding isolated non flammable buildings) fuel installation (including drums), hay stack (but only haystacks within 100 metres of any building) or group of such structures or installations. In each case the outer 2.5 metres of the area must be totally free of any inflammable material and where mowing is the method used all residue of the mowing process must be removed from the area.

Note—Boundary firebreaks are not compulsory within the Shire of Kojonup Rural Area. Land holders can provide fire breaks if they wish.

General Information—If its considered impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks on the land as required by this notice you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If permission is not granted by Council or its duly authorised officer you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

Please Note: Following the method adopted by Council to inspect the firebreaks required in this notice, it is not necessary for Council to notify you or give you any prior warning that legal action may proceed for failing to comply with the requirements of this notice.

Harvesting: As per the Bush Fires Act it is now compulsory that an engine powered pumping unit and not less than 400 litres of water be in attendance during grain harvesting operations.

Swathers and Balers are subject to the same conditions as harvesting, i.e. an engine powered pumping unit and not less than 400 litres of water be in attendance during operations from 1st December.

Oxyacetylene, Arc welders, friction cutting equipment (whilst used in the open) are subject to the same conditions as swathers and balers, and that in addition, the worksite be adequately cleared of flammable material prior to the use of the above mentioned equipment.

Please note: The Bushfire Advisory Committee recommends the prior installation of a preliminary chemical firebreak around your house and sheds and also around the 20 metre boundary mark to burn your break from/to. This practice will help reduce the number of protective burns which escape. The chemical break should be installed in June, or thereabouts, however, annual seasonal conditions should be considered.

- (1) The three members polling the highest number of votes shall hold office until the close of the next but two succeeding annual general meetings, and in case of a tie, the returning officer shall decide the issue.
  - (2) The two members polling the lowest number of votes shall hold office until the close of the next succeeding annual general meeting, and in the case of a tie, the returning officer shall decide the issue.
  - (3) In the event of there being no ballot, the time for retirement shall be settled by lot.
- (c) At the third annual general meeting held after the coming into effect of this by-law the three members of Committee due to retire shall retire, and three members shall be elected in accordance with the preceding by-law, and shall hold office until the close of the next but two succeeding annual general meetings.
- (d) At the fourth annual general meeting held after the coming into effect of this by-law and at each succeeding annual election the members elected shall hold office for three years.
- (e) At the first annual general meeting held after the coming into effect of the amendment of the first paragraph of By-law 4 the three members of the Committee due to retire shall retire and two members shall be elected in accordance with the preceding by-law and shall hold office until the close of the next but two succeeding annual general meetings and at each succeeding annual election the members elected shall hold office for three years."

- (a) all members due to retire shall retire, and the three members shall be elected in accordance with the preceding by-laws;
