Made by the Minister under section 54.

Citation

1. This instrument may be cited as the *Cockburn Sound (Crab) Management Plan Amendment (No. 2) 1996*.

Principal Plan

2. In this instrument the *Cockburn Sound (Crab) Management Plan 1995** is referred to as the principal Plan.

Clause 3 amended

3. Clause 3 of the principal Plan is amended by deleting the item commencing "Regulations" and substituting the following item—

“ “Regulations” means the *Fish Resources Management Regulations 1995*; ”.

Clause 10 amended

4. Clause 10 of the principal Plan is amended—

- (a) in subclause (2) by deleting “subclauses (3) and (4)” and substituting the following—
“ subclause (3) ”; and
- (b) deleting subclause (4).

Clause 12 amended

5. Clause 12 of the principal Plan is amended—

- (a) in subclause (3) by—
 - (i) deleting “millimetres,” at the end of paragraph (b) and substituting the following—
“ millimetres. ”; and
 - (ii) by deleting “and have attached to it by negatively buoyant rope one float which—
- (c) has a diameter of not less than 190mm, and
- (d) is branded or stamped in legible characters not less than 80mm high and not less than 15mm wide with the letter “F” followed by the distinguishing number allotted under subregulation (4) of the Regulations in respect of the licensed fishing boat that is used to set or lift the crab pot.”;
- (b) by inserting in order the following subclauses—
 - “ (3A) A crab pot shall either—
 - (a) have attached to it a negatively buoyant rope to which is attached one float which—
 - (i) has a diameter of not less than 190mm; and
 - (ii) is branded or stamped in legible characters not less than 80mm high and not less than 15mm wide with the distinguishing number allocated under regulation 118(3) of the Regulations in respect of the licensed fishing boat that is used to set or lift the crab pot; or
 - (b) be attached to another crab pot by a minimum of 20 metres of negatively buoyant rope.
 - (3B) A crab pot being used in the Fishery by a licensee or nominated operator in accordance with subclause (3A) (b) of this clause must not be attached to a crab pot being used under the authority of another licence. ”;
- and
- (c) in subclause (5) by deleting “Schedule 4” and substituting the following—
“ Schedule 3 ”.

Clause 14 amended

6. Clause 14 of the principal Plan is amended in subclause (1) by deleting “clause 12” and substituting the following—

“ clause 13 ”

Schedule 3 repealed

7. Schedule 3 of the principal Plan is repealed.

Schedule 4 amended

8. Schedule 4 of the principal Plan is amended by renumbering it as “ Schedule 3 ”.

KIMBERLEY PRAWN MANAGEMENT PLAN AMENDMENT 1996

Made by the Minister under section 54.

Citation

1. This instrument may be cited as the *Kimberley Prawn Management Plan Amendment 1996*.

Principal Plan

2. In this instrument the *Kimberley Prawn Management Plan 1993** is referred to as the principal Plan.

Clause 9 amended

3. Clause 9 of the principal Plan is amended by inserting after subclause (5) the following subclauses—

“ (6) Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 7(2) and subclauses (1), (2) and (4) of this clause, a person who—

- (a) qualifies for access to the Fishery in accordance with clause 7 but did not apply within the time specified in that clause for a Class 1 licence; and
- (b) being the licensee of a boat which fits the description in subclause (1) of this clause and did not apply for either—
 - (i) a Class 2 licence; or
 - (ii) compensation in accordance with subclause (2) of this clause,

and satisfies the Minister that—

- (c) the failure to apply for the Class 1 licence and subsequently a Class 2 licence or compensation was due to inadvertence; and
- (d) in the opinion of the Executive Director had the person applied within the time specified in subclause (1) and subclause (4) of this clause the person would have been granted a Class 1 licence and subsequently a Class 2 licence or compensation as the case may be,

may apply at any time to the Executive Director for a Class 1 licence and the Executive Director may treat that application as if it were an application within clause 7(2).

(7) If an application made in accordance with subclause (6) of this clause is granted and a Class 1 licence issues, the holder of that licence may within 14 days of that licence being issued, apply to the Executive Director in the approved form to surrender that licence on payment of compensation in an amount as fixed by the Minister as if the application was an application under subclause (2) and the compensation was to be paid under subclause (3).

(8) If the holder of a licence which has been issued in accordance with subclauses (6) and (7) of this clause does not apply within 14 days to surrender that licence and be paid compensation then that failure to apply shall be grounds for the Executive Director to cancel the licence. ”.

Clause 13 amended

4. Clause 13 of the principal Plan is amended in subclause (2) by deleting “1 April 1996” and substituting the following—

“ 1 February 1997 ”.

Clause 16 amended

5. Clause 16 of the principal Plan is amended by deleting “51.25 metres” and substituting the following—

“ 58.5 metres ”.

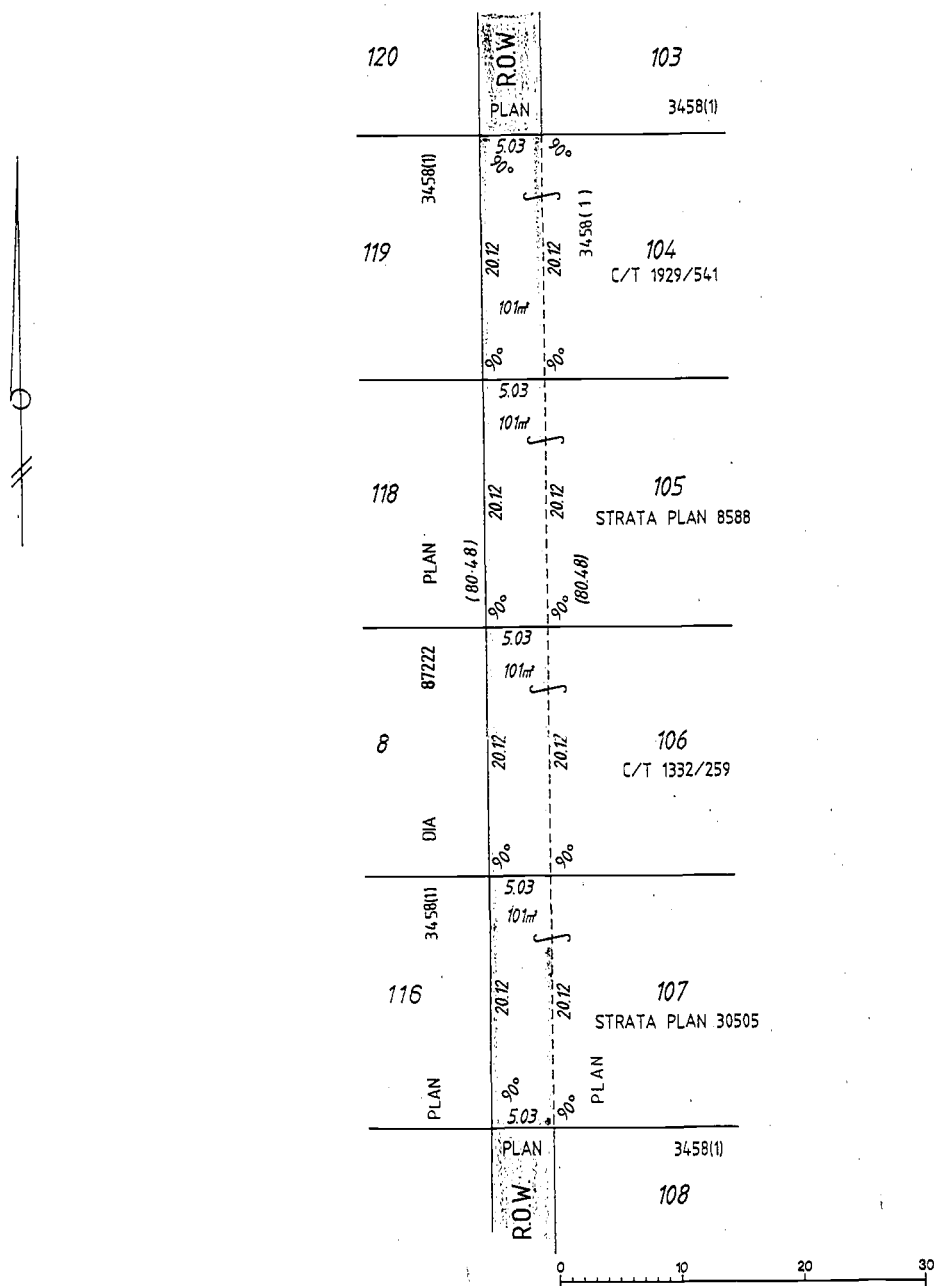
