1. This amendment may be cited as the South Coast Purse Seine Management Plan Amendment 1997.

Principal Plan

2. In this amendment the South Coast Purse Seine Management Plan 1994^* is referred to as the principal Plan.

Clause 6 amended

- 3. Clause 6 of the principal Plan is amended by deleting paragraph (d) and substituting the followin paragraph—
 - " (d) in Zone 4 of the Fishery from 1 April 1996 is that the boat was used to take a minimum of 50 tonnes of small pelagic fish from the waters described as Zone 4 during the period 1 March 1992 to 31 December 1993; or ".

SOUTH COAST PURSE SEINE MANAGEMENT PLAN AMENDMENT (NO. 2) 1997

Made by the Minister under section 54(2).

Citation

1. This Plan may be cited as the South Coast Purse Seine Management Plan Amendment (No. 2)

Principal Plan

2. In this amendment the South Coast Purse Seine Management Plan 1994* is referred to as the principal Plan.

Clause 3 amended

- 3. Clause 3 of the principal Plan is amended by-
 - (a) deleting the item commencing "authorised boat" and substituting the following—
 - " "authorised boat" means-
 - (a) a licensed fishing boat the name and licensed fishing boat number of which are specified in a licence; or
 - (b) a boat specified in a written authority under regulation 132 where that boat is to be used in the place of a boat described in (a);";
 - (b) inserting after the item commencing "authorised boat" the following item—
 - ""Catch and Disposal Record Book" means a book of triplicate consignment notes in a form approved for the purpose of clause 14 by the Executive Director;";
 - (c) inserting after the item commencing "commencement date" the following item—
 - ""exhausted" means used in whole or in part to take small pelagic fish;";
 - (d) inserting after the item commencing "purse seine net" the following item-
 - ""regulations" means the Fish Resources Management Regulations 1995;";
 - (e) deleting the items commencing "quota", "quota period", "unallocated units", "unit", "Zone 1 units", "Zone 2 units", "Zone 3 units" and "Zone 4 units"; and
 - (f) inserting after subclause (2) the following—
 - "(3) Unless the contrary intention appears the following words have the meanings provided for in the regulations—

"licensed fishing boat"; and

"licensed fishing boat number.".

Clause 6 deleted and substituted

4. Clause 6 of the principal Plan is deleted and the following clause substituted—

"Criteria to operate a boat in the Fishery

6. A person must not use a boat in a Zone of the waters of the fishery unless the boat is an authorised boat.".

Clause 6A inserted

5. The principal Plan is amended by inserting after clause 6 the following clause—

"Criteria to be satisfied before a licence may be granted

- 6A. (1) No licence authorising fishing in—
 - (a) one zone only of the fishery; or
 - (b) any combination of all or any of Zones 1, 2, 3 and 5,

is to be granted by the Executive Director after the commencement of this amendment.

(2) The Executive Director may grant a licence authorising fishing in Zones 4 and 5 to a person who is the holder of a fishing boat licence under the authority of which a fishing boat was used during the period 1 March 1992 to 31 December 1993 to take a minimum of 50 tonnes of small pelagic fish from the waters of Zone 4.".

Clause 9 amended

- 6. Clause 9 of the principal Plan is amended by-
 - (a) deleting subclause (4) and substituting the following subclause—
 - "(4) The Executive Director may, by notice published in the Gazette, prohibit fishing in a Zone of the fishery for the period specified in the notice if in the opinion of the Executive Director the prohibition is required in the better interests of the fishery."; and
 - (b) inserting after subclause (6) the following—
 - "(7) A person must not fish in a Zone of the fishery at a time when fishing in the Zone has been prohibited by a notice made under subclause (4).".

Clause 10 deleted and substituted

7. Clause 10 of the principal Plan is deleted and the following clause substituted—

"Zones

10. A person shall not operate in a Zone of the fishery unless the person is authorised to fish in the Zone by a licence which confers and is endorsed with not less than 8 units of entitlement in respect of that Zone.".

Clause 11 amended

- 8. Clause 11 of the principal Plan is amended by-
 - (a) deleting paragraph (f) of subclause (6) and substituting the following paragraph—
 - "(f) the number and class of units of entitlement conferred by the licence, and the Zones of the fishery in which the holder of the licence may operate; and"; and
 - (b) deleting subclauses (7) and (8).

Clause 12 deleted and substituted

9. Clause 12 of the principal Plan is deleted and the following clause substituted—

"Units of entitlement

- 12. (1) The entitlement to fish for small pelagic fish which was specified on a licence shall upon the renewal of the licence following the commencement of this amendment be converted into units designated as Class A, B C or D units as provided for in this clause.
 - (2) The entitlement conferred by a licence which was endorsed with Zone 1 units shall, upon the renewal of the licence, be converted into an equivalent number of Class A units of entitlement.
 - (3) The entitlement conferred by a licence which was endorsed with Zone 2 units shall, upon the renewal of the licence, be converted into an equivalent number of Class B units of entitlement.
 - (4) The entitlement conferred by a licence which was endorsed with Zone 3 units shall, upon the renewal of the licence, be converted into Class C units of entitlement in accordance with subclause (6).
 - (5) The entitlement conferred by a licence which was endorsed with Zone 4 units shall, upon the renewal of the licence, be converted into Class D units of entitlement in accordance with subclause (6).
 - (6) For the purposes of subclauses (4) and (5) the number of Class C and D units conferred by a licence upon renewal of the licence shall be calculated in accordance with the following formula—

$$N = NZ \times 1.25$$

where—N is the number of Class C or D units and shall be rounded to the nearest whole number, and

NZ is the number of Zone 3 or 4 units, as the case may be.

- (7) The number and class of units that shall be conferred by and endorsed on a licence granted after the commencement of this amendment and in accordance with clause 6A(2) is 25 Class D units of entitlement, provided that where the total amount of small pelagic fish to which the criteria relate is not less than 208 tonnes the number of Class D units that shall be conferred by the licence is the quotient of the number of tonnes divided by 8 rounded down to the nearest whole number.
- (8) The Executive Director may refuse an application for the transfer of a unit of entitlement on the grounds that—
 - (a) the application is not in respect of a whole number of units;
 - (b) in the event of the transfer a licence would confer less than 8 units of a particular class of entitlement; or
 - (c) the entitlement to take fish, to which the unit relates, has been exhausted.
- (9) In the event that all the units of entitlement are transferred from a licence the Executive Director may cancel the licence.".

Clause 13 deleted and substituted

10. Clause 13 of the principal Plan is deleted and the following clause substituted—

'Quota

- 13. (1) A person shall not take small pelagic fish from the waters of the Fishery other than in accordance with a class of entitlement conferred by and specified on a licence.
 - (2) Each unit of entitlement designated as a Class A, B, C or D unit conferred by and endorsed on a licence entitles the holder of the licence, or a person acting on that persons behalf, to fish for, within the period for which the licence has been granted or renewed, the amount of small pelagic fish specified in Schedule 6 from the Zones specified in Schedule 6.
 - (3) A person must not fish for small pelagic fish in a Zone of the fishery if the whole of the entitlement to take fish which the licence confers and specifies, has been exhausted.".

Clause 14 deleted and substituted

11. Clause 14 of the principal Plan is deleted and the following clause substituted—

"Catch and Disposal Records

- 14. The master of an authorised boat shall, whenever small pelagic fish are taken—
 - (a) complete in triplicate, in Part A of a consignment note in a Catch and Disposal Record Book, details of any small pelagic fish landed ashore;
 - (b) complete the consignment note within 30 minutes of landing ashore the small pelagic fish and shall not allow any of those fish to be removed from that place of landing unless the consignment note is completed;
 - (c) cause the original copy of the completed consignment note to accompany any small pelagic fish taken under the authority of the licence from the place of landing to the place of the processor specified on that consignment note;
 - (d) forward, within 24 hours of landing ashore the small pelagic fish, the duplicate copy of the completed consignment note to the Regional Office of the Fisheries Department that is nearest to the place of landing;
 - (e) retain the triplicate copy of the completed consignment note in the Catch and Disposal Record Book and produce the Catch and Disposal Record Book to a Fisheries Officer on demand;

- (f) retain all three copies of any cancelled, spoiled or unused consignment notes in the Catch and Disposal Record Book; and
- (g) not deliver or allow to be delivered any small pelagic fish for the purpose of sale to any processor or place other than the processor and place specified on a completed consignment note.".

Clause 18 deleted and substituted

12. Clause 18 of the principal Plan is deleted and the following clause substituted—

"Offences and major provisions

18. A person who contravenes a provision of clause 6, 9, 10, 13 or 14 commits an offence and for the purposes of section 75 of the Act these are major provisions.".

Schedule 6 inserted

13. The principal Plan is amended by inserting after Schedule 5 the following—

"Schedule 6

- One Class A unit entitles the taking of a total of 5,500 kilograms of small pelagic fish from all or any of Zones 1,2 or 5 or any combination of those zones
- One Class B unit entitles the taking of a total of 5,500 kilograms of small pelagic fish from all or any of Zones 2 or 5 or any combination of those zones
- One Class C unit entitles the taking of a total of 8,000 kilograms of small pelagic fish from all or any of Zones 3 or 5 or any combination of those zones
- One Class D unit entitles the taking of a total of 8,000 kilograms of small pelagic fish from all or any of Zones 4 or 5 or any combination of those zones ".



FIREBREAK NOTICE

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Halls Creek.

Pursuant to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before 1st May 1997 and thereafter up to and including 30th November 1997 to have firebreaks clear of all flammable material in accordance with the following—

- (a) Rural land being all land outside townsites and not land being held under pastoral lease; firebreaks are required to be—
 - 1. Not less than four metres wide inside, along and within 10 metres of the external boundaries
 - 2. Not less than two metres wide and within three metres of the perimeter of all building and/or haystacks or groups of buildings.
- (b) Pastoral lands, being all lands outside townsites held under pastoral lease; firebreaks are required to be not less than two metres wide and within three metres of the perimeters of all buildings and/or haystacks or groups of buildings.
- (c) Townsite land—
 - 1. Where the area of the land is 2 000 square metres or less, all inflammable material from the whole of the land is required to be removed.
 - 2. Where the area of the land is greater than 2 000 square metres, a firebreak of not less than two metres in width, immediately surrounding any buildings or not less than two metres wide inside, along and within two metres of external boundaries of the land is required.
- (d) Rubbish sites, being all rubbish sites for pastoral station, townsite, and community use. Firebreaks are required to be not less than two metres wide and within three metres of the perimeter of the rubbish site.
- (e) Fuel dumps and depots—remove all inflammable material from all land where fuel drum ramps or dumps are located and where fuel drums whether containing fuel or not are stored to a distance of at least five metres outside a perimeter of any drum, ramp or stack of drums.
- (f) The Acts referred to in paragraph (a) to (e) hereof must be performed to the satisfaction of the duly authorised officer of the Shire of Halls Creek.
- (g) If it is considered impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to remove inflammable material from the land as required by this notice you may apply to this Council or its duly authorised officer not later than 17th April 1997 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land.
- (h) The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of \$1 000 or a prescribed penalty of \$80 on service of an Infringement Notice and a person in default is also liable whether prosecuted or not to pay the cost of performing the work.



- 8.1 On-site effluent disposal shall be the responsibility of the individual landowner.
- 8.2 The disposal of liquid and/or solid wastes shall be carried out with an effluent disposal system approved by Council and the Health Department of WA. Systems shall be designed and located to minimise nutrient export and/or release into any waterway or ground water. Conventional effluent disposal systems for new dwellings shall be set back a minimum of 100 metres from Pwakkenbak Creek and situated 2 metres above the highest known ground water level.
- 8.3 Council shall require the use of amended soil type effluent disposal systems, such as Ecomax/ATU Systems in situations where a 100 metre setback from the creek line cannot be achieved, where soil conditions are not conducive to the retention of nutrients and in low lying areas.

Separation from waterways and ground water shall be determined by Council in conjunction with the Health Department of WA.

- 8.4 Variations to the design or location of effluent disposal areas will require a suitably qualified practitioner demonstrating that effluent disposal will not cause environmental or health impacts to the satisfaction of Council and the Department of Health.
- 8.5 No more than one effluent disposal system will be permitted on one lot.

9.0 BUSHFIRE MANAGEMENT CONTROL

- 9.1 Council may request the Commission to impose a condition at the time of subdivision for the construction of the strategic firebreak as shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan.
- 9.2 Where a lot is traversed by a strategic fire break as shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan, the owner of the lot shall

maintain such firebreak to the satisfaction of Council. Fencing and/or unlocked gates across the strategic firebreak shall only be permitted at the discretion of and to the satisfaction of Council and the Bush Fires Board.

9.3 Low fuel buffers, at least 20 metres wide shall be established and maintained around all buildings.

9.4 The subdivider shall make arrangements to the satisfaction of Council to ensure prospective purchasers are aware of the fire management guidelines of the Homeowners Bushfire Survival Manual and the Australian Standard 3959 "Construction of Buildings in Bushfire Prone Areas."

10.0 NOTIFICATION OF PROSPECTIVE OWNERS

Provision shall be made to Council's satisfaction to ensure prospective purchasers of land with Rural Residential Zone Area No 3 are given a copy of these Special Provisions prior to entering into an agreement to acquire any property.
