HEALTH ACT 1911

CITY OF GOSNELLS HEALTH AMENDMENT (No. 1) LOCAL LAWS—EATING HOUSES 1997

Made by the Council of the City of Gosnells under the Health Act 1911.

Citation

- 7. Fourth Schedule—Licence Conditions

Paragraph (b) delete the words "residence he/she" and insert "residence, the holder".

Delete all words from "Transfer" to "Gosnells" inclusive.
