The MEDICAL BOARD OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA having held An Inquiry on 16 December 1997, into allegations that Dr Peter Poh Soon Chia was guilty of gross carelessness or incompetence contrary to Section 13(1)(c) of the Medical Act 1894 as amended, and having heard Mr A. Metaxas, Counsel for the Board and Mr M. Buss QC, Counsel for Dr Chia, HEREBY FOUND as follows:

- 1. That the charge of Gross Carelessness has been established in 8 of the 12 allegations made against Mr Chia in the Notice of Inquiry.
- 2. That the following conditions and restrictions upon Mr Chia's practise apply:
 - (i) for the next 12 months Mr Chia may not:
 - perform any laparoscopic surgery;
 - practise intra abdominal surgery other than as an assistant to an accredited surgeon.
 - (ii) Mr Chia shall submit to this Board, not later than 9 months from 16 December 1997, evidence of satisfactory compliance with a surgical re-training program acceptable to the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons or such other professional body satisfactory to the Board which might establish his capacity to resume unrestricted surgical practise. The Board shall then consider what, if any, further conditions should be imposed on his practise at the expiration of this 12 month period.
- 3. The Board orders Mr Chia to pay the costs of the Inquiry.
