CURTIN UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY ACT 1966

Curtin University of Technology, Bentley, 10 October 1997.

The Council of the Curtin University of Technology has made the Statute set out in the Schedule hereunder by resolution dated 27 November 1996.

SCHEDULE STATUTE 21 UNIVERSITY ACADEMIC BOARD

- 1. There shall be a Board of the University called the Academic Board.
- 2. The Board shall elect its chairperson from amongst the academic staff of the University as prescribed in the Rules made under this Statute.
- 3. Membership of the Academic Board, the method of appointment and tenure of office of members and all other matters necessary or desirable to ensure the effective exercise of the functions of the Academic Board shall be prescribed in Rules made under this Statute.
- 4. The functions of the Academic Board shall include-
 - (a) the discussion and submission to the Council of opinions and recommendations on academic policy, academic development, the admission of students, instruction, studies and examinations, research, the admission to degrees, the discipline of the University and any other matters which in the opinion of the Academic Board are of an educational nature;
 - (b) the furnishing to the Council of reports on all matters referred to it by the Council for consideration: and
 - (c) such other acts or matters as may be conferred or imposed by the Rules.
- 5. The Academic Board shall have all such powers as may be necessary to discharge its functions.

The Common Seal of Curtin University of Technology was hereto affixed on the 15th day of October 1997 by the authority of the Council.







NOTICE TO OWNERS AND/OR OCCUPIERS OF LAND WITHIN THE SHIRE OF PLANTAGENET

Pursuant to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954 you are hereby required, on all land owned or occupied by you to plough, cultivate, scarify, burn, chemically spray or otherwise clear of all inflammable material, firebreaks of dimensions as follows: See (a) (c) (d) and (e) below—

- 3 On land exceeding 40 hectares in area if boundary firebreaks are not installed owner/occupiers shall maintain a mobile firefighting unit (self propelled, towed or slip on) in working order with a minimum capacity of 400 litres of water, and
- 4 A firebreak shall be installed not less than 3 metres wide adjacent to the perimeter of all grain producing crops irrespective of whether such grain producing crops are to be harvested or not; or
- 5 A firebreak not less than 3 metres wide—as an alternative to (4 above) inside, along and within 100 metres of the boundaries of all land owned or occupied by you.

B. EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Harvesting equipment requirements—when harvesting is in progress owners/occupiers of land shall have a mobile fire fighting unit in working order with a minimum of 400 litres of water in or immediately adjacent to the paddock being harvested.
- On farm fire fighting equipment requirements—Owners/Occupiers of land exceeding 40 hectares shall maintain a mobile fire fighting unit (self propelled, towed or slip on) in working order with a minimum capacity of 400 litres of water, if boundary firebreaks of 2 metres are NOT installed.

C. TOWNSITES FIREBREAKS NOTICE

Owners/Occupiers of land shall install a firebreak not less than 2 metres wide around and within the boundaries of each individual Lot or, around and within a combination of Lots where such Lots are adjoining and used as one parcel of land in the Shire of Plantagenet townsites of Mount Barker, Kendenup, Narrikup and Rocky Gully.

- 7.5.6 Derelict of Poorly Maintained Signs
- 7.5.6.1 Where, in the opinion of the Council, an advertisement has been permitted to deteriorate to a point where it conflicts with the objectives of the Scheme or it ceases to be effective for the purpose for which it was erected or displayed, Council may by notice in writing require the advertiser to:

DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC PROSECUTIONS ACT 1991

Section 24

GUIDELINES TO POLICE OFFICERS AND OTHER PUBLIC OFFICERS FOR THE EXERCISE OF THE DISCRETION NOT TO PROSECUTE INDICTABLE OFFENCES

Introduction

Every decision whether or not to charge a person with an indictable offence must be in the public interest.

When a charge is laid, there is a written record of the charge and the evidence in support is available in due course for review.

These guidelines are intended to clarify the exercise of discretion by police officers and public officers in situations where the public interest does not require a person to be charged with an indictable offence.

These guidelines should not discourage police officers and other public officers from exercising the discretion. The guidelines are to promote consistency and improve accountability.

The Director of Public Prosecutions is the only person with statutory authority to grant indemnities from prosecutions.

Furthermore, the only bodies able to grant an undertaking that answers given or statements made by a person will not be used in evidence are Courts and the Director of Public Prosecutions.

Police and other public officers do not have these powers.

Therefore, the decision not to proceed with a prosecution in the public interest is one that must always be capable of review.

Guidelines

- 1. There will be occasions, when despite sufficient credible evidence identifying a person as having committed an offence, a police officer or public officer will exercise a discretion not to charge that person.
- 2. Such a discretion should only be exercised in the public interest and by applying to the particular facts and circumstances the *Statement of Prosecution Policy and Guidelines* published in *Government Gazette* No. 157 on 6 November 1992.
- 3. The reasons for the exercise of a discretion not to lay a charge in a particular case must be recorded in writing.
- 4. The exercise of a discretion not to lay a charge in a particular case should be subject of routine review within the Police Service or other responsible authority. The review must also be recorded in writing.
- 5. These guidelines apply to all indictable offences, including indictable offences triable summarily and will become operative from 1 February 1998.
