**FT301\*****RETAIL TRADING HOURS ACT 1987**  
**RETAIL TRADING HOURS (EXEMPTION ORDER No. 12) AMENDMENT**  
**ORDER 1998**

Made by the Minister for Fair Trading under section 5 (1) of the Act.

**Citation**

1. This order may be cited as the *Retail Trading Hours (Exemption Order No. 12) Amendment Order 1998*.

**Clause 2 amended**

2. (1) Clause 2 (1) of the *Retail Trading Hours Exemption Order (No. 12) 1994\** is amended—

- (a) by deleting “and” after paragraph (e); and
- (b) by inserting after paragraph (e) the following paragraph—

“  
(ea) in the opinion of the chief executive officer, each owner of the retail shop is not related to any owner of another retail shop that is in what, in the opinion of the chief executive officer, is the same location; and  
”

(2) Clause 2 of the *Retail Trading Hours Exemption Order (No. 12) 1994\** is amended by inserting after subclause (4) the following subclause—

“

(5) For the purposes of subclause (1) (ea), in determining whether the owner of a retail shop is related to the owner of another retail shop the chief executive officer may have regard to whether—

- (a) one of them is—
  - (i) a child of, or of the spouse of, the other;

- (ii) a parent of, or of the spouse of, the other;
- (iii) a brother or sister of, or of the spouse of, the other; or
- (iv) the spouse of the other;
- (b) one of them is a related body corporate (as defined in section 9 of the Corporations Law) of the other;
- (c) one of them is a corporation within the meaning of the Corporations Law and the other—
  - (i) is an officer, within the meaning of the Corporations Law, of that corporation; or
  - (ii) is a majority shareholder in that corporation;
- (d) one of them is accustomed or under an obligation, whether formal or informal, to act in accordance with the directions, instructions or wishes of the other in relation to the operation of the retail shop;
- (e) one of them is—
  - (i) an employee; or
  - (ii) an agent, a principal, a partner, a nominee, a solicitor, an accountant or an auditor,of the other; and
- (f) one of them is—
  - (i) a trustee for the other; or
  - (ii) a trustee of a trust of which the other is a discretionary or other beneficiary.

”.

3. In this order the *Poisons (Authorized Possession of Substances) Order (No. 7) 1996\** is referred to as the principal order.

#### Clause 3 amended

4. Clause 3 of the principal order is amended by deleting the definition of “**specified person**” and substituting the following—

“ “**specified person**” means Graham Geoffrey Randall, police officer, of 2 Adelaide Terrace, Perth; ”.

#### Clause 4 amended

5. Clause 4 of the principal order is amended by deleting paragraphs (b) and (c) and substituting the following—

“ (b) 100 g of cannabis oil; and  
(c) 100 g of heroin, ”.

4. In this order—

“**specified place**” means the premises occupied by the Western Australian Police Service’s Alcohol and Drug Co-ordination Unit, at 210 Adelaide Terrace, Perth;

“**specified substance**” means the amount of the substance included in Schedule 9 to the Act, possession of which is authorized under clause 5.

**Possession of certain substance authorized**

5. Subject to clause 6, the persons mentioned in the Table to this clause are authorized to together possess at the specified place not more than 30 g of cannabis for educational purposes.

**Conditions of authorized possession**

6. The possession authorized under clause 5 is subject to the conditions that—

- (a) the specified substance, when not required for the purposes referred to in clause 5, is stored at the specified place in a secure manner, as directed by the Commissioner of Health;
- (b) written records relating to the specified substance are maintained by the persons mentioned in the Table to clause 5 at the specified place, as directed by the Commissioner; and
- (c) if requested by the Commissioner, any oral information or written report relating to the specified substance is given by the persons mentioned in the Table to clause 5 to the Commissioner.

“**specified substances**” means the amount of the substances included in Schedule 9 to the Act, possession of which is authorized under clause 5.

**Possession of certain substance authorized**

5. Subject to clause 6, the persons mentioned in the Table to this clause are authorized to together possess at the specified place, for the purpose of analytical chemical analysis, not more than—

- (a) 250g of heroin;
- (b) 40g of 3,4-Methylenedioxy-N, a-Dimethylphenylethylamine (MDMA);
- (c) 10g of 3,4-Methylenedioxyamphetamine (MDA);
- (d) 1mg of lysergide; and
- (e) 16g of cannabis.
