and so on, increasing in units of up to \$150.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Regulations 1999.*

".

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation on the day on which the *Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Act 1998* comes into operation.

3. Definition

In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears —

"5 year search" means a search about a particular registrable event that is conducted in the Register, an index to the Register or both in respect of a period of 5 consecutive years or less.

4. Fees

The fees set out in column 2 of the Table to this regulation are payable in respect of the corresponding matters in column 1 of the Table.
