Notice to all Owners and Occupiers of Land in the Shire of Lake Grace

Pursuant to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required on or before the 1st day of November, 1999, to plough, cultivate, scarify, burn or otherwise clear upon the land, firebreaks free of all flammable materials at least three metres wide, according to the following directions and in the following circumstances, on all rural and townsite land owned or occupied by you, and therefore up to and including the 31st day of March, 2000, to maintain the firebreaks clear of all flammable materials.

1. (a) Immediately inside all external boundaries of the property or as is practicable, firebreaks of not less than 3 metres wide and;
(b) Where buildings, haystacks, fuel ramps, fuel tanks and stored fuel drums are situated on land, firebreaks of not less than 2.5 metres wide within 33.5 metres of the perimeter of such buildings, haystacks, fuel ramps, fuel tanks and stored fuel drums in such a manner as to completely encircle the buildings, haystack, fuel ramps, fuel tanks and stored fuel drums and;
2. Where land is in crop and adjoins the railway line reserve a firebreak of not less than 3 metres wide encircling the crop and;
3. (a) Immediately surrounding an aerial landing ground situated on the land a firebreak of no less than 6 metres wide and;
(b) Any aerial landing ground used as the motor start up, refuelling and maintenance area to be completely cleared of flammable materials for a radius of 18 metres and;
4. Maintain clear of all flammable materials all townsite blocks and;
5. Where bush or land has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether intended to burn the bush or not), provide a firebreak of not less than 13 metres wide inside the external boundaries of the land so prepared. If you become owner or occupier of land after the 1st day of November, 1999, the requirements of this notice are varied so as to require you to comply with the terms of this notice within 14 days of the date of your becoming owner or occupier of such land, instead of on or before the 1st day of November, 1999. The firebreaks required by this notice are to be maintained clear of flammable materials up to and including the 31st day of March, 2000.

If it is considered to be impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice you may apply to the Council or its duly authorised officer, before the 11th October, 1999, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions on the land. If permission is granted by Council or its duly authorised officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice. The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine, not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1 000) and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier before the date specified.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING (WestOne Services) ORDER 1999

Made by the Minister for Employment and Training under section 57 of the *Vocational Education and Training Act 1996*.

Part 1—Preliminary

Citation

1. This order may be cited as the *Vocational Education and Training (WestOne Services) Order 1999*.

Commencement

2. This order comes into operation on the day on which it is published in the *Government Gazette*.

Interpretation

3. In this order unless the contrary intention appears—

“**TAFE International**” means the institution established by the *Vocational Education and Training (TAFE International) Order 1997*;

“**the Institution**” means WestOne Services established under clause 4.

Part 2—Establishment**Establishment and name**

4. An institution to be known as WestOne Services is established under section 57 of the Act.

Functions of Institution

5. The functions of the Institution are—

- (a) to collect, store, maintain and disseminate or diffuse vocational education and training intellectual property and related products provided or produced by public training providers or other persons for the State training system or other persons;
- (b) to engage in any publishing activity by using any media and other technology for the matters referred to in paragraph (a);
- (c) to co-ordinate, arrange or provide for the collection, storage, maintenance and dissemination or diffusion of vocational education and training intellectual property and related services provided or produced by public training providers or other persons for the purposes of the State training system.

Management and control

6. The management and control of the Institution are vested, in the chief executive but subject to the exercise of the Minister’s powers under section 14 of the Act.

Powers of the chief executive

7. The chief executive may do all things necessary or convenient to be done for or in connection with the performance of the functions of the Institution.

Advisory committee

8. The chief executive may appoint a committee for the purposes of advising the chief executive in carrying out the functions of the Institution.

Staff

9. For the purposes of assisting the Institution in carrying out its functions—

- (a) there may be appointed under and subject to the Public Sector Management Act 1994 such public service officers and other employees as are necessary;
and
- (b) despite paragraph (a), the chief executive may employ or engage persons otherwise than under the *Public Sector Management Act 1994*.

Application of the Financial Administration and Audit Act 1985

10. For the purposes of the *Financial Administration and Audit Act 1985* the Institution is to be regarded as a service of the Department.

Part 3—Consequential Provisions**Consequential amendments**

11. The *Vocational Education and Training (TAFE International) Order 1997* is amended in clause 5—

- (a) by inserting after paragraph (a) the following—
“and” ;
- (b) by deleting “State;” in paragraph (b) and substituting the following—
“State.” ; and

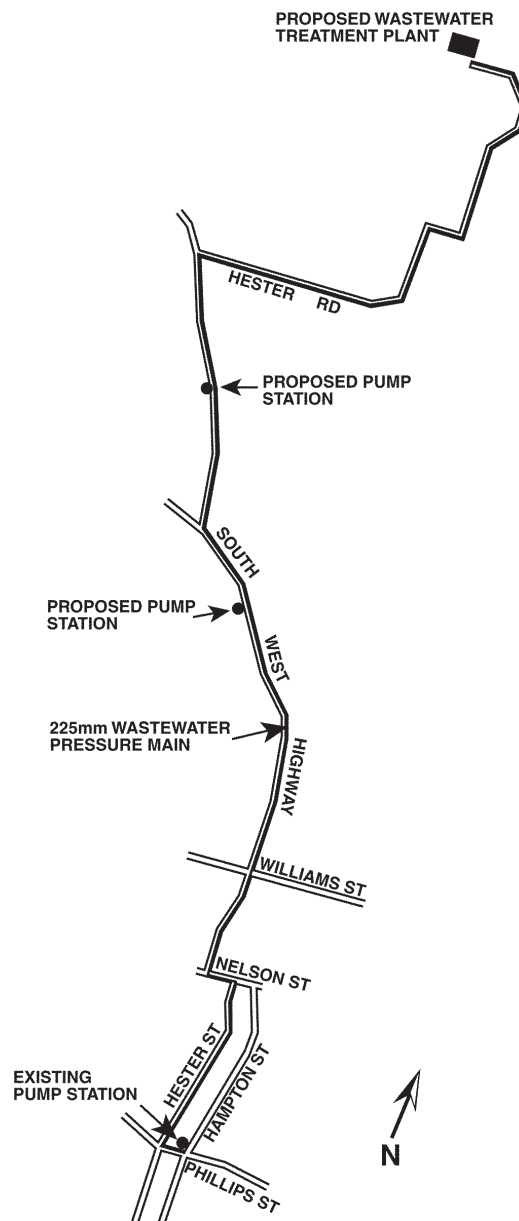
