Totalisator Agency Board (Betting) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1999

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Totalisator Agency Board* (Betting) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1999.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation on the day on which the *Acts Amendment (Fixed Odds Betting) Act 1999* comes into operation.

3. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Totalisator Agency Board (Betting) Regulations 1988**.

4. Regulation 12 amended

- (1) Regulation 12 is amended by inserting before "Subject" the subregulation designation "(1)".
- (2) At the end of regulation 12 the following subregulations are inserted
 - (2) In addition to the circumstances set out in subregulation (1), the TAB or an agent of the TAB may accept a bet where the part or full payment for the bet is
 - (a) in the form of a betting voucher for money's worth, issued by the TAB;
 - (b) by means of a winning ticket; or
 - (c) subject to subregulation (3), by cheque.

"

- (3) For the purposes of subregulation (2)(c), a cheque may be accepted as part or full payment for a bet if
 - (a) the cheque is completed, signed and dated prior to the acceptance of the bet;
 - (b) the cheque is banked no later than the next banking day after the bet is received; and
 - (c) the cheque is accepted in accordance with any rules made by the TAB under section 15 of the Act.

Pursuant to Sections 33 and 42 being loans under Section 36 of the Housing Act 1980, The State Housing Commission by this determination which was approved the Honourable Minister for Housing

fixes the following maximum standard rates of interest to apply in respect of the various classes of loan granted by it.

- 1. Income Based Loans, pre 1985 Variable Interest Schemes and Wisechoice under Sections 33 and 36 to 7.25% per annum.
- 2. In respect of Shared Equity 1994 (Real Start) (Subsidised Rate) Loans the standard rate of interest shall be 6.5% per annum rising by 1.0% per annum on every June 30 subsequent to the date from which interest is to be calculated until the rate of interest is 7.25% per annum.
- 3. In respect of Shared Equity 1994 (Aboriginal) (Subsidised Rate) Loans the standard rate of interest shall be 6.5 % per annum rising 0.5 % per annum on every June 30 subsequent to the date from which interest is to be calculated until the rate of interest is 7.25% per annum.
- 4. In respect of Shared Equity 1994 (Access) (Subsidised Rate) Loans the standard rate of interest shall be 6.5% per annum rising 0.5% per annum on every June 30 subsequent to the date from which interest is to be calculated until the rate of interest is 7.25% per annum.
- 5. In respect of Shared Equity 1994 (Real Start) (Unsubsidised Rate) Loans the standard rate of interest shall be 7.25% per annum.
- 6. In respect of Shared Equity 1997 (Good Start) (Subsidised Rate) Loans the standard rate of interest shall be 6.5% fixed per annum, until the borrowers' income exceeds Homeswest's maximum rental income eligibility limits. The rate will then move to the Commonwealth Bank standard home loan variable interest rate subject to a minimum interest rate of 6.5% per annum.

This determination shall take effect from February 1, 2000.

 - 4.4 Council shall refuse to issue consent for the keeping of stock on Lots 81-87, 90 & 92-101 where there is less than 4000m^2 of fenced and existing cleared land available and capable of keeping the stock proposed.
 - $6.4\,$ Landowners of Lots 81-87, 90 & 92-101 will be required to submit an overall design and landscape plan which addresses Provisions 6.1 to 6.3 and—
 - setbacks from property boundaries;
 - stormwater disposal;
 - that cut and fill of the site shall be kept to a minimum with preference given to split level development and the breaking, up of building mass;
 - that the total size of outbuilding/s shall be restricted to 120m² with a maximum eave height of 3 metres;
 - driveways shall be designed to minimise visual impact and erosion by being aligned with the contours of the site and planted with trees and shrubs. Stormwater runoff shall be attenuated to ensure erosion does not occur; and
 - and the landscape plan shall indicate the number, type and location of shrubs and trees to be planted and maintained as a condition of development approval to effectively minimise the visual impact of development on the site.
- iii) Modifying provision 9.2 of Schedule No. 1, Special Rural Zone Area No. 11 of the Scheme Text as follows—
 - 9.2 Council shall require the use of amended soil type effluent disposal systems in the following locations or situations—
 - upon Lots 81-87, 90 & 92-101 as shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan; or
 - where a 100 metre setback from a creek line or water course cannot be achieved; or
 - where soil conditions are not conducive to retention of nutrients: or
 - in low lying areas; or
 - in areas where there is a perched winter water table.

No effluent disposal system shall be permitted within a 50 metre setback from a creekline of watercourse.

- iv) Changing the Community Site (Lot 91 as shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan) from the Special Rural zone to Public Purposes reserve.
- v) Amending the Scheme maps accordingly.

- 1. Rezoning Lot 13 Keenan Street (Wungong South Road), Darling Downs from Rural, Special Rural and Public Open Space to Rural Living A.
- 2. Amending the Scheme Map accordingly.
- 3. Amending the Scheme Text by inserting in Appendix 4A Special Provisions, the following—

a) SPECIFIED AREA OR LOCALITY

Lot 13 Keenan Street (Wungong South Road), Darling Downs

b) SPECIAL PROVISIONS TO REFER To a)

 Within the Rural Living Zone the following uses are permitted or are permitted at the discretion of Council—

Permitted Uses-

- Single House
- Public Recreation
- Public Utility

Discretionary Uses—

- Ancillary Accommodation
- Stables—1 hectare lots and above only
- Home Occupation
- Child Minding Centre
- Consulting Rooms
- Corner Store

All other uses are prohibited

In exercising its discretion in respect to AA uses, the Council having regard to the Planning Guidelines for Nutrient Management shall only permit such uses when it is satisfied following consultations with Government Agencies that the land use does not involve excessive nutrient application or the clearing of the land.

- 2. No dwelling shall be approved by the Council unless it is connected to an alternative domestic wastewater treatment system as approved by the Health Department of WA with an adequate phosphorus retention capacity, as determined by the Department of Environmental Protection, and with the base of the system or the modified irrigation area being the required distance above the highest known water table.
- 3. No Indigenous vegetation or trees shall be destroyed or cleared except, but subject to the developer of the estate/landowner obtaining the prior consent in writing of the Council, where such vegetation is dead, diseased or where the clearing is required for the purpose of a firebreak, dwelling, outbuilding, fence drainage systems, driveways and/or to accommodate the discretionary uses identified under Provision 1.
- 4. The subdivider shall, in accordance with the Subdivision Guide plan and the Schedule of Landscaping for this estate, plant indigenous trees and shrubs of a species and at a density and distribution to the satisfaction of the Council prior to the transfer of a lot(s) to a new owner.
- 5. The subdivider shall either maintain the trees and shrubs planted until the land is sold, or shall plant sufficient numbers of trees and shrubs to allow for natural loss. Thereafter, the owners of the subdivided lots shall be responsible for the maintenance and replacement (if and where necessary) of those trees and shrubs planted by the subdivider to the satisfaction of the Council.

a) SPECIFIED AREA OR LOCALITY

b) SPECIAL PROVISIONS TO REFER To a)

- 6. The subdivider shall prepare and implement a Fire Management Plan that identifies and implements the construction requirements relative to strategic firebreaks, water supplies and equipment and any other fire requirements that may be deemed necessary, to the specification and satisfaction of the local authority and the Bush Fires Board of WA.
- 7. Notwithstanding the obligations of the subdivider under Clause 5.12.9e of the Scheme, the subdivider shall drain the land and provide drainage sumps in accordance with the Subdivision Guide Plan for the estate. Those easements required by Council shall be provided to the Council free of cost at the time of subdivision to provide for the ongoing maintenance of the drains and sumps.
- 8. At the time of the building application for each lot a plan of the site shall be submitted by the applicant to the satisfaction and specifications of the Council which shall show site contours, existing trees and stands of vegetation, those trees and vegetation to be removed and retained and proposals for tree planting and maintenance.
- 9. The land is situated within the catchment of the Peel-Harvey estuarine system where active nutrient management and responsible use of fertiliser is crucial to the health of the catchment and estuary. The application, type and distribution of fertiliser to the land shall be within limits set by the Department of Environmental Protection for irrigated and non-irrigated land.


