The Department of Conservation and Land Management advises on behalf of the National Parks and Nature Conservation Authority that an amendment to the Fitzgerald National Park Management Plan, 1991-2001, has been approved.

The amendment to the 1991 Management Plan was prepared in accordance with section 61 of the Conservation and Land Management Act 1984 and was approved by the Minister for the Environment on the 20 December 1999. No modifications were made to the amendment under section 60 (2) of the Act, and it comes into operation with this *Government Gazette* notice.

The amendment is required to permit changes to the fire management strategy of the wilderness zone of the National Park. The fire management strategy for the wilderness zone will be attached to the Management Plan as an appendix.
