PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA G. A. Kennedy, Deputy of the Governor. [L.S.] By the Honourable Geoffrey Alexander Kennedy, Officer of the Order of Australia, deputy of the Governor of the State of Western Australia.

- I, the deputy of the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council— $\,$
 - (a) under section 5(1)(a) of the *Prisons Act 1981* declare the buildings and enclosures set out in the Schedule to this proclamation to be a prison within the meaning and for the purposes of that Act to be known as the Hakea Prison with effect from the day on which this proclamation is published in the *Government Gazette*; and
 - (b) under section 5(1)(c) of that Act—
 - (i) declare that the prisons known as the Canning Vale Prison and The C.W. Campbell Remand Centre cease to be prisons with effect from the day on which this proclamation is published in the *Government Gazette*; and
 - (ii) direct that when the prisons referred to in subparagraph (i) cease to be prisons, the prisoners confined in them are to be confined in the Hakea


