Notice to all owners and occupiers of land within the Shire of Sandstone

**1. FIREBREAKS**

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you are hereby required on or before the 1<sup>st</sup> November 2000 or within fourteen days of you becoming owner or occupier of land should this be after the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 2000 to clear firebreaks and remove flammable material from the land owned or occupied by you as specified hereunder and to have the specified land and firebreaks clear of all flammable material from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 2000 up to and including the 31<sup>st</sup> day of March 2001.

**2. LAND OUTSIDE OF TOWNSITES**

Firebreaks must be cleared at least three metres in width completely surrounding and not more than twenty metres from the perimeter of any building or group of buildings. All flammable material must be removed from an area two metres in width immediately surrounding the buildings.

**3. TOWN SITES**

All land in the townsite shall have firebreaks at least three metres in width cleared of all flammable material immediately inside and along all external boundaries of the land and where there are buildings on the land additional firebreaks three metres in width shall be cleared immediately surrounding each building.

**4. FUEL DUMPS (FUEL DEPOTS)**

On all land where fuel drum ramps are located and where fuel dumps, whether containing fuel or not are stored, clear and maintain a firebreak at least four metres wide around any drum, ramp or stack of drums.

**5. GENERAL PROVISIONS**

If for any reason it is considered by the owner or occupier of land, that it is impractical to comply with the requirements of this notice a request may be made to the Council not later than 15<sup>th</sup> October 2000. Where approval of a proposed variation is not granted by Council you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for non-compliance with this notice is a maximum of \$1,000 and notwithstanding prosecution, Council may direct its Bush Fire Control Officer to enter on the land and carry out the requisite works at the owner/occupiers expense.

Council will assist owners/occupiers of town sites by carrying out a bulk rubbish collection where rubbish is placed on the verge on or before the 6<sup>th</sup> November 2000.

Where town site owners/occupiers are themselves unable to provide firebreaks along the external boundaries of the land, at the request of the owner/occupier, Council workers will carry out the work at a cost of \$25 per boundary, excluding the verge.

The Western Australian Planning Commission intends to amend the Metropolitan Region Scheme for land in the City of Swan, the Town of Bassendean and the Shires of Kalamunda and Mundaring, and is seeking public comment.

**Purpose**

The purpose of the Amendments is to give effect to eleven changes to zones and reservations of the Metropolitan Region Scheme. The ten individual proposals are contained within two Amendments, but have been published under one cover for convenience.

Proposals in **Amendment No. 1019/33** identify portions of land at Roland Road, Stoneville and Beacon Road, Parkerville for rezoning to urban as a prerequisite to establishing two new "townsites" in the Shire of Mundaring. **Amendment No. 1022/33** proposals include realignment of the Public Transport Route through Ellenbrook, identification of various locations in Bullsbrook for urban use, transfer of a portion of the Cyril Jackson Senior High School to urban use, an extension of the industrial zone on Lakes Road, Hazelmere, reservation of land for parks and recreation around the Roe and Tonkin Highway intersection and transfer of industrial land between Purton Place and Clayton Street, Bellevue to urban use. Details of the proposed transfer of land between various zones and reservations in each Amendment is detailed in the Commission's *Amendment Report*.

**Procedure**

The procedure for amending the Scheme, as set out in section 33 of the Metropolitan Region Town Planning Scheme Act, is to be used to advertise these proposals. Public submissions are invited and the Amendments will eventually be put to Parliament for final approval. In accordance with the procedure in section 33, the Hon Minister for Planning has approved the Amendments for public display and for the calling of submissions.

Copies of the amending plans and detail plans showing the proposed changes to the zones and reservations of the Scheme, and the Commission's *Amendment Report* which explains the various proposals, will be available for public inspection from Monday 10 July 2000 to Friday 13 October 2000 at each of the following places—
