



Local Government Act 1995

Shire of Augusta-Margaret River (Appointment of Commissioners) Order 2000

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

This order may be cited as the *Shire of Augusta-Margaret River (Appointment of Commissioners) Order 2000*.

2. Interpretation

In this order —

“**Shire**” means the Shire of Augusta-Margaret River.

3. Offices of councillor declared vacant

- (1) More than $\frac{1}{2}$ the offices of members of the council of the Shire being vacant, the offices of the remaining members of the council are declared vacant under section 2.37(1) of the Act.
- (2) The declaration under subsection (1) takes effect from the day on which this order is published in the *Gazette*.

4. Commissioners appointed

- (1) Under sections 2.37, 2.39 and 2.40 of the Act, the following people are appointed as commissioners of the Shire until a new council is elected and holds its first meeting —
 - (a) Edward Henry Kelly;
 - (b) Edward George Tait;
 - (c) Harry Morgan.
- (2) Edward Henry Kelly is appointed to be the chairperson of the commissioners.

- (3) Edward George Tait is appointed to be the deputy chairperson of the commissioners.
- (4) The appointments made under this clause take effect from the day on which this order is published in the Gazette.

5. Cancellation of extraordinary election

- (1) The direction in this clause is made under section 9.62 of the Act.
- (2) Despite sections 4.8 and 4.9 of the Act, and despite the decision of the president or council of the Shire under section 4.9 to fix 20 September 2000 as the day for any poll needed for an extraordinary election —
 - (a) an extraordinary election to fill an office of councillor of the Shire is not to be held; and
 - (b) any poll that would, but for this direction, be held on that day is cancelled.

6. Poll date for election of new council

Under section 2.37(5) of the Act, 1 September 2001 is fixed as the day for any poll needed for the election of members to fill the vacant offices of councillor of the Shire.
