Conservation and Land Management Act 1984

## Public Firewood Areas Order (No. 2) 2000

Made by the Executive Director under regulation 98 of the *Forest Management Regulations 1993*.

### 1. Citation

This order may be cited as the *Public Firewood Areas Order* (No. 2) 2000.

### 2. Interpretation

- (1) References in this order to CALMAPS are to maps produced by the Department of Conservation and Land Management.
- (2) Copies of the maps are available for inspection by the public during normal office hours at the places referred to in clause 4.

### 3. Public firewood areas

- (1) The areas of State forest named in column 1 and described in column 3 of Schedule 1 are set aside for the purposes of the collection of firewood by members of the public.
- (2) The areas set aside under subclause (1) are delineated on the relevant CALMAPS referred to in column 2 of Schedule 1.
- (3) Regulation 100 of the *Forest Management Regulations 1993* applies to the areas described in Schedule 1.

### 4. Inspection of CALMAPS

A CALMAP referred to in Schedule 1 may be inspected at the following Department of Conservation and Land Management offices —

- (a) Dwellingup District Office, Banksiadale Road, Dwellingup;
- (b) Mundaring District Office, Weir Road, Mundaring;
- (c) Perth District Office, 5 Dundebar Road, Wanneroo;

(d) State Operations Headquarters, 17 Dick Perry Avenue, Kensington.

# Western Power Corporation (Gas Supply) Direction 2000

Made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 38A(1) of the Act.

### 1. Citation

This instrument may be cited as the Western Power Corporation (Gas Supply) Direction 2000.

### 2. Definitions

In this instrument —

"gazettal day" means the day on which this instrument is published in the *Gazette*;

"specified area" means those parts of the State that were the subject of trading licences granted under Part 2A of the *Energy Coordination Act 1994* on 1 July 2000 to the Gas Corporation established by the *Gas Corporation Act 1994*.

### 3. Direction

- (1) The corporation must not sell or supply gas within, or for delivery or consumption within, the specified area during the period of 3 years commencing on gazettal day.
- (2) Nothing in subclause (1) is to be taken to prevent the corporation
  - (a) transporting gas for use by it in the performance of its functions under section 28(1) of the Act; or
  - (b) continuing to perform its obligations or exercise its rights under an agreement, in existence on gazettal day, relating to the sale or supply of gas.

### **HEALTH ACT 1911**

Shire of Harvey

HEALTH AMENDMENT (No. 1) LOCAL LAW 2000.

Made by the Council of the Shire of Harvey under the Health Act 1911

### Citation

1. This Local Law may be cited as the Shire of Harvey Health Amendment (No. 1) Local Law 2000.

### **Principal Local Laws**

2. In this Law, the Shire of Harvey Health Local Laws 1997, as amended\*, are referred to as the principal Local Laws.

#### **Amendment**

3. The Principal Local Laws are amended as described in the following schedule—

7	132(1)	Delete the definition of "lodging house" in subsection (1) and substitute the following— "lodging house" includes a recreational campsite, a serviced apartment or a short term hostel.'
8	134(c)(i)	Delete the words "prescribed in Schedule 14" from subsection (c)(i) and substitute the words "as Fixed from time to time by Council under Section 344C of the Act".
9	136(b)	Delete the words "prescribed in Schedule 14" from subsection (b) and substitute the words "as Fixed from time to time by Council under Section 344C of the Act."
10	150(3)(d) Schedule 14	Delete paragraph (d) of subsection (3) and substitute the following—  (d) a lodger or other person does not smoke in any dormitory, kitchen, dining room or other public enclosed place, within a short term hostel or recreational campsite."  Delete Schedule 14.

# Explosives and Dangerous Goods (Authorised Explosives) Order 2000

Made by the Minister for Mines under section 14 of the *Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act 1961*.

### 1. Citation

This order may be cited as the *Explosives and Dangerous Goods* (*Authorised Explosives*) *Order* 2000.

### 2. Commencement

This order comes into operation on the day after the day on which it is published in the *Gazette*.

### 3. Explosives declared to be authorised explosives

The explosives specified in Schedule 1 are declared to be authorised explosives for the purposes of the *Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act 1961*.

### 4. Former order cancelled

The Explosives and Dangerous Goods (Authorized Explosives) Order 1999 is cancelled.

### **BUSH FIRES ACT 1954**

Shire of Nannup

Fire Hazard Reduction Notice 2000/2001

IMPORTANT: Significant changes have been made to this notice.

### PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY

Notice to Owners and/or Occupiers of Land Within the Shire of Nannup

In this notice: "**Trafficable**" means an area of 3 metres minimum width constructed to allow unrestricted access to all maintenance and fire fighting vehicles and has all trees on both sides of firebreaks progressively pruned to a minimum height of 4 metres.

All owners and occupiers of land in the Shire of Nannup are required to carry out fire prevention work and to maintain access for fire fighting vehicles on the land owned or occupied in accordance with the provisions of this order.

This work must be completed by:

1st December, 2000, in Townsite,

15th December 2000, in rural areas.

This work must be maintained throughout the summer months until the close of the restricted burning period on 1 May 2001.

Properties, which do not comply with this Notice at the time of the inspection, will be immediately issued with a \$100 infringement notice. No further warnings will be issued.

### 1. ALTERNATIVE MEASURES

If it is considered impractical for any reason, to clear firebreaks or remove inflammable material, as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council by no later than the 1st November each year for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative measures to abate the fire hazards on the land. Any such application must bear the signature of the Fire Control Officer for the area signifying agreement to this variation. If permission is not granted, you shall comply with the requirements of this Notice. Applications for alternative measures must be renewed each year.

### 2. MINIMUM STANDARDS

The requirements of this order are considered to be the minimum standard of fire prevention work required to protect, not only individual properties, but also the district generally. In addition to this order Council may issue special orders to owners/occupiers if hazard removal is considered necessary in some specific areas.

### 3. PENALTIES

Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of this notice may be issued with an infringement notice fine of \$100 or prosecuted with an increased maximum fine of \$1,000. Council may also carry out the required works at the owner/occupier's expense.

#### 4. INSPECTIONS

Inspections of Firebreaks and hazard reductions around buildings will be carried out by an authorised officer on or after the specified work completion dates.

#### 5. FIRE HAZARDS

Where in the opinion of an Authorised Officer or the Area Fire Control Officer the land contains an amount of inflammable material which is considered hazardous, the land owner shall clear such hazard upon service of a notice requiring such works to be carried out.

### YOUR RESPONSIBILITY

#### 1. Urban Land

- 1.1 Urban land means land within the Shire of Nannup, which is within the Townsite or is within any area, which is sub-divided for residential purposes.
- 1.2 Where the area of land is less than or equal to  $2024m^2$  (approx. 0.5 acre) all inflammable material shall be removed from the whole of that land, with the exception of live, standing trees and live garden plants.
- 1.3 Where the area of land exceeds  $2024m^2$  (approx. 0.5 acre) firebreaks not less than 2 metres wide shall be constructed immediately inside the boundary of the land.
- 1.4 All inflammable material except for live standing trees and live garden plants shall be cleared within a 20 metre radius of all buildings.

#### 2. Rural Land

- 2.1 This section applies to:
  - 2.1.1 All holdings of land within the Darradup, North Nannup and Nannup Brook Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade boundaries.
  - 2.1.2 All rural holdings of land that allow access to the general public, e.g. chalet developments, bed and breakfast establishments, museums, door sale businesses etc.
- 2.2 Firebreaks clear of all flammable material, not less than 2 metres wide shall be constructed immediately abutting all homesteads, buildings and fuel storage areas on the land. Further, a reduced flammable fuel zone extending a further 20 metres from the firebreak shall be maintained. (Note: live standing trees may be permitted in this area).
- 2.3 A trafficable area (as previously defined in this order) shall be constructed inside and within 6 metres of the boundary of each lot unless the landowner has contributed to a strategic firebreak. Further, a 2 metre mineral earth firebreak shall be constructed within this trafficable area.
- 2.4 Where land is protected by strategic firebreak measures, it shall be the responsibility of all landowners protected by the strategic firebreak to contribute to the maintenance of the firebreak.
- 2.5 Landowners shall maintain access across their land for the use of fire fighting vehicles between 1 December 2000 to 1 May 2001.
- 2.6 There is no requirement for Firebreaks mentioned in 2.2 and 2.3 above, where:
  - 2.6.1 The whole area not covered by homestead and buildings is kept mown or slashed or clean of inflammable material, or,
  - 2.6.2 The whole area not covered by homestead and buildings is kept green by efficient water reticulation systems installed by the landowner.
  - 2.6.3 Live standing trees are permitted in 2.6.1 and 2.6.2 above.

### 3 Plantations

- 3.1 A plantation is any area of planted trees, other than a windbreak, exceeding 3 hectares.
- $3.2~\mathrm{A}$  windbreak is planted areas of trees not exceeding  $100~\mathrm{metres}$  in depth and  $1~\mathrm{kilometer}$  in length. Separation between windbreaks must be  $50~\mathrm{metres}$  (sides) and  $15~\mathrm{metres}$  (ends) allowing access to all maintenance and fire fighting vehicles.
- $3.3\,\mathrm{All}$  plantations require Planning Approval from Council prior to development. Council may require plantation fire protection measures to be fulfilled as a condition of Planning Approval.
- 3.4 Firebreaks not less than 10 metres wide, shall be constructed on the boundaries of plantations or on such alternative location as may be agreed between Council and the plantation owner. Boundary firebreaks shall consist of an area 10 metres wide cleared of all flammable material and having no overhanging tree branches for a vertical clearance of at least 10 metres.
- 3.5 Internal firebreaks clear of all inflammable material and not less than 6 metres wide shall be constructed surrounding compartments of approximately 30 hectares. All internal firebreaks must be maintained in a trafficable condition as previously defined in this order.
- 3.6 Where power lines pass through, or near plantation areas, additional obligations are required by the state power authority. Plantation owners and/or managers should consult Western Power for advice on their responsibilities.

### 4 Camp Fires

- 4.1 Lighting of fires in the open air for the purpose of camping or cooking is prohibited in the Shire of Nannup during the Prohibited and Restricted Burning Period each year.
- 4.2 Areas, which are set aside for cooking by CALM or the Shire of Nannup, are excluded from this prohibition providing properly constructed cooking facilities are provided,
- 4.3 No fires may be lit under this section if the Fire Danger Forecast is 'very high' or 'extreme.
- 4.4 The fire shall be completely extinguished by the application of water or earth before leaving it.

4.5 The following conditions apply to campfires lit in recognised areas during the Prohibited Burning Period and also to campfires lit during the Restricted Burning Period:

### 4.5.1 Open Solid Fuel Fires

- 4.5.1.1 Not to be lit within 3 metres of a log or stump.
- 4.5.1.2 An area with a radius of at least 3 metres around the site is to be cleared or all bush and other inflammable materials.
- 4.5.1.3 Not permitted on any day when an 'extreme' or 'very high' fire danger is forecast unless written approval is given by the local authority.
- 4.5.1.4 The fire shall be completely extinguished by the application of water or earth before leaving it.

#### 4.5.2 Gas Barbecues and Cookers

- 4.5.2.1 Properly constructed gas barbecues and cookers, the flame of which is encapsulated by the appliance, may be used at any time for the purpose of camping or cooking in recognised camping and picnic areas.
- 4.5.2.2 All combustible material is to be cleared from within a 5 metre radius of the gas barbecue or cooker.
- 4.5.3 GARDEN REFUSE OR RUBBISH burnt on the ground may be lit only between 6.00 pm and 11.00 pm and must be completely extinguished with water or earth by midnight. All flammable matter is to be cleared within 5 metres of all points of the site of the fire and a person must be in attendance during the whole time that the fire is burning.
