Shire of Wickepin

LOCAL GOVERNMENT PROPERTY LOCAL LAW

Under the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1995 and under all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Wickepin resolved on 15 November 2000 to make the following local law—

The Shire of Moora Local Government Property Local Law as published in the *Government Gazette* of 30 November 1999, is adopted as a local law of the Shire of Wickepin with the modifications which follow—

1. Preliminary

Wherever "Shire of Moora" is mentioned in the local law substitute "Shire of Wickepin".

2. Clause 1.2—Definitions

2.1 In the appropriate alphabetical position insert—

- " "boat" means any ship, vessel or structure capable of being used in navigation by water, however propelled or moved, and includes a jet ski; ".
- 2.2 In the definition of "vehicle", add a new paragraph—
 - "(e) a boat."

3. Clause 1.5-Repeal

Delete clause 1.5(1) and substitute—

- "1.5 (1) The following local laws are repealed—
 - Smoking in Halls, published in the *Government Gazette* of 11 January 1924;
 - Care and Control of Reserve No. 9610, published in the *Government Gazette* of 31 October 1975; and
 - Swimming Pool By-laws, published in the *Government Gazette* of 14 September 1979.".

4. Clause 2.7—Activities which may be pursued on specified local government property

- 4.1 In clause 2.7(1) renumber paragraphs (e) to (h) inclusive to (g) to (j) respectively and insert the following two paragraphs—
 - "(e) launch, beach or leave a boat;
 - (f) take or use a boat, or a particular class of boat;".
- 4.2 In clause 2.7(2)(d), insert "boats," after "vehicles," in both places where this occurs.

5. Clause 2.8—Activities which may be prohibited on specified local government property

5.1 In clause 2.8(1)-

- (a) delete paragraph (g);
- (b) renumber paragraphs (e) and (f) to (f) and (g) respectively; and
- (c) insert the following paragraph—
 - "(e) taking or using a boat, or a particular class of boat;".
- 5.2 In clause 2.8(2)(c), insert "boats," after "vehicles," in both places where this occurs.

6. Divisions, clauses renumbered

In Part 5, renumber Divisions 2 and 3 to 3 and 4 respectively and clauses 5.2 and 5.3 to 5.7 and 5.8 respectively.

7. New clause and Division inserted

7.1 In Part 5, after clause 5.1 insert—

"Consumption of food or drink may be prohibited

5.2 A person shall not consume any food or drink in an area where consumption is prohibited by a sign".

7.2 In Part 5, after Division 1 insert the following-

"Division 2—Lake Yealering

Application

5.3 This Division applies to Reserve No 9610.

Appointment of authorised persons

5.4 The local government may authorise, under section 9.10 of the Act, a person or persons to perform all or any of the functions under this local law in relation to the reserve.

Speed of vehicles

5.5 A person shall not on the reserve drive a motor vehicle of any kind, whether towing a boat or caravan or not, other than upon a defined road or on an approved parking area—

- (a) at a speed in excess of fifteen (15) kilometres per hour;
- (b) in a reckless, negligent or dangerous manner; or
- (c) while under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

Water activities on Lake Yealering

5.6 (1) A person shall not swim, ski, sail, row or drive a motor powered boat on or in any part of Lake Yealering—

- (a) other than in an area which may be set aside, from time to time for the purpose; or
- (b) which may from time to time, be declared unfit for the purpose.

(2) For the purpose of subclause (1) areas may be delineated by a map, notice, flags, markers or buoys placed in position by a person or persons authorised by the local government to do so.".

LOCAL LAWS RELATING TO PEST PLANTS

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the above mentioned Acts and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Wickepin resolved on 15 November 2000 to make the following local laws—

- 1. These local laws may be cited as the Shire of Wickepin Pest Plant Local Laws 2000.
- 2. In these local laws, unless the contrary intention appears—

"district" means the district of the local government;

"local government" means the Shire of Wickepin;

"pest plant" means a plant described as a pest plant by clause 4 of these local laws.

- 3. These local laws apply in respect of the district.
- 4. Every plant described in the First Schedule to these local laws is a pest plant.
- 5. (a) The local government may serve on the owner or occupier of private land within the district, a duly completed notice in the form of the Second Schedule to these local laws requiring him to destroy, eradicate or otherwise control any pest plant on that land.
 - (b) A person served with a notice under subclause (a) of this clause shall comply with that notice within the time and in the manner specified therein.
- 6. Where a person fails to comply with a notice under clause 5 of these local laws served upon him, the local government may—
 - (a) Without payment of any compensation in respect thereof, destroy, eradicate or control, as the case may be, any pest plant, the destruction, eradication or control of which was required by the notice; and
 - (b) Recover in a court of competent jurisdiction from the person to whom the notice is directed, the amount of the expense of such destruction, eradication or control.
- 7. The local laws relating to Pest Plants published in the *Government Gazettes* of 18 July 1980, 26 February 1982 and 4 June 1982, are repealed to the extent that they are still valid.

IN THE MATTER OF AN INQUIRY WITH REFERENCE TO THE CONDUCT OF DR VELUPILLAI SAKARAPANI

DOB: 1 JANUARY 1937

The Board having held an Inquiry on 6 November 2000 under Section 13(1)(c) of the Medical Act whereby Dr Sakarapani may be guilty of gross carelessness or incompetence.

The Board has considerable concerns with Dr Sakarapani's conduct in this case. He has admitted he made an error in failing to diagnose a sub-mucous cleft palate and, as a result, carried an inappropriate procedure; namely, adenoidectomy. The fact that the child has some abnormalities in appearance and the speech pathologist had expressed concerns regarding the child's nasal speech should have all raised Dr Sakarapani's suspicions.

The Board considers that he should have taken greater steps to have examined the child after he was anaesthetised and before he commenced surgery.

Having considered the views of various otolaryngologists, the Board is of the view that it is possible the condition may have been difficult to diagnose in this such patient. Therefore the Board does not consider the level of carelessness has been shown to reach the level of gross carelessness. The Board accepts Dr Sakarapani's commitment to take up the offer of further education from Professor Atlas and his colleagues. The Board also advises Dr Sakarapani to maintain ongoing collegiate contact with his professional peers.

The Board wishes to state that it accepts the views and opinion of Professor Atlas, Mr Coates and Mr Bracks and Mr Mark Edwards regarding appropriate standards of care in paediatric otolaryngology. The Board rejects the views of Dr Ian Bernadt.






